# **APPROVAL OF MINUTES:**

 Approval of December 12, 2024, Regular Meeting Minutes: Yasmin Julio made a motion to approve the December 12, 2024, meeting minutes as presented. Avery Wilson seconded the motion. Motion approved unanimously.

## **OLD BUSINESS:**

2. **Update Oasis Consulting:** Mike Monteleone, PE, Exec VP of Oasis Consulting Services provided an update on the Fort Gillem South Parcel Development and Stephens Lake.

- a. Stephens Lake has experienced severe erosion
- b. Oasis Consulting recommends remediation of the stormwater detention or renovation of the existing structure to include a water / recreation park.
- c. Oasis Consulting recommends a conditional assessment report be completed to determine the feasibility of addressing the potential breach or renovation of the existing damn.
- d. During this conditional assessment Oasis will take sediment samples for testing.
- e. Chairwoman Kimberly James asked staff to schedule a tour of Stephens and Marchman Lake.
- f. Oasis Consulting also presented their renewed contract proposal for On-Call Environmental Engineering Consulting Services. The contract will be reviewed and submitted for proposal at the February 13, 2025, URA regular meeting.
- g. Page three (3) of the contract also proposes adding the Old Fire Station site to the Brownfields Program as it is the only URA owned site at the former Fort Gillem not covered by this program.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

- 3. **Financial Update:** John Wiggins delivered the update.
  - a. The URA Army checking account beginning balance was \$\$3,760,699 with an ending balance of 43.767.064.
  - b. The URA Kroger checking account beginning balance was \$471,113 with an ending balance of \$472.337.
  - c. The URA Operating revenue beginning balance was \$15,520,000 with an ending balance of \$14.689.030.
  - d. Total Net Position as of December 2024 was a budget of \$12,438,950 with an ending budget balance of \$11,969,503.
  - e. URA Georgia Fund 1 beginning balance of \$34,719,514 with an ending balance of \$4,782,720.78.

### **Description of Work:**

FemPro'z, LLC is pleased to submit this proposal to the City of Forest Park for the repair of the storm drain system located at 200 Metcalf Rd. Forest Park, Ga. The proposed work includes the following:

- Curb and Gutter Repair: Restoration of any damaged curbs and gutters to ensure proper drainage flow and structural
  integrity.
- 2. Manhole Cover Replacement: Replacement of manhole covers to maintain safety and accessibility.
- 3. **Double Wing Storm Drain Cover Replacement**: Installation of a new double wing storm drain cover to restore functionality and compliance with safety standards.
- Throat/Wall Repair: Repairs to the throat and wall of the storm drain to prevent further deterioration and ensure proper water flow.
- 5. **Pipe Column Installation:** Installation of a reinforced pipe columns to provide additional structural support and mitigate future damage risks.

### **Special Considerations:**

- Unknown Damages: Please note that the full extent of the damage cannot be assessed until the demolition of the damaged structure and removal of all debris have been completed. Should additional damages be discovered during this process, these changes will be invoiced separately, with prior approval from the City of Forest Park.
- \* Material Specification: The repair work will utilize D.O.T. AirMix grade concrete, which is specially designed for durability and compliance with Department of Transportation standards. This ensures the longevity and resilience of the repaired structures.
- 3. Reinforcement: Pipe columns will be added to the interior wall to add additional structural support to the drain cover top

#### **Terms and Conditions:**



Oasis Consulting Services (Oasis) sincerely appreciates the opportunity to provide this proposal for the above referenced services for the existing Stephens Lake Dam located at the Gillem Logistics Center in Forest Park, Georgia. Our understanding of the project requirements comes from our conversations with Mr. Jim Hardin with Walden, Ashworth & Associates, Inc., our recent site visit, and our experience with similar projects. The following will present our understanding of the project, a recommended scope of services, and the cost for those services.

