STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends Council approve Ordinance No. 1000

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Planning Commission met on November 21, 2023, to discuss proposed changes to pavement requirements in industrial zones. During the public hearing for Vincent Ferris' in relation to his property located on S. 6th St. on October 17, 2023, Planning Commission members realized that the current development code required paving of all parking areas in industrial zones. In fact, the current development code contained provisions to require all parking areas to be paved, as well as all driveways. Two of the members of the Planning Commissions that were appointed in 2012, did so due to the City's requirement to pave industrial zone parking areas. At that time, they successfully convinced the Planning Commission and the City Council that industrial properties shouldn't be required to pave interior parcels, where maneuvering and parking are occurring. They asked for the previous code language from the older development code to be applied to the newer municipal code in order to remove the paving requirement.

The Planning Commission had also considered changes to HMC 18.70.030(c), but the PW Director felt that request should be denied, due to the increase in regulatory requirements, and the need to keep loose rock off of the City's transportation network. The Planning Commission agreed with the denial, as long as industrial properties didn't

have to pave parking lots or maneuvering areas unless they were 200' feet from City streets, commercial zones, or residential properties, as allowed in the previous code.

At the last meeting the Planning Commission also discussed landscaping requirements in HMC 18.75.030(5)(b). When the City was discussing the new development code, we recognized that it would be unusual for the City to have any future development that would have parking areas that are larger than 5,000 feet, but didn't want to shortchange ourselves, if we were to get a large commercial establishment, such as Target, or a large grocery store. However, it's unlikely that a large commercial establishment will ever consider building in Harrisburg; plus the Planning Commission is always able to apply more stringent requirements to site plan and conditional use requests. The provision to require irrigated landscape islands is very cost prohibitive to smaller industrial and commercial properties.

Planting trees is always a good idea, as it helps to cool down the heat from those surfaces. However, the Planning Commission didn't want us to use the first part of HMC 18.75.030(5)(a), as it calls for a minimum of 10% of the total area of all parking areas, as measured around the perimeter of all parking spaces and maneuvering areas, shall be landscaped. They felt that a tree for every 15 parking spaces was fair and is all that is needed when there are landscaping requirements elsewhere in the Municipal Code. The physical barriers required in HMC 18.75.030(5) are important as well, for both safety, as well as protection of landscaping, and sidewalks or driveways.

The Planning Commission staff report from November 21, 2023, can be found in **Exhibit A**. In that report, staff explained and provided findings that allowed for our ability to apply these changes as corrections to the development code. The changes requested are to either revert to the requirements of the previous development code, or to remove some of the sentences in the newer development code. The changes we are making can therefore be applied without a public hearing, as well as avoiding the notification requirements of the Department of Land Conservation & Development (DLCD). Both the DLCD and our legal team provided us with the ORS and OAR that allowed the City to be more efficient with the changes we desired, as well as the process being less expensive in the long run. Because it also benefits industrial property owners, it's a win-win situation for the City.

CRITERIA AND FINDINGS OF FACT:

In relation to HMC 18.75.030(5), Landscaping, Walls, Fences & Outdoor Lighting and HMC 18.80.030(4), Vehicular Access & Circulation.

Criterion: 19.35.010 Purpose.

The purpose of this chapter is to provide standards and procedures for amendments to the comprehensive plan, this code, and the zoning map. Amendments may be necessary from time to time to reflect changing community conditions, to correct mistakes, or to address changes in the law. [Ord. 987 § 1 (Exh. A), 2022.]

1. Except for corrections, amendments to the comprehensive plan are legislative (Type IV).

Discussion: The Planning Commission has considered the comparisons between the current Zoning & Development Code, in relation to the previous Zoning & Development Code, and is recommending that

- 1. The City should return to the previous zoning requirements in relation to paving of hard surfacing materials in the industrial zones; and,
- 2. The City should strike the first sentence in section 18.75.030(5)(a), and all of (b) which requires irrigated landscape islands for parking areas larger than 5,000 square feet.

Finding: As discussed by the Planning Commission in the staff report of November 12, 2023, in relation to current development code HMC 19.35-010-020(1), the revision of the current development code in section HMC 18.80.030(4): Parking & Loading, and that of section HMC 18.75.030(5): Landscaping and Screening, are hereby considered to be corrections, rather than amendments. The adoption of Ordinance No. 1000 will therefore correct the Municipal Code and will take effect on January 14, 2024. This criteria has been met.

BACKGROUND

At the meeting of September 19, 2023, Planning Commissioners expressed surprise during the public hearing for a site plan for Vincent Ferris Construction. Two of the

Planning Commission members had applied for their current positions back in 2012 in relation to the City updating the zoning code at that time, as it required paving for industrial zoned lands. They successfully lobbied to find a solution that worked for Harrisburg. During the relatively fast update and review of the Zoning and Development Code in 2020-2021, some of the members of the Planning Commission didn't realize the ramifications of how the development code would apply to industrial site plans in relation to paving, and in particular to manufacturing and storage facilities that are located quite some distance from a public right-of-way. Unfortunately, none of the Planning Commission caught this during the final review of the amended development code.

After a lengthy discussion in relation to this matter, the Planning Commission made a recommendation to the City Council that we modify the M-1 & M-2 code to no longer require paving in the industrial zones other than for the driveway, and primary parking lots.

The Planning Commission also met in the month of October to discuss these changes, but since these changes are in relation to recommendations made by John Hitt, that it deserved a conversation amongst the majority of the Planning Commission, rather than barely the quorum present at that meeting.

