1. Council Discussion on Approval of the 2025 City Council Meetings Calendar-Executive Offices

Background/History:

Section 2.20 of the City Charter states, "The city council shall hold regular meetings at a stated time and place by ordinance by not less than twice a month." The City of Forest Park typically holds council meetings on the 1st and 3rd Mondays. However, the dates highlighted in red indicate meetings that will be held on the 1st Tuesday when a national holiday falls on a Monday. Staff is seeking approval of the 2025 city council meeting calendars.

2. Council Discussion on Approval of the 2025 City Council Holiday Calendar-Executive Offices

Background/History:

The Holiday Calendar provides a schedule of official holidays observed by the city, detailing dates when city offices will be closed, and services may be limited. This calendar helps residents and employees stay informed about holiday closures and any adjustments to city services, including trash collection, public works, and recreational facilities. Accessible on the city's website, the calendar is regularly updated to reflect changes in observances or city operations.

City Manager Clark noted that the personal day allotted to employees needs to be added to the calendar. He stated that Christmas Eve was on a Wednesday, and Christmas Day was on a Thursday. He asked how it was handled when the holiday fell like that.

Comments/Discussion from Governing Body:

Councilmember James asked for his recommendation.

City Manager Clark noted giving the employees the Friday as well, or the alternative is to use their personal day that Friday. He said employees usually use their personal day for a mental break from the city.

Mayor Butler asked about New Year's Eve and News Day.

City Manager Clark noted the city works on New Year's Eve, and New Year's Day falls on Thursday.

Mayor Butler asked if he is proposing they have that Friday off as well.

City Manager Clark noted that it is the pleasure of the governing body. He said he does not know how this city has handled it but has seen it done in several different ways.

Councilmember Mears asked how it would affect emergency services and if there was a certain number of days they had to be there.

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City Manager Clark noted it is a decision of the governing body, but the calendar is part of the city code. Mr. Clark noted they still get the holiday hours just not on the holiday.

Director Brown noted that if the holiday is on a Thursday, they would come back the next day. She noted that it is the decision of the governing body.

3. Council Discussion on 3rd Party Data Review – IT Department

Background/History:

As part of the review of our security footprint, we are asking a 3rd party vendor to complete an analysis of City Hosted Data. The review of this data is to evaluate for any PII (Personally Identifiable Information) hosted within our data footprint.

4. Council Discussion to accept the Thriving Communities Grant funding through Norfolk Southern -Planning Community Development

Background/History:

The Planning and Community Development department has applied for the Thriving Communities Grant program (Request ID: 95288529) through Norfolk Southern for City Park Master Improvement projects. This grant has been approved and will be awarded in the amount of \$50,000.00. The approved funds will be utilized for direct program and project support and a tax acknowledgement will need to be completed within 90 days, and the impact/outcomes report within 180 days, of receiving the grant.

Director Dozier noted they were awarded the \$50,000 grant to use as part of our city master Parks program. She said the intent is to utilize the funding to purchase equipment for the parks as part of an initial to improve the parks in the city.

Comments/Discussion from Governing Body:

Councilmember Mears asked if it included the pocket parks.

City Manager Clark noted they did not Bill Lee nor Starr Park, he stated they will contribute these funds to the project. He noted this is just to allow them to accept the award and amend the budget if necessary.

5. Council Discussion for Approval to Enter into a contract for Construction Manager At Risk (CMAR) Services for the New City Center: Procurement/Executive Office

Background/History:

The City of Forest Park is planning a new City Center facility to include the City Administration, Police Headquarters, Municipal Court, and Recreation Department, as well as below grade structured parking. Site work shall include, but is not limited to, all associated grading, utilities, erosion control, paving and landscaping. The awarded Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) firm will manage the construction, provide technical review during the pre-construction period, and provide cost evaluation assistance to the City. The CMAR firm will assume responsibility for project construction costs by issuing a guaranteed maximum price (GMP), which will be a contractual obligation. The CMAR firm will develop an overall final project schedule, which will be a contractual obligation. In addition, the CMAR firm will be responsible for methods of construction, safety, and the scheduling and coordination of the work of all construction and

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miscellaneous contracts required for completion of the project within its established budget and schedule. Four (4) proposals were received, and after evaluation of the technical and cost proposals, the dedicated Evaluation Committee recommends awarding the project to the following highest scoring vendor: **Carroll Daniel Construction**.

Talisha Clark, Procurement Manager, noted they received four proposals. Three of those proposals remained responsive and made it through the full scoring process. They conducted interviews with all three firms, and Carol Daniel Construction was the highest-scoring proposer after the interviews. Their references came back with solid 10s on all three that they provided.

Ernest Ellis, CEO of Fs 360, noted they are here to present an overview of our approach and the team's experience. He said they can bring forth what they believe would be an outstanding outcome for the entire community in Forest Park. He noted we have the expertise and the collaborative team, and with the experience with the architectural firm, precision planning that will bring forth the necessary experience, the work history, to make sure that they exceed expectations, not only for the city leadership but for the community as well, with regards to local participation. He noted that they have the maximum number of subcontractors working on this project who are citizens of this community, that are diverse, and capable. He said they have demonstrated work history and experience across both of the companies, first of which, with regards to my company, some of you may or may not know Fs 360 is a Forest Park task order contractor.