# PROJECT INFORMATION

We understand that you plan to breach the dam at Stephens Lake located at Fort Gillem in Forest Park, Georgia. We also understand Stephens Lake is currently maintaining water upstream of the dam. Based on our past experience of the dam area, we understand the dam is approximately 20 feet in height and approximately 200 to 250 feet in length. No other details were available at the time this proposal was prepared.

## **SCOPE OF SERVICES**

Our scope of services includes performing a subsurface exploration and geotechnical evaluation for the existing dam. We propose a total of five (5) Standard Penetration Test (SPT) borings be performed in the proposed dam area to depths of 40 feet below existing grades to determine soil consistency and in-situ moisture content. We also propose three (3) piezometers to be set on the

dam to depths of 20 feet below existing grade to establish any groundwater table. This comprises a total of 200 feet of soil test borings and 60 feet of auger borings.

We expect that the drilling can be performed during normal business hours and that evening or weekend drilling will not be required. Boring cuttings and excess spoils will be left onsite. Repair of grass and landscaping due to drill rig access is outside of the scope of services.

Oasis will contact Georgia Utilities Protection Center to mark any <u>public</u> utilities in the proposed drilling area. Oasis cannot be responsible for damage to utilities that are not properly located.

The soil test borings will be advanced by twisting continuous hollow stem auger flights into the ground. At selected intervals, Standard Penetration Resistance testing will be performed, and soil samples recovered for visual classification. The results of the penetration tests, when properly evaluated, provide an indication of the relative consistency of the soil being sampled, the potential for difficult excavation and the soil's ability to support loads.

We plan on setting three (3) piezometers on the dam in order to measure stabilized groundwater. The temporary wells consist of placing slotted PVC pipe within the borehole and backfilling the area between the pipe and the borehole with sand. Groundwater is allowed to rise and fall within the slotted pipe and allowing stabilized groundwater to be measured.

For the purpose of this proposal, we anticipate using the results of the Standard Penetration Tests (SPT) to provide recommendations for allowable bearing pressures at the base of the dam and results of the piezometers to determine an existing groundwater table and have not planned any laboratory testing, such as one-dimensional consolidation tests. These assumptions seem reasonable considering the nature of the proposed construction.

Oasis will perform laboratory testing on multiple split barrel samples to aide in soil classification and the suitability of on-site soils for reuse as fill. We propose to perform the following laboratory testing: 5 Standard Proctor tests, 10 Atterberg Limit tests, 10 grain size distribution tests, and 30 moisture content tests.

Following completion of the fieldwork, Oasis Consulting Services will issue a report, which will describe our understanding of the proposed dam breach, methods of exploration employed, site and subsurface conditions encountered, and conclusions and recommendations regarding the geotechnical aspects of the project. The conclusions and recommendations will include, but not be limited to, the following:

- Site Preparation
- Suitability of On-Site Soils for Reuse as Fill
- Potential for Difficult Excavation
- Compaction Requirements
- Temporary and Permanent Dewatering
- Groundwater Recommendations
- Other Geotechnical Aspects of the Proposed Construction