INTRODUCTION

At the September meeting, Staff was asked to provide the Planning Commission members with a copy of all code requirements in relation to paving. The Planning Commission will find this research as **Exhibit A**. Because the development code had been adopted a year ago, Staff didn't necessarily think that the City could call this a correction. Because this amendment would apply to all industrial lands, it looked as though HMC 19.35.010(2) would apply, and therefore require a PAPA (Post Acknowledgement Plan Amendments) Notice requirement of 35 days; which would not leave enough time for the required public hearings to take place according to State Statutes before this meeting. HMC 19.35.010 - 020 is below.

19.35.010 Purpose.

The purpose of this chapter is to provide standards and procedures for amendments to the comprehensive plan, this code, and the zoning map. Amendments may be necessary from time to time to reflect changing community conditions, to correct mistakes, or to address changes in the law. [Ord. 987 § 1 (Exh. A), 2022.] 19.35.020 Procedure.

- 1. Except for corrections, amendments to the comprehensive plan are legislative (Type IV).
- 2. Amendments to the development code or zoning map that affect more than one parcel, or more than one acre, whichever is greater, are legislative (Type IV) actions. Amendments to the development code or zoning map that are less than one acre and affect only one parcel are quasi-judicial (Type III) actions.

- 3. Amendments to the zoning map that require an amendment to the comprehensive plan are legislative (Type IV) actions.
- 4. Amendments that do not meet the criteria under subsections (1) through (3) of this section may be processed as either quasi-judicial or legislative amendments, subject to applicable Oregon law. [Ord. 987 § 1 (Exh. A), 2022.]

Staff finally had an opportunity to consult with our regional Department of Land Conservation & Development director, who provided some guidance in relation to whether or not this could be considered a correction, rather than an amendment. She was supplied with the following ORS and OAR; and it was suggested that Staff check with our legal team over the ramifications of determining whether or not we feel that the statutes, and OAR would apply in this case. Those are below:

ORS 197.610

(5) When a local government determines that the land use statutes, statewide land use planning goals and administrative rules of the commission that implement either the statutes or the goals do not apply to a proposed change to the acknowledged comprehensive plan and the land use regulations, submission of the proposed change under this section is not required.

660-018-0022

Exemptions to Notice Requirements Under OAR 660-018-0020

(1) When a local government determines that no goals, commission rules, or land use statutes apply to a particular proposed change, the notice of a proposed change under OAR 660-018-0020 is not required.

Since then, Staff also checked with our legal team, who suggested a way to proceed if the City should feel that this could be a correction, rather than an amendment. Therefore, Staff does feel that since we haven't had a previous application that was affected by any of these parts of the Municipal Code, that the City could determine that it should be a correction, rather than an amendment, even though it's been a year since adoption.

Because the paving requirement is listed through several sections, Staff felt that we needed some more conversation on what needed to be changed before taking this to the City Council for further discussion. Looking at **Exhibit A**, the Planning Commission should note that HMC 18.65, 18.70, 18.75, 18.80, 18.85 and 18.90 all apply to both site plans and conditional use permits. Those are the two main types of land use actions that would apply to industrial zoned lands. (A partition doesn't require paving by itself, until it's determined by an applicant what type of use should be applied to the property, and then proceeds with a site plan, subdivision, or conditional use permit.)

The prior development code (**Exhibit B**) required that any industrial zoned property that was within 200' of a residential zone, or a property that had a residential use, or within 50' of a commercial property, or a public street, should be required to apply a hard surface to all areas that were used for parking or maneuvering. However, all

commercially zoned usages or zoning were required to have hard surfacing regardless of where it was located. Under the old development code, the industrial property being considered at the last meeting would be required to pave the parking areas in the site plan within 200' of the property line. Everything parked in this area, would require hard surfacing treatment, and everything behind the 200' measurement wouldn't need to be hard surfaced.

When John Hitt went over this part of the code, he was stressing that in terms of property valuation, it is in the City's best interest to require paving of all parts of an industrial property. That still applies if the City only considers property tax revenue; however, in terms of a tough economy, the City should also consider if businesses will be attracted to develop here. Allowing more flexibility in industrial zones would be favorable to economic development. However, it should also be noted that most businesses that are developing in an industrial zone tend to be in manufacturing, and therefore, usually have deeper pockets, and can typically afford hard surfacing treatments.

Since this hadn't been broadly discussed during the amendment's portions of prior meetings, the Planning Commission could return to this previous municipal code wording; requiring that any industrially zoned property would need to have paving if it was within 200' of a property used for residential purposes, or zoned as such, or within 50' if it was a commercial property, or within 50' of a public street. This would feasibly be considered a correction to return to the previous code requirements. If the Planning Commission wishes to change beyond this requirement, then the City would need to proceed with the Legislative Type IV requirements of the current development code.

It is in Staff's opinion that commercially zoned property, which are located more centrally to main arterials and traditional downtown markets should continue to be required to apply hard surfacing treatments. Applicants have the ability to apply for variances, if the applicant feels that they can meet the criteria in relation to a variance request. There are few remaining parcels of commercially zoned properties which would be large enough and capable of housing a structure in which to conduct business, and customer parking, while also allowing for 'storage of recreational vehicles, travel trailers, or boats that do not typically move more than once per week'.

<u>Driveways</u>: Driveways were not questioned in September, but the Planning Commission should consider that now, while the windows of correction are still open, and determine if they would like to return to the previous code in relation to industrially zoned properties. In **Exhibit B**, the Planning Commission can see that industrially zoned properties were required to have hard surfacing for the first 50' of driveway. In the current code, under **Exhibit A**, HMC 18.70.030, all driveways, regardless of where they are located on an industrial property, would require hard surfacing. Driveways within 50' of a public street are still capable of carrying gravel, dirt, mud, and other substances onto a public street. Regulatory requirements are now stricter in terms of controlling these substances. Therefore, staff is more favorably inclined to require a

primary driveway to be paved throughout the property, and recommends that the Planning Commission only approve the 1st & 3rd correction request.

