#### 7. PUBLIC HEARINGS

A. PUBLIC HEARING - The City Council will hold a Public Hearing for the purpose of permitting or denying a request from Alex Campolo c/o Advanced Architectural Stone, for a change of zoning, from (A2) Single Family Residential to (E) Heavy Industrial, on property located at 400 Holley Street (Baker Addition Block 8 Lot 12) Everman, Texas.

Mayor opened the Public Hearing at 6:31pm.

City Manager Craig wanted to give council a little bit of background information as they might remember on this before the comments. EDC approved land conveyance of land located on Holley to Advance Architectural Stone and they have an interest in rezoning that property to Heavy Industrial for the purposes of installing a parking lot so that their employees would have a location to park at rather than parking on the street and creating as traffic congestion issue. This property has been conveyed to them already and now they are just applying for that change. The Planning and Zoning has held a public hearing already for this change and there were no comments against this and the Board approved the change with the requirement of them putting up a fence between them and the residential properties. Craig recommender to approve this with that requirement in the motion. Mayor then asked if there were any comments from the citizens, there were none. Mayor closed the Public Hearing at 6:34pm.

A. Tennis and Pickleball Courts

This was briefly discussed before and council woman Allen wanted an update on this Craig stated. Also, keep in mind the Economic Development privacy with this discussion. We do have a local developer that is working on expanding his property and looking to include several pickleball, and tennis courts as well as bean bag toss and so forth. Craig stated about six months ago Council woman Allen suggested looking into this and it was not a month later this local business owner was looking to do this. Craig's recommendation is to allow the private side to develop this and do what we can to support this business and building this. This is in the works and they have already put applications in and we should see something within about six months or so. This is an Economic Development draw but is private. Council woman Allen asked since this is private would we be able to get something like this opened in the City of Everman? Craig stated that he don't want to say that it is impossible and that they could definitely look into grant opportunity's and other possible funding options to make this happen in the future. Council would like to see in the future that we have something like this for the public.

B. Reduction of Motor Vehicle Emissions Ordinance

This item was brought to council at a previous meeting and council would like to partilepate our would like to do this with the least restrictions. This would need to be adopted in order to have future funding. Also, council would like to set the fine to this violation to \$1- \$500 and the idle time that a person can't go over is at 15 minutes. This ordinance will be amended and brought back to council for approval.

C. Discussion related Pittman Park, Memorial Park, Mobile Food Truck Park, Maintenance and Police Department Facility Parking Lots and bids received for potential improvements

Chip seal work is common. There is no fund for this and will have to come out of General Fund. Bids are good for 30 days. This may go higher or could stay the same. Right now with the way the parking lots look they would last maybe a couple of years but with care. This is not expected to last long with the recycled asphalt on there now. With the damage already done to the parking lots this needs to be addressed. The \$45,000 would have to come from General Fund like said and this will make the Budget very tight. Council would like to move forward with the one parking lot replacement for \$45,000 out of the General Fund.

A. Review and Discussion of Park Rules

Craig stated that there has been a lot of talk about the Park rules. The city does not allow animals in the parks at all. There is a lot of citizens that have animals and walk in the Park. This has been difficult to enforce. Also, there is not a place that a citizen can take their dog on a leash. Craig has brought the idea to having the South end of Pittman Park to allow animals on leashes in that Park only. He also recommended that we also put more and better signs with the Park rules and city ordinances and fines so that the rules are displayed for the citizens to see so that we don't have anyone else locking their pets in Memorial Park to run free like we have already had happen. Council asked about the trash cans in the park and Craig stated that there is some in the park but they are going to improve those trash cans and the pet waste dispensaries so that people have somewhere to put the pet droppings. This will be discussed in the upcoming Budget. Council Member Allen stated that she would think the only animals allowed the Memorial Park would be service animals. Craig followed by stated that he agreed with her one hundred percent. Craig also mentioned the separation of the Parks as in Pittman Park, Anderson Football Field and Memorial Park. Pro-Tem Mackey suggested getting a sign up for Anderson Football Field so that can happen. Council also realizes that a lot of citizens do not follow the rules but by putting this into place for the citizens may help that situation and encourage them to read the rules and following them by making a place for them to bring animals. The concern is still there on the rules and citizens following them but when it is caught they will be enforced. Also, Craig did state that only in the event of an incident would they be required to ask for shot records for the animal. It was said that horses have been seen out there also at times and Craig stated there will be better enforcement on that and council agrees to not allow the horses in the Park. Craig asked council if he had a general consensus to allow dogs in Pittman Park only on a leash and they agreed to this so they will move forward with making this amendment to the ordinance and bring this back before council for their final approval.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 782**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF EVERMAN, TEXAS, THE ZONING ORDINANCE, APPENDIX B, SECTION 4.13, PRINCIPAL PERMITTED USE TABLE, ENTERTAINMENT – AMUSEMENTS, AND PROVIDING FOR FINDINGS OF FACT, AMENDMENT, REPEALER, SEVERABILITY, AN EFFECTIVE DATE, AND PROPER NOTICE.

