
PROJECT BASIS

PUBLIC INPUT

- Connectivity & Congestion
 - Improved access to/from Eagle Crossing
 - Alternate east-west route from 6th to Bootlegger
 - Gaps in sidewalk ADA ramps
 - Congestion at US 87 & Bootlegger
- Operations & Safety
 - Skyline Drive sight distance, speeds
 - 36th Ave speeds, backing out of driveways
 - Narrow streets with on-street parking










TRAFFIC MODELING

- Baseline Scenario (2040)
 - 10%-45% growth typical throughout
 - Heavy growth on 6th north of Skyline
 - Extension of 36th to 6th would limit demand along Skyline
- Traffic patterns/operations
 - LOS projected to still br excellent for all scenarios






STREET NETWORK (BASELINE)
