- Increase their awareness of breast cancer risk, prevention, early detection, and treatment;
- Encourage and support those affected by breast cancer;

It is possible I don't have my facts correct - and I am open to correction. And - as I understand things - from people I know who organized the recent May Day event on Mill Street - I understand they received critical correspondence from the City of Grass Valley regarding their event. This despite - as I understand it - having received permission and permits prior to the event. (on this - I could be mistaken)

Contrast that with the recent memorial on Mill Street, public property, for the murdered Charlie Kirk. As an African-American resident of Nevada County, and one who spends much time (and money) in Grass Valley. I find that more than problematic. I am not aware the conveners of the memorial received the same scrutiny and treatment as the May Day organizers.

The murder of Mr. Kirk is a tragic event - alongside a long list of homicides by gun each year (about 38 per day). And - Mr. Kirk espoused a level of disdain, cruelty and harmful rhetoric toward African-Americans that is frankly - despicable. Same is true of his comments about LGTBQ and immigrants. That public property is utilized for such a person is highly improper.


I was a public servant for 42 years and Public Works Director for 42. During my tenure we went out of our way to not show a partisan preference in our appearance, values and work. Otherwise - for local government to do so - or at least look like it does - alienates some portion of the public they are paid to serve. In addition - honoring Mr. Kirk on public property is not just partisan - his message; and frankly his followers - espouse views that frankly to me and many others - are frightening.

People are free to mourn Mr. Kirk - yet - I don't believe public property is the appropriate place - especially the marvelous mall on Mill Street.

So people with disabilities are unable to access the studios upstairs. People with disabilities are unable to bring their children to dance classes upstairs, And it shouldn't be on disabled people in our community to have to advocate for something that is legally required of that business. <u>Background Information</u>: As part of the Parks Project and Refunding lease agreement approved by Council in November 2021, Staff has been working to enact the vision of new and upgraded sports facilities, including a state of the art, lit, multi-sport field. The City's permit application was recently approved by the Division of State Architect (DSA) for the construction of a complete sports lighting system at the Lyman Gilmore turf field. Work at the School would occur as part of the long-term agreement with the Grass Valley School District which allows the City to develop and operate the fields as a public space outside of school hours.

As listed in the DSA application, the City proposes installing a complete Light-Structure System manufactured by Musco Sports Lighting, LLC. Musco is a word leader in sports lighting solutions and is also an approved Sourcewell supplier, a cooperative purchasing agency which conducts competitive solicitations on behalf of government agencies. This allows the City to contract with Musco without repeating the timely procurement process and Staff proposes to purchase the system directly from Musco and then contract separately for the prep work, installation and associated improvements.

Staff recommends that Council approve the purchase of a complete field Light-Structure System from Musco Sports Lighting, LLC and authorize the City Engineer to execute a purchase agreement with Musco in an amount not to exceed \$225,000. If approved, delivery of the lighting system is expected in 8-10 weeks and Staff would look to contract for installation over the winter, weather permitting.

<u>Council Goals/Objectives</u>: The purchase and installation of a new field lighting system executes portions of work tasks towards achieving/maintaining Strategic Plan Goal - Recreation & Parks.

<u>Fiscal Impact</u>: The purchase and installation of lighting system was fully funded in the FY 24/25 Capital Improvement Program Budget.

<u>Background Information</u>: In 2023, the City was awarded \$319,847.94 in Proposition 1, Round 2 IRWM Implementation grant funds to restore a portion of the Magenta Drain running through Memorial Park. The Magenta Drain Restoration Project will restore a stretch of creek that runs through Memorial Park that has been fenced off and neglected for many years. At one time, the waterway was contaminated by runoffs from the Empire Mine site, but with recent remediation efforts by the State and the City of Grass Valley, the creek now runs clean again. In February 2025, the City contracted Dudek consulting firm to provide design and environmental services for the restoration project. Dudek has prepared a conceptual design that includes:

- Removal of perimeter fencing to improve public access.
- Removal of nonnative invasive vegetation.
- · Replanting of native riparian vegetation.
- Realign the creek in various areas.
- Removal of the retaining wall and replacing it with vegetated rip rap.
- Adding streambed boulders and cobbles.
- Installing creek access points with concrete steps and boulder crossings.
- Adding crushed gravel trail adjacent to the creek.

<u>Council Goals/Objectives</u>: The Magenta Drain Restoration Project executes portions of work tasks towards achieving/maintaining the Strategic Plan Goal - Recreation and Parks.



Background Information: The gas station at 2001 Nevada City Highway was constructed around 1980 when the property was in the jurisdiction of Nevada County. The monument sign appears to have been installed around 1990. Most recently, the site has been operated by the gas company, Speedway. The property owner has decided to rebrand as a Shell station. In the process of this rebranding, and in reviewing the proposed signage, staff determined that several proposed signage features, all having to do with lighting, were in conflict with the signage code.

Applicant Sal Pablo, on behalf of SEI Fuel Services, applied for a sign exception permit in August 2025. The application included the following three sign exception requests to allow for the following sign features:

- A light bar proposed around the perimeter of the two pump canopies;
- An internally illuminated price sign; and
- An internally illuminated "Shell" symbol on the two canopies at three locations, as well as on the monument sign.

The Development Review Committee reviewed the sign exception at its meeting on September 9, 2025, and unanimously recommended that the Planning Commission approve the internally illuminated price signage, as well as the internally illuminated "Shell" symbol signage. However, the committee recommended against approving the light bar proposed around the canopy structures citing that they could not make the required finding that the feature "enhances the building architecture."

The planning commission reviewed the sign exception at their meeting on September 16, 2025 and they approved only the price sign illumination and denied both the illuminated logos and the illuminated light bars around the canopies.

The applicant filed an appeal of the decision to deny the illuminated "Shell" signs only. Their appeal form and correspondence to staff have indicated they are only seeking overturning of the decision to deny the illuminated "Shell" signage at three locations on the two canopies and on the monument

sign. They have indicated that they are open to reducing light levels during nighttime hours as may be specified by City Council.

<u>Regulatory Authority:</u> Section 17.38.050 of the City Municipal Code prohibits internally illuminated signage "except where authorized by a sign exception permit and determined by the review authority to constitute a design element that is integrated with and enhances building architecture."

Pursuant to Table 3-9 GVMC, a sign exception permit may be granted by the planning commission, with a recommendation by the Development Review Committee, when a sign "exceeds standards specified in the sign ordinance." In this case, the proposed signage exceeds the standard of prohibiting internally illuminated signage and explicitly states that it can only be allowed with a sign exception permit.

Environmental Determination: The proposed project qualifies for a Categorical Exemption pursuant to Section 15301, Class 1, of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and Guidelines. A Class 1 Categorical Exemption consists of the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alternation of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of use beyond that existing at the time of the lead agency's determination. The proposed sign exception is intended to aid in navigation to the business and will not result in an expansion of use of the commercial property on which it will be located.

<u>Council Goals/Objectives</u>: This appeal is not in support of a specified strategic goal but is a required step in the applicant's due process for a sign exception application.
