3. Fitness Connection Update

Goldsmith, along with the Fitness Connection presented their idea of an all-inclusive playground, fitness stations and a splash pad to the City Council. The City Council was very excited about the idea. Goldsmith, Huehnergarth, Emily Snedden and Mick Michel met to look at the logistics of the space where they'd like to place the playground. It appears to fit in the area they recommended. The next step is to look at the design. There is a wide variety of parks to pick from. Huehnergarth brought back brochures from his last conference. He talked to vendors there that have installed these types of playgrounds and splash pads. Once the Fitness Connection selects a design, they will present it the Parks & Recreation Commission. Depending on cost, we may need to do these enhancements in phases. The all-inclusive park is the first item to accomplish.

It may also be important for vendors to look at the location we plan to place the park. There are so many ideas out there that this may help narrow the search. They are looking for a park for all age levels because Xavier students will play there and they range from Preschool to 6th grade. Next, the Fitness Connection will look into the funding. They will be looking at fundraising, capital campaigns, grants, etc. Any ideas can be forwarded to Goldsmith or Huehnergarth. The group is hoping for construction in the spring.

5. Soccer - Rules & Teams

The City of Manchester reached out to Huehnergarth to see if they could be included in our Senior Soccer League (high school) and possibly a junior high team. The commission would like a roster in advance so that the players will remain the same and they don't keep pulling in their best kids.

Huehnergarth would also like to add a rule that 2 girls on each team need to be on the field at all times or only play 10 players. This would require all girls to get playing time. This rule would apply to grades 5th/6th and 7th/8th. We will revisit this for younger grades after this is tested on the older grades. This will be enforced by referees and coaches.

6. Aquatic Center Updates

Everything is going well so far with the aquatic center. We have 17 lifeguards and 15 facility assistants hired. There is training set up for April 28th for the lifeguards as well as the required meeting for all aquatic center employees. The pumps are working well and they will begin filling up the pool the beginning of May to allow chemicals to balance and use the sun to naturally heat the pool. We still need to keep thinking of ideas to keep the pool exciting and fun without expending a lot of funds.

7. Track Meet Updates

The Community track meet will be held on May 4th. There are currently 35 entrants registered. Huehnergarth will be sending a flyer to all students at Western Dubuque next week. Some of the parents have seen a post by the PE teacher at Western Dubuque to advertise the event. Field events will be from 9 am - 9:40 am. Races will be from 10 am - 11 am. The children need to be there between 8 am and 9 am to register, however, they will be flexible with children that

are in other sports. We still need volunteers to help work this event. Last year we had 5 or 6 volunteers and then the parents also helped. The state meet is in Marshalltown on June 1st.

8. Commission Member Comments

There will be training on Friday, April 19th at 5:30 pm for kids wanting to referee. It's a good idea for junior high children to start refereeing. They can get the experience and then be able to referee games for the other teams that come into town. They children can make good money being a referee.

Batting cage installation is in the process at Commercial Club. It was asked where we are on the protective nets for fans at Commercial Club. No further action has been taken on this idea. Nets would be a very expensive option and Huehnergarth has stated he has tried for grants before with Out Run the Rays with no luck, so he was hesitant to put in the work to try again. Members of the commission have heard several comments on safety from other parents as they are sitting in the stands. It's mostly for balls that are coming from behind that they can't see coming. Ungs suggested putting a shade that comes from the backstop and then goes over the stands. We could possibly try Out Run the Rays or try FarmTek for a donation.

Huehnergarth ask what would be good games times for the Pre-K T-ball. We have 6 Pre-K Tball teams and 4 Kindergarten T-ball teams. They decided good times for games would be: 5:45 pm, 6:30 pm, and 7:15 pm.

