A. <u>DPW Monthly Report – October 2024 Statistics</u>. Randazzo reported that the wastewater treatment plant was in compliance for the entire month of October. Comprehensive Contracting installed a new check valve in the manhole on Branch Drive along with raising two manholes to allow for easier acceding during flooding events if necessary. Work has begun on construction of the mulch odor bed at the Kress Road pump station. The last item needed, the blower fan, is expected to be delivered on November 27<sup>th</sup> and should be installed the first week of December. Randazzo noted that Biotech is here this week doing a sludge haul which is good as their pricing will go up in January.

Ward stated that during their winterizing of the pump stations a large mouse nest was found in the controls for the generator at the Regency Village pump station. Randazzo also noted that the Township Contractor has replaced one hundred (100) of the old 200 series grinder pump stations as part of the replacement program with approximately 50 remaining.

Bids were due by 2:00 p.m. on November 13, 2024. A total of two bids were received by the Township from C & E Construction Co. and D'Angelo Brothers, Inc. Opening and review of the bids was completed at 2:30 p.m. during the Municipal Utilities Committee meeting. Hohl stated the preliminary review of the bid pricing worksheets indicate that C & E Construction Co. is the low bidder.

#### 2.4(f) Public Participation.

Members of the public shall have an opportunity, under Call to the Public, to address the Board for no more than three (3) minutes on any item. The Board may suspend the time limitation when warranted. When all persons who wish to address the Board have been heard, the Supervisor shall announce that public comment is concluded.

#### 2.4(g) Board Correspondence.

Board Correspondence shall be included in the Consent Agenda. A motion may be made to consider the correspondent's request under current business. If no motion is made to consider the request, the correspondence will be received and filed.

Informational written correspondence that does not require Board action will be forwarded to Board members in a timely fashion.

#### **HISTORY:**

Zoning Text Amendment to amend Zoning Ordinance Article XIII, Section 36-482, Sign Regulation Enforcement.

The Hamburg Township Planning Commission recommended amendments to the Zoning Ordinance Article XIII, Section 36-482, Sign Regulation Enforcement based on the recommendation of the Parks and Recreation Board (See attached).

#### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff suggests that the Township Board discuss and review amendments to Zoning Ordinance Article XIII, Section 36-482, Sign Regulation Enforcement. If the Board should decide, a resolution may be made to pass the proposed text amendments.

#### **Example Approval Motion**

The Township Board approves the amendments to Zoning Ordinance Article XIII, Section 36-482, Sign Regulation Enforcement. This text amendment was discussed at the Hamburg Township Board of Trustees Meeting on December 17, 2024.

#### Sec. 36-482. Sign regulation enforcement.

- (a) Signs on private property. Signs in violation of the regulations will be enforced by the zoning administrator or designee utilizing Ordinance No. 71-A the civil infraction ordinance.
- (b) Signs within the public or private right-of-way or on public land. Signs in violation of the regulations will be removed by the zoning administrator or designee.
  - (1) First violation: Will be removed and held for ten days at the Township offices, after which the signs will be discarded.
  - (2) Second violation: The signs will be removed and will be discarded without a holding period.
  - (3) Signs in continual violation of the regulations may be enforced by the <u>Code Enforcement Officer</u>, <u>zoning administrator</u>Zoning Administrator, or designee, utilizing <u>Ordinance No. 71 AChapter 1</u>, Article II, Section 1-45 Sanctions for violations, in the Hamburg Township <u>-civil infractions</u>Code of <u>Ordinances</u>.
  - (4) Signs will be considered in the public right-of-way if they are within ten feet of a public street or if they are in violation of section 36-228.
  - (5) For purposes of assessing fines and penalties only, a violation under this section shall be classified a Class E municipal civil infraction.
  - (6) Signs for Park/Trail related events must be approved through the Park Use Application process.

### Park/Trail Use Application - Sign Policy/Procedure

The Hamburg Township park and recreation system affords residents and visitors with a higher quality of life standard. The benefits of a quality parks and recreation system include: Greater opportunities for a healthy lifestyle; Increased property values throughout the Township; Encouragement of economic development, which in turn, can further attract investment; Natural beauty; Environmental gains and benefits; Socializing and fun; and Sense of place and identity for the community. Hamburg Township parks afford all residents and visitors of Hamburg Township with the opportunity to participate and enjoy in the Township's parks and recreation facilities and to act as gathering spaces for community building.

This policy is included in the Parks and Recreation Policies and Procedures and is intended to allow specific signage associated with the approved use of Township owned/operated parklands. The allowed signage will help Hamburg Township to better meet the needs of the community and public use of the parkland systems. The signage will help to better inform people of upcoming events and direct people to the event.

All signage placed on Township owned/operated property, must first be approved through the Hamburg Township Parks and Recreation application process. Only signage relating to, and in support of, an approved event on Hamburg Township owned/operated park/trail property, qualifies for this addendum. Must be requested at time of application, or no later than 60 days prior to event. Any other requests must comply with <a href="Hamburg Township Ordinance - Chapter 36">Hamburg Township Ordinance - Chapter 36</a>, <a href="Article VII">Article VII</a>, <a href="Section 36-222">Section 36-222</a>.

#### Signage Regulations for Park Use Applications:

In addition to directional signage allowed during an event in Hamburg Township Parks and/or Trails, signs announcing the approved event are only allowed with an approved Park Use Application:

- 1) Temporary freestanding signs:
  - a. On the Township owned property where the event is located:
    - i. One 32 square foot sign; and
    - ii. Four 6 square foot signs, with one side 4' max in length.
  - b. On the Township owned property at M-36 and Merrill Road (parcel 15-23-300-028):
    - i. One 32 square foot sign.
  - c. On other pre-approved events on Hamburg Township owned/operated park/trail property.
    - i. Provide site plan, size, and sign details in writing to the Park Coordinator during the Park Use Application approval process, no later than 60 days prior to event date.

