REQUEST: For Town Council to Approve 2023 Zora Festival Agreement

<u>SUMMARY</u>: P.E.C. in partnership with the Historic Town of Eatonville entails ensuring that the Town is an internationally recognized cultural heritage tourism destination for the arts and culture from throughout the African Diaspora, with special emphasis on the multi-disciplines as represented in the life and work of Zora Neale Hurston. The Town Council of the Town of Eatonville wishes to support all efforts that seek to draw visitors to this community.

The Historic Town of Eatonville Town Council assigns to P.E.C., the exclusive right to present the Outdoor Festival of the Arts for the 34th Annual ZORA! Festival, January 27 – 29, 2023. The terms and conditions are outlined in the 2023 Zora Festival Agreement

Council met Tuesday, January 17, 2023 in consideration of approval the agreement. The motion to approve did not pass. To ensure that the agreement meets all expectations of Council and has been vetted by the Town's Attorney, a special meeting was established to resolve matters pertaining to the current Agreement.

- <u>To allow</u> P.E.C. is <u>permitted</u> to use the Town Hall Parking Lot on Saturday and Sunday for Public Service/Community Space Booths such as the Blood Bank, Orange County Fire & Rescue, et al;

IN EXCHANGE FOR THE EXCLUSIVE PRIVILEGES IDENTIFIED ABOVE, P.E.C, AGREES TO:

- Full Compliance with Town Code: P.E.C. shall fully comply with all requirements of the Town's Code of Ordinances, and specifically with Article II, Division 2, Sec. 12-48, and Sec. 12-50 52.
- Free entry dates: _Friday, January 27 _ through_ Sunday, January 29_30, 2023: _To allow free entry to the ZORA!® Outdoor Festival of the Arts, to all Eatonville Residents residents who provide authorized proof of residency (Driver's License or Official Florida Identification) within the Town of Eatonville to the company managing the admission gates.
- gate admissions. Eatonville <u>residents</u> (adults & children) who <u>wantWish</u> to sit in the reserved/V.I.P section of the Main Stage on Saturday, January 28 and Sunday, January 29, 2023, <u>will have temust</u> pay the <u>requiredestablished</u> ticket price.
- Pay \$12,280.00 to the Town of Eatonville for public safety services no later than (police and fire/rescue) on or before January 20, 2023, a cashier's by certified cashier's check in the amount of \$12,280.00. There will be a reconciliation of public safety hours worked after the event and if a credit is due to PECP.E.C. (based on the applicable billable rates for public safety employees as quoted in Composite Exhibit "B") then the Town will issue a refund within 30 days after the event reconciliation.  - 4. Traffic congestion

- P.E.C. and the Town's Police Department will follow the Orange County-approved MOT, which will be implemented by Flash-rite. The Flash-rite will be contracted directly by P.E.C., and the Town shall have no responsibility for directing, supervising or controlling Flash-rite or its personnel in the performance of its contractual obligations to P.E.C. P.E.C. must provide the Eatonville Police Department will have received with all appropriate documentations documentation regarding the MOT and Flash-rite no later than January 20, 2023. Failure to timely provide this documentation to the satisfaction of the Eatonville Police Department is grounds for the Town's termination of this Agreement and cancelation of the Festival.
- The areas to be designated as "NO PARKING" or "TOW AWAY" zones ("Non-Parking Areas") shall be determined by the Town's Police Department and the Town's Police Department shall direct P.E.C. as to where these the appropriate signs should for such areas must be placed since it. It is P.E.C.'s responsibility to properly place them the signs.

P.E.C. shall provide a true copy of the certificate of insurance to the Town Clerk's Clerk's Office no later than January 23, 2023, which is the Monday prior to the first day of the Outdoor Festival of the Arts, Friday, January 20, 2023. 27, 2023. Failure to timely provide this proof of insurance coverage protecting the Town is grounds for the Town's termination of this Agreement and cancelation of the Festival.
- This Agreement cannot be revised, amended, or modified without the written, mutual consent of the parties hereto.
- In the event any term or terms or condition or conditions of this Agreement are ruled illegal or unconstitutional, the Parties agree that those terms and is conditions may be severed from this Agreement, the severed portion or portions shall not invalidate and that the remaining terms and conditions of this Agreement shall remain enforceable between the Parties.



Re: Zora 2023

I would like to begin by addressing the questions that were asked in prior emails.