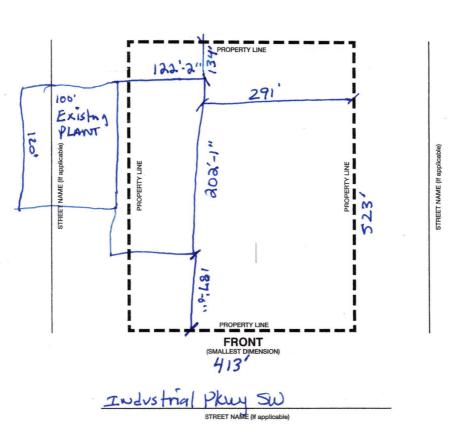

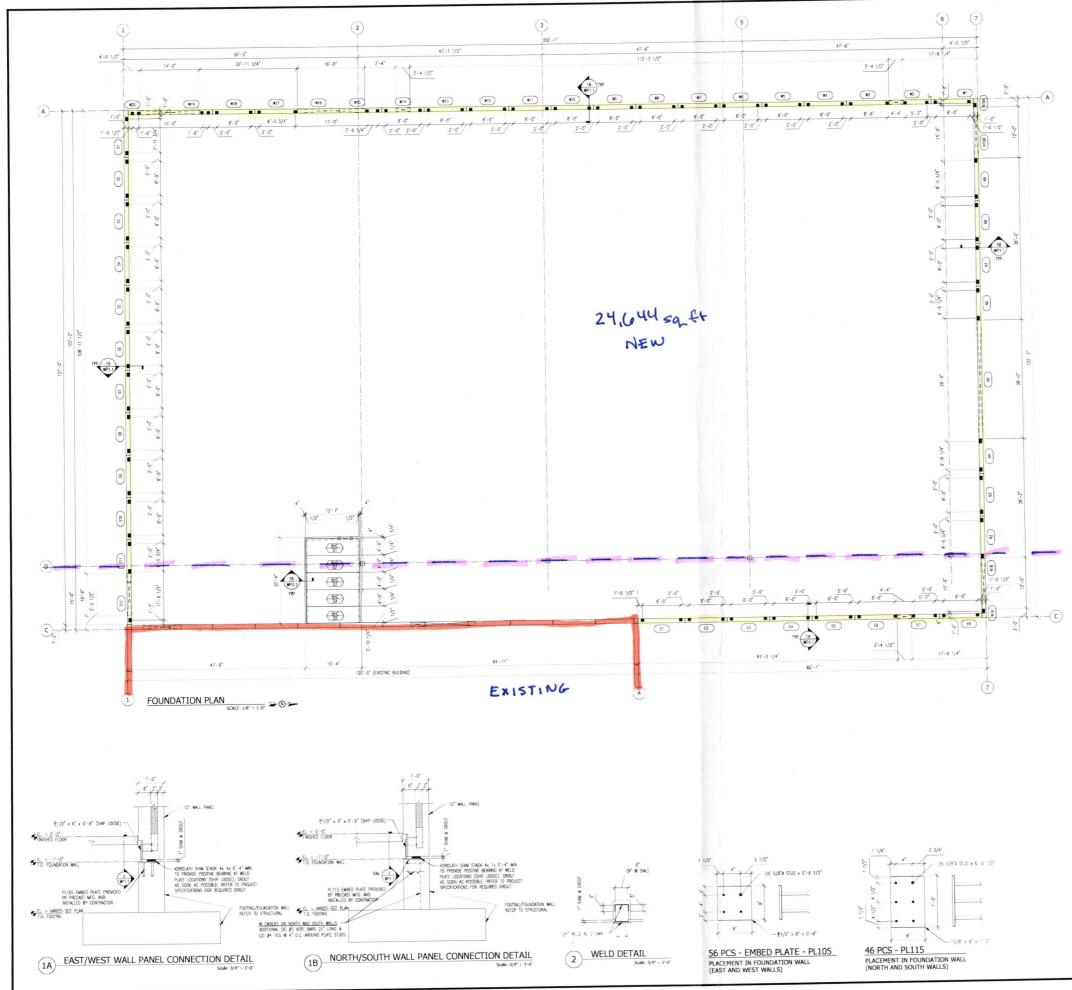


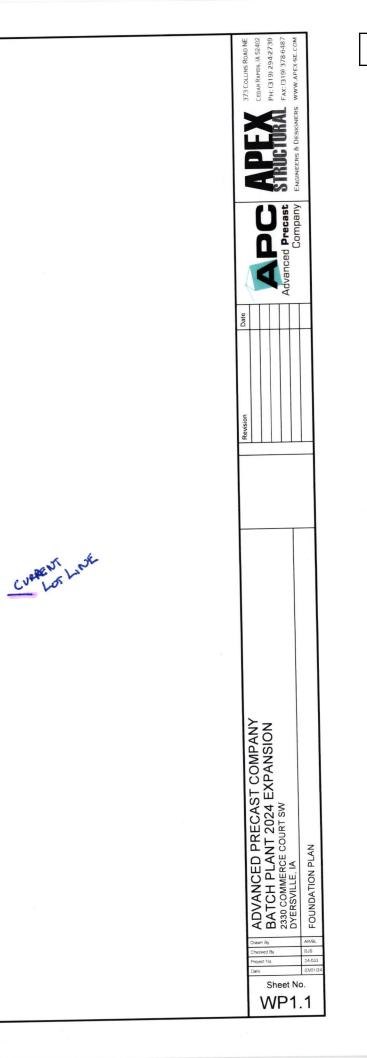

Agreement for Contract Services Between Delaney's Ice Cream and the City of Dyersville

This AGREEMENT was made and entered into this May 7, 2024, by and between DELANEY'S ICE CREAM, FARLEY, IOWA 52046 (hereinafter referred to as the "DELANEY'S"), and the CITY OF DYERSVILLE, IOWA (hereinafter referred to as the "CITY"),

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, the CITY desires to engage the services of the DELANEY'S to furnish ice cream concession stand operations at City-owned parks in Dyersville, Iowa, during City recreational events, and the DELANEY'S has signified its willingness to provide services to the CITY.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto do mutually agree as follows:

A. Scope of Consultant's Services:

The DELANEY'S agrees to perform in a good and professional manner those services described in the scope of work (Attachment A), a copy of which is attached thereto and incorporated in this AGREEMENT.

B. Changes:

The DELANEY'S may, from time to time, require or request changes in the scope of work of the CITY to be performed hereunder. Such changes, including any appropriate increase or decrease in the amount of compensation, which are mutually agreed upon by and between the CITY and the DELANEY'S, shall be incorporated in written amendments to the AGREEMENT.

C. Method of Payment:

The DELANEY'S shall pay funds to the City under the terms of this AGREEMENT, and Attachment A, Scope of Work. The Pricing Matrix shall show the basis for the percentage proposed to be funded back to the City with an agreement of 10% of the annual gross receipts and any additional items not foreseen as costs associated with the operations. The DELANEY'S will submit, on an annual basis, to CITY a record of the date and time each concessions operation was initiated, the dollar amounts grossed, and the time expended during the operation. Payment shall be made in a lump sum to the CITY no later than December 30, 2024.

D. Time of Performance:

The scope of work will begin upon execution of this AGREEMENT by both parties. This AGREEMENT shall expire on November 1, 2024, unless the CITY terminates this AGREEMENT under Section F of this AGREEMENT.

E. Termination:

This AGREEMENT may be terminated by either party upon thirty (30) days' written notice should the other party fail to perform in accordance with its terms through no fault of the party initiating the termination.

This AGREEMENT may be terminated by the CITY without cause upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the DELANEY'S.

F. Equal Employment and Nondiscrimination:

The DELANEY'S agrees not to discriminate by reason of age, race, religion, color, sex, national origin, or handicap unrelated to the duties of a position, of applicants for employment, promotion, demotion or transfer, recruitment, layoff or termination, compensation, selection for training, or participation in recreational and educational activities. In connection with the scope of work under this AGREEMENT, DELANEY'S agrees to comply with the applicable provisions of State and Federal statutes and regulations.

G. Contract Documents:

The contract documents that constitute the entire AGREEMENT between the CITY and the DELANEY'S shall include the following component parts, all of which are attached hereto and shall be deemed to be a part hereof just as set forth in full in this AGREEMENT.

Attachment A—Scope of Work

H. Excusable Delays:

The DELANEY'S shall not be in default by reason of any failure in performance of this AGREEMENT in accordance with its terms (including any failure by the DELANEY'S to make progress in the prosecution of the work hereunder which endangers such performance) if such failure arises out of causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the DELANEY'S. Such causes may include, but are not restricted or limited to, acts of God or of the public enemy, acts of government in either the sovereign or contractual capacity, fires or floods, but in every case, if the failure to perform is beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the DELANEY'S, the DELANEY'S shall not be deemed to be in default.

