

# **ORDINANCE 0-22-01**

#### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 22-1.3 (DEFINITIONS AND WORD USAGE) AND SECTION 22-1.7 (REVIEW OF APPLICATIONS) OF SECTION 22-1 OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED TREE REMOVAL AND PROTECTION

**WHEREAS,** the Borough of Highlands has determined that it is in the best interest of the Borough to update Section 22-1.3 and Section 22-1.7 of the Borough Code.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the governing body of the Borough of Highlands as follows:

**SECTION I.** Borough Code Section 22-1.3, "Definitions and Word Usage" shall be amended as follows (all additions are shown in **bold italics with underlines**; all deletions are shown as **strikeovers in bold italics**):

#### 22-1.3 Definitions and Word Usage.

For the purposes of this section, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meaning given herein. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

APPLICANT – Shall mean any person making application to the *Tree Conservation*Officer <u>Tree Commissioner</u> for a Tree Protection Permit.

There are no changes to the remainder of this Section.

**SECTION II.** Borough Code Section 22-1.7, "Review of Applications" shall be amended as follows: (All additions are shown in *bold italics with underlines*; all deletions are shown as *strikeovers in bold italies*):

#### 22-1.7 Review of Applications.

- a. Application will be reviewed by the Tree Commissioner.
- b. When reviewing applications, the Tree Commissioner will, after inspecting the site, evaluating soil, location, grading, drainage and other conditions on the site and adjacent properties and consulting with such other officials, agencies, committees, boards and commissions as the *Officer Commissioner* deems appropriate, determine if the regulated activity proposed is prohibited, permitted or restricted in accordance with this section.

#### 1. Prohibited regulated activities include:

- (a) Clear cutting areas, outside of the limits of removal which collectively exceed forty (40%) percent of a lot.
- (b) Removal of any trees.
- (c) Any action that will substantially increase the potential of erosion.
- (d) Removal of any vegetation, including trees with a DBH less than four (4) inches on a slope.
- (e) Any action that will substantially change drainage patterns.
- (f) Any action inconsistent with other land use approvals or regulations affecting the site.
- (g) Any action that would create a potential hazard to persons or property.

#### 2. Restricted regulated activities include:

- (a) All regulated activities, which are neither prohibited nor permitted, are restricted. Applications may propose a combination of prohibited, permitted and restricted activities. In such cases, the *Tree Conservation Officer Tree Commissioner* may segregate the activities proposed and take the appropriate action on each type of activity.
- (b) Applications for restricted activities shall be referred to the *Planning Board Land Use Board* for recommendation to the *Tree Conservation Officer Tree Commissioner*.
- c. The *Planning Board Land Use Board* shall consider these factors in making a recommendation to the

Tree Commissioner concerning a restricted regulated activity:

- 1. Whether the proposed cutting or removal would impair the growth and redevelopment of the remaining trees on the applicant's property or adjacent property.
- 2. Whether the proposed cutting or removal would change existing drainage patterns.
- 3. Whether the proposed removal would allow soil erosion or increase dust.
- 4. Whether the proposed removal would constitute a significant change in the screening between existing or proposed buildings on contiguous lots or the aspect of the lot as viewed from the adjacent public road.
- 5. The overall, effect of removal of such tree(s) on the physical and aesthetic value of the property and the neighborhood.

- 6. Whether proposed changes to the topography of the area where such tree(s) are located will have a land configuration which shall be deemed injurious to the trees or other trees located nearby so as to require welling, construction of an aerification system, or tree removal or replacement.
- 7. Whether reasonable application of the standards of this section create a substantial hardship for the applicant, prohibiting reasonable use of the property consistent with the Planning and Development Regulations, and whether, therefore, one (1) or more of the standards should be waived.
- 8. In appropriate circumstances, an applicant may be required to post performance and maintenance guarantees assuring compliance with the provisions of any tree protection permit and this section and assuring provision of replacement plantings damaged or removed contrary to the terms of any tree removal/protection permit or this section.
- d. The Tree Commissioner shall give due deference to the recommendations of the *Planning Board Land Use Board* with regard to an application for a permit to allow a restricted regulated activity. The *Officer Commissioner* may only act contrary to, or significantly modify, the recommendations of the *Planning Board Land Use Board* if the *Officer Commissioner* finds that the recommendations are based on incomplete or inaccurate information, are unreasonable or impracticable or would produce results contrary to the intent of this section. The Tree Commissioner shall, provide the *Planning Board Land Use Board* with a copy of the Commissioner's final action on all permits for a restricted regulated activity.