<u>Parking Lot Design</u>: There is another part of the code that could also be considered by the Planning Commission, that technically affects the project being proposed in the future by Vincent Ferris. The Oregon Model Code that we followed included a few types of development that the City of Harrisburg may not ever experience. It was thought prudent to include them, as we didn't necessarily want to limit ourselves. Much of what we included in the code is in relation to current trends, and specific regulations. It is also important as it meets best practices in terms of property valuations.

HMC 18.75.030(5)(b) is in relation to any property that has a parking area that is larger than 5,000 sq. ft. 5,000 sq. ft would allow for approximately 20-25 spaces, with a drive lane. In HMC 18.75.030(5) below, section a is important, as trees can be included as part of the landscaping requirements, and they are also important to lowering the heat coming off of asphalt, gravel, and other dark or impermeable surfaces.

The type of parking lot that is being described below, however, is a standard such as that used for a large shopping area, like a grocery store, or a larger shopping mall. Staff feel that asking for the perimeter of all parking spaces to have at a minimum, 1 tree per 15 spaces, is not out of line. In c, all of the normal physical barriers that are on the edge of parking spaces, or maneuvering spaces are also important, and should not be eliminated. The Planning Commission could decide that b. shouldn't be applied to industrial zones, or they could recommend that it be removed entirely, as the provision of irrigation in a large parking lot is an expensive item.

HMC 18.75.030(5) Landscaping, Walls, Fences & Outdoor Lighting

- 5. Parking Lot Landscaping. All of the following standards shall be met for parking lots in excess of 5,000 square feet. If a development contains multiple parking lots, then the standards shall be evaluated separately for each parking lot.
 - a. A minimum of 10 percent of the total surface area of all parking areas, as measured around the perimeter of all parking spaces and maneuvering areas, shall be landscaped. At a minimum, one tree per 15 parking spaces on average shall be planted over and around the parking area.
 - b. All parking areas with more than 30 spaces shall provide irrigated landscape islands of at least one 48-square-foot island or larger for every 5,000 square feet of total parking surface area.
 - c. Wheel stops, curbs, bollards, or other physical barriers are required along the edges of all vehicle maneuvering areas to protect landscaping from being damaged by vehicles. Trees shall be planted at least two feet from any such barrier.

d. Trees planted in tree wells within sidewalks or other paved areas shall be installed with root barriers, consistent with applicable nursery standards.

If the Planning Commission should wish to return to the previous municipal development code in relation to industrial zoned property, then they can consider the following changes:

CRITERIA AND FINDINGS OF FACT

1. In Relation to Paving of property inside the M-1 and M-2 zones:

Criterion: 19.35.010 Purpose.

The purpose of this chapter is to provide standards and procedures for amendments to the comprehensive plan, this code, and the zoning map. Amendments may be necessary from time to time to reflect changing community conditions, to correct mistakes, or to address changes in the law. [Ord. 987 § 1 (Exh. A), 2022.] 19.35.020 Procedure.

1. Except for corrections, amendments to the comprehensive plan are legislative (Type IV).

Discussion: The Planning Commission has considered the comparisons between the current Zoning & Development Code, in relation to the previous Zoning & Development Code, and has determined that the City should return to the previous zoning requirements in relation to paving of hard surfacing materials which allows for the following:

d. In an M-1 zone, all areas for parking or maneuvering vehicles that are within 200 feet of a residence or residentially zoned property, or within 50 feet of commercially zoned property or a public street, shall be hard surfaced. e. In an M-2 zone, all areas for parking or maneuvering vehicles that are within 200 feet of a residence or residentially zoned property, or within 50 feet of commercially zoned property or a public street, shall be hard surfaced.

Finding: As discussed by the Planning Commission in the staff report of November 12, 2023, in relation to current development code HMC 19.35-010-020(1), the revision of the current development code in section HMC 18.80.030(4): Parking & Loading is hereby considered to be a correction, rather than an amendment. The current code will be altered to reflect and include that 'within both M-1 and M-2 zones, all areas for parking or maneuvering of vehicles that are within 200' of a residence or residentially zoned property, or within 50' of a commercially zoned property or a public street shall be hard surfaced from the property line'. **This criteria has been met.**

2. In Relation to the Paving of Driveways in the M-1 and M-2 Zones:

Criterion: 19.35.010 Purpose.

The purpose of this chapter is to provide standards and procedures for amendments to the comprehensive plan, this code, and the zoning map. Amendments may be necessary from time to time to reflect changing community conditions, to correct mistakes, or to address changes in the law. [Ord. 987 § 1 (Exh. A), 2022.] **19.35.020 Procedure.**

1. Except for corrections, amendments to the comprehensive plan are legislative (Type IV).

Discussion: The Planning Commission should consider the differences between the old Municipal Development Code, and the new Municipal Development Code, in relation to the paving requirements of driveways in the M-1 and M-2 zones. If the Planning Commission should wish to return to the previous Municipal Development Code in relation to driveways located in the M-1 and M-2 zones, then they can adopt the following finding. Otherwise, they can adopt only Criteria and Findings in support of No. 1 in relation to this issue, and to deny Criteria and Findings No. 2.