#### 2) Signage duration:

- a. If the event is held on between 1-7 consecutive days the signs may be installed 7 days prior to the event and must be removed within 2 days after the last day of the event.
- b. If the event is conducted over multiple weeks the signs allowed in section 1) a. ii. shall only be allowed the day of the event, all other signs allowed in section 1) may be installed 7 days prior to the event and must be removed within 2 days after the last day of the event.
- c. If the signs are not removed as required by the code the Township may remove the signage and may issue violations as outlined in Hamburg Township Code of Ordinances.
- 3) Directional signs shall be approved administratively for approved Park Use Applications and must pertain to Township owned or operated Park/Trail property only.
- 4) All signs shall be outside of the road right-of-way and at least 10 feet from a paved roadway or driveway.
- 5) The Township shall be authorized to remove any unapproved signage or additional signage placed unrelated scheduled events. Violations or abuses of this rule may result in termination or denial of park use.
- 6) Any unapproved signage pertaining to an event that is not taking place on Township owned/operated Park/Trail property, will be removed and will be considered a Class E municipal civil infraction. Charges for violations or abuses of this rule can be found at: Hamburg Township Code of Ordinances, Chapter 1, Article II, Sec.1-45.

#### Sign Application Materials:

The following information shall be submitted with the parklands use permit application:

- 1) Description of the signs including a drawing showing the proposed signs and the sign dimensions; and
- 2) Map showing the location of the proposed signs.
- 3) Any signs planned for the Road-Right-Of-Way must be submitted to the jurisdiction that regulates and oversees those roads.

Staff has reviewed the proposed amendments for accuracy and compatibility with the existing ordinance language and offers the following summary for your review. Staff comments are noted throughout with additions and changes to the Ordinance written in red.

#### Sec. 36-482. Sign regulation enforcement.

- (a) Signs on private property. Signs in violation of the regulations will be enforced by the zoning administrator or designee utilizing Ordinance No. 71-A the civil infraction ordinance.
- (b) Signs within the public or private right-of-way or on public land. Signs in violation of the regulations will be removed by the zoning administrator or designee.

- (1) First violation: Will be removed and held for ten days at the Township offices, after which the signs will be discarded.
- (2) Second violation: The signs will be removed and will be discarded without a holding period.
- (3) Signs in continual violation of the regulations may be enforced by the Code Enforcement Officer, zoning administrator-Zoning Administrator, or designee, utilizing Ordinance No. 71-AChapter 1, Article II, Section 1-45 – Sanctions for violations, in the Hamburg Township civil infractions Code of Ordinances. ordinance.
- (4) Signs will be considered in the public right-of-way if they are within ten feet of a public street or if they are in violation of section 36-228.

- (5) For purposes of assessing fines and penalties only, a violation under this section shall be classified a Class E municipal civil infraction.
- (6) Signs for Park/Trail related events must be approved through the Park Use Application process.

#### **CALL TO THE PUBLIC**

Sarah Bennett- 10582 Livingston St. Spoke on the apartment size of the project being like to adjacent lots. She stated that the apartments were huge in comparison to the surrounding single-family homes that surround this project. One of the Township Board Members requested that the buffer between the homes and this apartment complex be increased. According to Sarah, she stated that she did not feel that the developer met this request since they only met the zoning requirements for the required buffer while they did not increase it. Second, she said that it only appears that grass and fence exist between the apartments and the surrounding homes. She said she doesn't feel that the developer should be able to include the trees on neighboring lots as their required landscape buffer between these two uses. Third, Washington Street entrance and sidewalk that goes to the gas station project as the access to the Lakeland Trails pathway. In the past, the Livingston County Road Commission said that no sidewalks could be installed on Washington and Livingston Streets. If that is still the case, then this stated access will not be available for residents use to access Lakeland Trails. She then posed a question regarding the pump station connected to the gas station, if this project which depends on this station is moving forward but the gas station is not. What then happens?

Brenda Vibbart-10564 Hall Rd. One, she spoke about the fence that will be between the single-family homes and the apartment complex. She stated that it should not be up to each individual homeowner to maintain their side of this fence. She wants the fence to be set back far enough that if any trees fall on the fence, they will not be responsible for its replacement. Two, she wants to ensure that no one will be able to walk through her property so she wanted to propose that the buffer fence should keep running past her parcel to keep teens from accessing residential homes from the Hoskins abandoned property. Three, she asked about any noise reduction devices to reduce sound from the community pool. Fourth, she mentioned that this property will be sandwiched between two gun ranges and they will need to let their renters know about this off-site noise, so they don't bombard the police with unnecessary noise complaints.

<u>Dustin Hitchings- 10530 Hall Rd.</u> One, complimented that the developer for creating a 20 feet setback buffer near his property. Two, he was dissatisfied to see that they did not keep the tree buffer recommended by the planning commission from all parts of his parcel. Three, he stated that this GPUD project has a 30% density increase which doesn't match the Village Center. Four, he mentioned the traffic study and that Commissioner Hughes shared her knowledge regarding a project being an F grade project, and that this site would be such during rush hour.

<u>Megan Osborne- 10548 Hall Rd.</u> One, mentioned that the developer is relying on the single-family homeowner's trees as their landscaping buffer despite that they are falling in the current windstorms. She is concerned that the developer is only proposing to place bushes in between her home and their project as their landscaping buffer.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

# 1. PPAM #24-001 Final Site Plan Review (PCPUD) for the Lakeland Crossings on Learning Ln. (15-25-400-048)

Chair Muck welcomed David Rohr to present this project from the past to the present. At the last meeting, the planning commission members wanted the develop to address some issues and now they are back to address those issues. The fence being installed around the whole apartment complex and the size of the buffer between the homes and the project. Finally, they increased the lighting in the courtyards and the parking lot, while providing a photometric site plan.

Chair Muck welcomed the owner to the podium, and he said that they listened to the Planning Commissioners regarding their needs for this review, to approve it. He said that their civil engineer was present to address any of the commissioners' technical questions. Chair Muck invited the commissioners to ask questions, comments or motions about this project. Commissioner Leabu said that he complemented their choice in light fixtures, but he wanted to speak about the brackets being contemporary.

Commissioner Hamlin asked if all the lighting fixtures were pole mounted. The engineer said there are lights affixed to the apartment buildings that are porch lights that are operated by the tenants. The pole mounted lights will be located near the sidewalks. Commissioner Leabu asked how tall the poles were and one of the developers said 12 feet. Hamlin clarified that the site plan showed 14 feet, and the developer said she stands corrected. Leabu said he would like to see the pole heights to be 12 feet, and the developer said he would take note of this light pole height request. Commissioner Priebe thanked and complimented the developer for following her notes from the meeting minutes last month. Chair Muck asked a clarifying question of the developer regarding the residents' comments earlier about using the residents' vegetation as the project's buffer requirements. Muck asked David if this meets our zoning ordinance landscape requirements or should the commissioners ask the developer to enhance the buffer along the borders. There are old trees that might fall over or die, leaving these residents with open views of this complex. According to the owner, this project will plant all of the trees shown on their landscape plans for screening purposes and they are not counting the neighboring single family home property's trees as part of their requirements.