Kevin Thomas, Project Executive, noted he will oversee the day-to-day activities to ensure this project goes smoothly. He said they have experience with architecture and precision planning. He noted that is what they provide at Carol, Daniel. He stated he would be involved from day one to ensure they walk through the process as the complete life cycle begins. He said it would be a project of him and his team trying to ensure they get the best value for your project. Managing costs is a big thing. He stated they are a CMR risk contractor, and they make hard bids. He noted it allows them to keep the pulse on what's happening with the other contractors to ensure you're getting the best value. Mr. Thomas stated that they have financial transparency and that the are a team. He said they want to be a part of your team to ensure that everybody understands what you're paying for and that the products they want in your project are being put in.

Mr. Clark noted he thinks they should talk about cost.

Talisha Clark noted Carol Daniels came in with the lowest cost. They cut their costs from 3.4 million to 2.7 million. She said their pre-construction fee is 25 thousand and will be waived at the start of the contract start. She stated the construction fee is 1.9 million, which is lower than the other vendors.

City Manager Clark noted that they changed the format of how they put out the different companies that bid within the package. He stated he knew that Carol did the outreach two weeks ago but did not think it was sufficient for Forest Park. He believes it would be better to leverage the city PIO office to publish such an event and have it at the city facilities so any individual can understand how they can participate in the process.

Talisha Clark noted that once the governing body chooses to approve, they will work with legal to write up a contract and schedule a notice to proceed meeting.

Councilmember James stated she knows staff do a great job with their selection to get the appropriate people to do work within the city and wanted to thank them for doing what they do.

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Mr. Clark asked if they could explain how the meetings work.

Mr. Thomas noted that they have several set vendors with which they deal. He said that they publish on their Facebook and LinkedIn pages, which many of the vendors follow. He noted that they get to know the people and have them complete the paperwork to become part of their sub list. They make sure they can do the job and get them paired up.

Mr. Ellis noted he is the president of the National Minority Association for Contractors here in Atlanta. He noted it is essential that they create contract opportunities. He said it is to put contractors in rotation for the long haul. They are there to help grow and develop these contractors.

Comments/Discussion from Governing Body:

Councilmember Akins-Wells thanked the team for putting this together and the presenters for thinking about their community, which has amazing, qualified people. She noted that it would mean a lot for them to be able to provide input on this huge project.

Councilmember Mears thanked them for the presentation. He noted his concern is reaching out to the smaller contractors that are just getting started. He said they will have to stay on top of them to ensure they continue to perform like they start out. Mr. Mears noted they have to be able to step in when things start falling off to make sure the project continues to run smoothly.

There were 2 (two) public comment speakers.

Carl Evans noted he had a friend call city hall to get his truck put in the Christmas Parade and was told it was too late. He noted his friend, nor did he hear about a parade until today. He noted at the last meeting the Beautification Committee was talking about the clean sweep, and they had not used the flip signs in over three years or longer. He noted when they were being used, people knew about the clean sweep. Mr. Evans said he does not think the

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legacy residents who were not a part of the home program should be excluded from participating in the new signup.

Jay Evans noted that she was honored to be chosen to participate in the commercial. She thanked everyone involved.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

City Manager Clark thanked the Chief of Staff, who served as the Administrator for the first round of the home program. He noted that it has opened up to 61 and under, as it was first open to the legacy residents. He noted that they will give an overview of the program and answer any questions.

Pauline Warrior, Chief of Staff, noted that they are excited about the second phase because of the success of the first phase. She said that the first phase was for the legacy residents, and the requirement was for those aged 62 and older. She noted that the funds used were ARPA, and the amount available was 1.3 million dollars. There were 276 applicants, and 76 residents qualified. Ms. Warrior said that there was a \$10,000 threshold for repairs to be done for each qualified resident. She noted 33 contractors registered to participate, and ten qualified. She said it was expanded, and they accepted six more contractors.

She noted that this phase is for people aged 21 to 61. They must reside within the city limits, and the home must be in the homeowner's name. She noted that income will be verified. Ms. Warrior pointed out that no former participants could reapply to ensure everyone had an opportunity to participate.

Mr. Clark thanked the governing body and noted that they look forward to launching phase two. He also thanked the PIO office for putting this video together. He noted that they did not have a program mandate requirement. He stated that you have up to 60 days to finalize everything. This round of the program is from 18 to 61 because they could not apply the first time.

Councilmember James asked if the 60 days were for when they apply or when they contact a vendor.

City Manager Clark noted once they have the notice to proceed and have contacted the contractors.

PRESENTATIONS:

Staff Presentation Regarding Ongoing and Planned PIO Activities – Public Information Office

Background/History:

The Public Information Office exists to ensure that information released by the City of Forest Park is timely, accurate, comprehensive and relevant to all aspects of communications with the general public, internal staff and members of the media. It is the mission of the Public Information Office to promote and enhance city government via media relations, print and digital publications, social media, marketing campaigns and the city's website. A comprehensive presentation is to be provided to city council regarding current and planned office activities.

Javon Lloyd, PIO noted he is joined by his colleague Kwame Marshall. He gave an overview of what has been happening. He noted they are the first responders of information for highlights in the community, and general events. He said they have been able to secure positive news coverage through all the major news stations throughout Atlanta and share some positive stories. He noted the Home Program was picked up by the USA Suns, and this shows the word is getting out about what is going on. He thanked Mr. Marshall

for doing professional headshots for all employees. He noted they keep citizens informed through the weekly newsletter, constant contact, the mail distribution list, and emails. Mr. Lloyd said they also use the local news outline to cover what is happening and get the word out. He said when it comes to videography, they have been able to push out consistent content, they go out and make things happen. Mr. Lloyd noted they have a website redesign project coming up and thanked the council for approving this. He states he is looking forward to creating literature in diverse languages and continuing to establish relationships with regional, local, and national media partners.