Finding: As discussed by the Planning Commission in the staff report of November 12, 2023, in relation to current development code HMC 19.35-010-020(1), the revision of the current development code in section HMC 18.70.030(4)(c) is hereby considered to be a correction, rather than an amendment. The current code will be altered to reflect and include that 'Driveways shall be paved and meet applicable construction standards, except for those in the M-1 and M-2 zones', **This criteria has been met.**

HMC 18.70.030 (4): Vehicular Access & Circulation

- 4. Approach and Driveway Development & Circulation Standards
 - c. Driveways shall be paved and meet applicable construction standards, except in Industrial zones.
 - (1) In an industrial zone, the first 50 feet of any new driveway, measured from where the driveway intersects with the public street, shall be hard surfaced.

3. <u>In relation to HMC 18.75.030(5) Landscaping, Walls, Fences & Outdoor Lighting</u>

Criterion: 19.35.010 Purpose.

The purpose of this chapter is to provide standards and procedures for amendments to the comprehensive plan, this code, and the zoning map. Amendments may be necessary from time to time to reflect changing community conditions, to correct mistakes, or to address changes in the law. [Ord. 987 § 1 (Exh. A), 2022.] 19.35.020 Procedure.

1. Except for corrections, amendments to the comprehensive plan are legislative (Type IV).

Discussion: The Planning Commission should consider the requirements in HMC 18.75.030(5)(b), and determine if they feel that all parking areas with more than 30 spaces shall provide irrigated landscape islands of at least one 48-square-foot or larger for every 5,000 square-feet of total parking surface area, or if it should be revised to either repeal the requirement entirely, or to amend it to be required in commercial zones.

Finding: As discussed by the Planning Commission in the staff report of November 12, 2023, in relation to current development code HMC 19.35-010-020(1), the revision of the current development code in section HMC 18.75.030(5)(b) may be considered to be a correction, rather than an amendment. The current code can be altered to either remove section b entirely, or have it apply to only commercial zones. **This criteria has been met.**

CONCLUSIONS

The Planning Commission should discuss these issues, and determine if they feel that the current development code should be altered by the findings and recommendations in the staff report above. Section 1 is in relation to paving of industrially zoned properties that are located in M-1 and M-2 zones. Staff Recommends the Approval of Section 1. Section 2 is in relation to the possible modification of the paving of driveways in the M-1 and M-2 zones. Staff Recommends the Denial of Section No. 2. Section 3 is in relation to the current requirements for parking spaces in excess of 5,000 square feet. Staff Recommends the modification of having this apply only to the commercial zones, on the off chance that a large development that has this kind of a parking lot actually develops in Harrisburg.

PLANNING COMMISSION ACTION: Three issues are at stake in this staff report. One is in relation to Paving of Parking Lots and Drive Aisles in the M-1 and M-2 zones, while Two is in relation to the driveway paving in the M-1 and M-2 zones. Three is in relation to the landscape requirements in the industrial zones.

The Planning Commission has four options with respect to No. 1: Paving of property in the M-1 and M-2 zones:

- 1. Approve the request to correct the zoning and development codes in HMC 18.80.030(4);
- 2. Approve the request with modifications if desired by the Planning Commission:
- Motion to Request that Staff return in the future with modifications and language to amend the current zoning & development code in a Title IV application; or
- 4. Deny the request.

The Planning Commission has four options with respect to No. 2: Paving of driveways in the M-1 and M-2 zones:

- 1. Approve the request to correct the zoning and development codes in HMC 18.70.030(4)(c);
- 2. Approve the request with modifications if desired by the Planning Commission:

- Motion to Request that Staff return in the future with modifications and language to amend the current zoning & development code in a Title IV application: or
- 4. Deny the request.

The Planning Commission has four options with respect to No. 3: Parking areas with more than 30 spaces or larger than 5,000 square feet of total parking surface area.

- 5. Approve the request to correct the zoning and development codes in HMC 18.75.030(5)(b);
- Approve the request with modifications if desired by the Planning Commission:
- Motion to Request that Staff return in the future with modifications and language to amend the current zoning & development code in a Title IV application: or
- 8. Deny the request.

Based upon the criteria, discussion, and findings of facts above, Staff recommends the Planning Commission Approve the request to correct HMC 18.80.030(4), and to deny the language to correct HMC 18.70.030(4)(c), and to approve the changes to HMC 18.75.030(5)(b).

RECOMMENDED MOTION(S)

Consistent with staff's recommendation to the Planning Commission, the following motion(s) are recommended:

- 1. "I move to approve and recommend to the City Council the correction of HMC 18.80.030(4) based on findings contained in the November 12, Staff Report. This motion is based on findings contained in the November 12 staff report, and on findings made during deliberations on the request."
- 2. I move to (approve or deny the recommendation to City Council) the change to correct HMC 18.70.030(4)(c), based on findings and recommendations contained in the November 12, staff report, and on findings made during deliberations on the request.
- 3. I move to (approve or deny the recommendation to the City Council) the change to HMC 18.75.030(5)(b), based on findings and recommendations contained in the November 12, staff report, and on findings made during deliberations on the request.

ORDINANCE NO. 1000

AN ORDINANCE CORRECTING HARRISBURG MUNICIPAL CODE 18.75 AND 18.80

WHEREAS, the City of Harrisburg recently adopted the City's new Zoning and Development Code; and,

WHEREAS, modifications to the development code are expected as the City applies them to real world applications; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission recently discussed and recommended a change to HMC 18.80 to modify paving of surfaces in the industrial zones; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission also recommended a change to the landscaping requirements in industrial zones in HMC 18.75; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council agrees with the changes that were recommended.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY OF HARRISBURG ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Harrisburg Municipal Code Chapter 18.75.020 is amended as shown in Exhibit A;

Section 2. Harrisburg Municipal Code Chapter 18.80.030 is amended as shown in Exhibit B;

18.75.030(5) Landscaping and screening.