I. Extra Work:

No extra work will be undertaken without written authorization by the CITY.

J. Validation of Agreement:

The business shall provide primary concessions stand operations and services. The business will respond to service requests for concessions operations unless specified to the City, with a minimum of 24 hour notification. 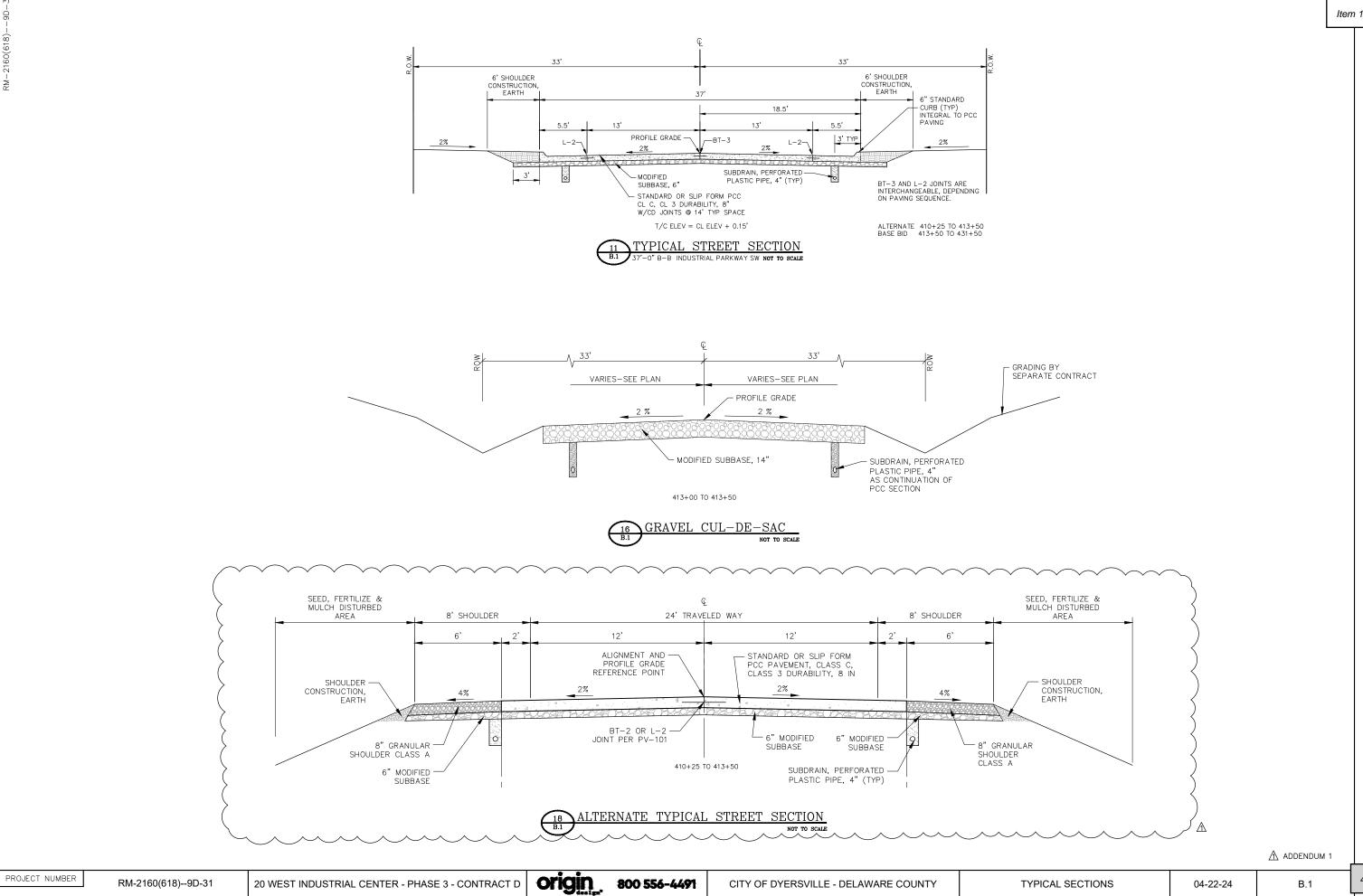

