A. Automatic External Defibrillator - Chief Janik [Informational Item]

Chief Janik, Saugatuck Township Fire, gives his support for an AED installation at Schultz Park. He was approached by the Pickleball Club who would like to see one near the courts. No Council action taken.

B. 3077 May Ave. Storage Pods - Kathy Sarkisian

City Planner Anderson updated Council on the current situation with 3077 May Ave. Storage Pods. The Pods, a vehicle, and junk have been there for some time now. Two violation letters have been sent to the occupant. The Ordinances need updates to address "junk" "Pods/Outdoor Storage" and what is temporary.

Council discussed the need for Ordinance updates pertaining to trash and Pods, also to better define "temporary". City Planner Anderson stated if Pods are not removed after the time Council designated a Civil Infraction would be given to the home owner.

Motion to grant a 30 day extension on the trash clearing, the smaller Pod must be removed by December 31, 2023, and the large Pod must be removed by January 31, 2023.
