Councilor Zabinski introduced the following resolution and moved for its adoption:

### GRPUC RESOLUTION NO. 08-12-2015-01 CITY OF GRAND RAPIDS RESOLUTION NO. 15 – 57

### RESOLUTION TO AMEND RESOLUTION NO. 12-15-09-05 THAT ESTABLISHED THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GRAND RAPIDS PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION AND THE CITY OF GRAND RAPIDS FOR IN LIEU OF TAX PAYMENTS AND UTILITY SUPPLIED SERVICES

WHEREAS, The Grand Rapids Public Utilities Commission, hereinafter referred to as GRPUC, and the City of Grand Rapids, hereinafter referred to as City previously adopted Resolution No. 12-15-09-05 establishing the Agreement between the GRPUC and City for in lieu of tax payments and utilities supplied services, and

WHEREAS, The City annexed certain areas of the Township of Grand Rapids through an orderly annexation process and further desire to provide those constituents in the annexed areas municipal electric utility services where it is reasonably; financially and technically feasible, and

WHEREAS, The Minnesota Public Utilities Commission requires the negotiation of electric service territory acquisition, between electric utilities take into consideration; the depreciated value of the assets being acquired, interconnection associated costs, lost revenue reimbursements and other costs, and

WHEREAS, The City desires to reduce the costs associated with having its Utility acquire the service territory of the annexed areas and further minimize the financial impact on both current and future customers of the Utility;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City and Utility that Resolution No. 12-15-09-05 be amended as follows:

The calculation of the annual PILOT amount shall exclude all kilowatt hours sold in electric service territory acquisitions made after January 1, 2015 for a period of time equivalent to the time basis used in the lost revenue calculation; typically a period of ten (10) years from the date of the electric service territory acquisition.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That either party to this Amendment may, at any time, request modification of the terms of this Amendment by notification, in writing to the other party. The notified party agrees to meet and confer regarding the requested modification.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Amendment shall become effective and be in full force and effect following agreement to and adoption by the Grand Rapids City Council.

# **UPDATE: ERP Go-live Timeline**


### Proposed revised timelines:

- Vendor disruptions caused GRPU to an agreed revision of the SpryPoint utility billing go-live to the first week of September.
- GRPU has chosen to shift our Oracle/NS4G financials go-live to the last week of August to run parallel with the utility billing launch.
- These GRPU date adjustments do not impact the City's Oracle/NS4G schedule.

### Franchise fee billing timeline:

- September 18 for Cycle 2 (residential) for August 12 through September 11 usage
- September 25 for Cycle 3 (residential) for August 18 through September 17 usage
- October 2 for Cycle 4 (residential) for August 25 through September 24 usage
- October 9 for Cycles 1 & 5 (commercial) for September 1 through September 30 usage

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# **UPDATE:** City - GRPU Collaborative Services

### Proposed updates for the 2026 MOU:

Information Technology (IT) Services

The IT Services collaboration ended May 20, 2025, as requested by the City.

GRPW/PU Shared Facility

The original lease agreement was structured around the 20-year bond debt repayment.

Now that bonds have been retired, the focus has shifted to routine capital replacements such as roof and flooring upgrades.

GRPU finance, along with City finance and PW teams, will begin collaborative discussions in July to modernize the agreement.

#### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into on this 18th day of December 2024 between the City of Grand Rapids, Minnesota, (City) and the Grand Rapids Public Utilities (GRPU).

This MOU establishes the framework for collaboration between the City and GRPU to benefit their property taxpayers and utility ratepayers. This MOU intends to outline the various areas of collaboration as they may change over time. The Parties agree to quarterly invoicing, an annual review of the MOU, and a six-month written notice of anticipated changes. Updates and changes will be recognized in a subsequent MOU on or before December 31 of each year. The original MOU became effective on January 1, 2024. Either party may terminate the MOU with a oneyear written notice. In the absence of such notification, the latest documented revision of this MOU will remain in effect.

Now, therefore, the parties agree to the various areas of collaboration as follows:

The cost-sharing shall follow the spreadsheet template developed annually by the Key Contacts which details the proposed IS projects and system maintenance, software licenses, and utility locating services breakdown. The GIS virtual servers shall be located to the GRPU network prior to December 31, 2025.



# **Proposed ALLETE Acquisition & GRPU Power Agreements**

## Background:

- Minnesota has assigned service areas for electric utilities and their retail customers (MN Stat. 216B.37)
- GRPU is a *wholesale*, not a retail, customer of Minnesota Power (MP)
- GRPU is a board member of the Northeastern Minnesota municipal power agency (NEMMPA)
- In 2021, NEMMPA negotiated new wholesale Electric Service Agreements (ESAs) with MP
  - ESA term is January 2022 December 2029
  - ESA is for full requirements (all power supply except 2 MW solar)
  - ESA is binding for successors; assigns with prior written consent


