Item 7A RIFLE LEASE PURCHASING PROGRAM - BUDGET AMENDMENT The Director of Public Services, in his memo dated February 25, 2022, is requesting a budget amendment to implement a rifle lease purchasing program. The program is an essential upgrade to the operations of the department. It has been determined that an officer's shooting accuracy greatly improves when provided with their own specific rifle which they are familiar with.

The majority of the requested funds will be returned to the City within the next two years as the funds for each officer's rifle package, with the exception of \$1.00, will be deducted from their paychecks at an estimated cost of \$43.00 over the next 52 pay periods. The remaining \$1.00 will be deducted at the time that the officer leaves the

department, upon which time they will assume full possession of the rifle package. The estimated cost per package, which includes the rifle, suppressor, weapon light, three magazines, and a rifle bag is \$2,237.00.

The Rifle Lease Purchasing Program has been reviewed by both City Attorney Walling and Tokio Marine HCC Public Risk Group Insurance Agency and neither had any concerns.

Sons of Liberty Gun Works (Loyal 9 Manufacturing) was chosen as the rifle manufacturer for their quality control, manufacturing processes, and lifetime warranty on the rifle. If any officer is without their firearm for any reason, they will provide that officer with an equivalent loaner until their weapon is returned. The department would be purchasing the EOTECH sights for each officer. An upgrade to the Aimpoint T-2 Ready would be available to the officers, however, they would be responsible for payment of the price difference between the two products, which amounts to \$314.73.

The total cost of the program is \$76,152.72 of which \$53,688.00 will be paid out of General Fund and charged to a receivable that will be reduced as the employee pays for the rifle through payroll deduction. The remaining \$22,464.72 of the total cost is not included in the FY 21/22 budget, therefore, requiring a budget amendment.

The director is requesting Council's approval of the implementation of the Rifle Lease Purchasing Program and the authorization of a budget amendment in the amount of \$22,464.72 from the General Funds Balance Account 101-000-699.000, Transfer from Prior Year Reserve, into account 101-310-757.000, Operating Supplies – Police Services.

I concur with his recommendation and do not believe any benefit will accrue to the City by seeking further bids.

Prerogative of the City Council to approve the implementation of the Rifle Lease Purchasing Program with a total cost of \$76,152.72 and authorize a budget amendment in the amount of \$22,464.72 from the General Funds Balance Account 101-000-699.000, Transfer from Prior Year Reserve, into account 101-310-757.000, Operating Supplies – Police Services.

Item 7B <u>BULLETPROOF VESTS - PURCHASE</u> The Director of Public Services, in his memo dated February 25, 2022, is requesting to purchase a total of seventeen (17) bullet proof vests to replace vests due to expire in June.

Section 56.4C of the 2019-2022 Collective Bargaining Agreement states that the city will provide subsequent replacements of bulletproof vests for full-time employees in line with the vest manufacturer's standards. The manufacturer of our current vests recommends replacement after five (5) years. In addition, the department has a mandatory wear policy for officers assigned to field duty activities when in full uniform.

The vests would be purchased from On Duty Gear, LLC in Clinton Township, Michigan. They are a sole vendor with a current MiDeal contract with the State of

Michigan. MiDeal is an extended purchasing program which allows Michigan local government units to use state contracts to purchase goods and services.

The cost for a set of concealable carriers, soft trauma places, and panel sets is \$660.00 for a total cost of \$11,220.00. Half the cost of each vest is expected, but not guaranteed, to be returned through the Department of Justice Bulletproof Vest Partnership Grant.

The Director recommends approval of the purchase of seventeen (17) bullet proof vests from On Duty Gear, LLC, in the amount of \$11,220.00.

I concur with his recommendation. This is a budgeted item included in the FY 21/22 budget and do not believe any benefit will accrue to the City by seeking further bids.

Prerogative of the City Council to approve the purchase of seventeen (17) bullet proof vests from On Duty Gear, LLC - 44315 N. Groesbeck Hwy., Clinton Township, MI 48036 in the amount of \$11,220.00 with funds to be taken from the Clothing/Uniform Allowance Account No. 101-345-725.000.