Mayor Butler noted she is thankful for both of them. She remembers what it was like trying to get the department created, and it has done a 180. Mayor Butler stated he said something that resonated with them all about changing their own trajectory and narrative. She noted they had done that.

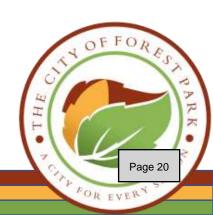

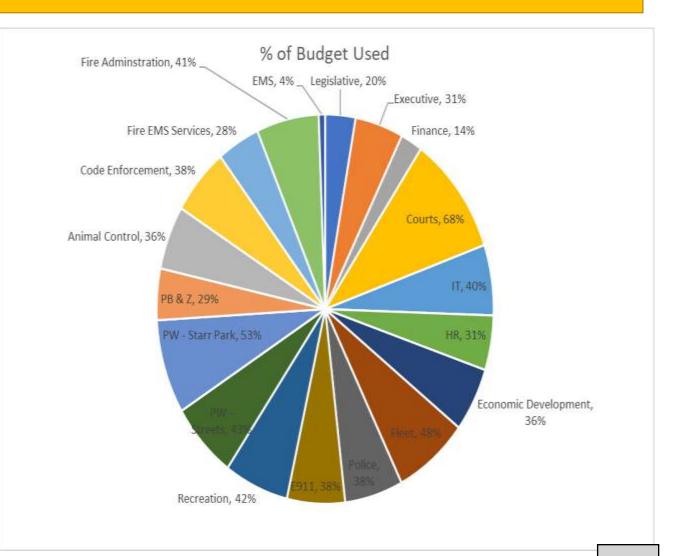

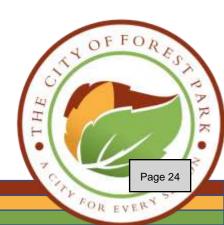

TERMS and CONDITIONS (Lighting – Governmental Service)

Item # 4.

