C.S. 3116 (T.H. 169) C.S. 3103 (T.H. 2) County of Itasca LUP # 3103-0021

Permittee: City Of Grand Rapids Expiration Date: 11/09/2026

The State of Minnesota, Department of Transportation ("MnDOT") and City Of Grand Rapids ("Permittee") entered into Limited Use Permit No. LUP # 3103-0021 ("LUP") involving the construction, maintenance and operation of a Facility as further described in the LUP.

The parties desire to <u>extend the term</u> of the LUP and the parties deem certain amendments and additional terms and conditions mutually beneficial for effective continuation of said LUP.

NOW THEREFORE

MnDOT and Permittee agree to amend the LUP with the substitution of the following terms and conditions which shall become part of the LUP.

- 1. Effective on 11/09/2026, the LUP is renewed for a period of ten (10) years commencing on 11/09/2026 and continuing through 11/09/2036 with the right of termination in MnDOT as set forth in the LUP.
- 2. Effective on 11/09/2026, Exhibit B is deleted, and the attached certified copy of the Resolution is substituted therefor.
- 3. MnDOT and Permittee agree that the electronic signature of a party to this LUP will be as valid as an original signature of such party and will be effective to bind such party to this LUP. The parties further agree that any document (including this LUP and any attachments or exhibits to this LUP) containing, or to which there is affixed, an electronic signature will be deemed (i) to be "written" or "in writing," (ii) to have been signed and (iii) to constitute a record established and maintained in the ordinary course of business and an original written record when printed from electronic files. For purposes hereof, "electronic signature" also means a manually signed original signature that is then transmitted by any electronic means, including without limitation a faxed version of an original signature or an electronically scanned and transmitted version (e.g., vis PDF) of an original signature. Any party's failure to produce the original signature of any electronically transmitted signature will not affect the enforceability of this LUP.

4. Except as specifically provided herein, the terms and conditions of the LUP are confirmed and continued in full force and effect. By this Amendment the terms and conditions herein incorporated into the LUP.

In accordance with Minnesota Statutes Section 161.434, the State of Minnesota, through its Commissioner of Transportation, ("MnDOT"), hereby grants a Limited Use Permit (the "LUP") to City Of Grand Rapids, ("Permittee"), to use the area within the right of way of Trunk Highway No. 169, 2 as shown in red on Exhibit "A", (the "Area") attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. This Limited Use Permit is executed by the Permittee pursuant to resolution, a certified copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

Municipal ID Entrance Sign

The Permittee's use of the Area is limited to only the constructing and maintaining a Municipal Identification Entrance Sign ("Facility") and the use thereof may be further limited by Minnesota Statutes Section 173.02 Subdivision 6(a) and Section 173.025. The Permittee will be allowed access from said trunk highway for the purpose of constructing and maintaining the sign. When working on the Area, the Permittee will conduct its operations in accordance with the requirements of the "Minnesota Field manual on Temporary Traffic Control Zone Layouts". No advertising of any nature is permitted on the Sign except that the Permittee may incorporate a short promotional slogan which has historically been used in the identification of the Permittee.

In addition, the following special provisions shall apply:

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

1. TERM. This LUP terminates at 11:59PM on 11/09/2026 ("Expiration Date") subject to the right of cancellation by MnDOT, with or without cause, by giving the Permittee ninety (90) days written notice of such cancellation. This LUP will not be renewed except as provided below.

Provided this LUP has not expired or terminated, MnDOT may renew this LUP for a period of up to ten (10) years, provided Permittee delivers to MnDOT, not later than ninety (90) days prior to

the Expiration Date, a written request to extend the term. Any extension of the LUP term will be under the same terms and conditions in this LUP, provided:

- (a) At the time of renewal, MnDOT will review the Facility and Area to ensure the Facility and Area are compatible with the safe and efficient operation of the highway and the Facility and Area are in good condition and repair. If, in MnDOT's sole determination, modifications and repairs to the Facility and Area are needed, Permittee will perform such work as outlined in writing in an amendment of this LUP; and
- (b) Permittee will provide to MnDOT a certified copy of the resolution from the applicable governmental body authorizing the Permittee's use of the Facility and Area for the additional term.