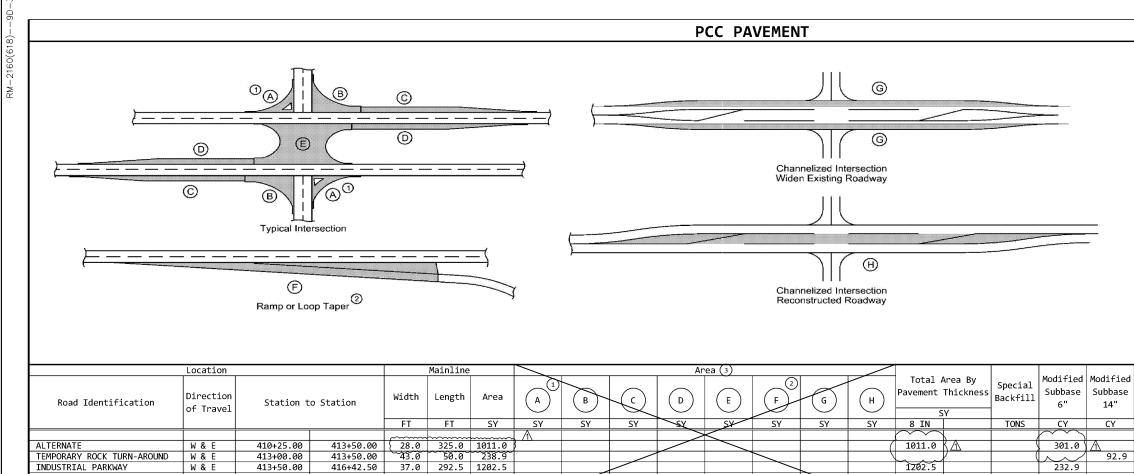

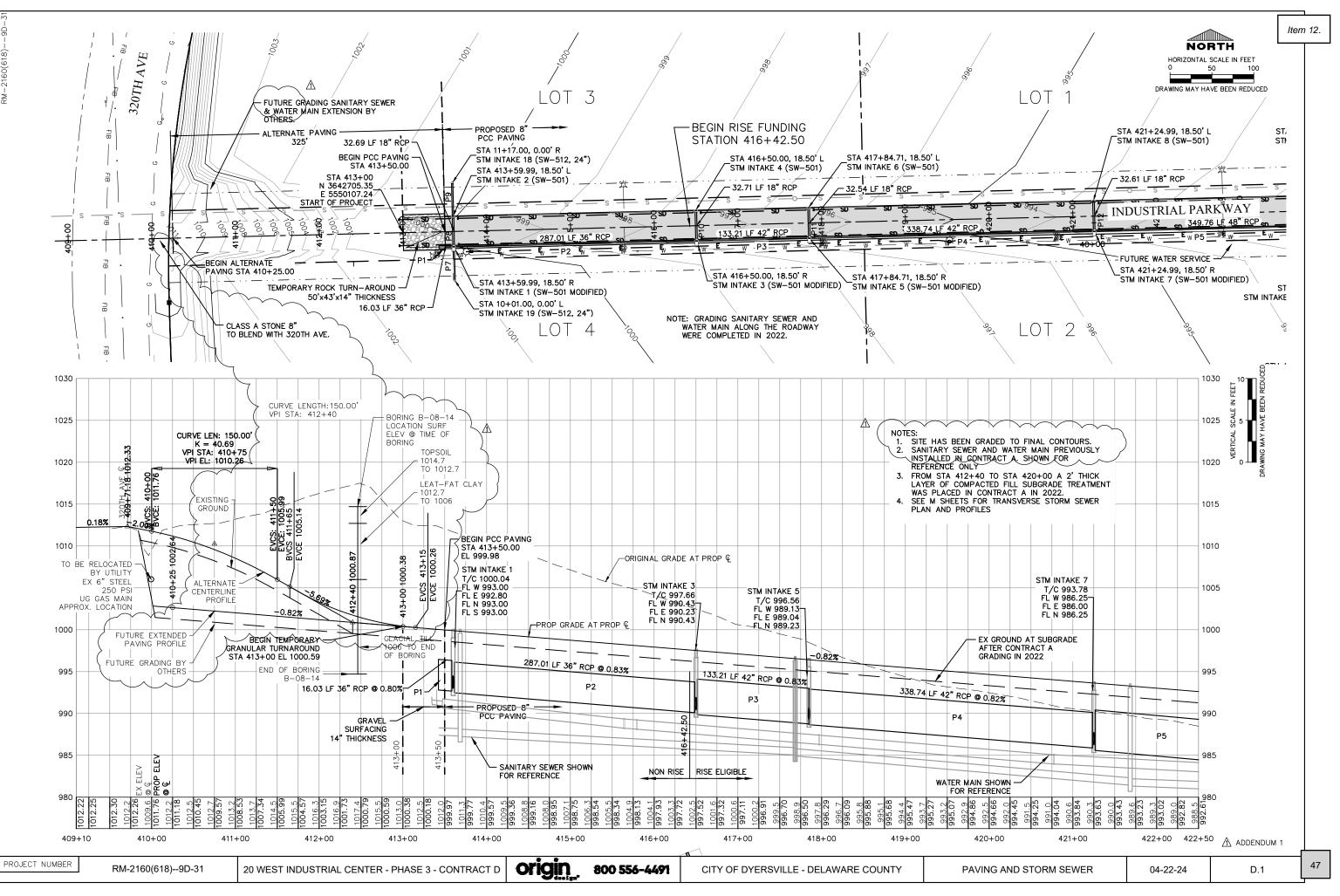

Black Hills Energy Requests Rate Review for System Investments in Iowa

GRIMES, Iowa – May 1, 2024 – Black Hills Energy today submitted a regulatory rate review proposal to the Iowa Utilities Board (IUB) to recover investments made in safety, reliability and system resilience for natural gas service to over 163,000 customers across 133 Iowa communities.

Since the last rate review in 2021, the company has invested approximately \$100 million in its infrastructure to modernize its system by updating and replacing aging pipe, safeguarding meters, and connecting to renewable natural gas projects to advance the sustainable use of the natural gas system. These projects have improved safety and reliability throughout Iowa in compliance with state and federal regulations and the obligation to serve.

"We are proud of our strong legacy of providing safe, reliable and cost-effective service to our Iowa communities," said Kevin Jarosz, vice president of operations for Black Hills Energy. "This winter, we were pleased Iowans saw the lowest natural gas prices we've seen in several years. We are very mindful of the impacts of inflation on our customers, and we are carefully managing our costs. This rate review request reflects the critical investments we've made to maintain system resilience and keep our customers safe and businesses operating through extreme weather events while also supporting economic growth in our Iowa communities."

As proposed, the average residential customer bill would increase by \$7.56 per month based on an average monthly use of 63 therms. The increase for customers will vary, based on rate class, load factors and total usage. The rate review does not affect the cost of the natural gas delivered by Black Hills Energy. The cost of the natural gas commodity is a direct pass-through to customers, meaning there is no mark-up or profit.

Under Iowa law, the company can implement a temporary increase in rates that will remain in effect until the IUB completes its review of the proposal. Black Hills Energy will implement a temporary rate increase of approximately \$2.94 per month based on the average residential customer monthly usage of 63 therms on May 11, 2024. Temporary rate increases are subject to refund, plus interest, after the IUB issues a final decision on the request.

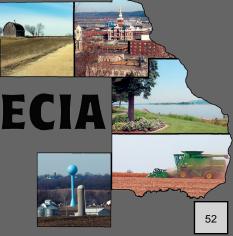

After forming in 1974, ECIA naturally needed a governing board and the following year, representatives from Cedar, Clinton, Delaware, Dubuque, and Jackson counties were appointed.