- 1. The proposal reflects the need for coverage based on not just attendance but on overall safety. Although projected numbers play a factor, on the days where there will be ticket booths collecting money, artist that will be performing and other key locations that will need a dedicated officer, apart from the officers that will be walking the festival grounds.
- 2. Policy is that it be 1 officer for every 100 people. It is also mandatory that law enforcement be present when alcohol is being served or sold. This is also dependent upon the location of the event and type of event. In certain circumstances the owner of the venue may require more law enforcement coverage to better ensure the safety of the attendees.
- 3. The evaluation that will be conducted to determine the need to minimize the number of officers that will be present at the festival will be determined by the acting Chief of the Eatonville Police Department in conjunction with the City manager Mr. Randy Singh, Vivian Geary (Zora representative) and myself. This will be done with the safety of festival participants and attendees in mind first and foremost. Crowd size will be a consideration along with any other information received that can compromise the safe execution of the events of the day.
- 4. All officers will be required to be in attendance and minimizing the numbers as needed. It is easier to send officers home as opposed to calling them in or having them on standby. All efforts will be made to be budget conscious with in reason without compromising safety.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

- 5. Overnights were quoted with 3 officers due to a stage who will have its own dedicate security and taking into consideration, officers will need a restroom break and having 1 officer to watch over the whole enclosed space leaves room for something to happen.
- 6. The use of outside agencies is also needed due to the Eatonville Police Department being low on number of officers from years past. There are locations that need a dedicated officer and currently there aren't enough of my officers to effectively cover the festival safely. The use of outside agencies also requires abiding by there policy and procedure and their manner of hiring their officers off duty, to include their hourly wage.

Overall objective is to have everyone on the same page and have a safe festival, as we have always accomplished. This is a team effort and all decisions made will be conducted in the same fashion.

Temporary Traffic Control (TTC) Requirements

- 1. Temporary Traffic Control must meet or exceed current FDOT TTC/MOT 102-600 standard plans, Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines and MUTCD specifications.
- 2. Police officer(s), light towers and County Inspectors are required for night operations requiring lane or road closures.
- 3. Plastic drums must be used for night operations.
- 4. TTC plans including detours or barrier wall must be signed and sealed by a licensed engineer experienced in TTC design. Individual must also have advanced FDOT MOT certification.
- 5. Regulatory speed limits may be reduced by 10mph provided treatment is approved Orange County Traffic Engineering.
- 6. Orange County may modify lane/sidewalk closure restrictions at any time based on traffic volumes, traffic delays, safety concerns and/or citizen complaints.
- 7. Work requiring a Right of Way permit must be scheduled with Development Engineering regardless of MOT approval
- 8. Lane closures are prohibited in inclement weather or on County observed holidays and holiday weekends.
- 9. Local emergency services, transportation services and schools must be notified via email about road closures and detours 1 week in advance. MOTSubmittal@ocfl.net must be copied on notification email.
- 10. Lane closures are not permitted 30 minutes before school starts and 30 minutes after dismissal. The contractor is responsible for obtaining local schools bell schedules.
- 11. Barrier wall is required for open cuts in travel lanes that will not be restored the same day or for open cuts 4' deep or greater within 2ft of open traffic lane.
- 12. Company personnel must be onsite at all times if above ground hazards and/or drop-off conditions are present if appropriate treatments are not in place.
- 13. (PCMS) Portable Changeable (variable) Message Signs are required for lane closures lasting more than 2 days on collector roads, arterial roads & highways. PCMS must be placed 10 days in advance to notify the public about construction start dates. Once the projects starts the message must be modified to reflect current roadway conditions. Additional PCMS may be required based on the complexity of the TTC plan. PCM placement and messages shall be field verified by certified FDOT MOT project supervisor.
- 14. Radar Speed Display Units (RSDU) are required for work on high traffic volumes roadways with a speed limit of 45mph or greater. Orange County reserves the right to add Radar Speed Display Units at any time to improve safety.

- 15. Lane/sidewalk closure dates within 2 miles of the Convention Center must be approved by Krista Barber. Coordinate schedule with Krista via email at Krista.Barber@occc.net and also copy to MOTSubmittal@ocfl.net. Lane/sidewalk closures are prohibited when the Convention Center is hosting large events. This permit is not valid without written authorization from a Convention Center representative.
- 16. Only FDOT certified flaggers are permitted on Orange County projects. Flaggers must have FDOT certified card visible at all times during flagging operations.
- 17. The contractor is responsible for coordinating with adjacent projects and resolving conflicting construction activities/schedules.
- 18. FDOT MOT certified person (Worksite Traffic Supervisor) requirements
 - The certificate for the actual FDOT certified MOT person onsite daily must be submitted.


