Supervisor Tollisen: The first item on the agenda this evening is a presentation, and I'd like to call on David Maxfield, the President of the Halfmoon Celebrations Association, thank you all for the great job you do throughout the year, and we are happy that you are here with us.

Dave Maxfield: Dave Maxfield, 84 Guideboard Road.

Good evening. My name is David Maxfield, and I am a volunteer on Halfmoon Celebrations Association. Supervisor Tollisen: The next item on our agenda is a presentation on the Button Road Culvert Replacement Project, and I will ask our Engineer Dan Ekert from M.J. Engineering to do the presentation. Good evening and welcome.

Dan Ekert, P.E. Associate Bridge Group Manager, M.J. Engineering: Good evening, thank you for having me. I will try to make this as quick and informative as possible. We are here to discuss the placement of the Button Road Culvert. We were contacted by the Town to do a culvert inspection, and this came at a good time because NYS DOT was releasing applications for Culvert NY funding which provides up to 1.5 million dollars of funding for municipalities. The Town of Halfmoon expressed interest and M.J. was successful in submitting the application and obtaining monies, which was announced by Governor Hochul as of July this project received 1.499 million and this includes Construction, Design, Right-of Way, and Construction Inspection. We are hoping to have construction done in the summer of 2026 to avoid any conflicts with the schools.

PRESENTATION:BUTTON ROAD CULVERT REPLACEMENT PROJECT

PIN 1762.71 – Replacement of Button Road Culvert


MJ Project #: 1558

Button Road Culvert is an existing squashed corrugated metal pipe (CMP) that is approximately 11-foot W x 9-foot H. It is currently experiencing degradation to the invert of the pipe with section loss progressing. There is also a scour hole that has developed at the outlet, causing failure of the precast block wing walls and sloughing of the roadway embankment above.

MJ Engineering, Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Surveying, P.C. (MJ) was contracted by the Town to develop the grant application for New York's Bridge/Culvert NY program. This project was awarded \$1.499 Million to cover design, Right-of-Way, Construction Inspection, and Construction to replace the existing culvert.


MJ has completed the initial preliminary design phase, developed possible alternatives and determined the more efficient and effective alternative to continue through to final design. The preferred alternative is a 20-foot W x 10-foot H precast box culvert with a different slope to better accommodate the stream channel, while meeting the necessary environmental requirements.

The meeting tonight is to provide an update on the project, the findings, associated impacts with the preferred alternative, and the rest of the project schedule.

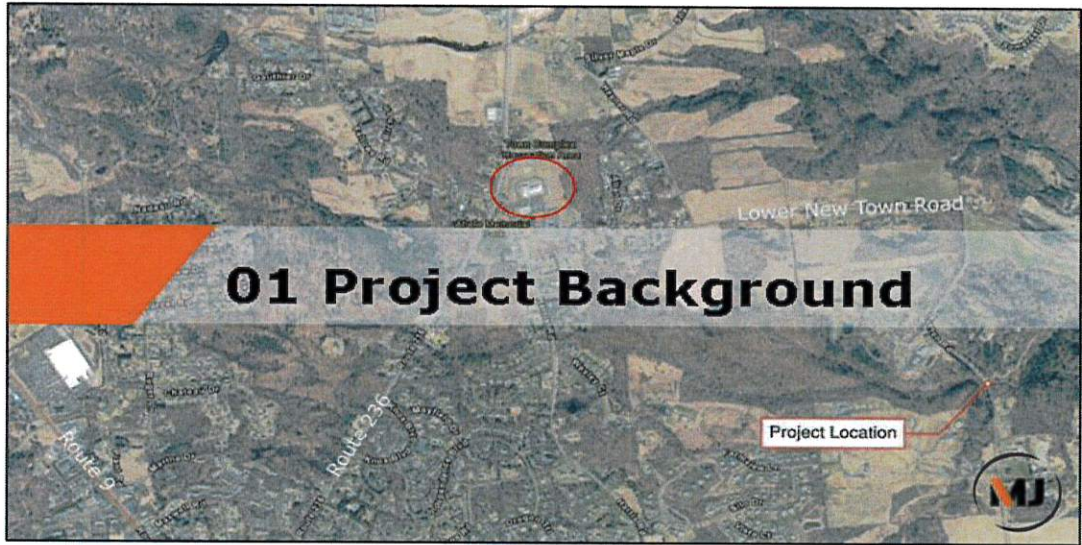

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Timeline




- 01 Culvert Inspection**

MJ performed a structural inspection on November 30, 2022 after being contracted by Town of Halfmoon due to concerns of the condition of the culvert and downstream erosion.
- 02 Culvert NY Funding**