- WHEREAS, the City of Everman ("City"), is a home rule municipality located in Tarrant County, Texas, created in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Local Government Code and operating pursuant to the enabling legislation of the State of Texas and its City Charter; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Everman, Texas ("Council") seeks to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the public by enforcing zoning regulations; and
- WHEREAS, the Council finds that these changes are in conformance with the City's Comprehensive Plan; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 211 of the Texas Local Government Code, the Council has authority to amend its zoning ordinances; and
- **WHEREAS**, pursuant to Chapter 51 of the Texas Local Government Code, the Council has determined that the authority granted through this Ordinance is reasonable and necessary; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Everman, Texas held a public hearing on this amendment on May 23, 2022.
- **WHEREAS**, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Everman, Texas recommended approval of this amendment on May 23, 2022.
- **WHEREAS**, the City posted notice in the newspaper on \_\_\_\_\_ regarding this amendment, which is at least fifteen (15) days before the adoption of zoning ordinance amendment; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Everman finds that the adoption of this ordinance serves a public purpose, and protects the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City of Everman, Texas by limiting the pollution created from unnecessary idling of motor vehicles within the City;

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EVERMAN, TEXAS THAT:

- **1. FINDINGS OF FACT.** The foregoing recitals are incorporated into this Ordinance by reference as findings of fact as if expressly set forth herein.
- 2. AMENDMENT. Appendix B, Section 4.13, Principal Permitted Use Table, Entertainment Amusements of the City of Everman Code of Ordinances is hereby amended and replaced so as to read in accordance with Exhibit A, which is attached hereto and incorporated into this Ordinance for all intents and purposes.
- **3. REPEALER.** All ordinances, resolutions, or parts thereof, that are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling as to the matters regulated, herein.
- 4. SEVERABILITY. Should any of the clauses, sentences, paragraphs, sections or parts of this Ordinance be deemed invalid, unconstitutional, or unenforceable by a court of law or administrative agency with jurisdiction over the matter, such action shall not be construed to affect any other valid portion of this Ordinance.
- **5. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage and publication.
- 6. **PROPER NOTICE & MEETING.** It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public, and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 551.

#### **RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

It is recommended that the Everman City Council approve Ordinance 782

#### **BACKGROUND INFORMATION:**

The City of Everman received an application for a business to open in the 800 Block of W. Enon Avenue. This owner had the desire to open an indoor game room for children under 13 years of age. She had the desire to host birthday parties, small children events, etc. This qualifies as an "indoor amusement". Upon review of our zoning ordinance, it seems as there is a very apparent typo or error.

According to our zoning ordinance, indoor amusement is not permitted within Commercially Zoned properties, however Outdoor Amusement is permitted. So although a small indoor childrens gameroom cannot open in this location, a Six Flags Over Texas could. This is backwards from most other municipalities. It is believed that this was a simple error that was overlooked when drafting the most recent version of the zoning ordinance.

Therefore, it is recommended by the P&Z Commission that the Everman City Council correct this believed error by passing this ordinance.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 783**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF EVERMAN, TEXAS AMENDING CHAPTER 14, "PARKS AND RECREATION", BY AMENDING CITY-OWNED PARK REGULATIONS FOR CLYDE PITTMAN AND JOHNSON PARKS, PROVIDING REGULATIONS, PROVIDING THIS ORDINANCE IS CUMULATIVE OF ALL OTHER ORDINANCES, PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS; PUBLICATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

- WHEREAS, the City of Everman, is a Home Rule municipality located in Tarrant County, Texas, created in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Local Government Code and operating pursuant to the enabling legislation of the State of Texas and its City Charter; and
- **WHEREAS,** Pursuant to Texas Local Government Code Section 51.001, the City of Everman has authority to adopt an ordinance that is for the good government, peace, or order of the municipality or for the trade and commerce of the municipality, and is necessary or proper for carrying out of a power granted to the city by law; and
- WHEREAS, the City of Everman has previously adopted ordinances regulating City Parks; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City Council deems it to be in the best interest of the health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Everman, and of the general public to amend those regulations governing the city parks within the City of Everman

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EVERMAN, TEXAS:

#### **SECTION 1: FINDINGS OF FACT**

The statements made in the foregoing recitals are incorporated into this Ordinance by reference as findings of fact as if expressly set forth herein.

#### **SECTION 2: ENACTMENT**

**Chapter 14. Parks and Recreation** of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Everman, Texas is modified as follows, unchanged provisions otherwise to remain in full force and effect:

#### **SECTION 14-21. – Rules and Regulations.**

The following regulations and restrictions are prescribed for the use of City parks:

• • •

(23) *Pets prohibited.* Except as otherwise specifically provided, it shall be unlawful for any person to bring any animal considered a pet in any city park. Pets shall include all dogs, cats, snakes, monkeys, and all other animals except for animals that are used for service of the disabled.

(27) *Exceptions to enforcement.* 

- (a) Dogs are allowed within Clyde Pittman Park and Johnson Park, if:
  - (i) Dogs are on leashes,
  - (ii) Owners collect/remove pet waste, and
  - (ii) Dogs have current rabies vaccination

(b) Except as provided by (27)(a), all pets are strictly prohibited from Memorial Park, All Sports Fields or within 100 feet of any concession stand.

#### **SECTION 3: REPEALER**

All ordinances, resolutions, or parts thereof, that are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling as to the matters regulated herein. The provisions in Chapter 14 Parks and Recreation, of the Everman Code, and the provisions in any other section of the said Code affected by this Ordinance, are hereby modified to reflect the above enactments, otherwise to remain in full force.

#### **SECTION 4: SEVERABILITY**

Should any of the clauses, sentences, paragraphs, sections or parts of this Ordinance be deemed invalid, unconstitutional, or unenforceable by a court of law or administrative agency with jurisdiction over the matter, such action shall not be construed to affect any other valid portion of this Ordinance.

#### **SECTION 5: PUBLICATION**

Following its adoption, the City Secretary is hereby directed to publish a caption of this Ordinance that summarizes its purpose, as provided in Section 52.013 of the Texas Local Government Code. The City Secretary is further directed to cause the relevant language of Chapter 14 Parks and Recreation and of any other section of the Everman Code affected and amended by this Ordinance, to be published in the appropriate location in said Code.

#### **SECTION 6: EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon its passage and publication, as provided in Section 3.10 D of the City Charter.

#### **SECTION 7: PROPER NOTICE AND MEETING**

It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance was passed was open to the public, and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by law.