- Agreement Scope. This Lighting Services Agreement ("Agreement") establishes the terms and conditions under which Georgia Power Company ("GPC") will provide lighting and renated service (collectively, the "Service") to the customer identified on Page 1 ("Customer") at the Service Address shown on Page 1 (the "Premises"). GPC may install, update, modify, or replace any GPC-owned pole, base, wiring, conduit, fixture, control, equipment, device, or related item at the Premises (collectively, "GPC Assets") for any reason related to the Service or to use of GPC Assets.
- 2. <u>Term and Termination</u>. The initial Agreement term is stated on Page 1, calculated from the date of the first bill. After the initial term, this Agreement automatically renews on a month-to-month basis until terminated by either party by providing written notice of intent to terminate to the other party (in accordance with the notice provisions of the *Miscellaneous* section below) at least 30 days before the desired termination date. The initial term and any renewal term or terms are collectively the "Term."
- 3. Intent and Title. This Agreement governs GPC's provision of the Service to Customer and is not a sale, lease, or licensing of goods, equipment, property, or assets of any kind. GPC retains the sole and exclusive right, title, and interest in and to all GPC Assets. Customer acknowledges that GPC Assets, although attached to real property, always will remain the exclusive personal property of GPC and that GPC may remove GPC Assets upon Agreement termination. GPC makes no representation or warranty regarding treatment of this transaction by the Internal Revenue Service or the status of this transaction under any federal or state tax law. Customer enters into this Agreement in sole reliance upon its own advisors.
- 4. Payment. GPC will invoice Customer monthly for the Monthly Cost as described on Page 1. The Service Cost portion of the Monthly Cost will renew at the amount shown on Page 1, but the Regulated Cost portion will be determined by the applicable Georgia Public Service Commission-approved tariff at the time of billing. Customer agrees to pay the total amount billed in full by the invoice due date. If a balance is outstanding past the due date, Customer acknowledges that GPC may require Customer to pay a deposit of up to two times the Estimated Monthly Charge in order to continue Service. If applicable, Customer must provide a copy of its Georgia sales tax exemption certificate. Customer must pay costs associated with any Customer-initiated charge to the Service after the date of this Agreement.
- 5. Premises Activity. Customer hereby grants to GPC and its contractors, agents, and representatives the right and license to enter the Premises at any time to perform any activity related to the Service or to GPC's use of the GPC Assets, including the right to access the Premises with vehicles, GPC Assets, or other tools or equipment, and to survey, dig, or excavate, in order to: (i) install and connect GPC Assets, provide Service, or provide or install any other service; (ii) inspect, maintain, test, replace, repair, disconnect, or remove GPC Assets; (iii) install additional equipment or devices on GPC Assets; or (iv) conduct any other activity reasonably related to the Service or GPC Assets (collectively, "GPC Activity"). Customer represents or warrants that it has the right to permit GPC to provide the Service and to perform the GPC Activity upon the Premises and, if applicable, has obtained express written authority and required permission from all Premises owners, and any other person or entity with rights in the Premises, to enter into this Agreement and to authorize the GPC Activity and the Service.
- 6. Installation and Underground Work. Customer recognizes that the Service requires installation of GPC Assets. Customer warrants or covenants that: (i) the Premises' final grade will vary no more than six inches from the grade existing at the time of installation; and (ii) if applicable and required for proper installation, Premises property lines will be clearly marked before installation.
 - A. <u>Customer Work</u>. If GPC, upon Customer's request, allows Customer, itself or through a third party, to perform any activity related to installation of GPC Assets (including trenching), Customer warrants or covenants that the work will meet GPC's installation specifications (which GPC will provide to Customer and which are incorporated by this reference). Customer must provide GPC at least 10 days' prior written notice of its schedule for the work, so that GPC can schedule GPC's installation work promptly thereafter. Customer will be responsible for any additional costs arising from non-compliance with GPC's specifications, Customer's failure to complete Customer's work by the agreed completion date, or failure to provide GPC timely notice of any schedule change.
 - B. <u>Underground Facility/Obstruction Not Subject to Dig Law.</u> Because GPC Activity may require excavation not subject to the Georgia Utility Facility Protection Act (O.C.G.A. §§25-9-1 25-9-13) ("Dig Law"), Customer must mark any private utility or facility (e.g., gas/water/sewer line; irrigation facility; fiber/data/communication line) or other underground obstruction at the Premises that is not subject to the Dig Law. If GPC causes or incurs damage due to Customer's failure to mark a private facility or obstruction before GPC commences GPC Activity, Customer is responsible for all damages and any loss or damage resulting from any such delay.
 - C. <u>Unforeseen Condition</u>. The estimated charges shown on Page 1 include no allowance for subsurface rock, wetland, underground stream, buried waste, unsuitable soil, underground obstruction, archeological artifact, burial ground, threatened or endangered species, hazardous substance, or similar condition ("Unforeseen Condition"). If GPC encounters an Unforeseen Condition in connection with any GPC Activity, GPC, in its sole discretion, may stop all GPC Activity until Customer either remedies the condition or agrees to reimburse all GPC costs arising from the condition. Customer is responsible for all costs of modification or change to GPC Assets requested by Customer or dictated by an Unforeseen Condition or circumstance outside GPC's control.
- 7. GPC Asset Protection and Damage. Throughout the Term, in the event of any work or digging near GPC Assets, Customer (or any person or entity working on Customer's behalf) must: (i) provide notices and locate requests to the Georgia Utilities Protection Center ("UPC") and other utility owners or operators as required by the then-current Dig Law; (ii) coordinate with the UPC and any utility facility owner/operator as required by the Dig Law; and (iii) comply with the High-voltage Safety Act (O.C.G.A. §§46-3-30 -- 46-3-40). As between Customer and GPC, Customer is responsible for any damage arising from failure to comply with applicable law or for damage to GPC Assets caused by anyone other than GPC or a GPC contractor, agent, or representative.
- 8. Pole Attachments. Nothing in this Agreement conveys to Customer any right to attach or affix anything to any GPC Asset. Customer agrees that it will not, and will not permit others to, rearrange, disconnect, remove, relocate, repair, alter, tamper with, or otherwise interfere with any GPC Asset. If Customer desires to attach or affix anything to GPC Assets, Customer must first obtain GPC's written consent. Customer may call GPC Lighting and Smart Services business unit at 1-888-660-5890 to request consent.
- 9. Interruption of Service. Customer understands that Service is provided on an "as is" and "as available" basis and may be interrupted. If there is a Service interruption, Customer must notify GPC. Following notice, GPC will restore Service, at no cost to Customer. Customer may notify GPC by either calling 1-888-660-5890 or by reporting online at: https://www.georgiapower.com/community/outages-and-stormcenter/power-outage-overview/street-light-outage.html.
- 10. <u>Disclaimer; Damages</u>. GPC makes no covenant, warranty, or representation of any kind (including warranty of fitness for a particular purpose, merchantability, or non-infringement) regarding Service, GPC Assets, or any GPC Activity. Customer acknowledges that, due to the unique characteristics of the Premises, Customer's needs, or selection of GPC Assets, the Service may not follow IESNA guidelines. Customer waives any right to consequential, special, indirect, treble, exemplary, incidental, punitive, loss of business reputation, interruption of Service or loss of use (including loss of revenue, profits, or capital costs) damages in connection with the loss or interruption of Service, GPC Assets, or this Agreement, or arising from damage, hindrance, or delay involving the Service, GPC Assets, or this Agreement, whether or not reasonable, foreseeable, contemplated, or avoidable. To the extent GPC is liable under this Agreement, and to the extent allowed by applicable law, GPC's liability is expressly limited to: (i) with respect to the Service purchased by Customer, the annual amount paid by Customer for the Service; or (ii) with respect to any other liability, to proven direct damages in an amount not to exceed \$100.00. Customer is solely responsible for safety of the Premises; Customer agrees that GPC has no obligation to ensure safety of the Premises and that GPC has no liability for any personal injury, real or personal property damage or loss, or negative impact to Customer or any third party that occurs at the Premises.
- 11. Risk Allocation. Each party will be responsible for its own acts and the results of its acts, except as otherwise described in this Agreement.
- 12. Georgia Security, Immigration, and Compliance Act. Customer is a "public employer" as defined by O.C.G.A. § 13-10-91 and this is a contract for physical performance of services in Georgia. Compliance with O.C.G.A. § 13-10-91 is a condition of this Agreement and is mandatory. GPC will provide to Customer a contractor's affidavit for installation services as required by O.C.G.A. § 13-10-91. If GPC employs any subcontractor in connection with installation under this Agreement, GPC also will secure from each subcontractor an affidavit attesting to compliance with O.C.G.A. § 13-10-91.
- 13. <u>Default</u>. Customer is in default if Customer: (i) does not pay the entire amount owed to GPC within 45 days after the due date; (ii) terminates this Agreement without proper notice and prior to the end of the then-current Term; or (iii) breaches any material term, warranty, covenant, or representation of this Agreement. GPC's waiver of a past or concurrent default will not waive any other default. If a default occurs, GPC may: (a) immediately terminate this Agreement; (b) remove any GPC Asset from the Premises; or (c) seek any available remedy provided by law, including the right to collect any past due amount, or any amount due for the Service during the remaining Term.
- 14. Miscellaneous. This Agreement contains the parties' entire agreement relating to the Service, GPC Assets, and GPC Activity and replaces any prior agreement, written or oral. Subject to applicable law, GPC may modify the terms of this Agreement by providing 30 days' prior written notice of such modification to Customer. If Customer uses the Service or makes any payment for the Service on or after the modification effective date, Customer accepts the modification. GPC's address for notice is 1790 Montreal Circle, Tucker, GA 30084-6801; Customer's address for notice is stated on Page 1. Either party may update administrative or contact information (e.g., address, phone, website) at any time by written notice to the other. Customer will not assign, in whole or in part, this Agreement or any right or obligation it has under this Agreement; any such assignment without GPC's prior written consent will be void and of no effect. In this Agreement: (i) "include(ing)" means "include, but are not limited to" or "including, without limitation"; and (iv) "written" or "in writing" includes email communication. Georgia law governs this Agreement. If a court rules an Agreement provision unenforceable to any extent, the rest of that provision and all other provisions remain effective.

A RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS KIMBERLY JAMES, HECTOR GUTIERREZ, LATRESA AKINS-WELLS, AND ALLAN MEARS TO AUTHORIZE ENTERING INTO A LIGHTING SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH GEORGIA POWER FROM THE CITY'S PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, the City of Forest Park ("City") is a municipal corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Georgia; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement states that Georgia Power shall install one (1) new LED light fixture on the existing pole at either a monthly cost of Twenty-Seven Dollars and 00/100 Cents (\$27.00) or an annual cost of Three Hundred and Twenty-Four Dollars and 00/100 Cents (\$324.00); and

WHEREAS, the approval of this Agreement is necessary for the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City.

THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF FOREST PARK, GEORGIA HEREBY RESOLVES:

<u>Section 1.</u> *Approval.* The Department's request to enter into a Lighting Service Agreement #LP101193 with Georgia Power to install one (1) new LED light fixture at the corner of Jonesboro Road and Watts Road at either a monthly cost of Twenty-Seven Dollars and 00/100 Cents (\$27.00) or an annual cost of Three Hundred and Twenty-Four Dollars and 00/100 Cents (\$324.00) as presented to the Mayor and Council on December 16, 2024 is hereby approved.

Background/History:

The Public Works Department has received authorization from the Police and Rec and Leisure Departments to surplus 15 inoperable vehicles. These vehicles were deemed too costly to repair due to their age and faulty components. Some of the vehicles will be replaced by newer models previously approved by the Council. It is important to highlight that, while Clayton County would handle the general administration of the election, the City Clerk will retain responsibility for managing the qualifying process for candidates, as has been standard protocol in past elections.

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-

AN ORDINANCE BY FOREST PARK, GEORGIA, COUNCILMEMBERS KIMBERLY JAMES, HECTOR GUTIERREZ, LATRESA AKINS-WELLS, AND ALLAN MEARS TO AUTHORIZE THE CLAYTON COUNTY BOARD OF REGISTRATION AND ELECTIONS TO CONDUCT ANY AND ALL MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS HELD BY THE CITY IN 2025; AND FOR OTHER LAWFUL PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the duly elected governing authority of the City of Forest Park, Georgia (the "City") is the Mayor and Council thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Georgia Election Code, O.C.G.A. § 21-2-45(c), provides that the governing authority of a municipality may authorize any county within which that municipality wholly or partially lies to conduct any or all elections; and

WHEREAS, the governing authority of the City of Forest Park desires to authorize Clayton County Board of Registration and Elections to conduct any and all municipal elections held by the City in 2025, including, but not limited to, a special election on March 18, 2025.

BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOREST PARK, GEORGIA, and by the authority thereof:

<u>Section 1.</u> The Mayor and City Council of the City of Forest Park, Georgia hereby authorizes the Clayton County Board of Registration and Elections to operate as the "Superintendent" of the aforementioned elections and shall perform any and all

functions of the City or any of its officials in connection with the conduct of such election or runoff thereof. The Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into an Intergovernmental Agreement with Clayton County, in substantially the same form as the agreement attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and to take any and all necessary steps to accomplish the purposes and intent of this Ordinance.

<u>Section 2.</u> The preamble of this Ordinance shall be considered to be and is hereby incorporated by reference as if fully set out herein.

Section 3. (a) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that all sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are or were, upon their enactment, believed by the Mayor and Council to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional.

- (b) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, each and every section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is severable from every other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance. It is hereby further declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, no section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is mutually dependent upon any other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance.
- (c) In the event that any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall, for any reason whatsoever, be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the express intent of the Mayor and Council that such invalidity, unconstitutionality or unenforceability shall, to the greatest extent allowed by law, not

render invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections of the Ordinance and that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, all remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of the Ordinance shall remain valid, constitutional, enforceable, and of full force and effect.

Section 4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed to the extent of such conflict.

<u>Section 5.</u> The effective date of this Ordinance shall be the date of adoption unless otherwise stated herein.

Section 6. The City Clerk, with the concurrence of the City Attorney, authorized to correct any scrivener's errors found in this Ordinance, including any exhibits, as enacted.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR THE PROVISION OF ELECTION SERVICES BETWEEN CLAYTON COUNTY, GEORGIA AND THE CITY OF FOREST PARK

THIS INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT is entered into this 2nd day of December 2024, ("**Effective Date**") between Clayton County, Georgia (the "**County**"), a political subdivision of the State of Georgia, and the City of Forest Park, Georgia (the "**Forest Park**"), a municipal corporation of the State of Georgia.