If Permittee's written request to extend the term is not timely given, the LUP will expire on the Expiration Date.

- 2. REMOVAL. Upon the Expiration Date or earlier termination, at the Permittee's sole cost and expense Permittee will:
 - (a) Remove the Facility and restore the Area to a condition satisfactory to the MnDOT District Engineer; and
 - (b) Surrender possession of the Area to MnDOT.

If, without MnDOT's written consent, Permittee continues to occupy the Area after the Expiration Date or earlier termination, Permittee will remain subject to all conditions, provisions, and obligations of this LUP, and further, Permittee will pay all costs and expenses, including attorney's fees, in any action brought by MnDOT to remove the Facility and the Permittee from the Area.

 CONSTRUCTION. The construction, maintenance, and supervision of the Facility shall be at no cost or expense to MnDOT.

Before construction of any kind, the plans for such construction shall be approved in writing by the MnDOT's District Engineer. Approval in writing from MnDOT District Engineer shall be required for any changes from the approved plan.

The Permittee will construct the Facility at the location shown in the attached Exhibit "A", and in accordance with MnDOT-approved plans and specifications. Further, Permittee will construct the Facility using construction procedures compatible with the safe and efficient operation of the highway.

Upon completion of the construction of the Facility, the Permittee shall restore all disturbed slopes and ditches in such manner that drainage, erosion control and aesthetics are perpetuated.

The Permittee shall preserve and protect all utilities located on the lands covered by this LUP at no expense to MnDOT and it shall be the responsibility of the Permittee to call the Gopher State One Call System at 1-800-252-1166 at least 48 hours prior to performing any excavation.

Any crossings of the Facility over the trunk highway shall be perpendicular to the centerline of the highway and shall provide and ensure reasonable and adequate stopping sight distance.

- 4. MAINTENANCE. Any and all maintenance of the Facility shall be provided by the Permittee at its sole cost and expense, including, but not limited to, plowing and removal of snow and installation and removal of regulatory signs. No signs shall be placed on any MnDOT or other governmental agency sign post within the Area. MnDOT will not mark obstacles for users on trunk highway right of way.
- 5. USE. Other than as identified and approved by MnDOT, no permanent structures or no advertising devices in any manner, form or size shall be allowed on the Area. No commercial activities shall be allowed to operate upon the Area.

Any use permitted by this LUP shall remain subordinate to the right of MnDOT to use the property for highway and transportation purposes. This LUP does not grant any interest whatsoever in land, nor does it establish a permanent park, recreation area or wildlife or waterfowl refuge Facility that would become subject to Section 4 (f) of the Federal-Aid Highway Act of I968, nor does this permit establish a Bikeway or Pedestrian way which would require replacement pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Section 160.264. No rights to relocation benefits are established by this LUP.

This LUP is non-exclusive and is granted subject to the rights of others, including, but not limited to public utilities which may occupy the Area.

- APPLICABLE LAWS. This LUP does not release the Permittee from any liability or obligation imposed by federal law, Minnesota Statutes, local ordinances, or other agency regulations relating thereto and any necessary permits relating thereto shall be applied for and obtained by the Permittee.
- 7. CIVIL RIGHTS. The Permittee, for itself, its successors, and assigns, agrees to abide by the provisions of Title VI Appendix C of the Civil Rights Act of I964, which provides in part that no person in the United States, shall on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from, or denied use of any Facility.
- 8. SAFETY. MnDOT shall retain the right to limit and/or restrict any activity, including the parking of vehicles and assemblage of Facility users, on the highway right of way over which this LUP is granted, so as to maintain the safety of both the motoring public and Facility users.
- ASSIGNMENT. No assignment of this LUP is allowed.