- 5. Parking Lot Landscaping. All of the following standards shall be met for parking lots in excess of 5,000 square feet. If a development contains multiple parking lots, then the standards shall be evaluated separately for each parking lot.
 - a. At a minimum, one tree per 15 parking spaces on average shall be planted over and around the parking area.
 - b. Wheel stops, curbs, bollards, or other physical barriers are required along the edges of all vehicle maneuvering areas to protect landscaping from being damaged by vehicles. Trees shall be planted at least two feet from any such barrier.
 - c. Trees planted in tree wells within sidewalks or other paved areas shall be installed with root barriers, consistent with applicable nursery standards.

Exhibit B

18.80.030(4) Automobile parking.

- 4. Parking Stall Design and Minimum Dimensions. Where a new off-street parking area is proposed, or an existing off-street parking area is proposed for expansion, the entire parking area shall be improved in conformance with this code. At a minimum, except as provided in HMC 18.80.030(4)(a), parking spaces and drive aisles shall be paved with asphalt, concrete, or other City-approved materials, provided the Americans with Disabilities Act requirements are met, and shall conform to the minimum dimensions in Table 18.80.030.5 and the figures below.
 - a. In M-1 and M-2 Industrial zones, all areas for parking or maneuvering vehicles that are within 200 feet of a residence or residentially zoned property, or within 50 feet of commercially zoned property, or a public street, shall be hard surfaced.
 - b. All off-street parking areas shall contain wheel stops, perimeter curbing, bollards, or other edging as required to prevent vehicles from damaging buildings or encroaching into walkways, landscapes, or the public right-of-way. Parking areas shall also provide for surface water management, pursuant to HMC 18.85.050.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council approve Ordinance No. 1001 and to file a formal request to transfer the reserve strips from Linn County to the City of Harrisburg

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Earlier this year, Staff was asked to look at the reserve strip at the end of N. 8th St., and to open up that section of road for vehicular traffic. During that process, the manager of the real estate division of Linn County realized that the particular reserve strip in question wasn't the only one in their files that should belong to the City.

At this time, the Real Estate Division and Staff have identified 8 reserve strips that need to be transferred from Linn County to the City of Harrisburg. 5 of those reserve strips are on streets that are already open to traffic and must be formally dedicated as a City street. Only 1 of those reserve strips requiring a dedication is City owned. The strips are shown in **Exhibit A**.

This process took approximately 15-hours of Staff time, as we completed the research into this project, plus time and money to pay the City's Engineering firm to complete the legal descriptions of each reserve strip. Staff was able to determine that most of the

reserve strips were from subdivisions that were platted in the mid-sixties. Staff suspects that there are still other reserve strips in town that will need dedication, many of them in our older subdivisions. However, these are housekeeping types of issues and are not a priority at this time.

As noted previously during a Council meeting, one of these will require our surveyor to complete further research into the process of when the High School was first platted, and constructed, as it appears that the western half of S. 9th St. may not have been dedicated correctly. This will likely require coordination with the School District, depending upon what occurred in the past.

The ordinance adoption and completion of this process is contingent upon the Linn County Commissioners allowing the transfer of properties to the City of Harrisburg. This process, along with the adoption of the Ordinance will complete the dedication of the streets as per ORS standards.

ORDINANCE NO. 1001

AN ORDINANCE DEDICATING VARIOUS RESERVE STRIPS IN THE CITY OF HARRISBURG

WHEREAS, the Dedication of these Reserve Strips are contingent upon the transference of the ownership from Linn County to the City of Harrisburg, Oregon; and,

WHEREAS, consistent with Oregon Revised Statute 92.175 and during a regularly scheduled public meeting on December 14, 2023, the City Council of the City of Harrisburg did review the Conveyance of Reserve Strips that currently exist in previously dedicated City Streets; and,

WHEREAS, the Reserve Strips that are listed in Exhibit A have been used as a public road for decades, and shall forever now be dedicated as a public road as described in Exhibit A;

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the City Council determine if the information provided in the report and at the meeting warrants a 1% increase to the Solid Waste Franchise Rate

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Republic Services sends information to the City on an annual basis when they anticipate a rate increase in the following calendar year. Since 2017, the rates have increased a total of 6 times, with this year being the 7th request. (There were no increases suggested in 2020). Last year, Republic Services asked for a 9% increase, but the City Council only allowed a 7.5% increase.

Solid waste services are one of the few franchises in which the City Council gets to review and participate in a decision to allow rate increases. Ordinance No. 879 was approved in 2009 and is the current ordinance governing solid waste services in Harrisburg. The term for this franchise agreement is a rolling five-year term, unless the City notifies the franchise otherwise based on the terms in the agreement. If needed for referral, the ordinance is online as part of the City Council Agenda for December 13, 2022, as it was part of last year's packet.

Over the last several years, City Council has always asked for additional information to be provided in support of any rate increase requests. Republic Services was asked to provide the rate comparison figures for the 2023 services year which are part of their overall packet. (**Exhibit A**) The proposed rates are based on a formula that Republic Services identifies as the annual Refuse Rate Index (RRI). The RRI formula includes

the rate as provided in the CPI (Consumer Price Index), along with the CPI rate for low sulfur diesel, and the rate charged by the Coffin Butte Disposal. This year, Republic Services is requesting a 1% increase for solid waste services, based off of the RRI schedule for 2023. A 1% increase represents an average increase of \$.22 cents - \$.36 cents per month depending upon the customers cart size. The table below tracks the increases requested since 2017. The packet information and rate schedule includes service rates at the 1% increase, as well as a 2% increase, based on the recycle round-up promotion. (Please see Page No. 3 in this report for more information in relation to the recycle roundup.)