Commissioner Hughes asked Priebe what the requirements regarding the Lakeland Trail access were. Access to the Lakeland Trails shall be to the west through the Village Center and have them identify the sidewalk to the end of their property since they do not own anything else. The engineer came up to the podium to clarify that that some existing sidewalks exist onsite, and they are shown on the site plan off Washington St. Muck stated that he hoped that the Township Board and Township Supervisor would work with the county on street scape and the downtown pedestrian traffic. This is something that will need to be addressed at the Township Board level as we see these developments come in downtown. He said that was his opinion and he was not looking for that to be included in the motion.

Commissioner Priebe asked the commissioners if they need to add lighting for pedestrian scale lighting to the park to allow safe pedestrian access to the conditions for the final site plan for this project. Leabu and David said that had been satisfied.

Approval motion was made by Commissioner Priebe, seconded by Commissioner Muir, that the planning commission recommends approval for the final GPUD site plan as shown on this project plans to the Township Board because the project as conditioned is consistent with the requirements of the General Planned Unit Development regulations and will be able to meet site plan review standards of the zoning ordinance as discussed at the meeting tonight and presented in the staff report with the following conditions of approval:

**Condition 1:** Prior to the issuance of a land use permit, all appropriate approvals from local, county, state and federal agencies, including, but not limited to, Hamburg Township Fire, Accessor, and Public Works Departments,

the Livingston County Road Commission, Drain Commissioner, and Health Department, and the Michigan Department of Environmental, Great Lakes and Energy, and Transportation shall be received.

**Condition 2:** A development agreement including mater deeds and bylaws will be submitted for this project. This agreement will be reviewed by the Township Attorney. This agreement shall include a cross-access agreement that allows public use of the private roadways, sidewalks and parks within the project.

**Condition 3:** The new lighting fixtures presented, including the bollards, are acceptable and the height of the light poles shall not exceed 12 feet.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

1. Consideration of the repeal of the Zoning Ordinance Section 36-434 -Cottage housing planned unit development (CHPUD).

Chair Muck opened the meeting to David. David explained that he had given the commissioners a copy of the existing ordinance as well as the proposed ordinance. He stated we have two redundant ordinances that said the same thing. It was recommended by Commissioner Hughes to repeal the original cottage housing since it was largely covered in the newly updated ordinance. At the last meeting, there was no objection to doing this repeal. David is looking for a recommendation from the commissioners to take to the Township Board, in favor of repealing this second section of the cottage housing ordinance.

**Approval** motion made by Commissioner Hughes, seconded by Commissioner Priebe, to recommend to the Township Board to repeal Section 36-434 to 36-438 Cottage Housing Planned Unit Development (CHPUD).

2. Proposed Amendments to PZTA #24-0004 Zoning Ordinance, Article 3, Section 36-482 Sign regulation enforcement.

Chair Muck opened the public hearing to David. David explained that this request came from Parks and Recreation Department for code enforcement and infraction penalties. Chair Muck stated that he sits on the Park and Recreational Board. He stated that signage enforcement needed to be clarified so staff and residents knew were signage could be placed, and how long it could stay there. We have had several

large events going on in the community on Merrill, and we needed to clean up the signage ordinance to get it on the books. Muck said he appreciated the work of Deby Hennerman. Commissioner Hamlin asked if this was all new. Chair Muck and David said no but that the park application and this ordinance needed to be clarified regarding the size, duration and placement of such signage. Commissioner Priebe asked if this was an ordinance that was ready to make a motion on or is this just something for us to look at? David told her that this was something that they could make a motion on since this was a public hearing. The redlined document is showing what changes are being made to this sign ordinance. Commissioner Priebe said that since this is a public hearing, it should be opened up for discussion from the public.

Chair Muck opened the call to the Public on this PZTA #24-0004 Zoning Ordinance, Article 3, Section 36-482 Sign regulation enforcement. No one came to the podium, so Chair Muck closed the call to Public.

Chair Muck opened the meeting to the commissioners.

**Approval** motion made by Commissioner Priebe, seconded by Commissioner Mariani, to propose revisions to Article 3, Section 36-482 Sign Regulation Enforcement as presented in tonight's meeting.

**3. Zoning Administrator's Report**- we will not have any agenda items for November as of today. We will be looking to do the 5-year review of the Master Plan in January.

Commissioner Hamlin wanted to state that he got a copy of the traffic study for the Lakeland Trails Apartments, and it appears that we will be getting a four-way stop intersection. He said that this is not good. Some communities hire a traffic engineer on their behalf to interact with MDOT and since we are having a lot of these projects coming into this area, we might want to hire a traffic expert to review these studies and help with the traffic flow from this new area. Commissioner Leabu said he agreed with Hamlin. Commissioner Hughes asked David if the developer pays for these traffic studies. She said she didn't think that the engineers were out there onsite to check the flow numbers. David agreed that these traffic impact studies are difficult to understand. David admitted that we don't have a lot of say or power in this process. By having a third-party contractor engineer review, we might have a little more involvement in our communities traffic management. David agreed that this sounded like a good idea. Commissioner Priebe asked if around a bout would be a better plan than a four way stop for this intersection. Chair Muck agreed that this would be a good idea as well. He asked David to take this back to the Township Supervisor to have this discussion about the recommendation to have an outside firm or engineer analyze these studies on behalf of the township.

## **HISTORY:**

Zoning Text Amendment to repeal Zoning Ordinance Article VII, Section 36-434-438, Cottage Housing Planned Unit Development (CHPUD).

The Hamburg Township Planning Commission recommended the repeal of Zoning Ordinance **Section 36-434-438** at their October 16, 2024, meeting. The Newley amended *PZTA24-0002 Cottage Housing Opportunity Planned Unit Development (CHOPUD)* will function as the only cottage planned unit development in the Township.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff suggests that the Township Board discuss and review the recommended repeal of Zoning Ordinance Section 36-434-438, Cottage Housing Planned Unit Development (CHPUD). If the Board should decide, a resolution may be made to pass the proposed zoning text amendment.

## **Example Approval Motion**

The Township Board approves the repeal Zoning Ordinance Section 36-434-438, Cottage Housing Planned Unit Development (CHPUD) This text amendment was discussed at the Hamburg Township Board of Trustees Meeting on December 17, 2024.