ECIA Designated By EDA

The five-county ECIA area has become eligible for increased Federal financial assistance to plan and carry out programs aimed at creating jobs and stimulating coordinated economic growth, according to an October 6th press release by Robert T. Hall, Assistant Secretary of Commerce for Economic Crevelopment. The announcement states that the alot the EDA district program is to accurace

al of the EDA district program is to encourage adjacent counties to work together in a joint effort to overcome regional problems blocking economic growth.

Designation of the East Central Iowa Economic Development District makes each Economic Development District makes each member city and county eligible for bonuses of 10 percent above what they would normally receive in EDA grants for public facilities essential to long range industrial and com-mercial growth. In addition to public works grants, the EDA program includes loans and loan guarantees to encourage private enterprise to expand and create lobe and planning create to expand and create jobs, and planning grants and technical assistance to help solve problems blocking growth. The program thus aims to create jobs through the development of local resources

ECIA Executive Director, Karl Biasi, stated that he wished to thank all those local officials who assisted since the designation application was submitted in April, 1977. He further noted that ECIA has assisted the City of Dyersville in securing an EDA grant for a water project in their industrial park, and is currently working

with several other member governments on ustrial and commercial public facilities programs

In the future, ECIA will apply for EDA planning funds to continue designation. Regional officials in Denver have indicated that ECIA's first report will be required in June, 1979.

RTA Helps Multicultural Family Center

Contracting with East Central Intergovernmental Association (ECIA) for management services and office space, RTA staff manage a fleet of 30 light duty buses and accessible minivans, all equipped to accommodate the public, including children, elderly, and people with disabilities. The non-profit transit service provides 100,000 annual passenger trips serving over 2,500 individuals in the three-county region.

The RTA's services are based on the demand of their clients. Recently, the RTA partnered with the Multicultural Family Center to take their clients to the University of Dubuque. Bailey Galle, AmeriCorps Academic Advocate, Multicultural Family Center City of Dubuque AmeriCorps Program had this to say about the partnership, "We are loving being able to use RTA. Having access to transportation has opened a lot of doors in what we can provide for the youth we serve, and we are so excited to go on more field trips in the future.

So far, we have been able to go to a Fighting Saints hockey game and to the University of Dubuque Heritage Center to watch a Black violinist perform. Both field trips were firsts for so many of our teens and we are so happy that we can offer these experiences for free because of valuable partnerships like this. Our drivers are always so nice, and Stacie Scott is so great to work with. I cannot say enough positive things about this service!"

CSEI Awarded HUD's FY23 CoC Grant

Community Solutions of Eastern Iowa (CSEI) was chosen to receive the Continuum of Care Competition (CoC) Homeless Assistance Grant renewal funding for their Rapid Rehousing (RRH) program. CSEI will receive \$254,556 over a 12-month period to build on the program they started in 2022.

CoC grant funding supports a broad array of interventions designed to assist individuals and families experiencing homelessness, particularly those living in places not meant for habitation, located in sheltering programs, or at imminent risk of becoming homeless.

Jennifer Walker, Director of Special Programs ECIA/CSEI said, "This funding has been critical for people in our area experiencing homelessness. The need for housing assistance continues to outpace the funding CSEI has, so we are glad to be able to renew this grant. We are seeing some really good outcomes for the families we can get into affordable housing and provide them with case management assistance. The two services go hand-in-hand in this grant, and that makes a big difference."

Finance 101 & FY25 Budget Trainings, and More!

Its budget time, so ECIA offered four training sessions providing an overview of city government financing and budgeting. Partially funded by U.S. Department of Agriculture's Rural Community Development Initiative (USDA RCDI), ECIA partnered with Iowa League of Cities' Teresa Rotschafer who addressed the state-imposed limitations on property taxes, the impacts of inflation, and the difficult choices cities are facing. She provided suggestions for balancing the city budget in 2024 and discussed ways to cut services, reduce costs, or enhance city revenues.

Three in-person training sessions were held across the ECIA region and one virtual training, with over 48 participants. 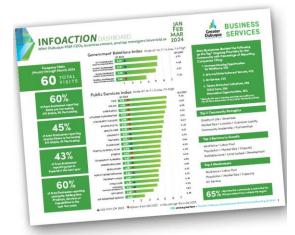