## ESTIMATE OF COST

- 1. Scope of Services. The scope of Consultant's services ("Services") will be set forth in the Scope of Services section of an individual proposal, task order (which sections are incorporated into this PSA) or as described in the Scope of Services above. Portions of the Services may be subcontracted. Consultant's Services do not include the investigation or detection, nor do recommendations in Consultant's reports address the presence or prevention of biological pollutants (e.g., mold, fungi, bacteria, viruses, or their byproducts) or occupant safety issues, such as vulnerability to natural disasters, terrorism, or violence. If Services include purchase of software, Client will execute a separate software license agreement. Consultant's findings, opinions, and recommendations are based solely upon data and information obtained by and furnished to Consultant at the time of Services.
- 2. Acceptance/Termination. Client agrees that execution of this PSA is a material element of the consideration Consultant requires to execute the Services. If Services are initiated by Consultant prior to execution of this PSA as an accommodation for Client at Client's request, both parties shall consider that commencement of Services constitutes formal acceptant of all terms and conditions of this PSA. Additional terms and conditions may be added or changed only by written amendment to this PSA signed by both parties. In the even Client uses a purchase order or other form to administer this PSA, the use of such form shall be for convenience purposes only and any additional or conflicting terms it contains are stricken. This PSA shall not be assigned by either party without prior written consent of the other party. Either party may terminate this PSA or the Services upon seven (7) days written notice to the other. In such case, Consultant shall be paid costs incurred and fees earned to the date of termination plus reasonable costs of closing the project.
- 3. Change Orders. Client may request changes to the Scope of Services by altering or adding to the Services to be performed. If Client so requests and Consultant agrees, Consultant will return to Client a statement (or supplemental proposal) of the change setting forth an adjustment to the Services and fees for the requested changes. Following Client's review, Client shall provide written acceptance. If Client does not follow these procedures, but instead directs, authorizes, or permits Consultant to perform changed or additional work, the Services are changed accordingly and Consultant will be paid for this work according to the fees stated or its current fee schedule. If project conditions change materially from those observed at the site or described to Consultant at the time of proposal, Consultant is entitled to a change order equitably adjusting its Services and fee.
- 4. Compensation and Terms of Payment. Client shall pay compensation for the Services performed at the fees stated in the Compensation section of the individual proposal, task order (which sections are incorporated into this PSA) or per the Fee Schedule attached to this PSA. If not stated in either, fees will be according to Consultant's current fee schedule. Fee schedules are valid for the calendar year in which they are issued. Fees do not include sales tax. Client will pay applicable sales tax as required by law. Consultant may invoice Client at least monthly and payment is due upon receipt of invoice. Client shall notify Consultant in writing, at the address below, within 15 days of the date of the invoice if Client objects to any portion of the charges the invoice and shall promptly pay the undisputed portion. Client shall pay a finance fee of 1.5% per month, but not exceeding the maximum rate allowed by law, for all unpaid amounts 30 days or older. Client agrees to pay all collection-related costs that Consultant incurs, including reasonable attorney fees. Consultant may suspend Services for lack of timely payment upon seven (7) days written notice until Client pays all outstanding fees and costs, including suspension charges. It is the responsibility of Client to determine whether federal, state, or local prevailing wage requirements apply and to notify Consultant if prevailing wages apply. If it is later determined that prevailing wage apply, and Consultant was not previously notified by Client, Client agrees to pay the prevailing wage from that point forward, as well as retroactive payment adjustment to bring previously paid amounts in line with prevailing wages. Client also agrees

