BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Crime Comparison by Quarter Report (**Exhibit A**) has been updated by the addition of the 4th Quarter of 2024. *Person Crimes* are down to 3, which is the lowest rate in 2024. *Person Crimes* are serious crimes, which in the 4th quarter, included a person who committed assault, harassment, and escape, a possible sex crime, and a domestic disturbance that was reported to the District Attorney.

Property crimes have decreased to 7 during the 4th Qtr. of 2024. These included a burglary (Pharmacy), plus a theft and shoplifting, all at our businesses, with the one residential exception being fraud. *Drug/Alcohol Crimes* are at zero, as are *Traffic Offenses*. *All other offenses* is 12; which is 3 more than the previous quarter. These were mostly warrants for arrest. One 17-yr old juvenile was arrested for failure to perform the duties of a driver, property damage, curfew violation, and driving uninsured.

In arrests, there were 2 *person arrests; 4 traffic arrests*, and 13 *all other arrests*. Most of *all other arrests* are based on outstanding warrants, and are the same as above in all other offenses.

Citations were up by 8 from the last quarter to 46. Total violations were increased slightly over the previous quarter. There were 3 non-injury crashes. Moving violations

was slightly higher than 3rd quarter, at 21, plus 28 *licenses without insurance*, and 3 *speeders. Equipment violations* also increased by 1 to 20.

In the YTD Crimes compared to last year (**Exhibit B**, Page 4), Council can see that *property crimes, all other offenses, and person crimes,* are all still lower than last year. Traffic offenses were the same compared to last year.

Finally, looking at the Contract Cities Crime Report, (**Exhibit B**, Page 5) at the end of the report, the latest arrests have moved Harrisburg to a rate higher than any of the other contract cities. But to keep it in perspective, that is due to people with warrants having violated several crimes. In comparison, we have a count of 8, compared to Millersburg's 6 for YTD crimes during 2024. Finally, crimes last year was 6 higher than this year.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the City Council review and determine if the grant should be provided to the Freeman's for improvement of the former VFW Quonset Hut.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

When the Freemans first submitted their report to the City, it was intended for the Property Improvement Grant in the HRA. \$50,000 was budgeted for this fiscal year's grants. The grant request was put on hold, while additional information was provided to Staff. Shortly after, Staff became aware of a loss of revenue in the HRA fund. and began researching why the expected revenues weren't arriving from Linn County. It was discovered that Linn County had submitted the incorrect statute language to the Oregon Department of Revenue for Substantial Amendment No. 6, causing a loss of revenue for this fiscal year. At the last HRA meeting, Staff shared that Linn County will be providing the bulk of the revenues due in this fiscal year, in fall of 2025, along with the next fiscal year's revenues. As such, the HRA Board decided that it shouldn't be accepting grant requests this year.

Because the Freemans had already submitted the grant request, based on previously budgeted funds, Staff suggested that the Freeman's could instead obtain the grant from

the Community & Economic Development Fund (CE & D). This fund currently has \$155,000 remaining in it, after \$40,000 was used last year to apply to the former Air Thai restaurant.

The Quonset hut was built in 1930 and has been used continuously since it's placement at 160 Smith St. as the fraternal lodge of the VFW. The Freemans have plans to create a commercial business in this location and would also like to add a residential dwelling. They will need to apply for site plan approval for a business to be located there, along with a special use permit to allow a dwelling in a commercial zone, plus a variance will be needed to allow the residential unit to remain on the ground floor. The property is also located in the historical zone. The land use requirements will need to be approved prior to any work being done, and will be a condition to the grant being allowed to be applied to this structure. The Freemans are applying for the grant before the land use procedure, as this process is expensive, and knowing that they have the grant is necessary for proceeding forward.

The application itself, along with the map, quotes for work to be done, and pictures of the property are available in **Exhibit A**, with the exception of the formal electrical bid from 4-Point Electric, LLC, and a bid from Bennett Ceilings. The applicant will provide emails, or proof of bids provided by next Wednesday's meeting and will be included as an Addendum in the minutes. The eligibility standards are located in the application for the CE & D grant shown in **Exhibit B**.