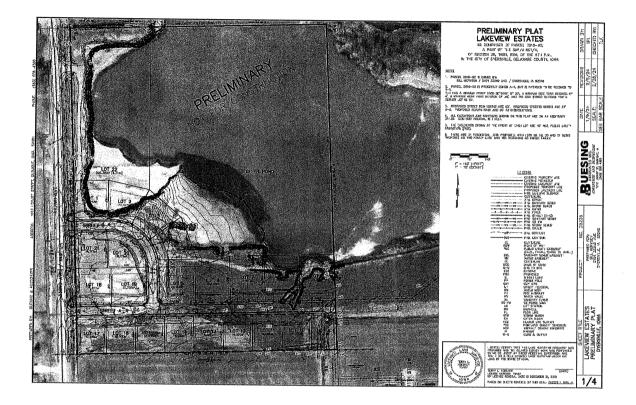

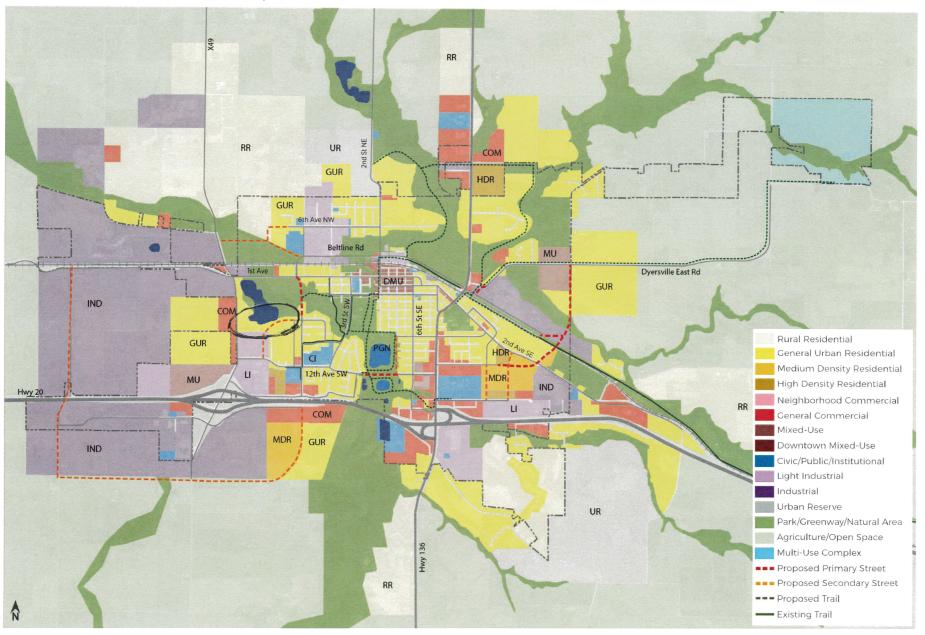
EXHIBIT B MAP OF THE PROPERTY

WHEREAS, on DATE, the Iowa Economic Development Authority ("Authority"), 1963 Bell Avenue, Suite 200, Des Moines, Iowa 50315, and recipient name ("Subrecipient") recipient address entered into that certain Grant Agreement Number 23-XXX-XX ("Grant Agreement") setting out the terms and conditions for the Downtown Housing Grant ("Grant") for Subrecipient's Project; and

WHEREAS, the IEDA and Subrecipient wish to amend the Grant Agreement to address federal requirements for the source of funds for the Grant Agreement and provide other clarifications,

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties amend the Grant Agreement as follows:

<u>New article 5.17: CONSISTENT PURPOSE.</u> Subrecipient will monitor compliance with 2 C.F.R. 200.310 through 316, which require that property, supplies, and equipment purchased with the Grant must continue to be used consistent with the purpose for which it was purchased or improved or be subject to disposition procedures specified therein and will notify IEDA of changes to the use of the Project. In furtherance of this obligation, Subrecipient will ensure each of the following through December 31, 2031:

5.17.1 That the Project has been continuously occupied as a permanent residence, except for reasonable periods required to fill a vacancy between occupants as determined by the Subrecipient:

5.17.2 That the Project has not been used as a short-term rental of fewer than six months in duration or used as other commercial property;

5.17.3 That the Subrecipient has effective covenants and restrictions in place for the Project property to ensure compliance.

Except as otherwise revised above, the terms, provisions, and conditions of the Grant Agreement executed by IEDA and Subrecipient on DATE remain unchanged and are in full force and effect:

AGREEMENT FOR COVENANTS AND RESTRICTIONS (DOWNTOWN HOUSING GRANT PROGRAM)

THIS AGREEMENT FOR COVENANTS AND RESTRICTIONS ("Agreement"), effective as of May 7, 2024 is between City of Dyersville, Iowa, (the "City"), and Penn House LLC (the "Owner").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City received Downtown Housing Grant Program ('Program") funds from the Iowa Economic Development Authority ("IEDA"); and

WHEREAS, the City utilized the Program funds received from IEDA to assist Owner with its project to be located on the real estate described in **Exhibit A** hereto (the "Property") as identified in the Program Agreement Number 22-ARPDH-019; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Program contract executed by the City and IEDA dated July 5, 2022 ("the Contract") the Owner is required to develop a housing unit or housing units, and is further required to comply with the requirements and covenants set forth therein; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 2 C.F.R. 200.310-316, property, supplies, and equipment purchased with Grant Funds, must continue to be used consistent with the purpose for which it was purchased or improved or be subject to disposition procedures specified therein; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and for other valuable consideration the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. DEFINITIONS. As used in this Agreement, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings unless the context otherwise requires:

"Housing Units" means those units contained on the Property that are occupied as permanent residences.

"Downtown Housing Grant Program" or "Program" means the grant program administered by IEDA to provide financial assistance for projects that support local downtown revitalization through new and renovated housing opportunities in communities under 30,000.

"IEDA" means the Iowa Economic Development Authority.

2. As a condition to receipt of Program Funds, and in order to help ensure compliance by the Owner and any future owner of the Project with the requirements and covenants set forth in the Contract and Development Agreement throughout the required period of time ("Enforcement Period") as set forth in the Contract and Development Agreement thereto, so as to maintain the housing units for which assistance has been provided through the Program and therefore protect the investment of the City and IEDA in the Project, and in order to give the City and IEDA the ability to fulfill its obligations under the Program to ensure such compliance, certain covenants and restrictions enforceable by the City must be placed on the real estate described in **Exhibit A** hereto governing the use of the Project, which covenants and restrictions shall run with the land and be binding on the Owner and its successors or assigns. The Owner, for itself and for its successors or assigns, makes the following covenants as to the use of the Project and the real estate described in **Exhibit A**:

(a) All of the Program Funds shall be spent on Eligible Costs of the Project described in the Contract, in accordance with the Project described in Exhibit A to the Contract;

(b) The Project shall be completed so as to provide the project benefits as required by and specified in the regulations and as referenced in the Contract;

(c) The Project shall constitute an eligible activity in compliance with the Program as described in the Contract, and the Owner shall comply with all of the Program requirements and shall own, operate and manage the Project as an eligible project **throughout the Enforcement Period ending effective December 31, 2031**;

(d) Throughout the Enforcement Period, the Project shall be continuously occupied as a permanent residence, except for reasonable periods required to fill a vacancy between occupants as determined by the city, and shall not be used as a short-term rental of fewer than six months in duration or used as other commercial property;

(e) Throughout the Enforcement Period, the Owner shall allow inspections of the Project to ensure continued compliance with all locally adopted and enforced building codes and standards, or, in the absence of any locally adopted and enforced building codes and standards, the requirements of the current Iowa State Building Code;

(f) Throughout the Enforcement Period, the City and Owner shall comply with all laws, guidance, rules and regulations applicable to the Program and Grant Funds, including but not limited to the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Pub. L. No. 117-2 (March 11, 2021), specifically Subtitle M – Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds, Section 9901 of the Act ("SLFRF"); Section 602(c) of the Social Security Act; all rules and regulations applicable to SLFRF, including but not limited to 2 CFR 200 and all appendices thereto, the Final Rules, and all rules and regulations described in U.S. Department of the Treasury Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Fund Award Terms and Conditions attached hereto as Exhibit B; and all applicable Treasury or other federal guidance.