According to the Franchise Agreement, in section 20, it notes that the City may approve the rates if they are not unreasonable and are not substantially higher than those charged generally under similar service requirements and for the same and similar quality of service. The City may establish a different rate schedule. In considering rate adjustments, the City must find the rates to be fair, just, reasonable, and sufficient to provide proper service to the public and will take into consideration the cost of doing business by the Franchisee, the ability of the customer to pay such rates and the rates charged by a similar business. There is a specific list of items the Council should consider when determining the customer rate:

- 1. The cost of performing the service provided by the Franchisee.
- 2. The anticipated increase or decrease in the cost of providing this service.
- 3. The need for equipment replacement and the need for additional equipment to meet the service needs, or technological changes.
- 4. Compliance with federal, state, or local laws or regulations.
- 5. The Franchisee's investment, the value of the business and the necessity that the Franchisee have a reasonable operating margin and rate of return on revenue.
- The public interest in assuring reasonable rates to enable the Franchisee to provide efficient and beneficial service to the residents and other users of the service.
- 7. The local wage scales, cost of management, facilities, and disposal fees and charges.
- 8. Any profit or cost savings resulting from recycling and resource recovery, and any additional costs resulting from recycling and resource recovery.
- 9. Any increase or decrease in the franchise fee charged by the City.
- 10. Rates in other cities for similar service.

11. Any other information deemed necessary for a rate review and adjustment.

As normal, Staff hopes to obtain the rate schedules from Sweet Home Sanitation, which serves both Sweet Home & Brownsville, plus Junction City, and will bring those rates to the meeting. (They aren't available on-line as they have been in the past). Depending upon the decision made by the City Council, Staff can then return in the month of January with a resolution.

Republic Services (RS) does provide community services to the City as part of their services offered. A recycle roundup day has been provided on an annual basis for many years, and is almost always held prior to the 4th of July. They will continue to do this going forward. Last year, the City asked for additional bulky items to be allowed to be dropped off, in order to allow larger items, such as furniture to be disposed. This provided an opportunity for people who have received code violations to clean up their properties. This years event proved quite popular and resulted in a total of five total drop boxes being used at an additional cost. The initial 3 boxes were filled in the first hour of the event, and after the 2 additional boxes were added, the service still had to end shortly before the advertised end of the event. The City provided two employees on this day; Carol verified that residents using the service were from Harrisburg, and a PW employee provided the backhoe to put bulky items in the drop cans.

The letter enclosed with the report has noted that Republic Services is suggesting that they can continue the bulky waste collection with the recycle roundup, but as it's more expensive, that the City should consider another method to pass this cost onto citizens using the service. They've suggested an at-point fee collection of \$6 a load, an additional 1% rate increase, or to simply bill the City. While RS has listed \$6,000 to \$7,500 as the likely fee for this suggestion, Staff does note that the rates are somewhat confusing, as a 30-yd drop box under industrial service rates would only come to \$853 using the new rate sheet for industrial services. However, the last page of the report shows an Industrial Container Recovery Fee of \$3,000. I believe this is why it's listed as \$6,000 to \$7,500; RS can confirm this during the meeting. While the City has not yet received the pledged funds promised at the end of 2022 for the summer sounds series; we should take under consideration that Republic Services also hasn't billed us for the two additional drop boxes that the City requested when setting up this promotion.

If, after discussion, the City Council decides to allow a rate increase, then they should motion for staff to return in January with a resolution.

This report provides information necessary to calculate the annual Refuse Rate Index (RRI) effective January 1, 2024. As stated in the Rate Modification and Rate Adjustment Statement this calculation is based on the Consumer Price Index, fuel cost and disposal costs. Based on these factors, the calculated adjustment for January 1, 2024, is 1% as shown below:

As expected, the reduction in fuel prices and a more moderate economy are driving this modest increase. Residential customers will see increases from .22 to .36 monthly, depending on cart size.

At the request of Council, we collected bulky waste at the annual Recycle Event. Republic Services donated three 30-yard drop boxes. Those were filled within the first hour of the event and more had to be brought in. Eventually, we had to cut off this service before the event ended. If Council desires, we can make collecting bulky waste a permanent expansion of the event. There are several ways to do this:



Sustainability in Action

- People bringing bulky waste could pay a fee (estimated at \$6.00 per load)
- The cost of the hauls and disposal could be billed to the City (estimated to be \$6,000-7,500 annually)
- The cost could be spread across rates, resulting in an additional 1% increase (.22 .36 per household per month)

If council chooses to not maintain the expanded event and collect bulky waste, we can still hold the regular, annual recycling event as we have in the past.

We look forward to discussing this with Council.

City Council Business Meeting Minutes November 14, 2023

Mayor Robert Duncan led the Pledge of Allegiance

CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL by Mayor, Robert Duncan at the hour of 6:31pm

CONCERNED CITIZEN(S) IN THE AUDIENCE. All in attendance were there for items on the agenda.

THE MATTER OF MEETING WITH A MEMBER REPRESENTATIVE FROM LCSO IF ONE IS AVAILABLE: Sergeant Steve Frambes was not able to attend. This report will be forwarded to the December City Council Meeting.