December 2022; Town wanted to pursue NYSDOT Culvert NY funding for the replacement the culvert after the inspection. The Town released an Expression of Interest to Consultants.
- 03 Culvert NY Application**

MJ was successful in the pursuit of the Expression of Interest and developed the Grant Application for February 2023.
- 04 Grant Funding Approval**

July 5, 2023 Governor Hochul announced the winners of the funding. Button Road received \$1.499 Million to be replaced.





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Inspection

Advanced deterioration of the pipe's invert for the entire length of the culvert. Loss of galvanization with subsequent section loss of the corrugations.



The downstream end of the culvert is approximately 4' above the stream channel due to scour. It has caused the precast wingwall blocks to fail at the outlet and there is considerable bank erosion downstream of culvert.

The failed wingwalls, along with the scour pond, is causing advanced erosion to the roadway slopes. Noticeable sloughing of the roadway embankment was observed above the corrugated metal pipe.



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02 Development of Alternatives



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Design Objectives



Service Life
Requirement of the BridgeNY funding is that the culvert needs to have a minimum service life of 50 years



Hydraulic Vulnerability
Mitigate the existing scour and erosion issues. Remove the scour hole and mitigate bank erosion.



Minimize Right-of-Way Impacts
The outlet of the existing structure is actually outside the existing Town owned Highway Boundary. Attempted to keep permanent features within Town owned property.




Maintenance Costs
Proposed Structure to minimize future maintenance costs for the Town in addition to providing the 50-year service life.




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Analysis of Project Site




Survey
Locate property lines, topography utility locations, etc.




Geotechnical Investigations
Completed three (3) borings to develop a subsurface stratigraphy for which the structure will be built upon.




Utility Research
Placed a Design Ticket to identify the number and owners of existing utilities; Overhead Lines and a Town Waterline.




Hydraulic Analysis
Determined the proper sizing for the structure to accommodate the design storm events, as well as properly protect the streambed and adjacent tanks.



Environmental/Cultural Impacts
Coordination with NYSDOT, SHPO, FHWA, and NYSDEC to confirm there is no adverse affect by the project. Included Wetland assessment.



Preliminary Cost Estimates
Develop preliminary estimates of the design alternatives to compare to the grant amount and between each alternative. The grant amount is \$1.044 Million for Construction.





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Structure Options

Precast Box Culvert: 4-sided structure, embedded into the streambed. Ease of installation, low maintenance, precast elements for longer durability. **Estimated Cost: \$1.001 Million**

Precast Three-Sided Frame: Would provide the natural streambed with low maintenance, and precast elements; but would require piles at the abutments, inflating the cost. **Estimated Cost: \$1.755 Million**

Corrugated Metal Pipe Arch: Similar structure to the existing, which would lead to the same durability issues as the existing one; would require Cast-in-place headwalls/wingwalls. Does not sufficiently address the current hydraulic issues. **Estimated Cost: \$991,000**



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03 Preferred Alternative





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Precast Box Culvert

Replacement structure will be:

- 20W ft x 10H ft precast box, with 2 ft embedded to meet the need of a natural streambed material.
- Proper Concrete wingwalls and headwalls to protect and support the roadway banks.
- Proper scour protection to mitigate the erosion concerns.
- Meets almost all four (4) project objectives.




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Travel

During Construction, there will be a full detour. This will allow for quicker and more durable construction with the elimination of construction joints at stage lines.

Approximately 3.8 miles from either side of Button Road.