**SECTION III. SEVERABILITY.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION IV. REPEALER.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

**SECTION V. EFFECTIVE DATE**. This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage as provided by law.

### **ORDINANCE 0-22-02**

# AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 21-115 (BASIS FOR ESTABLISHING THE AREAS OF SPECIAL FLOOD HAZARD) OF THE BOROUGH CODE

**WHEREAS,** the existing Flood Insurance Rate Map and Flood Insurance Study Report for the Borough of Highlands have been modified by the Federal Emergency Management Agency; and

**WHEREAS,** by way of correspondence dated December 15, 2021, the Federal Emergency Management Agency advised that the modified flood hazard information and revised map panels will be effective as of June 15, 2022; and

**WHEREAS,** the Borough of Highlands desires to accept the modified Flood Insurance Rating Map and Flood Insurance Study Report effective June 15, 2022.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the governing body of the Borough of Highlands as follows:

**SECTION I.** Borough Code Section 21-115, "Basis for Establishing the Areas of Special Flood Hazard" shall be amended as follows (all additions are shown in **bold italics with underlines**; all deletions are shown as **strikeovers in bold italics**):

#### 21-115 Basis for Establishing the Areas of Special Flood Hazard.

The areas of special flood hazard for the Borough of Highlands, Community No. 345297, are identified and defined on the following documents prepared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency:

- 1. A scientific and engineering report "Flood Insurance Study, Monmouth County, New Jersey (All Jurisdictions)" dated *June 20, 2018. June 15, 2022.*
- 2. Flood Insurance Rate Map for Monmouth County, New Jersey (All Jurisdictions) as shown on Index and panels 34025C0067G, 34025C0069F, 34025C0086G, and 34025C0088G; whose effective date is *June 20, 2018. June 15, 2022*.

The above documents are hereby adopted and declared to be a part of this ordinance. The Flood Insurance Study and maps are on file at 42 Shore Drive, Highlands, New Jersey 00732-1405.

**SECTION II.** <u>SEVERABILITY.</u> If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.

**SECTION III.** <u>REPEALER.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

**SECTION IV. EFFECTIVE DATE**. This Ordinance shall take effect on June 15, 2022.

# A RESOLUTION APPOINTING MUNICIPAL ATTORNEY FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR 2022 & AUTHORIZING THE AWARD OF A FAIR AND OPEN CONTRACT FOR PROFESSIONAL LEGAL SERVICES

WHEREAS, the Borough of Highlands has a need for professional legal services to be provided to the Borough of Highlands for the calendar year 2022 pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.5; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has determined and certified in writing that the value of the contract may exceed \$17,500; and

WHEREAS, The Borough of Highlands, through a fair and open process in accordance with N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.5 solicited proposals from qualified attorneys for the appointment and position of Borough Attorney for the calendar year 2022 and said requests for Professional Services – Municipal Attorney were received in the Office of the Municipal Clerk no later than 11:00 am on December 17, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has reviewed all proposals received and has determined that the Mayor and Borough Council desires to authorize the execution of a professional services contract between the following listed persons/firms and the Borough for the provisions of said services for the year of 2022; and

WHEREAS, certification of the availability of funds has been provided by the Chief Financial Officer contingent upon the adoption of the 2022 Budget; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough of Highlands Governing Body as follows:

- 1. Brian J. Chabarek of the Law Firm of Davison, Eastman, Munoz, Paone, P.A. is hereby appointed Borough Attorney for the calendar year 2022 and is awarded a professional services contract at the rate of a monthly retainer in the amount of \$5,500.00 and an hourly rate of \$150 per hour plus reimbursable expenses for professional legal services outside of the retainer services as outlined in the contract, for the period of January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022, for an amount not to exceed \$180,000.00.
- 2. The Mayor and Borough Clerk are hereby authorized to sign the Professional Services Contract for the aforesaid services.
- 3. This contract is awarded without competitive bidding as a "Professional Service" in accordance with the Local Public Contracts Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5(l)(a) because it is for services performed by persons authorized by law to practice a recognized profession.