As noted below, the project does meet the requirements of the grant:

- The property is located in the C-1 Commercial zone,
- City Council approval of this permit will allow eligibility of this project, even though it is inside the HRA boundaries,
- The project does cure blight, as the condition of the roof and the structure itself is poor. The rear of the property will be greatly improved, and is visible to Moore St. and City Hall parking areas.
- This project must comply with all City adopted codes and ordinances, and as noted in the staff report above, will need to go through the Planning Commission process.
- The project is visible from the public right-of-way, from both Smith St., and Moore St.
- The project is not tax exempt, and all taxes, fees, and liens are paid.

The application used is acceptable to Staff, as it asks for the same information as the HRA property improvement grant. The applicants are well aware of the historical zone requirements, and the City's grant process, as they've received several HRA grants for the Order of the Oddfellows Building on the corner of 2nd & Smith St. They also successfully used a Main Street Revitalization Grant to apply to that structure, and have created exactly the kind of mixed use urban development that was envisioned by the HRA. Their home is located on the 2nd and 3rd floors of the Oddfellows structure, while there is a commercial business on the bottom floor facing Smith St. The owners respect

the process, as Donnell was raised in Harrisburg, making them ideal candidates for honoring the VFW building, and historical Harrisburg while creating a new commercial use.

The decision in relation to the design of the windows, paint and doors will be made by the Planning Commission when the land use application is reviewed. However, the City Council can see in the pictures provided in **Exhibit A** some other admittedly more modern adaptations of Quonset huts that have been modified for urban use. This building will be like some of the others that have been through the Planning Commission process as it's a challenging building that isn't at all like an 1890's riverfront community.

The main work being done includes repair and power washing to the metal rolled roofing, as well as the front and back siding. New windows and doors will be added, and new lighting will also be added to meet appropriate commercial security requirements; new landscaping will also be required on the lot, as per the development code. The applicant received both electrical and a general contractor bid for repair and prep work from Bennett Ceilings, in the combined amounts of \$15,655. However, those contractors haven't yet provided them with a formal written bid, that is emailed, or signed and stamped by them. They have provided us with a written statement of the work to be done, and the value. The applicants understand that they will need to obtain the formal written or emailed bids to be provided by Wednesday's meeting. This can also be conditioned if needed.

Regardless of which designs the Freemans will apply after going through the land use process, it's clear that the City will gain a new commercial structure that can be used for a viable retail or service business; that is truly a mixed use, with a residential use in the back of the property. This is an exciting project for the City, as the business additions of Allstate in the Oddfellows building, and the Rampy Building being used for Arrow Services, are two businesses that the City didn't have five years ago. The City welcomes the continued commercial growth in our traditional downtown core.

If the City Council agrees with the use of the funds for this project, then Staff suggests the following Conditions of Approval.

Conditions of Approval:

- The property owners must obtain approval from the Planning Commission for the following land use and application procedures before construction work commences:
 - a. A Site Plan
 - b. A Special Use Permit for the mixed-use development
 - c. A Historical Zone Application
 - d. A Variance to allow a residential unit on the ground floor
 - e. A Change of use Building Permit to apply to both the commercial use, and the residential use of the structure.

- 2. The property owners must sign a development agreement with the City of Harrisburg.
- The Property must undergo inspection, and the applicant must provide proof of payment, and meet the requirements of the development agreement before reimbursement is provided.
- 4. No construction may start until the development agreement is signed, and the conditions of approval are completed.
- 5. All construction work must be completed within a year of the development agreement.