- 10. IN WRITING. Except for those which are set forth in this LUP, no representations, warranties, or agreements have been made by MnDOT or Permittee to one another with respect to this LUP.
- 11. ENVIRONMENTAL. The Permittee shall not dispose of any materials regulated by any governmental or regulatory agency onto the ground, or into any body of water, or into any container on the State's right of way. In the event of spillage of regulated materials, the Permittee shall notify in writing MnDOT's District Engineer and shall provide for cleanup of the spilled material and of materials contaminated by the spillage in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations, at the sole expense of the Permittee.
- 12. MECHANIC'S LIENS. The Permittee (for itself, its contractors, subcontractors, its materialmen, and all other persons acting for, through or under it or any of them), covenants that no laborers', mechanics', or materialmens' liens or other liens or claims of any kind whatsoever shall be filed or maintained by it or by any subcontractor, materialmen or other person or persons acting for, through or under it or any of them against the work and/or against said lands, for or on account of any work done or materials furnished by it or any of them under any agreement or any amendment or supplement thereto.
- 13. NOTICES. All notices which may be given, by either party to the other, will be deemed to have been fully given when served personally on MnDOT or Permittee or when made in writing addressed as follows: to Permittee at:

Statement of Work - Audit Services

This agreement constitutes a statement of work ("SOW") under the master service agreement ("MSA") dated October 25, 2024, or superseding MSA, made by and between CliftonLarsonAllen LLP ("CLA," "we," "us," and "our") and City of Grand Rapids ("you," "your," or "the entity"). We are pleased to confirm our understanding of the terms and objectives of our engagement and the nature and limitations of the services CLA will provide for the entity as of and for the year ended December 31, 2025.

Mary L Reedy is responsible for the performance of the audit engagement.

Scope of audit services

We will audit the financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, the discretely presented component unit, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information, which collectively comprise the basic financial statements of City of Grand Rapids, and the related notes to the financial statements as of and for the year ended December 31, 2025.

The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) provides for certain required supplementary information (RSI) to accompany the entity's basic financial statements.

The RSI will be subjected to certain limited procedures, but will not be audited.

We will also evaluate and report on the presentation of the supplementary information other than RSI accompanying the financial statements in relation to the financial statements as a whole.

Nonaudit services

We will also provide the following nonaudit services:

- · Preparation of your financial statements and the related notes.
- · Preparation of the required supplementary information (RSI).
- · Preparation of the supplementary information.
- · Preparation of GASB 87/96 Tool, if necessary

Audit objectives

The objectives of our audit of the financial statements are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the

financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditors' report that includes our opinion about whether your financial statements are fairly presented, in all material respects, in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAP). Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America (U.S. GAAS) will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. Misstatements, including omissions, can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the financial statements.

We will also perform procedures to enable us to express an opinion on whether the supplementary information (as identified above) accompanying the financial statements is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements as a whole.

We will apply certain limited procedures to the RSI in accordance with U.S. GAAS. However, we will not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the RSI because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance. We will also perform procedures to enable us to express an opinion on whether the supplementary information (as identified above) other than RSI accompanying the financial statements is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements as a whole.

The objectives of our audit also include:

- Reporting on internal control over financial reporting and on compliance with the provisions of laws, regulations, contracts, and award agreements, noncompliance with which could have a material effect on the financial statements in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*.

Circumstances may arise in which our report may differ from its expected form and content based on the results of our audit. Depending on the nature of these circumstances, it may be necessary for us to modify our opinions, add an emphasis-of-matter or other-matter paragraph to our auditors' report, or if necessary, withdraw from the engagement. If our opinions on the financial statements or compliance are other than unmodified, we will discuss the reasons with you in advance. If circumstances occur related to the condition of your records, the availability of sufficient, appropriate audit evidence, or the existence of a significant risk of material misstatement of the financial statements or material noncompliance caused by error, fraudulent financial reporting, or misappropriation of assets, which in our professional judgment prevent us from completing the audit or forming an opinion on the financial statements or an opinion on compliance, we retain the right to take any course of action permitted by professional standards, including declining to express opinions or issue reports, or withdrawing from the engagement.

As part of our audit, we will also perform the procedures and provide the report required by the Minnesota Legal Compliance Audit Guide for Political Subdivisions.