# RESCINDING APPROVAL OF LIQUOR LICENSE NO. 1317-33-017 FOR THE 2020-2021 TERM

This Cash Management Plan (the "Plan") is prepared pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-14 in order to set forth the basis of deposits ("Deposits") and investment ("Permitted Investments") of certain public funds of the Borough of Highlands, pending the use of such funds for the intended purposes. The Plan is intended to assure that all public funds identified herein are deposited in interest bearing accounts or otherwise invested in Permitted Investments hereinafter referred to. The intent of the plan is to provide that the decisions made with regard to the Deposits and the Permitted Investments will be done to ensure the safety, the liquidity, (regarding its availability for the intended purposes), and the maximum investment return within such limits. The plan is intended to ensure that any Deposit or Permitted Investment matures within the time period that approximates the prospective need for the funds deposited or invested so that there is not a risk to the market value of such Deposits or Permitted Investments.

#### II. DEFINITIONS

"Arbitrage" refers to the rules and regulations governing the issuance of bonds or notes and the reinvestment of the proceeds at higher yield. These regulations are promulgated by the Internal Revenue Service, Regulation 1.103.

"Certificate of Eligibility" is the certification issued by the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance, Division of Banking, that a Public Depository is eligible to act as a depository for public funds and qualifies as a participant in the New Jersey Governmental Unit Deposit Protection Act, GUDPA.

"GUDPA" requires a bank that accepts public funds to be a public depository. A "Public Depository" is defined as a state bank, a national bank, a savings bank or association which is located in the State of New Jersey, the deposits of which are insured by the Federal

Deposit Insurance Corporation, and which received or holds public funds on deposit. A local unit may make deposits in, or purchase certificates of deposit from, banks which are located in New Jersey and which meet the requirements of the "GUDPA".

"The New Jersey Cash Management Fund." The New Jersey Division of Investment is authorized pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52-18A-90.4 to establish, maintain and operate, with the approval of the State Investment Council and the State Treasurer, a common trust fund known as the State of New Jersey-New Jersey Cash Management Fund (the "Fund"). The Fund is authorized to accept deposits from all Local Units of government. The Fund is a "common trust" fund pursuant to the statute that created such funds within the jurisdiction of the Division of Investment. According to the enabling legislation, monies of Local Units deposited in the Fund must be invested in obligations and bonds that meet the investment requirements of the statute. These obligations include, among other things, evidences of indebtedness of U.S. corporations. These obligations are less secure than those permitted to Local Units under the Act. Thus, the Fund is riskier than direct investments in federal securities or GUDPA protected deposits by Local Units.

#### III. IDENTIFICATION OF FUNDS AND ACCOUNTS TO BE COVERED BY THE PLAN

A) The Plan is intended to cover the deposit and/or investment of the following funds and accounts of the Borough.

Workers Compensation Account

- B) The Plan is not intended to cover the deposit and/or investment of the following Funds and Accounts of the Borough
- 1. Petty Cash Funds
- 2. Cash drawn from a Federal Agency under a letter of credit which cash has to be paid out within 5 working days to a vendor.
- 3. Deposit, retainage, or amounts posted by way of bond, held by the Borough for such things as faithful performance, if the Borough would be required by law to pay back any interest earned to the provider of the deposit, except where the Borough is required by law or court decision to invest the fund.

4. Amounts derived from the sale of bonds or notes, only to the extent that a specific written opinion of counsel states that the earning of (full) interest would result in the bonds or notes being classified as an arbitrage (not Federally Tax Exempt) issue pursuant to federal regulations. To the extent that some interest is allowable, it shall be deposited at the most favorable rate obtainable.

## IV. DESIGNATION OF OFFICIALS OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLANDS AUTHORIZED TO MAKE DEPOSITS AND INVESTMENTS

The Chief Financial Officer, and The Borough Administrator, (The "Designated Officials") are hereby authorized and directed to deposit and/or invest the Funds referred to in the plan.

#### V. STANDARDS OF CARE

- 1. The Designated Officials involved in the investment process shall refrain from personal business activity that could conflict with the proper execution and management of the investment program, or that could impair their ability to make impartial decisions.
- 2. The Designated Officials shall disclose any material interests in the financial institutions with which business is conducted and they shall refrain from undertaking personal investment transactions with the same individual with whom business is conducted on behalf of the Borough.
- 3. The Chief Financial Officer, under the direction of the Borough Administrator, is responsible for establishing and maintaining internal control. The controls should ensure that the assets of the Borough are protected from loss, theft, or misuse.