Item 19.

- (a) It is the intent of this section and sections 36-435 to 36-438 to offer an alternative to traditional single-family detached and attached housing developments through the use of planned unit development legislation as authorized by the Michigan Zoning Enabling Act, Public Act No. 110 of 2006, as amended for the purpose of:
  - (1) Encouraging the construction of more affordable single-family residential detached or attached dwelling units which utilizing public sewer and public water systems;
  - (2) Facilitating the construction of affordable single-family residential detached or attached housing units on a smaller scale than conventional multifamily developments to accommodate higher density and lower cost dwelling units;
  - (3) Offering an alternative to multifamily residential developments in order to provide affordable housing for persons in a small scale, less dense neighborhood setting;
  - (4) Preserving the rural character and appearance of the Township through the construction of small scale environmentally sensitive developments on sites within the village center master plan area.
  - (5) Encouraging the clustering of detached or attached single-family dwelling units to promote the safety and security of the residents.
- (b) These regulations are intended to preserve a traditional rural character to the land use pattern in the Township through the creation of small residential nodes contrasting with open space and less intensive land uses. This section is not intended as a device for circumventing the zoning regulations of the Township, the standards set forth therein, nor the planning concepts upon which this chapter has been based.
- (c) These regulations are intended to result in a specific development substantially consistent with zoning ordinance standards yet allow for modifications from the general standards.

(Zoning Ord. 2020, § 14.3.1, 1-5-2021)

Sec. 36-435. - Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

CHPUD means a housing development which meets the unique needs of the residents through the provision of significant facilities and services specifically designed to meet the physical or social needs of such residents.

CHPUD lot means land occupied or to be occupied by CHPUD units and accessory buildings permitted herein, together with such open spaces as are required under this chapter and having its principal frontage upon a street.

CHPUD unit means a single-family residential dwelling unit with full facilities for residential self-sufficiency.

Sec. 36-436. - Zoning.

A CHPUD may be located in the following zoning districts: RB, VC and VR.

(Zoning Ord. 2020, § 14.3.3, 1-5-2021)

Sec. 36-437. - Development design standards.

CHPUD housing shall meet the following criteria:

- (1) Public sewer and public water. Public sewer and public water shall be provided.
- (2) CHPUD size. No fewer than four CHPUD units nor more than 20 CHPUD units shall be permitted per lot.
- (3) Acreage and density requirements. A CHPUD development may be approved upon any residentially zoned land with density as permitted below:

RB	1 acre	7,500 square feet
VC	1 acre	4,100 square feet
VR	1 acre	5,450 square feet

- (4) Unified control. The CHPUD shall be initially under single ownership or control, so there is a single person, entity or condominium having proprietary responsibility for the development of the CHPUD as evidenced by a title company licensed to do business in the state. In the event, all or any portion of the development changes ownership or control prior to completion of the project, the terms and conditions of this planned unit development shall be binding on any successor owner of all or any portion of the property.
- (5) Guarantee of open/common space. At least 50 percent of the total site area shall be preserved as open space. This open space shall be held in common ownership by all residents of the CHPUD. This open space shall be utilized for recreation facilities such as lawns, gardens, plazas, common use buildings, pool areas, picnic areas, walking trails or other open space uses which provide residents the opportunity to enjoy the features of the site. The open space shall be configured to be integrated with the individual units and maximize the proximity of each housing unit to natural open space. The principle common open space area shall be centralized to the project and at least 50 percent of the CHPUD units shall have their main entries on the centralized common space area. A guarantee to the satisfaction of the Township Planning Commission that all open/common space portions of the development will be maintained in the manner approved shall be provided. Documents shall be presented that bind all successors and future owners in fee title to commitments made as a part of the proposal. This provision shall not prohibit a transfer of ownership or control, provided notice of such transfer is provided to the Township and the land uses continue as approved in the CHPUD plan.
- (6) Area, height, bulk and layout regulations.

Maximum CHPUD unit floor area:	1,200 square feet
Maximum building height:	2 stories
Distance between walls of buildings:	10 feet
Basement:	Optional
Shed:	Optional 11

Garage:	Optional	Item 19.
Covered parking:	Optional	
Minimum setbacks*:	15 feet from street or private road right-of-way, 10 feet from side and rear lot lines, 5 feet from common access drives	m
Common access drives:	4 feet from all lot lines	

\*The setbacks are from the overall CHPUD lot.

- (7) Attached units. No more than four units shall be attached in a single structure.
- (8) *Garages/carports.* If provided, garages can be attached or detached from the main structure. Garages may be linked so as to have common walls. Garages/carports may be on common owned property.
- (9) Porches. Each CHPUD unit shall have a front porch that is a minimum of six feet deep and 50 percent of the front elevation.
- (10) *Private outdoor space.* Each unit shall have no more than 2,000 square feet of private outdoor space. This space shall include any private outdoor parking areas, open porches, and yard space that is not open for common use.
- (11) Common area. Each CHPUD shall have a common area containing at least one common use structure such as a pool house, clubhouse, gazebo, deck, patio or terrace that shall be covered with a roof, of similar architectural style and design as the CHPUD units located on the lot, and a minimum of 100 square feet. Common use structures can be counted towards the common open space area.
- (12) Storage sheds. Any storage sheds shall be so designed as to have the same roof pitch and architectural style as the CHPUD units in the development. Storage sheds may be linked so as to have common walls; however, each shed must have its own private, lockable access door. The dimensions of any shed servicing a CHPUD unit shall conform to other size provisions of this chapter. Storage sheds may be located on commonly owned property.
- (13) Water and sewer system service. CHPUD developments are required to be serviced by public sewer and public water services.

(14)

Roads. The CHPUD shall have paved access designed and constructed to AASHTO standards and shall provide adequate access for emerg vehicles.

Item 19.