(g) In order to ensure compliance with the covenants in subparagraphs (d), (e), and (f) above, Owner shall submit to the City its annual certification of compliance with such covenant, together with documentation in form and substance satisfactory to the City evidencing compliance with such covenant; and

(h) The Owner shall comply with all the covenants set forth in the Development Agreement.

3. All the covenants herein shall run with the real estate described in **Exhibit A** hereto and the Project thereon and be binding upon the Owner and its successors or assigns for the Enforcement Period. To ensure compliance with the requirements of the Program, this Agreement shall not be terminated before December 31, 2031.

4. Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 3, such covenants shall cease to apply to the Project prior to the end of the Enforcement Period in the event of involuntary noncompliance therewith caused by a fire, seizure, requisition, foreclosure, transfer of title by deed in lieu of foreclosure, change in a federal law or action of a federal agency after the date of making of the Loan which prevents the City or its successors or assigns from enforcing the covenants, or condemnation or similar event, but only if, within a reasonable period, amounts received by the Grantor as a consequence of such event are used to provide a project which meets the requirements of the Program.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 4, if once the Project has been subject to foreclosure, transfer of title by deed in lieu of foreclosure or similar event, and at any time during the part of the Enforcement Period subsequent to such event, the Grantor or a related person to the Grantor obtains an ownership interest in the Project for tax purposes, the covenants herein shall once again run with the land described in Attachment A hereto and the Project thereon and be binding on the Grantor or such related person and their respective successors or assigns for the remainder of the Enforcement Period.

5. The Owner shall cause this Agreement and all amendments and supplements hereto to be recorded and filed in such manner and in such places as the City may reasonably request, and shall pay all fees and charges incurred in connection therewith.

6. This Agreement may be amended only by an amendment in writing executed by the parties hereto and properly recorded in the County Recorder's office.

7. Except for the rental of units in the Project to tenants, the Owner hereby covenants and agrees not to sell, transfer or otherwise dispose of the Project or any interest therein without obtaining the prior written consent of the City, which shall be conditioned solely upon receipt of evidence satisfactory to the City that the Owner's purchaser or transferee (i) has assumed in writing and in full the Owner's duties and obligations under this Agreement and all related documents thereto; (ii) has the financial capability to carry out such obligations; and (iii) is knowledgeable in the operation and management of facilities similar to the Project facilities. It is hereby expressly stipulated and agreed that any sale, transfer or other disposition of the Project in violation of this paragraph may be ineffective to relieve the Owner of its obligations under this Agreement and all related documents thereto.

8. If the Owner defaults in the performance or observance of any covenant, agreement or obligation of the Owner set forth in this Agreement, and if such default remains uncured for a period of 20 Business Days, provided, however, that if a non-monetary default cannot reasonably be cured within 20 Business Days and the Owner commences a cure within 20 Business Days and proceeds in good faith to effect such cure thereafter, the cure period with respect to such breach or default shall be extended for up to an additional 30 Business Days, then the City may declare that the Owner is in default hereunder and may take any one or more of the following steps, at its option:

(a) temporarily suspend making disbursements of Program Funds under this Agreement pending correction of the deficiency or default by the Owner;

- (b) require the immediate repayment of the Program Funds;
- (c) declare the Owner and its principals "not in good standing" with respect to the City;
- (d) cease making any further payments of Program Funds under this Agreement;
- (e) terminate this Agreement;

- (j) exercise any rights it may have under the Contract or Development Agreement; and
- (k) exercise any other rights and remedies that may be available under law or in equity.

No delay in enforcing the provisions hereof as to any breach or violation shall impair, damage, or waive the right of the City to enforce the same or to obtain relief against or recover for the continuation or repetition of such breach or violation or any similar breach or violation thereof at any later time or times.

9. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Iowa.

10. Any notice required to be given hereunder shall be given by registered or certified mail at the addresses specified below or at such other addresses as may be specified in writing by the parties hereto:

The Iowa Economic Development Authority awarded a Downtown Housing Grant that is providing support for a project in your community. Under the program, you, the city, are the grantee. It is not a grant to a developer or property owner.

Under the terms of the grant, the city is **reimbursed** for costs incurred by the city. Costs are not reimbursable until the city has incurred and paid or at least authorized payment of the costs. If the city is paying vendors directly, the city must submit to IEDA proof of payment or authorization of payment. If the city has a contract with a developer that is paying vendors, the city must reimburse the developer for those costs or authorize payment to the developer and submit to IEDA proof of payment or proof that the city has authorized payment. IEDA cannot disburse funds unless costs have been incurred and the city has paid the costs or at least authorized payment of the costs.

Acceptable proof of authorization to pay costs would include council minutes approving and authorizing payment to the developer or the vendor of an amount specified in the minutes. Proof of payment would include a copy of the cleared check issued by the city to the developer or the vendor.

If it is the city's preference to delay authorizing payment of costs until RSM has confirmed that the costs are eligible for reimbursement, please be aware that disbursement of funds to the city to reimburse it for those costs will also be delayed. The length of the delay will be dependent upon the city's internal procedures for approving payment requests (board or council approval, etc.) and how promptly the city submits proof of payment or proof of authorization of payment in support of the request for disbursement.

If you have a request for reimbursement pending, please be aware that IEDA cannot issue payment to reimburse the city until these requirements have been met. If you submitted a request for the first draw and IEDA has issued payment to you to reimburse you for those costs, IEDA will not issue the final draw until the requirements set out in this email have been met. In accordance with owner instructions, bids for the City of Dyersville-Delaware County RM-2160(618)--9D-31 20 West Industrial Center, Phase 3 Contract D Storm Sewer, Paving and Lighting project were opened and read at 1:00 PM on May 1, 2024. Eight (8) bids were received for this project. The as-read bid results were as follows:

The Contract Documents for bidding the project states "Award of contract will be based on the lowest responsive responsible base bid received. Alternate 1 will be awarded (or declined) to the lowest responsive responsible base bidder, deemed to be in the best interests of the City."

After reviewing the bids, it was determined the low bid was submitted by Dave Schmitt Construction Co., Inc. of Cedar Rapids, Iowa, in the amount of \$885,552.83 for the Base Bid and \$72,991.20 for Alternate 1.