THE MATTER OF HOLDING A PUBLIC HEARING TO DISCUSS CHANGES TO THE RIGHT-OF-WAY LOCATED AT THE END OF N. 8TH ST., AT THE INTERSECTION OF ARROW LEAF AVE

At the hour of 6:32pm, Mayor Duncan opened the Public Hearing

Eldridge reviewed the staff report informing Council this request originated from Republic Services and the Harrisburg Fire/Rescue District. She informed Council that Public Hearing notifications

were mailed out to over 49 residents on October 23, 2023 and Council can motion to open the road to traffic or keep the intersection closed and the City would work with everyone on instructions for garbage pickup going forward.

Fire Chief Bart Grifith approached Council. He stated that he has no concerns about the proposal and thinks it's a good idea. He noted that the HFRD or other emergency responders would not be restricted from going either direction.

At the hour of 6:42pm, Mayor Duncan closed the Public Hearing

 Klemm motioned to direct staff to open the intersection to vehicular traffic by converting the reserve strip into public right-of way, and to request that Linn County transfer the property to the City of Harrisburg and was seconded by Boese. The motion passed unanimously by a vote of 4-0.
 (Yes: Downey, Klemm, Boese, and Knox. No: None.)

THE MATTER OF A PRESENTATION FROM PEGGY MCGUIRE, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE COMMUNITY SERVICES CONSORTIUM: Mayor Duncan introduced Peggy McGuire. McGuire reviewed her presentation as shown in Exhibit A which outlines who needs Continuum Care, what makes up one and the need to be part of one to obtain federal funding. McGuire stated CSC is asking for support by resolution from all cities in our region, which will then be submitted to HUD at the end of the year with their proposal for funding.

- Mayor Duncan inquired about getting accurate counts when the homeless move from town to town. McGuire replied that point and time counts are done the 3rd week of January each year when the homeless are in shelters keeping out of the cold.
- Klemm commented on the difficulties of helping the homeless with a large percentage having mental health problems and other issues. McGuire replied that they try to help the ones they can and then move on to the next.
- Downey likes the idea of helping the homeless one by one to be more effective.
- Knox inquired about what other forms of participation CSC is looking for. McGuire stated that it's uncertain at this point until we become a Continuum but eventually, staff support will be required.
- Downey and Mayor Duncan would like to add to the proposed resolution that it should also support mental health care.
 - Downey motioned to return in December with a resolution including mental health and was seconded by Klemm. The motion passed unanimously by a vote of 4-0. (Yes: Downey, Klemm, Boese and Knox. No: None.)

THE MATTER AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO SIGN THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT GRANT PROGRAM (LGGP) AGREEMENT WITH THE OREGON PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT (OPRD) FOR THE \$96,166 EAGLE PARK DEVELOPMENT – PHASE 1 PROJECT: Eldridge stated this agreement must be signed to receive the grant funds, which is a reimbursement grant, and will be used to for Eagle Park's northern section. Eldridge pointed out a typo on page 77 of agenda and noted the Recreational Trail Program grant would provide the City with \$150,000 of funding and not \$250,000 as stated.

- Eldridge clarified for Knox that this grant covers everything listed on the top portion of page 77, cost permitting.
 - Klemm motioned to authorize the City Administrator to sign the LGGP
 Agreement with OPRD and was seconded by Downey. The motion passed

unanimously by a vote of 4-0. (Yes: Downey, Klemm, Boese, and Knox. No: None.)

THE MATTER OF APPROVING THE 1ST QUARTER 2023/2024 EXPENSE REPORT: Nelson commented that we are only at 25% of the budget, due to being in the 1st quarter and we are still ahead of where we projected. Nelson noted that property taxes should be received in the middle of November. No comments or concerns.

 Downey motioned to approve the 1st Quarter 2023/2024 Expense Report and was seconded by Klemm. The motion passed unanimously by a vote of 4-0. (Yes: Downey, Klemm, Boese, and Knox. No: None.)

THE MATTER OF APPROVING THE CONSENT LIST: No comments or concerns.

- Downey motioned to approve the consent list and was seconded by Klemm. The motion passed unanimously by a vote of 4-0. (Yes: Downey, Klemm, Boese and Knox. No: None.) A motion to approve the consent list approved the following:
 - Minutes from the September 26, 2023, October 10, 2023, and October 24, 2023 City Council Meeting
 - The Payment Approval Report for October 2023
 - Appointment of Rian Tupua to the Library Board with a term ending June 30, 2025

CITY ADMINISTRATOR VERBAL REPORT.

Eldridge introduced Edie Moro, who is now reporting for the Tri-County Bulletin. Moro stated the paper will eventually be printing 500 paper copies of the paper once a week and will be offering online subscriptions also.

Eldridge informed Council of the following:

- The higher courts have ended recreational immunity for case law and referred to a recent case in Newport where someone wasn't recreating on a trail but was passing through. She noted that we will be making changes to our legal defense next year.
- Eldridge reminded Council to shop small and shop local on Shop Small Saturday.
- The Light Parade will be held on Saturday December 2nd at 7pm. She noted the Library will also be holding a Holiday Bazaar that day from 10am to 6pm.
- January Council sessions will include discussion on the water bond project and how to move forward with funding.
- The City will be putting out an RFP for legal services soon.
- Eldridge will be working on submitting the Recreational Trail Program (RTP) grant application which is due Friday by midnight.
- Attorney Jim Brewer is sending a Notice of Default letter to BNSF with a 30-day compliance. Due to this, the City Council meeting for December will need to be moved to December 14th. Boese and Knox stated they were not available that day.
- Ross suggested the City show more support for our Veteran's next Veterans Day and display flags or banners of our local Vets. Chief Griffith thought it was a great idea and commented that the Fire Department would be willing to assist with any labor involved and suggested asking for donations.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Moritz motioned to approve the minutes for July 18, 2023, and was seconded by Neely. The Planning Commission then voted unanimously to approve the Minutes for July 18, 2023.

