

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### LIBRARY DIRECTOR'S REPORT

- **1. Leadership Advancement:** November marked a significant milestone for our team with Dan Wood's promotion to Assistant Library Director, effective December 1, 2023. Dan's dedication and innovative leadership have been instrumental in shaping our library's services and community engagement. His promotion is a testament to his hard work and the positive impact he has had on our library.
- **2. Expanding Educational Outreach:** In our ongoing commitment to education and community service, we are thrilled to announce the addition of a new part-time Literacy Associate position, focusing primarily on ESL (English as a Second Language) instruction. This role, entirely supported by grant funding, signifies our dedication to addressing the diverse educational needs of our community and fostering inclusivity through language learning.
- **3. Enhancing Outdoor Exploration:** In an exciting development, the Library has applied for the California State Libraries' "Parks Explorer" initiative. This program would enable us to offer "Parks Explorer" backpacks, equipped with binoculars, a compass, and wildlife guides, to encourage outdoor exploration and learning among our patrons. This initiative aligns with our goal to expand learning beyond traditional formats and promote an appreciation for nature and the environment.
- **4. Revitalizing Library Spaces:** Aesthetic enhancements began this month to invigorate and enliven the library's physical spaces. Key focus areas include the "New Books" and "DVD" sections near the entrance, where staff are introducing new themed displays. These changes aim to create a more welcoming and engaging atmosphere for our patrons, enriching their experience and encouraging exploration of our diverse collections.

**Looking Ahead:** As we move into the final month of the year, these developments reflect our ongoing commitment to serve and inspire our community. The Escondido Public Library continues to evolve, embracing new opportunities and challenges with the aim of enriching the lives of all who walk through our doors.

### ADULT SERVICES & PIONEER ROOM HIGHLIGHTS

- The "Healthy You Series: Meditation and Mindfulness" event was held on Wednesday, November 1. This session, which attracted 15 attendees, offered a wonderful opportunity for individuals to delve into the practices of meditation and mindfulness. It served as an ideal platform for those seeking to explore these methods for enhancing personal well-being.
- On Saturday, November 11, the "2nd Saturday Concert Series" featured "Opera a la Carte." This event, which drew an audience of 91, was well-received. Attendees expressed their gratitude for making opera



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accessible and enjoyed the explanations of the songs. The series, known for its mix of genres, had been appreciated for maintaining this variety over the years.

- The "Cultural Fair Series" showcased "Afghan Culture and Art" on Saturday, November 18, 2023. With 64 attendees, this event highlighted the importance of cultural education and aimed to enhance cultural competency across various professions. The attendees' comments reflected a strong desire for the continuation and expansion of such educational initiatives to foster greater cultural understanding and appreciation.
- The Pioneer Room served 23 patrons and launched two new collections on CONTENTdm in November, including the EUSD Nutrition Services Collection of crowd-pleasing recipes. With over 100 site views, the launch has been a huge success! Get a taste for the collection with these Home-Made Brownies and Chili Rice Salad recipes.

### YOUTH SERVICES HIGHLIGHTS

• The In-N-Out Cover to Cover Book Club concluded on Saturday, November 18, with an impressive turnout of **380 participants**. We distributed **593 coupons**, each redeemable for a complimentary hamburger or cheeseburger at In-N-Out. The program encourages children aged 4 to 12 to read five books, and in return, they receive a gift card for a free hamburger or cheeseburger. This initiative has been a staple for



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us over the years, serving as an excellent means to sustain the reading momentum beyond the conclusion of our summer reading program.

• Our **Inclusive Art Club**, held on November 17, saw a fantastic attendance of **26 individuals**. The event centered around the theme of Thanksgiving and is part of our twice-monthly series catering to all ages and abilities. Focused on sensory learning and art, attendees engaged in a story session, enjoyed songs, and had the opportunity to craft their own turkeys using a vibrant array of feathers and pastels.