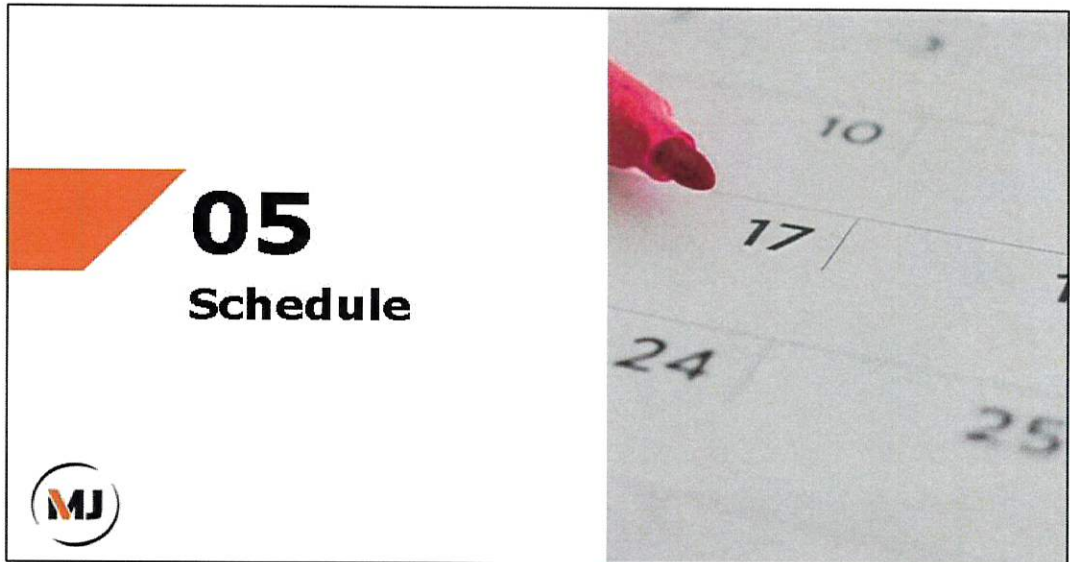
Overhead lines –

A buried Town of Halfmoon Waterline in the shoulder line is also present at the site, approximately 5 feet below the existing culvert. Should not be affected but will play into the final culvert's slope and location.

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Supervisor Tollisen: Any questions of the Board?

Deputy Supervisor Hotaling: How far back are you going to have to reinforce the structure? How far back are you going to have to go from the road?

Dan Ekert: Probably 15 feet ish on either other side. We will put taller wing walls to bring the culvert in. Currently the culvert is about 100 feet, and we are planning on putting in a 60-foot culvert.

Deputy Supervisor Hotaling: Being that you are planning on putting in a box culvert, you are not going to have to worry about 500-year floods?

Dan Ekert: that's our hydraulic analysis, we did go through that. We currently have a two-foot free board for the 50-year flood that does pass the 100-year flood fully

through, the 50-year may be up higher , but we are armoring the embankments enough where it should not be too big of a concern.

Deputy Supervisor Hotaling: With the box design we should be...

Dan Ekert: The box should be more sufficient to handle it.

Deputy Supervisor Hotaling: Thank you.

Councilman Connors: Thank you, Dan., There is a driveway on the northeast side that is going to be affected by this, so how is this going to impact those two properties that are adjacent to that driveway with the water, water hookups out in front, and some other utilities there, so how would that impact them?

Dan Ekert: We have the direct contractor to protect those at all costs, they have to maintain access at all times, so they won't have any issue being blocked or anything like that. If they are blocked, it would be very temporary, and the contractor would have to notify them prior to that. As far as the utilities, we should be ok as far as not hitting them.

Deputy Supervisor Hotaling: One other question I have, you had mentioned that the waterline is down five feet, and you are going to have to go down another two foot with this, what about frost?

Dan Ekert: As far as the line goes, we are planning on putting, there will 18 inches of either embankment or crush rock on the top of that; along with insulation board on top, then you will have concrete, and another two feet of fill, so you will be more than four feet below.

Deputy Supervisor Hotaling: Ok, thank you.

Supervisor Tollisen: Anything Else?

Tom Koval: Tom Koval, 100 Button Road, one of the properties you will be affecting. Are you sure that waterline goes underneath that culvert, because I've watched that go in, and I believe that was over the culvert.

Dan Ekert: Based on the information that we have been provided, it is below.

Tom Koval: You may want to do more research on that because I never saw them bore underneath that, that was a dove line, and it went over the top. And when you get to the point where you are going to be going on my property, I don't just want an easement, I want to know exactly what's going to be happening.

