Mayor Boles expressed gratitude for the former Mayor, Connie Kirk, who passed away recently. He stated she was a massive help to the Paluxy Music Festival, as she often volunteers for events and would be missed.

Ryan Laudermill spoke about the proposed Oncor transmission line. He wanted the City to be aware of the three different lines' placements, which may negatively affect tourism and nature areas, taking away from the city's unique character. Ryan expressed that this would be detrimental to our schools, property values, and tourism. He pointed out the city's vision statement, which expressed the value of small-town charm, and this would be the opposite of that.