Harrisburg Community & Economic Development Property Improvement Grant Program

Program Guidelines and Overview

Purpose:

Community & Economic Development is vital to the City of Harrisburg. As such, we have developed a Property Improvement Grant Program similar to the one used in the Harrisburg Redevelopment Agency. This will allow the City to continue to help businesses located in the commercial zone, but that are outside of the HRA boundaries, unless Council waives this requirement. Limited Financial Assistance is available for projects that increase the value of commercial buildings, and meet the guidelines of the program:

- 1. Develop downtown and Third Street as an historic & specialty business market.
- 2. Develop commercial sites within the City limits, but that are outside of the Urban Renewal Program Boundaries, or are otherwise not eligible for that program.
- 3. Improve conditions and appearances of public and private properties in the commercial downtown and on Third Street.
- 4. Create funding opportunities for renovation of properties and construction of new structures in downtown and on Third Street, consistent with an historic theme if located in that overlay zone.

Grant Funds:

The Community & Economic Development Property Improvement Grant Program provides funds for eligible projects. Property Improvement Grants may provide funding for up to 50 percent (50%) of the total cost of a project, with a maximum grant award of \$50,000.

The City Council shall have the power to determine the amount of grant funding to be issued, based on the project's relation to the goals and objectives of the Harrisburg Economic Development Program and overall Strategic Plan.

The City shall provide written record of funding decisions. The record shall include a description of the required uses of the approved funds. Grant funds must be used for the purposes defined by this record.

Eligible Applicants:

Eligible properties must be within the Commercial Zone (C-1) shown in the Harrisburg Zoning Map. Business owners who are tenants of a building must provide written consent from the building owner for all proposed improvements.

Eligible Projects:

Enhancements to new or existing buildings within the Commercial Zone may be eligible for funding. Projects must specifically be designed to increase the value and improve the facade of the business or structure. Eligible Projects must also meet the following criteria:

- The property must be located on property zoned C-1 (Commercial);
- The property may not be located in the Harrisburg Redevelopment Agency Boundaries (The City Council can waive this rquirement if appropriate);
- The project cures blight;
- The project complies with all city adopted codes and ordinances;
- The project is visible from the public right-of-way, or if an interior project, it is limited to patron areas;
- The property and/or project are not tax-exempt; and,
- All municipal taxes, fees, and liens are paid.

Application Process:

In order to receive a Community & Economic Development Property Improvement Grant, the building owner, or tenant with building owner approval, shall complete all of the following:

- If in Historic District, review historic design guidelines in the Harrisburg Community Action Plan;
- Complete and submit a Property Improvement Grant Application form;
- Submit a drawing of proposed improvements (plans need not be done by a professional architect unless the project includes structural improvements);
- Submit a specific description of each part of the proposed improvement (e.g. paint color, material type, etc.); and,
- Submit cost estimates for the proposed improvements. Bids shall be provided if the work will be done by a contractor.

Approval Procedures:

- Upon receipt of all application materials described above, City staff will review the application and refer it to the City Council.
- The City Council will then make a decision based upon the approval criteria. The
 City Council may impose conditions of approval, which shall be included in the
 Property Improvement Grant Agreement.
- If approved, City staff will contact the applicant and construction may ONLY begin after the Property Improvement Grant Agreement is signed by the applicant.

Award Reimbursement and Timing Procedures:

• Construction may begin only after the application is approved and the Property

Improvement Grant Agreement is signed by the applicant and City. Any materials purchased or work performed prior to the agreement being signed will not be eligible for reimbursement. Please be aware that the agreement is a legal document, and will not be available until at least two weeks from the time of approval.

- Grants will only be issued after construction is complete. Projects must be completed within twelve (12) months of the City Council approval.
- At completion of the project, City staff must be contacted for a site inspection. If the inspection finds that the project complies with all the standards and conditions above and with the pre-approved plans submitted with the application, then the project will be eligible for reimbursement.
- Reimbursable costs include materials and labor (for licensed, contracted work only). Receipts must be provided, along with corresponding proof of payment. (Credit card statements, cancelled checks, etc.)
- A final invoice with the total of the project must be provided to the City.
 Funds will be dispersed within 30 days from the date of the project invoice receipt.