Dan Ekert: Yes, we have to go through the whole Right-of Way process, and you will have an easement map....Inaudible at this point-did not use microphone

Tom Koval: I know they are going to be going off the bottom shoulder road, they will have to build some type of access to get in to that, and I want a say as to what happens to my property before I sign any easement. Thank you.

Supervisor Tollisen: Anyone else?

Marie Wilson: My name is Marie Wilson, 30 Siena Drive, I was just wondering how we can get information that you presented today? Is it on your website?

Dan Ekert: If you'd like my business card, you can email me, and I can get you all the slides.

Supervisor Tollisen: It will be placed on our Town website as well.

Attorney Murphy: I just have a quick question if you will educate me? It says that the design is going from November of this year to July of next year, but it's a Box Culvert? It's not as if you are creating the wheel, so I am confused as to why the time is so lengthy.

Dan Ekert: Obviously it is going to be the permitting and the utility agreements and the background, we just call that the final design phase, but all of that is in there.

Attorney Murphy: Ok, so it's not the design.

Supervisor Tollisen: The folks that are here that are interested in this, please see my secretary after, so we can get your contact information, so that we can keep you updated as much as we get updated during the project. Anyone else? Ok, Thank you Dan. There are a number of Community Events, and I will note that this Saturday, is our annual Veteran's Ceremony at the Halfmoon Town Park at the Veteran's Memorial. It's a special ceremony set aside each year for our Veteran's. It starts at 10 am and we will be serving our Veteran's lunch thereafter. If you are a Veteran, or a family member of a Veteran, please come to the event, and you are welcome to stay for the lunch. We do ask that you R.S.V.P. we have a good number of people already attending, I believe we have 150 people attending, but everyone is certainly welcome to join us.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is dated as of the **4th day of October in the year 2024** by and between the Town of Halfmoon (hereinafter called OWNER) and Bellamy Construction Company, Inc. (hereinafter called CONTRACTOR).

OWNER and CONTRACTOR, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 - WORK

CONTRACTOR shall complete all Work as specified or indicated in the Contract Documents. The Work is generally described as follows:

Provide all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and other means necessary and incidental to completion of work shown on Plans and contained in the specifications, including, but not limited to, the following:

- Furnish all labor, materials, machinery, tools, equipment, and other means of construction necessary for, and incidental to, the horizontal directional drill installation of approximately 1,200 linear feet of 8-inch diameter high density polyethylene water main on NYS Route 9 and NYS Route 236. The work shall include, but not be limited to, the installation of the new water main and associated fittings, connections to the existing water system, and the hydrostatic testing and disinfection of the water main, and the disconnection and decommissioning of the existing water main and services.
- Asphalt removal to facilitate installation of the proposed water main and appurtenances.

- Work zone traffic control.

ARTICLE 2 – ENGINEER

The Project has been designed by MJ Engineering, Architecture, Landscape Architecture, and Land Surveying P.C. who is hereinafter called ENGINEER and who is to act as OWNER's representative, assume all duties and responsibilities and have the rights and authority assigned to ENGINEER in the Contract Documents in connection with completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE 3 - CONTRACT TIMES

3.1 The Work will be substantially completed on or before **December 27, 2024** and completed and ready for final payment in accordance with paragraph 14.13 of the General Conditions on or before **May 30, 2025**.

3.2 *Liquidated Damages.* OWNER and CONTRACTOR recognize that time is of the essence of this Agreement and that OWNER will suffer financial loss if the Work is not completed within the times specified in paragraph 3.1 above, plus any extensions thereof allowed in accordance with Article 12 of the General Conditions. They also recognize the delays, expense and difficulties involved in proving the actual loss suffered by OWNER if the Work is not completed on time. Accordingly, instead of requiring of

such proof, OWNER and CONTRACTOR agree that as liquidated damages for delay (but not as a penalty) CONTRACTOR shall pay OWNER eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) for each day that expires after the time specified in paragraph 3.1 for completion and readiness for final payment or any proper extension thereof granted by the OWNER, CONTRACTOR shall pay OWNER eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) for each day that expires after the time specified in paragraph 3.1 for completion and readiness for final payment.