- (15) Parking requirements. The parking standards for a CHPUD shall be two spaces per unit. Each parking space shall have a minimum size of 180 square feet (ten feet by 18 feet), may be located either on-site or within 100 feet of the site, may be on-street or off-street and may be within a garage or carport structure or unenclosed. If the applicant requests a reduction in the parking requirements the planning commission must make the findings that alternative transportation options have been provided to the future residence of the project.
- (16) Construction drawings required. Scaled floor plan and building elevation drawings shall be presented for each CHPUD unit within the CHPUD that has a different interior layout and square footage of living space.
- (17) Sidewalks and access ramps. All pedestrian circulation walkways and sidewalks shall be hard-surfaced with either asphalt, concrete or brick paving and be accessible to the handicapped according to the standards set forth in the Americans with Disabilities Act. Sidewalks and pathways shall be designed to connect the CHPUD units to the common areas on the lot and to connect with adjacent properties. Handicapped access ramps are exempt from the required setbacks.
- (18) *Interior design.* A minimum of ten percent or at least one, whichever is greater, of the CHPUD units shall meet the International Code Council (American National Standards Institute) Accessibility Standards for Type B units.
- (19) Design compatibility. The exterior of each CHPUD unit shall be compatible in terms of architectural design, materials and color with the residential structures in the immediate neighborhood within 300 feet of the development parcel or lot. However, all housing units shall be a minimum of 14 feet wide at their least horizontal dimension and attached to a permanent foundation. Accessory buildings for a CHPUD unit, such as detached garage, common room and shed structures, shall be architecturally compatible with the design and style of the CHPUD units. Compatibility of design shall be decided by the planning commission.
- (20) Waiver of standards. The planning commission is hereby empowered to waive site design standards and development area requirements if public health and safety are not compromised. The planning commission is further empowered to specify conditions in issuing any special use permits as may be required.

(Zoning Ord. 2020, § 14.3.4, 1-5-2021)

Sec. 36-438. - Project standards.

In considering any application for approval of a CHPUD site plan, the planning commission shall make their determinations on the basis Item 19. the standards for site plan approval set forth in article III of this chapter, as well as the following standards and requirements:

- (1) Compliance with the CHPUD concept. The overall design and land uses proposed in connection with a CHPUD shall be consistent with the intent of the CHPUD concept, as well as with the specific design standards set forth herein.
- Compatibility with adjacent uses. The proposed CHPUD site plan shall set forth in detail, all specifications with respect to height, setbacks, density, parking, circulation, landscaping, views and other design features that exhibit due regard for the relationship of the development to surrounding properties, the character of the site, and the land uses. In determining whether this requirement has been met, consideration shall be given to:
  - a. The bulk, placement, and materials of construction of proposed structures.
  - b. Pedestrian and vehicular circulation.
  - c. The location and screening of vehicular use or parking areas.
  - d. The provision of landscaping and other site amenities.
- (3) Protection of natural environment. The proposed CHPUD shall be protective of the natural environment. It shall comply with all applicable environmental protection laws and regulations.
- (4) Common area and unit maintenance. The CHPUD shall include in the master deed, community bylaws or covenant provisions, as applicable for the maintenance of the common open space, including landscaping maintenance, snow removal and repairs to building exteriors, in a form approved by the Township Attorney.
- (5) Compliance with applicable regulations. The proposed CHPUD shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local regulations. (Zoning Ord. 2020, § 14.3.5, 1-5-2021)

Hamburg Township is proposing to remove their Cottage Housing Planned Unit Development Ordinance. The township amended and adopted Section 36.429-433: Elderly Cottage Housing Opportunity Ordinance to a Cottage Housing Opportunity Ordinance in September 2024. To avoid duplication of ordinances, the township seeks to remove Sections 36:434-438.

Staff has reviewed the proposed amendments for accuracy and compatibility with the existing ordinance language and offers the following summary for your review. Staff comments are noted throughout. The proposed changes will be to repeal the entire ordinance.

## The following will be removed from the Hamburg Township Ordinance:

Sec. 36-434. Cottage housing planned unit development (CHPUD); intent.

In the event, all or any portion of the development changes ownership or control prior to completion of the project, the terms and conditions of this planned unit development shall be binding on any successor owner of all or any portion of the property.
- (5) Guarantee of open/common space. At least 50 percent of the total site area shall be preserved as open space. This open space shall be held in common ownership by all residents of the CHPUD. This open space shall be utilized for recreation facilities such as lawns, gardens, plazas, common use buildings, pool areas, picnic areas, walking trails or other open space uses which provide residents the opportunity to enjoy the features of the site. The open space shall be configured to be integrated with the individual units and maximize the proximity of each housing unit to natural open space. The principle common open space area shall be centralized to the project and at least 50 percent of the CHPUD units shall have their main entries on the centralized common space area. A guarantee to the satisfaction of the Township Planning Commission that all open/common space portions of the development will be maintained in the manner approved shall be provided. Documents shall be presented that bind all successors and future owners in fee title to commitments made as a part of the proposal. This provision shall not prohibit a transfer of ownership or control, provided notice of such transfer is provided to the Township and the land uses continue as approved in the CHPUD plan.
- (6) Area, height, bulk and layout regulations.

Maximum CHPUD unit floor area:	1,200 square feet
Maximum building height:	2 stories
Distance between walls of buildings:	10 feet
Basement:	Optional
Shed:	Optional
Garage:	Optional
Covered parking:	Optional
Minimum setbacks*:	15 feet from street or private road right-of- way, 10 feet from side and rear lot lines, 5 feet from common access drives
Common access drives:	4 feet from all lot lines

<sup>\*</sup>The setbacks are from the overall CHPUD lot.

(7) Attached units. No more than four units shall be attached in a single structure.