Subject: Request for Budget Amendment for the Implementation of a Rifle Lease Purchasing Program

The Department of Public Safety is requesting a budget amendment for the purpose of implementing a rifle lease purchasing program. This program is an essential upgrade to the operations of the department. It has been determined that the shooting accuracy of each officer would greatly improve if they had their own specific rifle which they were familiar with. As active shooter situations increase throughout the country, it is important for each officer to be as ready as possible to react with proficiency in matters where split-second decisions are required.

The majority of the requested funds for the program will be returned to the City within the next two years as the funds for each officer's rifle package, with the exception of \$1.00, will be deducted from their paychecks at an estimated cost of \$43.00 over the next 52 pay periods. The remaining \$1.00 will be deducted at the time that the officer leaves the department, upon which time they will assume full possession of the rifle package. The estimated cost per package, which includes the rifle, suppressor, weapon light, three magazines, and a rifle bag is \$2,237.00.

The Rifle Lease Program has been reviewed by both City Attorney Debra A. Walling of Rosati, Schultz, Joppich & Amtsbuechler and the Tokio Marine HCC Public Risk Group Insurance agency. There were no concerns from either the city attorney or the insurance company.

Sons of Liberty Gun Works was chosen as the rifle manufacturer because of their quality control and manufacturing processes, and lifetime warranty on the rifle, including the barrel and all small parts. If any officer is without their firearm for any reason, including evidentiary procedures, Sons of Liberty Gun Works will provide that officer/agency with an equivalent loaner until their weapon is returned. The department would be purchasing the EOTECH sights for each officer. An upgrade to the Aimpoint T-2 Ready would be available to the officers however they would be responsible for payment of the price difference between the two products, which amounts to \$314.73.

Funding for the rifle program will require a budget amendment of \$22,464.72 to cover the cost of the expense that the City will incur. The remaining amount of \$53,688.00 will not require a budget amendment. This amount will be paid out of General Fund and charged to a receivable that will reduced as the employee pays for the rifle through payroll deduction.

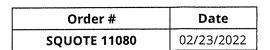

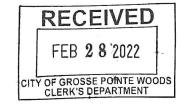

Subject: Request to Purchase Bulletproof Vests



The department is requesting to purchase a total of seventeen (17) bulletproof vests to replace vests which will expire in June. Six of the vests are for members of the Command Staff and the other eleven are for Public Safety Officers.

Section 56.4 C of the 2019-2022 Collective Bargaining Agreement states that the city will provide subsequent replacements of bulletproof vests for full-time employees in line with the vest manufacturer's standards. The manufacturer of our current vests recommends replacement after five (5) years. In addition, the department has a mandatory wear policy for officers assigned to field duty activities when in full uniform.

The vests would be purchased from On Duty Gear, LLC in Clinton Township, Michigan. On Duty Gear is a Police/ Military/ Fire and EMS uniform and equipment supplier and is the sole vendor with a current MiDeal contract with the State of Michigan. MiDeal is an extended purchasing program which allows Michigan local government units to use state contracts to purchase goods and services.

The cost for set of concealable carriers, soft trauma plates, and panel sets is \$660.00 for a total cost of \$11,220.00. The items are sold as a package at a substantially lower cost than if each were to be purchased individually. Our last major vest purchase with On Duty Gear was approved at the City Council meeting on October 18, 2021 after doing a price comparison with Vance Outdoors, Inc. of Obetz, Ohio, a vendor which the department had used in the past for vest purchases.

Half the cost of each vest is expected, but not guaranteed, to be returned through the Department of Justice Bulletproof Vest Partnership Grant.

Therefore, I am requesting Council to authorize the purchase of seventeen bulletproof vests from On Duty Gear, LLC, 44315 N. Groesbeck Hwy., Clinton Township, MI 48036 in the amount of \$11,220.00. This is a budgeted item in the 2021/2022 fiscal year budget in the Clothing/Uniform Allowance account number 101-345-725.000.