Dave Schmitt Construction Co., Inc. has been in operation since 1964, and has experience working on water main, sanitary and storm sewer projects. They are pre-qualified through the lowa Department of Transportation for underground and minor paving work. To date, Origin Design has not worked with Dave Schmitt Construction Co., Inc. on a project.

Subject: Repairs to 3rd Avenue Bridge

Dear Honorable Mayor Jacque and Council Members:

I am writing to bring to your attention the current state of the 3rd Avenue Bridge and recommend a course of action to address its immediate needs.

As you may know, the 3rd Avenue Bridge is a vital transportation link for the city, connecting the east and west sides of the river. However, the bridge is showing signs of deterioration due to exposure to weather, traffic, and road salt. Recently, some concrete and rebar became exposed on the south side of the bridge.

To address this issue, city staff proposes that the city council approve minor repair work, which involves removing the exposed rebar and concrete, improving the drainage system, and patching the concrete around the drains and the edge of the bridge. The repair work is estimated to cost \$25,400.

We believe that the repair work will extend the life of the bridge and improve its safety and appearance. However, it is important to note that this repair work will not address the bridge's long-term structural issues, which will require a major rehabilitation or replacement in the future.

Therefore, we also recommend that the council start planning for the bridge's future, consider rehabilitation or replacement options, and identify potential funding sources.

Summary of Intent, Inspection Procedures, and Limits

- Origin Design was contacted by the City of Dyersville Public Works Department to render our opinion as to the feasibility of repairing the 3rd Avenue SW bridge over the North Fork of the Maquoketa River. This report is intended to summarize our observations and recommendations.
- Our observations have been limited to readily available surface conditions. No destructive or invasive testing procedures, load rating, or detailed measurements have been performed as part of this inspection. Isolated acoustical sounding of concrete was performed. Origin Design reserves the right to revise our opinions if additional evidence becomes available.

Summary of Structural Conditions

- Numerous areas of loose and delaminated concrete were observed on the underside of deck, largely
 concentrated near the deck drains and outermost edges of the deck. There is also evidence that the
 previously patched areas on the underside of the bridge have delaminated from the underside of the slab.
- The concrete slab shows widespread signs of cracking and efflorescence on the underside of the slab. This is indicative of a high concentration of chlorides within the slab which accelerate the corrosion of reinforcing.
- The timber abutment backwall piles are pressure treated with creosote which only penetrated the outermost 2–3 inches of the pile. This results in the piles decaying from the inside out and these piles are starting to sound hollow when sounded which indicates the initial signs of section loss.
- The structure is in generally fair to poor condition and the rate of deterioration will likely accelerate in subsequent years. While there are no signs of immediate structural instabilities that would require immediate closure, a replacement plan for the structure should be developed.

Summary of Recommendations

- The areas of loose, overhead concrete pose a falling debris hazard which should be mitigated through selective demolition or through the installation of exclusionary fencing to prevent public access to the underside of the bridge.
- The general condition of the structure is not well suited for repair. The timber abutment piles are showing signs of decay and repair of these elements is not generally cost effective. Additionally, the high concentration of chlorides in the deck would ultimately reduce the longevity of any repair work done to the bridge. It is my opinion that repairing the structure would not be cost effective due to the high cost of these repairs and the potentially short longevity thereof. As a result, the bridge should be scheduled for replacement within the next 5-10 years.
- This bridge currently does not qualify for the City Bridge Funds Program as the bridge only scored 6 Priority Points: Sufficiency Rating (71.9 2 Points), ADT (1,810 4 Points), Detour Route (0.2 Miles 0 Points), and Bridge Posting (Not Posted for Load 0 Points). Each category is worth a maximum of 10 points. Funding was last awarded for bridges with at least 20 Priority Points. While the Sufficiency Rating for the bridge will continue to decrease during subsequent inspection cycles, it is unlikely that the bridge will qualify for this program without a reduction in the weight limit posting, which may be required as the structure continues to deteriorate.

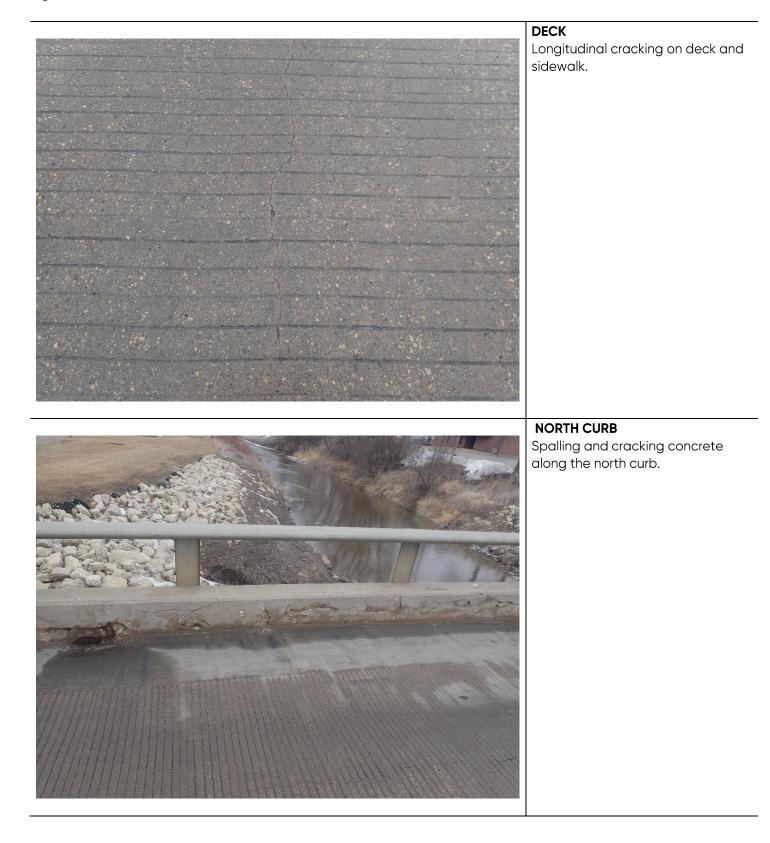