- (8) Garages/carports. If provided, garages can be attached or detached from the main structure. Garages may be linked so as to have common walls. Garages/carports may be on common owned property.
- (9) Porches. Each CHPUD unit shall have a front porch that is a minimum of six feet deep and 50 percent of the front elevation.
- (10) Private outdoor space. Each unit shall have no more than 2,000 square feet of private outdoor space. This space shall include any private outdoor parking areas, open porches, and yard space that is not open for common use.
- (11) Common area. Each CHPUD shall have a common area containing at least one common use structure such as a pool house, clubhouse, gazebo, deck, patio or terrace that shall be covered with a roof, of similar architectural style and design as the CHPUD units located on the lot, and a minimum of 100 square feet. Common use structures can be counted towards the common open space area.
- (12) Storage sheds. Any storage sheds shall be so designed as to have the same roof pitch and architectural style as the CHPUD units in the development. Storage sheds may be linked so as to have common walls; however, each shed must have its own private, lockable access door. The dimensions of any shed servicing a CHPUD unit shall conform to other size provisions of this chapter. Storage sheds may be located on commonly owned property.
- (13) Water and sewer system service. CHPUD developments are required to be serviced by public sewer and public water services.
- (14) Roads. The CHPUD shall have paved access designed and constructed to AASHTO standards and shall provide adequate access for emergency vehicles.
- (15) Parking requirements. The parking standards for a CHPUD shall be two spaces per unit. Each parking space shall have a minimum size of 180 square feet (ten feet by 18 feet), may be located either on-site or within 100 feet of the site, may be on-street or off-street and may be within a garage or carport structure or unenclosed. If the applicant requests a reduction in the parking requirements the planning commission must make the findings that alternative transportation options have been provided to the future residence of the project.
- (16) Construction drawings required. Scaled floor plan and building elevation drawings shall be presented for each CHPUD unit within the CHPUD that has a different interior layout and square footage of living space.
- (17) Sidewalks and access ramps. All pedestrian circulation walkways and sidewalks shall be hard-surfaced with either asphalt, concrete or brick paving and be accessible to the handicapped according to the standards set forth in the Americans with Disabilities Act. Sidewalks and pathways shall be designed to connect the CHPUD units to the common areas on the lot and to connect with adjacent properties. Handicapped access ramps are exempt from the required setbacks.
- (18) Interior design. A minimum of ten percent or at least one, whichever is greater, of the CHPUD units shall meet the International Code Council (American National Standards Institute) Accessibility Standards for Type B units.
- (19) Design compatibility. The exterior of each CHPUD unit shall be compatible in terms of architectural design, materials and color with the residential structures in the

immediate neighborhood within 300 feet of the development parcel or lot. However, all housing units shall be a minimum of 14 feet wide at their least horizontal dimension and attached to a permanent foundation. Accessory buildings for a CHPUD unit, such as detached garage, common room and shed structures, shall be architecturally compatible with the design and style of the CHPUD units. Compatibility of design shall be decided by the planning commission.

(20) Waiver of standards. The planning commission is hereby empowered to waive site design standards and development area requirements if public health and safety are not compromised. The planning commission is further empowered to specify conditions in issuing any special use permits as may be required.

## Sec. 36-438. Project standards.

In considering any application for approval of a CHPUD site plan, the planning commission shall make their determinations on the basis of the standards for site plan approval set forth in article III of this chapter, as well as the following standards and requirements:

- (1) Compliance with the CHPUD concept. The overall design and land uses proposed in connection with a CHPUD shall be consistent with the intent of the CHPUD concept, as well as with the specific design standards set forth herein.
- (2) Compatibility with adjacent uses. The proposed CHPUD site plan shall set forth in detail, all specifications with respect to height, setbacks, density, parking, circulation, landscaping, views and other design features that exhibit due regard for the relationship of the development to surrounding properties, the character of the site, and the land uses. In determining whether this requirement has been met, consideration shall be given to:
  - The bulk, placement, and materials of construction of proposed structures.
  - b. Pedestrian and vehicular circulation.
  - c. The location and screening of vehicular use or parking areas.
  - d. The provision of landscaping and other site amenities.
- (3) Protection of natural environment. The proposed CHPUD shall be protective of the natural environment. It shall comply with all applicable environmental protection laws and regulations.
- (4) Common area and unit maintenance. The CHPUD shall include in the master deed, community bylaws or covenant provisions, as applicable for the maintenance of the common open space, including landscaping maintenance, snow removal and repairs to building exteriors, in a form approved by the Township Attorney.
- (5) Compliance with applicable regulations. The proposed CHPUD shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local regulations.

Staff Comments: The Township amended and adopted Section 36.429-433: Elderly Cottage Housing Opportunity Ordinance to a Cottage Housing Opportunity Ordinance in September 2024. To avoid duplication in the zoning ordinance the township seeks to remove Sec. 36.434-438 from the Township Zoning Ordinance.

#### **CALL TO THE PUBLIC**

Sarah Bennett- 10582 Livingston St. Spoke on the apartment size of the project being like to adjacent lots. She stated that the apartments were huge in comparison to the surrounding single-family homes that surround this project. One of the Township Board Members requested that the buffer between the homes and this apartment complex be increased. According to Sarah, she stated that she did not feel that the developer met this request since they only met the zoning requirements for the required buffer while they did not increase it. Second, she said that it only appears that grass and fence exist between the apartments and the surrounding homes. She said she doesn't feel that the developer should be able to include the trees on neighboring lots as their required landscape buffer between these two uses. Third, Washington Street entrance and sidewalk that goes to the gas station project as the access to the Lakeland Trails pathway. In the past, the Livingston County Road Commission said that no sidewalks could be installed on Washington and Livingston Streets. If that is still the case, then this stated access will not be available for residents use to access Lakeland Trails. She then posed a question regarding the pump station connected to the gas station, if this project which depends on this station is moving forward but the gas station is not. What then happens?

Brenda Vibbart-10564 Hall Rd. One, she spoke about the fence that will be between the single-family homes and the apartment complex. She stated that it should not be up to each individual homeowner to maintain their side of this fence. She wants the fence to be set back far enough that if any trees fall on the fence, they will not be responsible for its replacement. Two, she wants to ensure that no one will be able to walk through her property so she wanted to propose that the buffer fence should keep running past her parcel to keep teens from accessing residential homes from the Hoskins abandoned property. Three, she asked about any noise reduction devices to reduce sound from the community pool. Fourth, she mentioned that this property will be sandwiched between two gun ranges and they will need to let their renters know about this off-site noise, so they don't bombard the police with unnecessary noise complaints.

<u>Dustin Hitchings- 10530 Hall Rd.</u> One, complimented that the developer for creating a 20 feet setback buffer near his property. Two, he was dissatisfied to see that they did not keep the tree buffer recommended by the planning commission from all parts of his parcel. Three, he stated that this GPUD project has a 30% density increase which doesn't match the Village Center. Four, he mentioned the traffic study and that Commissioner Hughes shared her knowledge regarding a project being an F grade project, and that this site would be such during rush hour.

<u>Megan Osborne- 10548 Hall Rd.</u> One, mentioned that the developer is relying on the single-family homeowner's trees as their landscaping buffer despite that they are falling in the current windstorms. She is concerned that the developer is only proposing to place bushes in between her home and their project as their landscaping buffer.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

# 1. PPAM #24-001 Final Site Plan Review (PCPUD) for the Lakeland Crossings on Learning Ln. (15-25-400-048)

Chair Muck welcomed David Rohr to present this project from the past to the present. At the last meeting, the planning commission members wanted the develop to address some issues and now they are back to address those issues. The fence being installed around the whole apartment complex and the size of the buffer between the homes and the project. Finally, they increased the lighting in the courtyards and the parking lot, while providing a photometric site plan.

