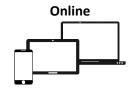

### **PREVIOUS ACTION**

On December 14, 2022, the City Council voted 3-1 (Martinez – No) to conduct an application/interview process in order to appoint a new City Council District 3 representative.

On January 25, 2023, the City Council interviewed 10 candidates for the District 3 vacancy. Upon completion of the interviews, the City Council voted 4-0 to schedule a Special Meeting on January 30, 2023 to take action on the vacancy, including the possible appointment of a District 3 representative.

### **BACKGROUND**

On November 3, 2020, Councilmember Joe Garcia was elected to the City Council District 3 seat. On March 30, 2022, the City Council adopted new District boundaries that were created by the Independent Redistricting Commission.

As a result of redistricting, Councilmember Garcia was drawn into City Council District 2 and became eligible to run for that seat. On November 8, 2022, Councilmember Joe Garcia was elected to the City Council District 2 Seat creating a vacancy in the City Council District 3 seat, effective December 14, 2022.

According the Government Code § 36512(b), within 60 days of a councilmember seat vacancy, the Council must decide whether to (1) appoint a councilmember to fill the vacancy, or (2) call for a special election. The Council is required to decide a course of action on or before February 12, 2023.



### STAFF REPORT

The City Clerk solicited applications from eligible candidates between December 15, 2022 and January 13, 2023. The following candidates applied for the position:

Each candidate completed an application, submitted a resume and signed an affidavit that they live in Escondido City Council District 3 and are registered to vote in Escondido City Council District 3. In addition, each candidate provided their Escondido City Council District 3 voter registration verification, driver's license (with an Escondido City Council District 3 address) and address verification (i.e., a water bill, a utility bill, a credit card bill or a lease agreement with an Escondido City Council District 3 address). These documents are on file with the City Clerk's Office.

On January 25, 2023, 10 candidates were interviewed for the District 3 vacancy and now the City Council can take the following action:

- Appoint a candidate to fill the vacancy during the January 30, 2023 Special Council Meeting.
- Delay candidate appointment to the February 8, 2023 Council Meeting.
- Schedule another Special Council Meeting to appoint a candidate prior to February 12, 2023.

If an appointment is not made by the February 12, 2023 deadline, a Special Election will be scheduled. The San Diego County Registrar of Voters estimates that a Special Election in City Council District 3 would cost \$350,000 to \$600,000+. The Special Election would take place November 7, 2023.