It is our understanding that our auditors' report will be included in your annual report which is comprised of the financial statements and that your annual report will be issued June 30, 2026. Our responsibility for other information included in your annual report does not extend beyond the financial information

identified in our opinion on the financial statements. We have no responsibility for determining whether such other information is properly stated and do not have an obligation to perform any procedures to corroborate other information contained in your annual report. We are required by professional standards to read the other information and consider whether a material inconsistency exists between the other information and the financial statements because the credibility of the financial statements and our auditors' report thereon may be undermined by material inconsistencies between the audited financial statements and other information. If, based on the work performed, we conclude that an uncorrected material misstatement of the other information exists, we are required to describe it in our report.

Auditor responsibilities, procedures, and limitations

Those standards require that we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the planning and performance of the audit. As part of our audit, we will:

- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements and material noncompliance, whether due to fraud or error, design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks, and evaluate whether audit evidence obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement or a material noncompliance resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control.
- Obtain an understanding of the entity and its environment, including the system of internal control, relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. However, we will communicate to you in writing any significant deficiencies or material weaknesses in internal control relevant to the audit of the financial statements that we have identified during the audit.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the financial statements, including the amounts and disclosures, and whether the financial statements represent the underlying transactions and events in a manner that achieves fair presentation.
- Conclude, based on our evaluation of audit evidence obtained, whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the entity's ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

Although our audit planning has not been concluded and modifications may be made, we have identified the following significant risk(s) of material misstatement as part of our audit planning:

- Management override of internal controls
- Improper revenue recognition

Tests of controls may be performed to test the effectiveness of certain controls that we consider relevant to preventing and detecting fraud or errors that are material to the financial statements and to preventing and

objectives are met; and that there is reasonable assurance that government programs are administered in compliance with compliance requirements.

You agree to inform us of events occurring or facts discovered subsequent to the date of the financial statements that may affect the financial statements.

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of other supplementary information in accordance with U.S. GAAP. You agree to include our report on the supplementary information in any document that contains, and indicates that we have reported on, the supplementary information. You also agree to include the audited financial statements with any presentation of the supplementary information that includes our report thereon or make the audited financial statements readily available to users of the supplementary information no later than the date the supplementary information is issued with our report thereon. You agree to provide us written representations related to the presentation of the supplementary information.

Management is responsible for the preparation of other information included in your annual report. You agree to provide the final version of such information to us in a timely manner, and if possible, prior to the date of our auditors' report. If the other information included in your annual report will not be available until after the date of our auditors' report on the financial statements, you agree to provide written representations indicating that (1) the information is consistent with the financial statements, (2) the other information does not contain material misstatements, and (3) the final version of the documents will be provided to us when available, and prior to issuance of the annual report by the entity, so that we can complete the procedures required by professional standards. Management agrees to correct material inconsistencies that we may identify. You agree to include our auditors' report in any document containing financial statements that indicates that such financial statements have been audited by us.

Management is responsible for providing us with a written confirmation concerning representations made by you and your staff to us in connection with the audit and the presentation of the basic financial statements and RSI. During our engagement, we will request information and explanations from you regarding, among other matters, the entity's activities, internal control, future plans, specific transactions, and accounting systems and procedures. The procedures we will perform during our engagement and the conclusions we reach as a basis for our report will be heavily influenced by the representations that we receive in the representation letter and otherwise from you. Accordingly, inaccurate, incomplete, or false representations could cause us to expend unnecessary effort or could cause a material fraud or error to go undetected by our procedures. In view of the foregoing, you agree that we shall not be responsible for any misstatements in the entity's financial statements that we may fail to detect as a result of misrepresentations made to us by you.

Management is responsible for establishing and maintaining a process for tracking the status of audit findings and recommendations. Management is also responsible for identifying and providing report copies to us of previous financial audits, attestation engagements, performance audits, or other studies related to the objectives discussed in the "Audit objectives" section of this letter. This responsibility includes relaying to us corrective actions taken to address significant findings and recommendations resulting from those audits, attestation engagements, performance audits, or other engagements or studies. You are also responsible for providing management's views on our current findings, conclusions, and recommendations,

as well as your planned corrective actions for the report, and for the timing and format for providing that information.