- WHEREAS, the parties to this Agreement are both governmental entities; and
- **WHEREAS**, the County and Forest Park desire to maintain a mutually beneficial, efficient and cooperative relationship that will promote the interests of the citizens of Clayton County; and
- **WHEREAS**, both parties are interested in serving the needs of the citizens of Clayton County by the County providing for the services of conducting elections required and permitted by law; and
- **WHEREAS**, Forest Park desires to contract with the County to conduct a special election for Forest Park pursuant to the applicable laws of the State of Georgia; and
- **WHEREAS,** Forest Park and the County are authorized by Art. IX, Sec. III, Par. I of the Constitution of the State of Georgia to enter into such an agreement for the conduct of the Special Elections; and
- **WHEREAS**, the Clayton County Board of Elections and Registration ("**BER**") has jurisdiction over the conduct of primaries and elections and the registration of electors in the County; and
- **WHEREAS**, the BER, among other things, is responsible for the selection and appointment of the election's supervisor and the selection, appointment, and training of poll workers in elections.
- **NOW THEREFORE,** in consideration of the following mutual obligations, the County and Forest Park agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS

1.1 This Agreement will govern the conduct of the 2025 Municipal Elections ("Municipal Election") which Forest Park requests the County to conduct, including any and all runoffs which may be necessary. It is the intent of the parties that Municipal Election be conducted in compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local legal requirements.

1.2 For the Municipal Election, Forest Park, at its sole option, shall submit to County a proper Election Resolution and Call for Election (the "Calls") as required by O.C.G.A. § 21-2-540, now and as it may be amended. Said receipt of a proper Election Resolution and Call. Calls shall be attached hereto and incorporated by reference in this Agreement as **Exhibit A.**

ARTICLE 2 TERM OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall commence on the date that it is executed by or on behalf of the governing authority of Clayton County, Georgia and will terminate on December 31, 2025, unless otherwise terminated as set forth herein.

ARTICLE 3 DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Pursuant to this Agreement, each party shall provide the following enumerated services:

- 3.1 Upon receipt of receipt of a proper Election Resolution and Call for Election as required by O.C.G.A. § 21-2-540, now and as it may be amended, the BER and/or the County Elections Director, or their designee(s) shall be responsible for:
- a) Designating early and advance voting sites and hours;
- b) Placing Forest Park's ballot question(s) on the ballot for a Municipal Election after timely written notice from Forest Park is received by the County (which such notice shall include all necessary details and information);
- c) Hiring, training, supervising, and paying poll officers and absentee ballot clerks;
- d) Preparing and submitting to Forest Park Clerk, as required by state law, now and as it may be amended hereafter, a list of electors;
- e) Performing duties of election superintendent/supervisor, and absentee ballot clerk for Municipal Elections;
- f)Performing logic and accuracy testing as required by Sections 183-1-12-.02 and .07 of the Official Compilation of Rules and Regulations of the State of Georgia, now and as they may be hereafter amended;
- g) Providing staff, equipment and supplies for conducting the Special Election at proper polling places on Special Election days and for conducting recounts as may be required; and
- h) Certifying Municipal Election returns as required by state law O.C.G.A. § 21-2-493, now and as it may be amended hereafter, and submitting certified Special Election returns to the Georgia Secretary of State and Forest Park Clerk or as otherwise directed.
- 3.2 Forest Park shall be responsible for:
- a) Placing advertisements in Forest Park's legal organ regarding Calls, as required by

- state law O.C.G.A. § 21-2-540, now and as it may be amended hereafter;
- b) Verifying, in a timely manner, accuracy of voter list(s) for Forest Park residents;
- c) For all aspects related to the issuance of bonds by Forest Park, except for Forest Park referendum election duties specifically requested of the County as provided herein;
- d) Notifying the County immediately of the need for a Municipal Election including election races and/or ballot referendum questions;
- e) Providing the County with an electronic copy of referendums that must be placed on a ballot; and
- f)Otherwise cooperating with the County in the performance of this Agreement and providing the County such documentation and information as it may reasonably request to facilitate the performance of its duties under this Agreement.

ARTICLE 4 COMPENSATION AND CONSIDERATION

Pursuant to this Agreement and O.C.G.A. § 21-2-2-45(c) now and as it may be amended hereafter, Forest Park shall pay to the County all costs incurred in performing the functions agreed upon herein, plus a ten percent (10%) administrative fee. Forest Park agrees to pay County the actual costs incurred by County in conducting Special Elections and administrative fees as stated on the County's invoice. Forest Park shall remit said funds to County within thirty (30) calendar days of receipt of invoice.

ARTICLE 5 LEGAL RESPONSIBILITIES

- 5.1 Forest Park shall be solely responsible for any liability resulting from any claims or litigation arising from or pertaining to any Special Election, except claims or litigation regarding the acts of agents or employees of the County, the County Board of Elections and Registration, and/or the County Elections Director in connection with any Special Election held pursuant to this Agreement. Forest Park agrees to reimburse the County for all costs, including, but not limited to, court costs and reasonable attorney fees for the County Attorney or outside counsel, incurred by the County as a result of any such claim or litigation should such costs result from liability resulting from any claims or litigation resulting from a contested Special Election wherein such claims or litigation are the result of acts of agents or employees of Forest Park. Forest Park shall make payment of such reimbursements to the County within thirty (30) calendar days of receipt of any invoice for reimbursement from the County.
- 5.2 In the event that a Special Election is contested, Forest Park shall be solely responsible for any liability resulting from any claims or litigation arising from or pertaining to any contested Special Election, except claims or litigation regarding the acts of agents or employees of the County, the County Board of Elections and Registration, and/or the County Elections Director in connection with any Special Election held pursuant to this Agreement. Forest Park agrees to reimburse the County for all costs incurred in responding to the election challenge which results from acts

by Forest Park agents or employees, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney's fees for the County Attorney or outside counsel and all expenses associated with the election challenge and any appeals thereafter. Forest Park shall make payment of such reimbursements to the County within thirty (30) calendar days of receipt of any invoice for reimbursement from the County. If a second election is required, such election will constitute a Special Election under this Agreement and shall be conducted in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

