Chair Dawn Hein called the meeting to order at 6:02 P.M.

A. Vice Chair Hoffman made a motion to approve the May 2025 minutes as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Rephan, a vote was taken, and the minutes were unanimously approved.

8. Project Presentations

A. 1 E. Main Street - Alteration

Ben Harman, an owner and representative of Gravel Ridge, LLC, presented his proposal to replace two exterior doors at his property located at 1 E. Main Street, which is part of a larger renovation project throughout a majority of the structure. The proposed doors, one at the main entrance fronting on E. Main Street and the other at the entrance fronting on S. Broadway, would be plain metal doors, to replace the existing, non-original doors. As part of his presentation, Mr. Harman also provided additional historic photos of the building to the Commissioners.

In addition to the presentation by Mr. Harman, Deirdre Robertson, Executive Director of FrostburgFirst, also made comments on the businesses that will be occupying the newly renovated spaces in the building, and discussed the impact of the project and stated how the renovation of 1 E. Main Street will help transform what was once a vacant building into an active and vibrant area in downtown.

After discussion, Commissioner Determan made a motion to approve the proposal, stating "I have studied the application and all relevant documents and presentation related to this case, and I am familiar with the property in question. I find that:

The proposed changes are compatible with the neighborhood because there is a gerherar compatibility of exterior design, proportion and texture of materials to be used.

5-bay brick-finished Colonial Revival-style house with a side-gable roof and a centered entry with a single-leaf entry door. The brickwork on the main house features recessed joints with tinted black mortar. Extending across the façade is an arcaded brick porch with corbeled brick trim and a forward-projecting center bay. Windows are flat-topped, mostly 6/6, with soldier-course brick lintels with brick drip labels, a window finish seen elsewhere in the district, including immediately to the north at 65 S. Broadway. On the façade are French windows with multi-light transoms.

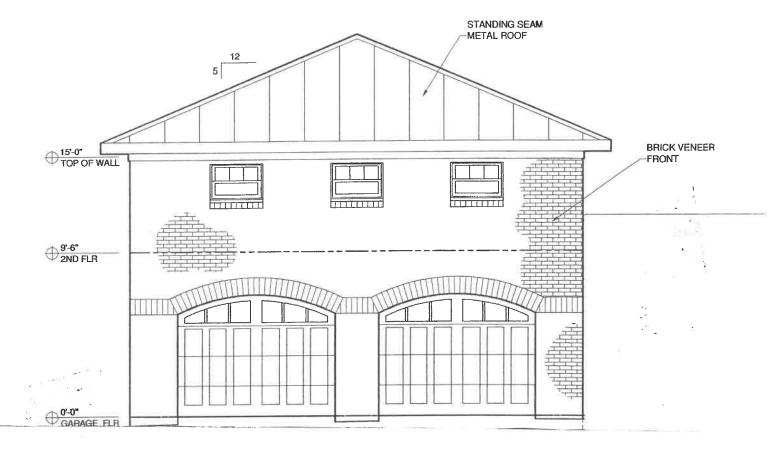

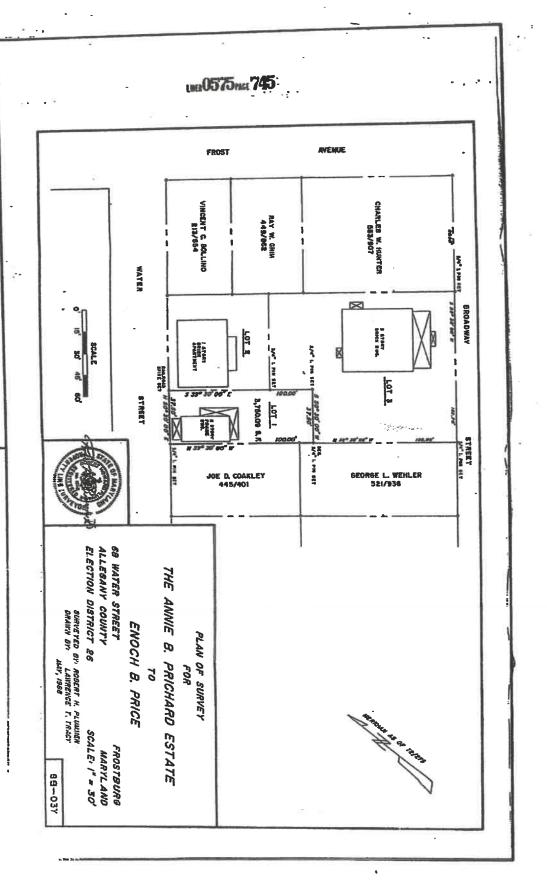