Responsibilities and limitations related to nonaudit services

For all nonaudit services we may provide to you, management agrees to assume all management responsibilities; oversee the services by designating an individual, preferably within senior management, who possesses suitable skill, knowledge, and/or experience to understand and oversee the services; evaluate the adequacy and results of the services; and accept responsibility for the results of the services.

Management is also responsible for ensuring that your data and records are complete and that you have received sufficient information to oversee the services.

Use of financial statements

Should you decide to include or incorporate by reference these financial statements and our auditors' report(s) thereon in a future private placement or other offering of equity or debt securities, you agree that we are under no obligation to re-issue our report or provide consent for the use of our report in such a registration or offering document. We will determine, at our sole discretion, whether we will re-issue our report or provide consent for the use of our report only after we have performed the procedures we consider necessary in the circumstances. If we decide to re-issue our report or consent to the use of our report, we will be required to perform certain procedures including, but not limited to, (a) reading other information incorporated by reference in the registration statement or other offering document and (b) subsequent event procedures. These procedures will be considered an engagement separate and distinct from our audit engagement, and we will bill you separately. If we decide to re-issue our report or consent to the use of our report, you agree that we will be included on each distribution of draft offering materials and we will receive a complete set of final documents. If we decide not to re-issue our report or decide to withhold our consent to the use of our report, you may be required to engage another firm to audit periods covered by our audit reports, and that firm will likely bill you for its services. While the successor auditor may request access to our workpapers for those periods, we are under no obligation to permit such access.

If the parties (i.e., you and CLA) agree that CLA will not be involved with your official statements related to municipal securities filings or other offering documents, we will require that any official statements or other offering documents issued by you with which we are not involved clearly indicate that CLA is not involved with the contents of such documents. Such disclosure should read as follows:

CliftonLarsonAllen LLP, our independent auditor, has not been engaged to perform and has not performed, since the date of its report included herein, any procedures on the financial statements addressed in that report. CliftonLarsonAllen LLP also has not performed any procedures relating to this offering document.

BACKGROUND:

This fall marked the retirement of Steve Ross, whose connection to Pokegama Golf Course began during his time at Sugar Lake Golf Course. After supporting both courses, Steve transitioned in 2016 to an independent contractor role with Pokegama Golf Course, where he spent the next nine years leading course maintenance and operations.

Throughout his years of service, Steve played an instrumental role in the care and maintenance of Pokegama Golf Course, its grounds, and its equipment. He consistently upheld high standards of quality, managed staff and budgets, and provided steady leadership across all aspects of course operations. Steve's commitment and expertise has made a lasting impact, and he will be greatly missed. We wish him all the best in his well-deserved retirement.

The Golf Course Superintendent position is currently vacant. We are requesting authorization for Human Resources to begin the process of posting internally, interviewing, and hiring for this role. The position will be a full-time exempt position, classified at Grade 6, with a 2026 salary range of \$48,139 to \$64,336, reflecting a 5% increase from the 2025 salary range.

All costs associated with this position are included in the 2026 budget.

Position Summary

BACKGROUND:

In 2021, the City of Grand Rapids entered a 5-year contract with Axon for 15 body worn cameras (BWC's), 15 Tasers, 14 in squad cameras, and Axon's digital evidence management system (evidence.com) for the Grand Rapids Police Department.

The benefit of all GRPD officers having BWC's, the same model of tasers, in-squad cameras, and several additional software programs that have improved our management of digital evidence and accountability, we have approached council several times to approve additional purchases. Currently we have 22 BWC's, 22 Tasers', 16 in squad cameras. This allows every officer, and the community assistance officer to have a BWC and Taser, and all GRPD patrol squads to have an in-squad camera.

Since 2021 all GRPD's digital evidence, including BWC/in-squad camera footage, photographs, and audio recordings is stored on Axon's evidence.com. The Itasca County Sheriff's Office, MN State Patrol, all other police agencies in Itasca County, the Itasca County Attorney's Office, and the Grand Rapids City Attorney utilize Axon for digital evidence. This makes sharing digital evidence with other agencies and prosecuting attorneys a uniform and efficient process.