- to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Consultant from any alleged violations made by any governmental agency regulating prevailing wage activity for failing to pay prevailing wages, including the payment of any fines or penalties.
- 5. Third Party Reliance. This PSA and the Services provided are for Consultant and Client's sole benefit and exclusive use with no third party beneficiaries intended. Reliance upon the Services and any work product is limited to Client and is not intended for third parties. For a limited time period, not to exceed three months from the date of the report, Consultant will issue additional reports to others agreed upon with Client. However, Client understands that such reliance will not be granted until those parties sign and return Consultant's reliance agreement and Consultant receives the agreed-upon reliance fee.
- 6. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY. CLIENT AND CONSULTANT HAVE EVALUATED THE RISKS AND REWARDS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS PSA, INCLUDING CONSULTANT'S FEE RELATIVE TO THE RISKS ASSUMED. TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, THE TOTAL AGGREGATE LIABILITY OF CONSULTANT (AND ITS RELATED CORPORATIONS AND EMPLOYEES) TO CLIENT IS LIMITED TO THE GREATER OF \$50,000 OR THE COMPENSATION PAID TO CONSULTANT FOR THE SPECIFIC PROJECT TASK ORDER IN DISPUTE, FOR ANY AND ALL INJURIES, DAMAGES, CLAIMS, LOSSES, OR EXPENSES (INCLUDING ATTORNEY AND EXPERT FEES) ARISING OUT OF CONSULTANT'S SERVICES OR THIS PSA. THIS LIMITATION SHALL APPLY REGARDLESS OF AVAILABLE PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE COVERAGE, CAUSE(S) OR THE THEORY OF LIABILITY, INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE, INDEMNITY, OR OTHER RECOVERY. THIS LIMITATION SHALL NOT APPLY TO THE EXTENT THE DAMAGE IS PAID UNDER CONSULTANT'S COMMERCIAL GENERAL LIABILITY POLICY. PRIOR TO ACCEPTANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT AND UPON WRITTEN REQUEST FROM CLIENT, CONSULTANT MAY NEGOTIATE A HIGHER LIMITATION FOR ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATION.
- 7. Indemnity/Statute of Limitations. Consultant and Client shall indemnify and hold harmless the other and their respective employees from and against legal liability for claims, losses, damages, and expenses to the extent such claims, losses, damages, or expenses are legally determined to be caused by their respective negligent acts, errors, or omissions. In the event such claims, losses, damages, or expenses are legally determined to be caused by the joint or concurrent negligence of Consultant and Client, they shall be borne by each party in proportion to its own negligence under comparative fault principles. Neither party shall have a duty to defend the other party, and no duty to defend is hereby created by this indemnity provision and such duty is explicitly waived under this PSA. Causes of action arising out of Consultant's services or this PSA regardless of cause(s) or the theory of liability, including negligence, indemnity or other recovery shall be deemed to have accrued and the applicable statute of limitations shall commence to run not later than the date of Consultant's substantial completion of services on the project.
- 8. Warranty. Consultant will perform the Services in a manner consistent with that level of care and skill ordinarily exercised by members of the profession currently practicing under similar conditions in the same locale. EXCEPT FOR THE STANDARD OF CARE PREVIOUSLY STATED, CONSULTANT MAKES NO WARRANTIES OR GUARANTEES, EXPRESS OR IMPLIED, RELATING TO CONSULTANT'S SERVICES, AND CONSULTANT DISCLAIMS ANY IMPLIED WARRANTIES OR WARRANTIES IMPOSED BY LAW, INCLUDING WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY AND FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE.
- 9. Insurance. Consultant represents that it now carries, and will continue to carry: (i) workers' compensation insurance in accordance with the laws of the states having jurisdiction over Consultant's employees who are engaged in the Services, and employer's liability insurance (\$1,000,000); (ii) commercial general liability insurance (\$1,000,000 occ/\$1,000,000 agg); (iii) automobile liability insurance (\$1,000,000 B.I. and P.D. combined single limit); and (iv) professional liability insurance (\$1,000,000 claim/\$2,000,000 agg). Certificates of insurance will be provided upon request. Client and Consultant shall waive subrogation against the other party on all general liability and property coverage.
- 10. CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES. NEITHER PARTY SHALL BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER FOR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO LOSS OF PROFITS OR REVENUE; LOSS OF USE OR OPPORTUNITY; LOSS OF GOOD WILL; COST OF SUBSTITUTE FACILITIES, GOODS, OR SERVICES; COST OF CAPITAL; OR FOR ANY SPECIAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, INDIRECT, PUNITIVE, OR EXEMPLARY DAMAGES.
- 11. Dispute Resolution. This PSA shall be governed by and construed according to Georgia law, without regard to any choice of law provisions. The Parties agree that exclusive jurisdiction and venue for any claims or suits arising from, by or between the Parties relating to this Agreement or the Project shall be the State or Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia.
- 12. Subsurface Explorations. Subsurface conditions throughout the site may vary from those depicted on logs of discrete borings, test pits, or other exploratory services. Client understands Consultant's layout of boring and test locations is approximate and that Consultant may deviate a reasonable distance from those locations. Consultant will take reasonable precautions to reduce damage to the site when performing Services. However, Client accepts that invasive services such as drilling or sampling may damage or alter the site. Site restoration is not provided unless specifically included in the Services.
- 13. Testing and Observations. Client understands that testing and observation are discrete sampling procedures, and that such procedures indicate conditions only at the depths, locations, and times the procedures were performed. Consultant will provide test results and opinions based on tests and field observations only for the work tested. Client understands that testing and observation are not continuous or exhaustive, and are conducted to reduce not eliminate project risk. Client agrees to the level or amount of testing performed and the associated risk. Client is responsible (even if delegated