ARTICLE 4 - CONTRACT PRICE

OWNER shall pay CONTRACTOR for completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents an amount in current funds equal to the sum of the amounts determined pursuant to paragraphs 4.1 below:

4.1 For all Unit Price Work, an amount equal to the sum of the established unit price for each separately identified item of Unit Price Work times the quantity of that item as indicated on the Bid Summary Form.

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As provided in paragraph 11.9 of the General Conditions, estimated quantities are not guaranteed, and determinations of actual quantities and classification are to be made by ENGINEER as provided in paragraph 9.10 of the General Conditions. Unit prices have been computed in paragraph 11.9 of the General Conditions.

ARTICLE 5 - PAYMENT PROCEDURES

CONTRACTOR shall submit Application for Payment in accordance with Article 14 of the General Conditions. Applications for Payment will be processed by ENGINEER as provided in the General Conditions.

5.1 ~~Progress Payments; Retainage~~ OWNER shall make progress payments on account of the Contract Price on the basis of CONTRACTOR's Applications for Payment as recommended by ENGINEER, on or about the 15th day of each month during construction as provided in paragraphs 5.1.1 and 5.1.2 below. All such payments will be measured by the schedule of values established in paragraph 2.9 of the General Conditions (or in the case of Unit Price Work based on the number of units completed) or, in the event there is no schedule of values, as provided in the General Requirements.

5.1.1. Prior to Substantial completion payments will be made in an amount equal to the percentage indicated below, but, in each case, less the aggregate of payments previously made and less such amounts as ENGINEER shall determine, or OWNER may withhold, in accordance with paragraph 14.7 of the General Conditions.

95% of Work completed (with the balance being retainage).

95% (with the balance being retainage) of materials and equipment not incorporated in the Work (but delivered, suitably stored and accompanied by documentation satisfactory to OWNER as provided in paragraph 14.2 of the General Conditions).

5.1.2. Upon Substantial Completion, in an amount sufficient to increase total payments to CONTRACTOR to 95% of the Contract Price (with the balance being retainage), less such amounts as ENGINEER shall determine, or OWNER may withhold, in accordance with paragraph 14.7 of the General Conditions. If Work has been 50% completed as determined by ENGINEER, and if the character and progress of the Work have been satisfactory to OWNER and ENGINEER, OWNER on recommendation of ENGINEER, may determine that as long as the character and progress of the Work remain satisfactory to them, there will be no additional retainage on account of Work completed, in which case the remaining progress payments prior to Substantial Completion will be in an amount equal to 100% of the Work completed.

5.2 *Final Payment.* Upon final completion and acceptance of the Work in accordance with paragraph 14.13 of the General Conditions, OWNER shall pay the remainder of the Contract Price as recommended by ENGINEER as provided in said paragraph 14.13.

ARTICLE 6 – INTEREST

All moneys not paid when due as provided in Article 14 of the General Conditions shall bear interest at the maximum rate allowed by law at the place of the Project.

ARTICLE 7 - CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIONS

In order to induce OWNER to enter into this Agreement CONTRACTOR makes the following representations:

7.1 CONTRACTOR has examined and carefully studied the Contract Documents (including the Addenda listed in paragraph 8) and the other related data identified in the Bidding Documents including "technical data."

7.2 CONTRACTOR has visited the site and become familiar with and is satisfied as to the general, local, and site conditions that may affect cost, progress, performance or furnishing of the Work.

7.3 CONTRACTOR is familiar with and is satisfied as to all federal, state, and local Laws and Regulations that may affect cost, progress, performance and furnishing of the Work.

