 - C. Rosenquist made a motion to approve the 12.27.2023 minutes with corrections, N. Martin seconded.

 - T. Cleveland would like to have the discussion of gift cards added to the meeting minutes.
 - All in favor, motion carried.
- B. Approval of Warrants #35
 - N. Martin made a motion to approve Warrant #35, S. Jenkins seconded. All in favor, motion carried.
 - N. Martin makes a motion to approve General Ledger Transaction #20230303 Payroll Warrant, S. Jenkins seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

- A. Re-adoption of Ordinances Action
 - C. Rosenquist asked C. Letourneau if she has heard anything from the public. C. Letourneau said at the beginning of the meeting she had not heard anything.
 - D. Thomas said he thinks they should not take the Animal Ordinance on.
 - S. Jenkins said if they can do something, they should. D. Thomas said the state is encouraging us to do nothing.
 - C. Letourneau explained if the board adopts this ordinance, then they are liable, and will have to enforce it to the letter.
 - B. Dunsmore asked why they are even looking at this. S. Jenkins says it is because of the cows on Plains Rd. She says people are looking for a solution. D. Thomas said it is dangerous driving there.
 - C. Rosenquist made a motion to exclude cows from the Animal Ordinance.
 - C. Rosenquist withdrew his motion.
 - C. Rosenquist made a motion to prepare the public for the elimination of the Stump Dump Ordinance; S. Jenkins seconded. All in favor, motion carried.
 - C. Rosenquist made a motion to approve the Motor Vehicle and Traffic Ordinances with updated speeds, S. Jenkins seconded.
 - K. Minck pointed out in Section 9 the words "legal trail" was deleted from the ordinance but yet it is still there.
 - F. Grimm asked about "Rock Maple Rd" and asked if it should say "Rock Island Rd".
 - N. Martin made a motion to amend the approval with the corrections of deleting "Legal trails" and the proper replacement of "Rock Island Rd", C. Rosenquist seconded. All in favor, amendment carried.

- The vote was called for the original motion. All in favor, motion carried.
 - C. Rosenquist made a motion to approve the Junk Ordinance; N. Martin seconded. All in favor, motion carried.
 - S. Jenkins made a motion to accept the Legal Trails Ordinance of trails 1, 3, 4, and 5, N.
 Martin seconded. C. Rosenquist abstains, D. Thomas, S. Jenkins, N. Martin voted in favor, motion carried.
