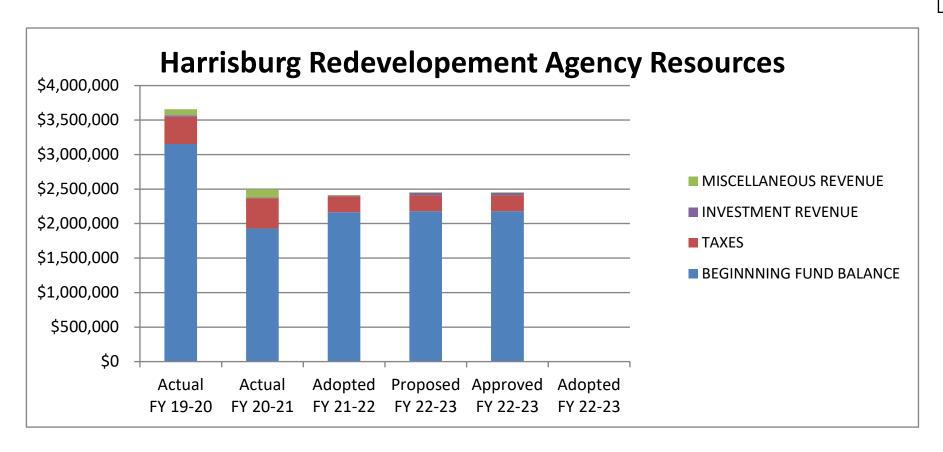

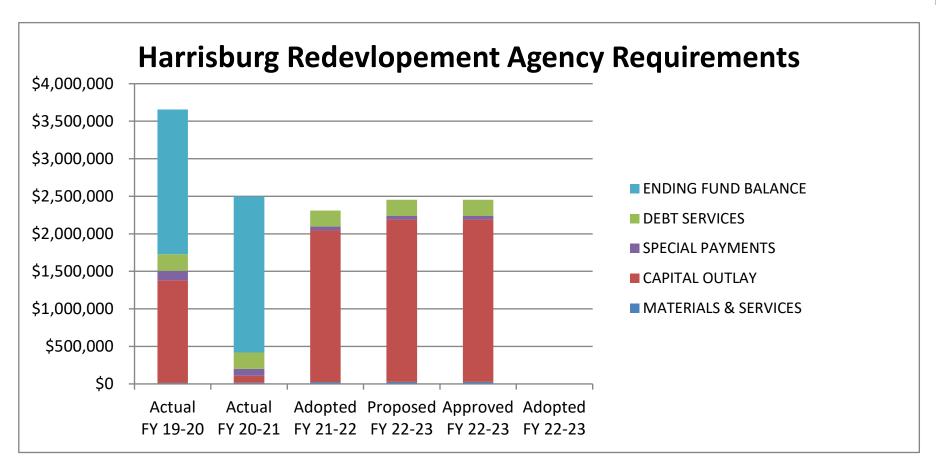

RESOLUTION NO. HRA-67

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE CASH BASIS OF ACCOUNTING FOR THE ANNUAL BUDGET, BOOKS OF RECORD, AND FINANCIAL REPORTING FOR THE HRA

WHEREAS, Harrisburg Redevelopment Agency has consistently prepared the annual budget on the modified accrual basis of accounting; and

WHEREAS, Harrisburg Redevelopment Agency wants to simplify and streamline the Agency's budgetary process by adopting the modified cash basis of accounting for budgetary purposes; and

WHEREAS, the selection of the basis of account is left to the discretion of each municipal corporation. Once a new basis of accounting is adopted, it shall be followed in the year for which the budget was prepared and each succeeding year thereafter until changed in a subsequent budget. Such change must be published as provided in ORS294.416(3).

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Harrisburg Redevelopment Agency adopts the modified cash basis of accounting for the annual budget, books of record, and financial reporting, effective July 1, 2023.