7.4 CONTRACTOR has carefully studied all reports of explorations and tests of subsurface conditions at or contiguous to site and all drawings of physical conditions in or relating to existing surface or subsurface structures at or contiguous to the site (except Underground Facilities) which have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions as provided in paragraph 4.2.1 of the General Conditions. CONTRACTOR accepts the determination set forth in paragraph SC-4.2 of the Supplementary Conditions of the extent of the "technical data" contained in such reports and drawings upon which CONTRACTOR is entitled to rely as provided in paragraph 4.2 of the General Conditions. CONTRACTOR acknowledges that such reports and drawings are not Contract Documents and may not be complete for CONTRACTOR's purposes. CONTRACTOR acknowledges that OWNER and ENGINEER do not assume responsibility for the accuracy or completeness of information and data shown or indicated in the Contract Documents with respect to Underground Facilities at or contiguous to the site. CONTRACTOR has obtained and carefully studied (or assumes responsibility for having done so) all such additional supplementary examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, and data concerning conditions (surface, subsurface, and Underground Facilities) at or contiguous to the site or otherwise which may affect cost, progress, performance, or furnishing of the Work or which relate to any aspect of the means, methods, techniques, sequences, and procedures of construction to be employed by CONTRACTOR and safety precautions, and programs incident thereto. CONTRACTOR does not consider that any additional examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, or data are

necessary for the performance and furnishing of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Times and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract Documents.

7.5 CONTRACTOR is aware of the general nature of work to be performed by OWNER and others at the site that relates to the Work as indicated in the Contract Documents.

7.6 CONTRACTOR has correlated the information known to CONTRACTOR, information and observation obtained from visits to the site, reports, and drawings identified in the Contract Documents and all additional examinations, investigations, explorations, tests, studies, and data with the Contract Documents.

7.7 CONTRACTOR has given ENGINEER written notice of all conflicts, errors, ambiguities or discrepancies that CONTRACTOR has discovered in the Contract Documents and the written resolution thereof by ENGINEER is acceptable to CONTRACTOR, and the Contract Documents are generally sufficient to indicate and convey understanding of all terms and conditions for performance and furnishing of the Work.

ARTICLE 8 - CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

The Contract Documents which comprise the entire agreement between OWNER and CONTRACTOR concerning the Work consist of the following:

- 8.1 This Agreement.
- 8.2 Performance, Payment, and other Bonds.
- 8.3 Notice to Proceed.
- 8.4 General Conditions.
- 8.5 Supplementary Conditions.
- 8.6 Specifications.
- 8.7 Drawings with each sheet bearing the following general title: Town of Halfmoon, NYS Route 9 and 236 Water Main Replacement.
- 8.8 CONTRACTOR's Bid.
- 8.9 Documentation submitted by CONTRACTOR prior to Notice of Award.
- 8.10 The following which may be delivered or issued after the Effective Date of the Agreement and are not attached hereto: All Written Amendments and other documents amending, modifying or supplementing the Contract Documents pursuant to paragraphs 3.5 and 3.6 of the General Conditions. The documents listed in paragraph 8.2 et seq. above are attached to this Agreement (except as expressly noted otherwise above). There are not Contract Documents other than those listed above in this Article 8. The Contract Documents may only be amended, modified or supplemented as provided in paragraphs 3.5 and 3.6 of the General Conditions.

ARTICLE 9 - MISCELLANEOUS

9.1 Terms used in this Agreement which are defined in Article 1 of the General Conditions will have the meanings indicated in the General Conditions.

9.2 No assignment by a party hereto of any rights under or interests in the Contract Documents will be binding on another party hereto without the written consent of the party sought to be bound; and, specifically but without limitation, moneys that may become due and moneys that are due may not be

assigned without such consent (except to the extent that the effect of this restriction may be limited by law), and unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under the Contract Documents.

9.3 OWNER and CONTRACTOR each binds itself, its partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives to the other party hereto, its partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives in respect to all covenants, agreements, and obligations contained in the Contract Documents.

9.4 Any provisions or part of the Contract Documents held to be void or unenforceable under any Law or Regulation shall be deemed stricken, and all remaining provisions shall continue to be valid and binding upon OWNER and CONTRACTOR, who agree that the Contract Documents shall be reformed to replace such stricken provision or part thereof with a valid and enforceable provision that comes as close as possible to expressing the intention of the stricken provision.

9.5 OTHER PROVISIONS

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, OWNER, and CONTRACTOR have signed this Agreement in triplicate. One counterpart each has been delivered to OWNER, CONTRACTOR, and ENGINEER. All portions of the Contract Documents have been signed, initialed or identified by OWNER, and CONTRACTOR, or identified by ENGINEER on their behalf.

This Agreement will be effective on October 4, 2024 (which is the Effective Date of the Agreement).