The original contract with Axon expires in 2026. Axon approached GRPD with options to combine the 10 contracts we currently have with Axon into a single contract and offered a 10-year contract with locked in pricing. This contract provides GRPD with new BWC's, Taser's, and in-squad cameras at the start of the contract and provides new BWC's every 2.5 years, new Tasers in-squad camera refreshes at year 5 and year 10.

This contract it will lock the City into a consistent price to be able to have predictable budgeting for the Axon line item for the next 10 years, at the price of \$78,872.33 for 2026, which is included in the 2026 preliminary budget, and \$106,276.82 per year for the remaining 9 years.

BACKGROUND:

A proposed preliminary plat entitled Crystal Lake Estates Second Addition was submitted by the Grand Rapids Economic Development Authority on October 6, 2025.

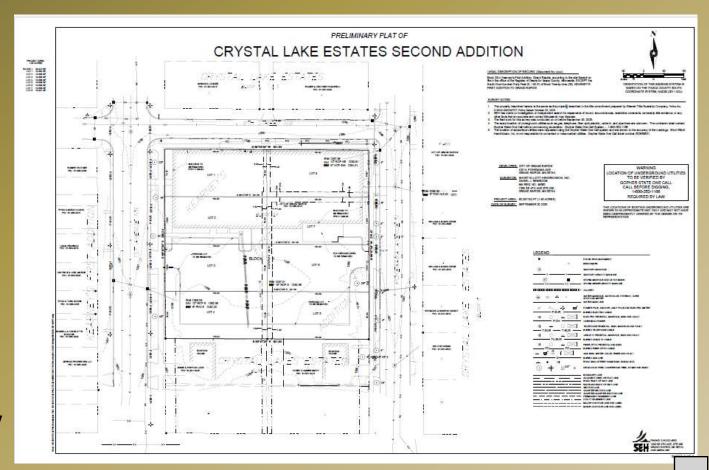

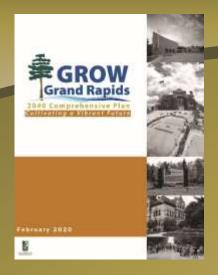

Some key development and redevelopment parcels that were addressed during the planning process include the following sites.

Forest Lake Elementary School Site

The former Forest Lake Elementary School site is located on the west side of downtown Grand Rapids. The location of the site makes it a target for either future single-family or multi-family residential usedue to its proximity to the downtown and surrounding traditional neighborhood uses.

Former Ainsworth Industrial Site

The former Aindworth site currently sits vacant along the western portion of the community, with rail access and proximity to US Highway 2. The site contains existing buildings and infrastructure that can be modified to accommodate a range of future uses. The site and existing buildings are large and may warrant the accommodation of multiple uses.

Grand Itasca Clinic and Hospital

Industrial Parks

The future land use map shows several additions to the City's industrial parks and other industrial expansion areas. Housing and Neighborhood Diversity

The planning process was cognizent of the City's and region's changing demographics, changes in industries and potential changes in immigration patterns. The future land use map and categories were created to support a range of insulaing types and to accommodate a variety of interconnected neighborhoods.

Future Development Considerations

The future land use map and corresponding estegories serve as the legal basis for zoning decisions within the CRy. While these components serve as the foundation for decision making, there are other considerations that should be included throughout the development process. The following considerations can simply be used during the development review process or the City may choose to develop/modify policy and regulations to require the consideration of these elements through the development process.

Residential Development

The maintenance of a healthy, infloritable and vibrant housing stock is a key consideration for cities throughout the State of Minnesota. Grand Rapids is home to existing vibrant neighborhoods where a range of qualify, type and affordshifty must be maintained for future recidents. The future land use plan uses four residential land use categories to guide future residential development – from large lot single-family to multifamily development. As the Oby continues for pursue recidential growth to maintain a range of options for future and current residential, the qualify and character of the residential development should be considered.

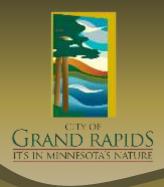

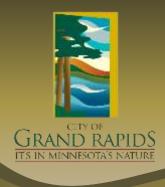

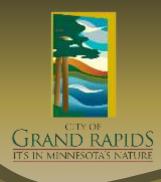