#### VI. PROCEDURES FOR THE RECEIPT OF MONIES

#### A. Department Procedures

- 1. A receipt shall be issued in duplicate for all transactions involving the receipt of money. A copy of the receipt shall be given to the paying party and the duplicate shall be maintained by the receiving department. All payments and receipts must be recorded.
- 2. All monies collected or received from any source by or on behalf of the Borough shall be deposited within forty-eight (48) hours of receipt to the designated bank pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-15.
- 3. All monies received shall be placed in a secured place until forwarded for deposit.
- 4. No department, division or agency shall engage in the practice of cashing checks with public funds. Cashing of employee pay checks is prohibited.
- B. Chief Financial Officer (Designated Official)
- 1. The Chief Financial Officer shall:
- a. Deposit all monies collected or received from any source by or on behalf of the Borough within forty-eight (48) hours of receipt to the designated bank pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-15. b. Ensure that all monies deposited are in interest bearing accounts.
- c. Make recommendations of legal public depositories to the Borough Council who shall by resolution designate said depositories at the first meeting of the calendar year.

- d. Ensure that each of the various accounts for which there is a separate bank statement is reconciled with that bank statement by the end of the following month.
- e. Verify that designated official depositories submit to the Chief Financial Officer a copy of the State of New Jersey, Department of Banking and Insurance, Governmental Unit Deposit Protection Act notification of Certificate of Eligibility, which must be filed semi-annually in the Department of Banking as of June 30 and December 31 of each year.

#### VII. DESIGNATION OF DEPOSITORIES

The following financial institutions are designated official depositories:

TD Bank, National Association; Ocean First Bank; United Roosevelt; and Valley National Bank

Designated official depositories are required to submit to the Chief Financial Officer of the Municipality a copy of the State of New Jersey, Department of Banking, Governmental Unit Deposit Protection Act notification of eligibility, which must be filed semiannually in the Department of Banking as of June 30th and December 31st of each year.

Said notices must be available for annual audit.

#### VIII. AUTHORIZED INVESTMENTS

Investments shall be limited to the following:

- a.) Bonds or other obligations of the United States of America or obligations guaranteed by the United States of America.
- b.) Any federal agency or instrumentality obligation authorized by Congress that matures within 397 days from the date of purchase and has a fixed rate of interest not dependent on any index or external factors.
- c.) Bonds or other obligations of the local unit or bonds or other obligations of school districts of which the local unit is a part or within which the school district is located; or
- d.) Bonds or other obligations, having a maturity date not exceeding 397 days, approved by the Division of Investment of the Department of Treasury for investment by local units.
- e.) Debt obligations of federal agencies or government corporations with maturities not greater than twenty (20) years from the date of purchase, excluding mortgage backed obligations, providing that such investments are purchased through the New Jersey Division of Investment and are consistent with the Division's own investment guidelines, and providing that the investment has a fixed rate of interest not dependent on any index or external factors.

- f.) Repurchase agreements of fully collateralized securities, subject to rules and conditions established by the N.J. Department of Community Affairs.
- g.) Bonds, notes, or other obligations issued by an agency or corporation of the federal government or a governmental agency established under the laws of this State, provided that the(issuer) is not in default as to the payment of principal or interest upon any of its outstanding obligations, and provided further that the bonds, notes or other obligations are purchased at fair market value, guaranteed as to interest and principal, and have a credit rating of A3 or higher by Moody's Investor Services, Inc., A- or higher by Standard and Poor's Corporation and A- or higher by Fitch Ratings, except that two of the three ratings is sufficient.
- h.) The cash management plan may provide for the purchase of certificates of deposits (CDARS) in accordance with the following conditions:
  - (1) The funds are initially invested through a public depository as defined in section 1 of P.L.1940, c.236 (C.17:9-41) designated by the local unit.
  - (2) The designated public depository arranges for the deposit of the funds in certificates of deposit in one or more federally insured banks or savings and loans association, for the account of the local unit;
  - (3) 100 percent of the principal and accrued interest of each certificate of deposit is insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation;
  - (4) The designated public depository acts as custodian for the local unit with respect to the certificates of deposit issued for the local unit's account; and
  - (5) At the same time the local unit's funds are deposited and certificates of deposits are issued, the designated public depository receives an amount of deposits from customers or other banks and savings and loan associations, wherever located, equal to the amount of funds initially invested by the local unit through the designated public depository.