to contractor) for requesting services, and notifying and scheduling Consultant so Consultant can perform these Services. Consultant is not responsible for damages caused by services not performed due to a failure to request or schedule Consultant's services. Consultant shall not be responsible for the quality and completeness of Client's contractor's work or their adherence to the project documents, and Consultant's performance of testing and observation services shall not relieve Client's contractor in any way from its responsibility for defects discovered in its work, or create a warranty or guarantee. Consultant will not supervise or direct the work performed by Client's contractor or its subcontractors and is not responsible for their means and methods.

- 14. Sample Disposition, Affected Materials, and Indemnity. Samples are consumed in testing or disposed of upon completion of tests (unless stated otherwise in the Services). Client shall furnish or cause to be furnished to Consultant all documents and information known or available to Client that relate to the identity, location, quantity, nature, or characteristic of any hazardous waste, toxic, radioactive, or contaminated materials ("Affected Materials") at or near the site and shall immediately transmit new, updated, or revised information as it becomes available. Client agrees that Consultant is not responsible for the disposition of Affected Material unless specifically provided in the Services, and that Client is responsible for directing such disposition. In the event that test samples obtained during the performance of Services (i) contain substances hazardous to health, safety, or the environment, or (ii) equipment used during the Services cannot reasonably be decontaminated, Client shall sign documentation (if necessary) required to ensure the equipment and/or samples are transported and disposed of properly, and agrees to pay Consultant the fair market value of this equipment and reasonable disposal costs. In no event shall Consultant be required to sign a hazardous waste manifest or take title to any Affected Materials. Client shall have the obligation to make all spill or release notifications to appropriate governmental agencies. The Client agrees that Consultant neither created nor contributed to the creation or existence of any Affected Materials conditions at the site. Accordingly, Client waives any claim against Consultant and agrees to indemnify and save Consultant, its agents, employees, and related companies harmless from any claim, liability or defense cost, including attorney and expert fees, for injury or loss sustained by any party from such exposures allegedly arising out of Consultant's non-negligent performance of services hereunder, or for any claims against Consultant as a generator. disposer, or arranger of Affected Materials under federal, state, or local law or ordinance.
- 15. Ownership of Documents. Work product, such as reports, logs, data, notes, or calculations, prepared by Consultant shall remain Consultant's property. Proprietary concepts, systems, and ideas developed during performance of the Services shall remain the sole property of Consultant. Files shall be maintained in general accordance with Consultant's document retention policies and practices.
- 16. Utilities. Client shall provide the location and/or arrange for the marking of private utilities and subterranean structures. Consultant shall take reasonable precautions to avoid damage or injury to subterranean structures or utilities. Consultant shall not be responsible for damage to subterranean structures or utilities that are not called to Consultant's attention, are not correctly marked, including by a utility locate service, or are incorrectly shown on the plans furnished to Consultant. Consultant shall be entitled to rely on said information provided by client.
- 17. Site Access and Safety. Client shall secure all necessary site related approvals, permits, licenses, and consents necessary to commence and complete the Services and will execute any necessary site access agreement. Consultant will be responsible for supervision and site safety measures for its own employees, but shall not be responsible for the supervision or health and safety precautions for any other parties, including Client, Client's contractors, subcontractors, or other parties present at the site.
