The meeting was called to order by Mayor Tedford at 9:00 a.m.

Councilman Harmon motioned to approve Council Meeting Minutes for February 6, 2024, and February 20, 2024; seconded by Councilwoman Frost and approved with a 3-0 vote by the Council.

Councilwoman Kent motioned to approve the accounts payable, payroll and customer deposit warrants; seconded by Councilman Harmon and approved with a 3-0 vote by the Council.

Consideration of application by Kathrein Eden for a retail establishment (off-premises) liquor license manager change for Safeway, Inc. to be located at 890 West Williams Avenue.

Deputy City Clerk Elsie Lee stated Kathrein Eden, Assistant Store Manager of Safeway Inc. has made an application for a retail establishment (off-premises) liquor license for Safeway Inc. to be located at 890 West Williams Avenue. A retail liquor license is a privileged license that allows the licensee to sell alcoholic beverages from a fixed and definite place of business for consumption off of the premises only. The application has been reviewed by Captain Daniel Babiarz, Deputy City Attorney Trent deBraga, City Engineer Derek Zimney, and Deputy City Clerk Elsie Lee and has been recommended for approval.

Mayor Tedford inquired if there were any comments or questions from the public or Council.

Councilwoman Frost motioned to approve the application by Kathrein Eden for a retail establishment (off-premises) liquor license manager change for Safeway, Inc. to be located at 890 West Williams Avenue; seconded by Councilwoman Kent and approved with a 3-0 vote by the Council.

Consideration of application by Miki Saavedra for a mobile food vendor license for We Can Warriors.

Deputy City Clerk Elsie Lee stated Miki Saavedra, owner of We Can Warriors has made an application for a mobile food vendor license for We Can Warriors. A mobile food vendor license is a privileged license that allows the licensee to sell food from a motor vehicle, or other type of food service conveyance, for human consumption and which is used to sell and dispense food or beverages to consumers. The application has been reviewed by Deputy City Attorney Trent deBraga, City Engineer Derek Zimney, Chief Ron Wenger, and Deputy City Clerk Elsie

Lee and has been recommended for approval.

Mayor Tedford inquired if there were any comments or questions from the public or Council.

Councilwoman Kent inquired if the business has only been operating in Churchill County.

City Clerk Elsie Lee stated that they have a City business license but have not been operating in the City since this ordinance has been passed. With the renewal of her business license this year, she also submitted for this license as well.

Mayor Tedford inquired if there were any further questions or comments.

Councilwoman Kent motioned to approve the application by Miki Saavedra for a mobile food vendor license for We Can Warriors; seconded by Councilman Harmon and approved with a 3-0 vote by the Council.

Consideration and possible approval of a parcel map for Pony Express Stations Series C to split Churchill County Assessor's Parcel Number 001-231-59, commonly known as 1110 W Williams Avenue, Fallon, NV, into two parcels.

City Engineer Derek Zimney stated that Pony Express Stations Series C, owner of Churchill County Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 001-231-59, has made an application and submitted a map to split its property at 1110 W Williams Avenue. This parcel map will create a 38,548 square foot parcel and a 6,064 square foot parcel. On December 28, 2023, the City Council approved a purchase and sale agreement with Pony Express Stations in the amount of eighty-eight thousand one hundred eighty-five dollars (\$88,185.00) for the purchase of what is now the 6,064 square foot parcel depicted on the parcel map. If approved, this parcel map will be recorded and the purchase and sale agreement approved by the City Council December 28, 2023, will proceed to escrow. The 6,064 square foot parcel will allow for future road and infrastructure improvements at the intersection of W Williams Avenue and Whitaker Lane.

I call Trent the parking czar of the City of Fallon because he will try to figure out each space, and sometimes it can be humorous as to trying to figure out the spaces, and this will make it a lot clearer. These are not radical changes; we are just trying to be more definitive with these ordinances.

- Public Property Accidents: 23 total accidents.
- Animal Shelter Services: Contributed 67 hours.
- Volunteers in Police Services: Total 125; Churchill – 74; City – 51.
- Various training courses were provided to sworn-in and non-sworn-in officers.
- 0 requests were made through the Citizen Assistance Program.
- Police officers participated in several various public relations events.
- No Citizen Surveys were returned.


Adjournment