Chair Muck welcomed the owner to the podium, and he said that they listened to the Planning Commissioners regarding their needs for this review, to approve it. He said that their civil engineer was present to address any of the commissioners' technical questions. Chair Muck invited the commissioners to ask questions, comments or motions about this project. Commissioner Leabu said that he complemented their choice in light fixtures, but he wanted to speak about the brackets being contemporary.

Commissioner Hamlin asked if all the lighting fixtures were pole mounted. The engineer said there are lights affixed to the apartment buildings that are porch lights that are operated by the tenants. The pole mounted lights will be located near the sidewalks. Commissioner Leabu asked how tall the poles were and one of the developers said 12 feet. Hamlin clarified that the site plan showed 14 feet, and the developer said she stands corrected. Leabu said he would like to see the pole heights to be 12 feet, and the developer said he would take note of this light pole height request. Commissioner Priebe thanked and complimented the developer for following her notes from the meeting minutes last month. Chair Muck asked a clarifying question of the developer regarding the residents' comments earlier about using the residents' vegetation as the project's buffer requirements. Muck asked David if this meets our zoning ordinance landscape requirements or should the commissioners ask the developer to enhance the buffer along the borders. There are old trees that might fall over or die, leaving these residents with open views of this complex. According to the owner, this project will plant all of the trees shown on their landscape plans for screening purposes and they are not counting the neighboring single family home property's trees as part of their requirements.

Commissioner Hughes asked Priebe what the requirements regarding the Lakeland Trail access were. Access to the Lakeland Trails shall be to the west through the Village Center and have them identify the sidewalk to the end of their property since they do not own anything else. The engineer came up to the podium to clarify that that some existing sidewalks exist onsite, and they are shown on the site plan off Washington St. Muck stated that he hoped that the Township Board and Township Supervisor would work with the county on street scape and the downtown pedestrian traffic. This is something that will need to be addressed at the Township Board level as we see these developments come in downtown. He said that was his opinion and he was not looking for that to be included in the motion.

Commissioner Priebe asked the commissioners if they need to add lighting for pedestrian scale lighting to the park to allow safe pedestrian access to the conditions for the final site plan for this project. Leabu and David said that had been satisfied.

Approval motion was made by Commissioner Priebe, seconded by Commissioner Muir, that the planning commission recommends approval for the final GPUD site plan as shown on this project plans to the Township Board because the project as conditioned is consistent with the requirements of the General Planned Unit Development regulations and will be able to meet site plan review standards of the zoning ordinance as discussed at the meeting tonight and presented in the staff report with the following conditions of approval:

**Condition 1:** Prior to the issuance of a land use permit, all appropriate approvals from local, county, state and federal agencies, including, but not limited to, Hamburg Township Fire, Accessor, and Public Works Departments,

the Livingston County Road Commission, Drain Commissioner, and Health Department, and the Michigan Department of Environmental, Great Lakes and Energy, and Transportation shall be received.

**Condition 2:** A development agreement including mater deeds and bylaws will be submitted for this project. This agreement will be reviewed by the Township Attorney. This agreement shall include a cross-access agreement that allows public use of the private roadways, sidewalks and parks within the project.

**Condition 3:** The new lighting fixtures presented, including the bollards, are acceptable and the height of the light poles shall not exceed 12 feet.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

1. Consideration of the repeal of the Zoning Ordinance Section 36-434 -Cottage housing planned unit development (CHPUD).

Chair Muck opened the meeting to David. David explained that he had given the commissioners a copy of the existing ordinance as well as the proposed ordinance. He stated we have two redundant ordinances that said the same thing. It was recommended by Commissioner Hughes to repeal the original cottage housing since it was largely covered in the newly updated ordinance. At the last meeting, there was no objection to doing this repeal. David is looking for a recommendation from the commissioners to take to the Township Board, in favor of repealing this second section of the cottage housing ordinance.

**Approval** motion made by Commissioner Hughes, seconded by Commissioner Priebe, to recommend to the Township Board to repeal Section 36-434 to 36-438 Cottage Housing Planned Unit Development (CHPUD).

2. Proposed Amendments to PZTA #24-0004 Zoning Ordinance, Article 3, Section 36-482 Sign regulation enforcement.

Chair Muck opened the public hearing to David. David explained that this request came from Parks and Recreation Department for code enforcement and infraction penalties. Chair Muck stated that he sits on the Park and Recreational Board. He stated that signage enforcement needed to be clarified so staff and residents knew were signage could be placed, and how long it could stay there. We have had several

large events going on in the community on Merrill, and we needed to clean up the signage ordinance to get it on the books. Muck said he appreciated the work of Deby Hennerman. Commissioner Hamlin asked if this was all new. Chair Muck and David said no but that the park application and this ordinance needed to be clarified regarding the size, duration and placement of such signage. Commissioner Priebe asked if this was an ordinance that was ready to make a motion on or is this just something for us to look at? David told her that this was something that they could make a motion on since this was a public hearing. The redlined document is showing what changes are being made to this sign ordinance. Commissioner Priebe said that since this is a public hearing, it should be opened up for discussion from the public.

Chair Muck opened the call to the Public on this PZTA #24-0004 Zoning Ordinance, Article 3, Section 36-482 Sign regulation enforcement. No one came to the podium, so Chair Muck closed the call to Public.

Chair Muck opened the meeting to the commissioners.

**3. Zoning Administrator's Report**- we will not have any agenda items for November as of today. We will be looking to do the 5-year review of the Master Plan in January.