WORK SESSION

THE MATTER OF CORRECTING THE HARRISBURG DEVELOPMENT CODE IN RELATION TO PAVING IN INDUSTRIAL ZONED SITES.

STAFF REPORT: Eldridge shared that 2012 was the last time the Planning Commission had addressed paving the first 200 feet of an industrial zone driveway. The current code was refined to fit what we wanted from our ongoing discussing during the process of creating our new code. At the last meeting, some of the Planning Commission members expressed their surprise about the paving portion in industrial zones in the new code. They mentioned that they didn't see it in the giant Developmental Code packet while going through the review process. She highlighted pages 15-17 that show all areas that apply to paving in an industrial zone. We can handle this as a correction and not an amendment. Page 18 shows the previous code. We need to discuss beatification versus economy. The current and previous code states that driveways within 50 feet of a street require a hard surface. If the city did not require this in our code, then State regulations would require a truck wash station for industrial zones.

• Culver said that is it each member of the Planning Commissions responsibility to go through

- their packets regardless of size and ask questions.
- Moritz said this is being discussed because of the Ferris application. He is building a new building with paving around the structure, but he thought he had to pave the entire parking lot per the new code.
- Neely said it should depend on the applicant. Ferris showed he was paving in the front and around the side, but not in back. Eldridge clarified that he was asking for the variance for a future site plan. He never stated in his application anything about future use, and he would have to come back for a variance. Neely then asked, using Ferris as an example, in M-1 and M-2 zones should all the property be paved if they are only performing work in the front portion. Eldridge stated that according to the new code, the front should be paved along with any area where vehicles are being maneuvered on.
- Culver asked if under the new code, an applicant can apply for a variance to not pave entire
 property. Eldridge said yes, they could. However, some of the board stated they would prefer to
 update the code rather than requiring a variance.
- Jackson asked if we were discussing if we want to keep the new code or revert to the old code
 for this section. Moritz added that if we went back to the old code, he would still have to pave 50
 feet from the road and could have gravel up to the parking lot, which would have to also be
 paved for ADA compliance.
- Neely said that the 50-foot paving requirement does not cover all scenarios. Jackson agreed and said that different situations should call for variances.
- Moritz suggested that we stay with the new code and have applicants apply for a variance if needed.
- Neely suggested that we have further discussion and should get more clarification from parties involved. Jackson agreed.
- Moritz motioned to table discussion on the HMC correction 18.80.030 (4) until the next Planning Commission Meeting and was seconded by Jackson. The Planning Commission then voted unanimously to table discussion on the HMC correction 18.80.030 (4) until the next Planning Commission meeting.

THE MATTER OF CORRECTING THE HARRISBURG DEVELOPMENT CODE IN RELATION TO PAVING IN INDUSTRIAL ZONED SITES, TO DRIVEWAYS IN INDUSTRIAL/CMMERCIAL ZONES, AND TO LANDSCAPING REQUIREMENTS IN INDUSTRIAL ZONES.

STAFF REPORT: Eldridge explained that we are still discussing this issue because it was tabled at the last meeting. The wording of what is being discussed and considered can be found on page 8 of the agenda packet. We are considering three (3) separate items. No. 1 – Paving of property, do we want to go back to the previous code? No. 2 – Paving of driveways, we can meet State TMDL requirements if the code stays the same as currently written. No. 3 – Landscaping requirements, the current code requires more than 30 spaces to have additional landscaping. Commission should consider the balance between higher value of property – vs- economic development. This would not be an issue for larger commercial owners but could become cumbersome for smaller industrial property owners. Regulatory issues coming from the state level are making a hardship on property owners and are currently being challenged by several cities. We can decide to remove subsections a & b on page 14 under section 5. We will handle each condition up for discussion separately including the motions.

No. 1 – Paving of property in the M-1 and M-2 zones.

• Kayner stated that he did not feel that the Planning Commission should be considering if

- actions will increase property value. Cluver said that the Commission should make decisions that do not devalue the properties in the city.
- Jackson asked if we had the ability to make retail properties do something different than the rest
 of properties in the zones being discussed. Kayner said we could and that the current code
 already reflects this issue.
- Neely asked who reviews the plans. Eldridge replied that she does or a consultant. Neely
 followed up with if the size of the building triggers the need to have the property paved. Eldridge
 clarified that it is any area of the property that vehicles are maneuvered on and referred to page
 15 section 4. Subsection d.
- Moritz reminded the commission that this is only referring to the M-1 and M-2 zones that touch
 any residential zone. Giles also added that if we are making a correction that means we are
 reverting to the previous code and would not require the entire process of an amendment.
- Giles motioned to approve and recommend to the City Council the correction of HMC 18.80.030 (4) based on finding contained in the November 12 Staff Report. This motion is based on findings contained in the November 12 Staff report, and on findings made during deliberations on the request and was seconded by Kayner. The Planning Commission then voted unanimously to approve and recommend to the City Council the correction of HMC 18.80.030 (4) based on findings contained in the November 12 Staff Report. - No. 2 Paving of driveways in the M-1 and M-2 zones.
 - Eldridge clarified that it is currently written that the first 50 feet of a driveway needs to be paved when adjoining a road. Staff recommends denial of this consideration and keep the code as written to prevent TMDL issues and further requirements of property owners such as installing truck wheel wash stations. This recommendation is based on discussions with the Public Works Director. Eldridge stated that we try to use common sense while reviewing code requirements. This motion is based on findings contained in the November 12 Staff report, and on findings made during deliberations on the request and was seconded by Kayner. The Planning