- 5.3 It is the intent of the parties to be covered under the auspices of any applicable immunity granted by law.
- 5.4 Should it be necessary to comply with legal requirements that any of the County's personnel shall be sworn in as a temporary officer or employee of Forest Park, such formality shall be observed without limitation.

ARTICLE 6 EMPLOYMENT STATUS

- 6.1 All County personnel assigned under this Agreement are and will continue to be employees of the County for all purposes, including, but not limited to: duties and responsibilities, employee benefits, grievance, payroll, pension, promotion, annual or sick leave, standards of performance, training, workers compensation and other liability insurance, and disciplinary functions.
- 6.2 All BER personnel assigned under this Agreement are and will continue to be part of the Clayton County Board of Registration and Elections and under the supervision of the Elections Director. Under no circumstances shall such personnel be considered employees of Forest Park for any purpose, including, but not limited to, the purposes outlined in subsection 6.1.
- 6.3 All Forest Park personnel assigned under this Agreement are and will continue to be employees of Forest Park.

ARTICLE 7 RECORDKEEPING AND REPORTING

- 7.1 The County Registration and Elections Department is the central repository for all departmental records and makes available public records as defined and required by the Georgia Open Records Act, O.C.G.A. § 50-18-70, *et seq.*, O.C.G.A. § 21-2-51 and O.C.G.A. § 21-2-72, now and as they may be amended hereafter. During the term of this Agreement, the County will continue to comply with the applicable provisions of the Georgia Open Records Act and the Georgia Election Code.
- 7.2 Except as limited by any provision of state or federal law, Forest Park may request, review and access data and County records at a mutually agreed upon time to ensure compliance with this Agreement.

ARTICLE 8 TERMINATION AND REMEDIES

Either party may unilaterally terminate this Agreement, in whole or in part, for any reason whatsoever by notice in writing to the other party delivered at least thirty (30) calendar days prior to the effective date of the termination.

ARTICLE 9 NOTICES

All required notices shall be given by certified first class U.S. Mail, return receipt requested. The parties agree to give each other non-binding duplicate facsimile notice. Future changes in address shall be effective upon written notice being given by Forest Park to the County Elections Director or by the County to Forest Park Manager via certified first-class U.S. mail, return receipt requested. ARTICLE 10 NON-ASSIGNABILITY

Neither party shall assign any of the obligations or benefits of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 11 ENTIRE AGREEMENT

The parties acknowledge, one to the other, that the terms of this Agreement constitute the entire understanding and Agreement of the parties regarding the subject matter of the

Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement between the Parties concerning the subject matter of this Agreement and supersedes all prior oral or written agreements or understandings. No representation oral or written not incorporated in this Agreement shall be binding upon Forest Park or the County. All parties must sign any subsequent changes in the Agreement.

ARTICLE 12 SEVERABILITY, VENUE AND ENFORCEABILITY

If a court of competent jurisdiction renders any provision of this Agreement (or portion of a provision) to be invalid or otherwise unenforceable, that provision or portion of the provision will be severed, and the remainder of this Agreement will continue in full force and effect as if the invalid provision or portion of the provision were not part of this Agreement. No action taken pursuant to this Agreement should be deemed to constitute a waiver of compliance with any representation, warranty, covenant or agreement contained in this Agreement and will not operate or be construed as a waiver of any subsequent BERach, whether of a similar or dissimilar nature. This Agreement is governed by the laws of the state of Georgia without regard to conflicts of law principles thereof. Should any party institute suit concerning this Agreement, venue shall be in the Superior Court of Clayton County, Georgia. Should any provision of this Agreement require judicial interpretation, it is agreed that the court interpreting or construing the same shall not apply a presumption that the terms hereof shall be more strictly construed against one party by reason of the rule of construction that a document is to be construed more strictly against the party who itself or through its agent prepared the same, it being agreed that the agents of all parties have participated in the preparation hereof.

ARTICLE 13 BINDING EFFECT

This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of, and be binding upon, the respective parties' successors.

ARTICLE 14 COUNTERPARTS

This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original, and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

A RESOLUTION BY COUNCILMEMBERS KIMBERLY JAMES, HECTOR GUTIERREZ, LATRESA AKINS-WELLS, AND ALLAN MEARS TO APPROVE THE GENERAL FUND BUDGET AMENDMENT AND THE SPECIAL REVENUE (POLICE) BUDGET AMENDMENT TO THE 2024-2025 FISCAL YEAR OPERATING BUDGET FROM THE CITY'S PURCHASING DEPARTMENT.

