Dear Supervisor Tollisen:

Based on previous conversations with the Town of Halfmoon (Town) and Bellamy Construction (Bellamy), construction work for the NYS Route 9-236 Intersection Water Main Replacement Project experienced delays thereby resulting in an extended construction duration and need for supplemental inspection services. A summary of the project progress and delays follows:

- Bellamy mobilized the week of 11/18/24 and construction activities were projected to take approximately 4 weeks.
- Construction activities exceeded the 4-week projection due to slowdowns related to the winter
 conditions, additional potholing work to locate the existing water main between Sta. 6+00
 and 8+00 after the initial mark outs, need for imported fill due to unsuitable backfill, additional
 hydrant and valve installation for future fire protection, and the Rite Aid fire service
 modification.
- Full-time inspection was required for all work in the road right-of-way in accordance with the NYSDOT Consultant Inspection Agreement (PERM 36).
- Bellamy was on-site for approximately 12 weeks and achieved substantial completion (i.e. water main active) on 3/6/25.
- Final restoration will be completed this spring to achieve final completion by 5/30/25.

MJ is currently providing full-time construction inspection based on the original contract executed with the Town on 5/16/24. The original contract included 160 hours of full-time inspection, which was an estimate based on an assumed 4-week construction duration. As of 12/30/24, the budgeted number of inspection hours was expended.

Based on the extended construction duration and revised completion dates, an additional 6 weeks of full-time construction inspection services in the NYSDOT right-of-way is required (240 hours). At the NYSDOT inspection rate of \$155/hr, the supplemental construction inspection services equate to \$37,200. Inspection is only provided when Bellamy is actively working onsite, and the additional CI work continues to be billed on an hourly not-to-exceed basis, consistent with the contract. Should the construction duration vary (shorter/longer) from that estimated, only the hours actually spent will be billed. It should be noted that the original construction administration budget appears sufficient to carry the project through completion.