Commissioner Hamlin wanted to state that he got a copy of the traffic study for the Lakeland Trails Apartments, and it appears that we will be getting a four-way stop intersection. He said that this is not good. Some communities hire a traffic engineer on their behalf to interact with MDOT and since we are having a lot of these projects coming into this area, we might want to hire a traffic expert to review these studies and help with the traffic flow from this new area. Commissioner Leabu said he agreed with Hamlin. Commissioner Hughes asked David if the developer pays for these traffic studies. She said she didn't think that the engineers were out there onsite to check the flow numbers. David agreed that these traffic impact studies are difficult to understand. David admitted that we don't have a lot of say or power in this process. By having a third-party contractor engineer review, we might have a little more involvement in our communities traffic management. David agreed that this sounded like a good idea. Commissioner Priebe asked if around a bout would be a better plan than a four way stop for this intersection. Chair Muck agreed that this would be a good idea as well. #### **BYLAWS & RULES OF PROCEDURE**

## **Article I - Name**

**Hamburg Township Parks & Recreation Committee** 

## **Article II - Purpose**

The Parks and Recreation Committee shall be an advisory body to the Hamburg Township Board of Trustee's for the following:

- 2.1 Management of Parklands and Recreational Facilities, Township Senior/Community Center, and the Lakelands Trail, including the approval and scheduling of their use.
- 2.2 Review of an Annual Business Plan and Supporting Budget as presented by the Clerk.
- 2.3 Development of recommendations to the Hamburg Township Board regarding expenditures and program enhancements.
- 2.4 Development and oversight of all grant proposals related to the Township's Parkland facilities and/or operations.
- 2.5 Development and maintenance of a five year Parks and Recreation Master Plan.
- 2.6 Development of agreements with schools and community groups, e.g. scouts, charitable and not-for-profit organizations, etc., to undertake cooperative programs, projects and events.
- 2.7 Marketing of various recreational programs to the community-at-large.
- Oversight for programmatic development and use of the Lakelands Trail.
- 2.9 In cooperation with the Township's Building & Grounds and Clerk's Departments, responsible for providing management oversight of all physical modifications and enhancements to the Parks and Recreation property and facilities to ensure that all work is done with the appropriate permits, licenses, inspections, and liability protection, e.g. bonding.
- 2.10 Working closely with the Township's Public Safety Departments (Police and Fire) to ensure that residents receive the proper level of protection during the time they are using the Townships Parks and Recreation facilities.
- 2.11 Working with Volunteer based organizations, individuals and groups who use Parks and Recreation facilities to obtain important feedback about their experiences and suggestions for improvement and usage.

## Article III - Membership

The Committee shall consist of five (5) voting members. All members shall be appointed by the Township Board according to the terms of these Bylaws.

- 3.1 Five (5) voting members shall consist of the following:
  - Hamburg Township Clerk.
  - One (1) additional member of the Hamburg Township Board of Trustees to be nominated by the Clerk and appointed by the Township Board.
  - Three (3) members at-large nominated by the Hamburg Township Clerk to be appointed by the Hamburg Township Board to serve for two year terms. All such members must be citizens of Hamburg Township. Such members shall not hold a position as an officer or a Board member of any category of user of the Township Park Facilities as set forth in the Hamburg Township Park Facility Use Policy, Sections 3.2, 3.3 and 3.4. Member may also be a Pinckney Community High School student as recommended by the acting PHS Athletic Director or Superintendent of Schools.
- 3.2 Attendance of non-voting staff members on as needed basis:
  - Parks & Recreation Coordinator
  - Public Safety representative
  - DPW/Building & Grounds representative
  - Senior Center Director
- 3.3 Removal. Any member may be removed by a majority vote of the Township Board for whatever reason.
- 3.4 Trustee, citizen and hourly staff members that are not serving during business hours will be paid at the rate of \$65.00 per diem for regularly scheduled meetings. Citizen and hourly staff members that are not serving during business hours will be paid at the rate of \$65.00 per diem for special meetings.
- 3.5 Members may be reimbursed for expenses authorized by the Committee incurred while performing duties related to the work of the Committee. Mileage authorized by the Committee for Committee activities will be reimbursed at the current rate approved by the Township Board. Travel to and from meetings will not be reimbursed.

3.6 Expenses incurred by members relating to attendance at recreational related seminars, conventions, or other meetings must be pre-approved by the Township Board.

## **Article IV - Officers**

4.1 Selection. The Clerk, or other Hamburg Township official named as Park Administrator, shall be the primary Chair of the Parks and Recreation Committee. At the January regular meeting, or the first scheduled meeting of a new term, the Committee shall elect from its voting members, a secondary Chairperson, who shall serve for a 24-month period beginning at the January regular meeting and running through the end of their stated term or until such time as a successor has been appointed, to run meetings in the primary Chairperson's absence. The Chairperson shall be responsible for establishing the agenda for all meetings and will preside over all meetings.

### **Article V - Meetings**

- 5.1 Meeting Notices. All regularly scheduled and special meetings shall be posted at the Hamburg Township Hall by the Hamburg Township Clerk, and shall otherwise comply with the requirements of 15.261 et seq., commonly referred to as the Open Meetings Act.
- 5.2 **Meetings.** Regular meetings shall be held monthly according to the schedule adopted by the Committee prior to their first regularly scheduled monthly meeting of each year to be held on the fourth Tuesday of January at 3:00 p.m.
- 5.3 **Special Meetings.** Special meetings may be called by the Township Clerk, the Chairperson of the Committee or by a majority of the voting members of the Committee.
- Quorum. In order for the Committee to conduct business or take any official action, a quorum consisting of the majority of all the voting members serving on the Committee must be present. When a quorum is not present, no official action may take place. The members of the Committee may discuss matters of interest, but can take no action until the next regular or special meeting.
- Voting. An affirmative vote of the majority of the quorum shall be required for the approval of any requested action or motion placed before the Committee. Voting shall ordinarily be by voice vote; provided, however, that a roll call vote shall be required if requested by any Committee member or directed by the Chairperson. If a roll call vote is taken, the individual vote, yea or nay, of each Committee member must be recorded in the minutes of the meeting.
- 5.6 **Order of Business.** A written agenda for all meetings shall be prepared as follows. The order of business shall include:

- 5.8 **Rules of Order.** All meetings of the Committee shall be conducted in an orderly manner similar to Roberts Rule of Order.

## **Article VI - Minutes**

6.1 Committee minutes shall be prepared by the Township Clerk. The Township Clerk may appoint a staff member as the minute's recorder who will be compensated according to current Township policy. The minutes shall contain a brief synopsis of the meeting, including a complete restatement of all motions and record of votes; and record of attendance. All communications, actions and resolutions shall be attached to the minutes. The official records shall be deposited with the Township Clerk.

#### **Article VII - Open Meetings and Freedom of Information Provisions**

- 7.1 All Committee meetings shall comply with the terms and provisions of MCL 15.261 et seq., commonly referred to as the Open Meetings Act.
- 7.2 All business conducted by the Committee or any and all of its documents are subject to the provisions of MCL 15.231 et seq., commonly referred to as Freedom Of Information Act (FOIA).
- 7.3 A person shall not be excluded from a meeting of the Committee except for a breach of peace committed at the meetings.