WHEREAS, the City of Forest Park ("City") is a municipal corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Georgia; and

WHEREAS, the City's 2024-2025 Fiscal Year Operating Budget ("Budget") was adopted on June 16, 2024 with City staff advising that the funding and revenues would continuously be monitored for accuracy and reporting purposes; and

WHEREAS, City's Purchasing Department ("Department") requests to approve a Five Hundred and Ninety-Seven Thousand, Nine Hundred and Sixty-Six Dollars and 00/100 Cents (\$597,966.00) budget amendment to accurately reflect the corrected operating revenue budget amount for the General Fund to be Forty-Two Million, Six Hundred and Sixty-Five Thousand, Three hundred and Seventy-Four Dollars and 00/100 Cents (\$42,665,374.00); and

WHEREAS, the Department further requests to approve a One Hundred and Ten Thousand Dollar and 00/100 Cents (\$110,000.00) budget amendment to accurately reflect the corrected operating revenue budget amount for the Special Revenue (Police) to be One Hundred and Eighteen Thousand Dollars and 00/100 Cents (\$118,000.00); and

WHEREAS, City staff recommends these understated funds be added to the operating budget for the Annual Audit which will decrease/increase the current revenues to amend the decrease/increase of expenditures; and

WHEREAS, the approval of the General Fund budget amendment and the Special Revenue (Police) budget amendment for the Budget is necessary for the health, safety, and welfare of the City's citizens.

THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF FOREST PARK, GEORGIA HEREBY RESOLVES:

<u>Section 1.</u> Approval. The Department's request to approve the General Fund budget amendment and the Special Revenue (Police) budget amendment to the 2024-2025 Fiscal Year Operating Budget as presented to the Mayor and Council on December 16, 2024 is hereby approved.

Section 2. *Public Record.* This document shall be maintained as a public record by the City Clerk ("Clerk") and shall be accessible to the public during all normal business hours of the City.

<u>Section 3.</u> *Authorization of Execution.* The Mayor is hereby authorized to sign all documents necessary to effectuate this Resolution.

Section 4. *Attestation.* The Clerk is authorized to execute, attest to, and seal any documents necessary to effectuate this Resolution, subject to approval as to form by the City Attorney.

Background/History:

In the interest of maintaining transparency, fairness, and ensuring the integrity of the electoral process, the proposed ordinance mandates that city employees who wish to run for municipal office must resign their position upon successfully qualifying for the election and submitting the requisite filing fees. This policy aims to address potential conflicts of interest, improve public confidence in the electoral process, and provide equal opportunity for all candidates by ensuring that public office candidates are not in a position to leverage their current employment status within the city government for political advantage

Key Provisions of the Ordinance

- 1. **Qualification and Filing Fees**: The ordinance stipulates that once a city employee successfully qualifies to run for a municipal office (i.e., city council, mayor, etc.) and pays the required filing fees, they are compelled to tender their resignation from city employment immediately.
- Resignation Requirement: Upon meeting the criteria of candidacy, the employee must formally resign from their position within the city. Failure to comply would result in the disqualification of their candidacy and potentially subject them to administrative actions.

ORDINANCE 2024-___

AN ORDINANCE BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOREST PARK, GEORGIA TO AMEND TITLE 2 (GENERAL GOVERNMENT) CHAPTER 2 (ELECTIONS) IN THE CITY'S CODE OF ORDINANCES AND TO ADOPT REGULATIONS CONCERNING CITY EMPLOYEES AS CANDIDATES FOR MUNICIPAL OFFICE; TO PROVIDE AN ADOPTION DATE; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER LAWFUL PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the duly elected governing authority of the City of Forest Park, Georgia (the "City") is the Mayor and City Council thereof; and

WHEREAS, section 36-35-3 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated (O.C.G.A.) provides cities the power to adopt clearly reasonable ordinances, resolutions or regulations relating to the cities' property and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to adopt certain regulations concerning city employees and municipal elections; and

WHEREAS, the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City will be positively impacted by the adoption of this Ordinance.

BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FOREST PARK, GEORGIA, and by the authority thereof:

Section 1. Title 2 (General Government), Chapter 2 (Elections) in the Code of Ordinances of the City of Forest Park, Georgia is hereby amended to include a new section, to be read and codified as set forth below:

"Sec. 2-2-6. – Employees as Candidates for Political Office.

- (a) Any city employee shall resign from employment upon qualifying as a candidate for any:
 - (1) elective office of the City of Forest Park;
 - (2) full-time elective office of a political subdivision of this state or any other state;
 - (3) full-time elective office of a political party or political organization;
 - (4) elective office of this state or any other state;
 - (5) elective office of the federal government.
- **(b)** Qualification for office shall be conclusively presumed whenever an employee files a candidacy application and pays any related application fees."

<u>Section 2.</u> The preamble of this Ordinance shall be considered to be and is hereby incorporated by reference as if fully set out herein.

<u>Section 3.</u> (a) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that all sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this Ordinance are or were, upon their enactment, believed by the Mayor and Council to be fully valid, enforceable and constitutional.

(b) It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, each and every section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is severable from every other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance. It is hereby further declared to be the intention of the Mayor and Council that, to the greatest extent allowed by law, no section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is mutually dependent upon any other section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance.

(c) In the event that any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance

shall, for any reason whatsoever, be declared invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable

by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, it is the express intent of

the Mayor and Council that such invalidity, unconstitutionality or unenforceability shall, to the

greatest extent allowed by law, not render invalid, unconstitutional or otherwise unenforceable any

of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections of the Ordinance and that, to

the greatest extent allowed by law, all remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and

sections of the Ordinance shall remain valid, constitutional, enforceable, and of full force and

effect.

Section 4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby expressly

repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall be codified in a manner consistent with the laws of the State

of Georgia and the City.

Section 6. The effective date of this Ordinance shall be the date of adoption unless

otherwise stated herein.

Section 7. The City Clerk, with the concurrence of the City Attorney, authorized to correct

any scrivener's errors found in this Ordinance, including any exhibits, as enacted.