No investment or deposit shall have a maturity longer than twenty (20) years from date of purchase, unless the fund seeks prior approval from the Department of Banking and Insurance and the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs to enter into a longer-term investment of a longer duration.

#### IX. SAFEKEEPING CUSTODY PAYMENT

To the extent that any Deposit or Permitted Investment involves a document or security which is not physically held by the Borough of Highlands, then such instrument or security shall be covered by all custodial agreements with an independent third party, which shall be a bank or financial institution in the State of New Jersey. Such institution shall provide for the designation of funds or the Permitted Investments or Deposits. Purchase of any Permitted Investments that involve securities shall be executed by a "delivery versus payment" method to ensure that such Permitted Investments are either received by the Borough of Highlands or by a third-party custodian prior to or upon the release of the Borough of Highlands funds.

#### X. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

On the first day of each month during which this Plan is in effect, the Designated Officials referred to in Section IV hereof shall supply to the governing body of the Borough of Highlands a written report of any Deposits of Permitted Investments made pursuant to this Plan, which shall include, at a minimum, the following information:

- a. The name of any institution holding funds of the Borough of Highlands as a Deposit of a Permitted Investment.
- b. The amount of securities or Deposits purchased or sold during the immediately preceding month.
- c. The class or type of securities purchased, or Deposits made.
- d. The book value of such Deposits or Permitted Investment.
- e. The earned income on such Deposits or Permitted Investments. To the extent that such amounts are actually earned at maturity, this report shall provide an accrual of such earnings during the immediately preceding month.
- f. The fees incurred to undertake such Deposits or Permitted Investments.
- g. The market value of all Deposits or Permitted Investments as of the end of the immediately preceding month.
- h. All other information which may be deemed reasonable from time to time by the governing body of the Borough of Highlands.

#### XI. BOROUGH AUDITOR

The Borough Investment practices (including compliance with N.J.S.A. 40A:5-14) and the agreement for banking services and compensation thereof shall be reviewed by the Borough Auditor as part of the annual audit, as required by N.J.S.A. 40A:5-4. Where a conflict exists between this Cash Management Plan and State Statute, the applicable State Statute shall apply.

#### XII. SURETY BONDS

- a. The Chief Financial Officer shall be covered by surety bonds. During the annual audit, the Borough Auditor shall examine said bonds to determine that proper coverage has been obtained.
- b. Staff members of the Chief Financial officer's office other than the C.F.O. (See a above) shall be covered by a public employee's faithful performances bond in the minimum amount of \$10,000.

#### XIII. TERM OF PLAN

The Plan may be amended from time to time. To the extent that any amendment is adopted by the Council, the Designated Official is directed to supply copies of the amendments to all of the parties who otherwise have received the copy of the originally approved Plan, which amendment shall be acknowledged in writing in the same manner as the original Plan was so acknowledged.

We continue to work closely with the Administrator and Department Heads, we continued to balance the management of the health crisis and do the Borough's business.

The December Report is as follows:

- Awarded contract for the Waterwitch Pump Station upgrades on December 15<sup>th</sup>. Work should start in the first quarter and be completed by the summer of 2022. This project has been on the books since before Sandy.
- Expanded our agreement with JFK Meridian from 8 hours per weekday to 12 hours, 5am-5 pm and entered into a Shared Service Agreement with Atlantic Highlands to share JFK/Meridian Ambulance service and costs. This agreement will reduce our costs while enjoying the higher amount of service hours.
- Awarded engineering and construction contract to rehab King and Matthews Streets for the NJ DOT sponsored
  project for resurfacing, reconstruction and drainage for these roads. Work should start in the first quarter.
- Grants Awarded
  - Monmouth County Open Space for the Skate Park \$200,000 on December 9<sup>th</sup>
  - 2022 Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration (REPI) Program Challenge pre-proposal accepted on December 21<sup>st</sup>. They are interested in a full proposal for our project. They received a total of 38 pre-proposals from organizations around the country and only 20 were asked for a full proposal; each offering a promising approach to preserving compatible land uses in areas where the military trains, tests and operates [Earle]. Our full application is due March 21, 2022.
  - Out total grants and other funds award for 2021 was \$4,551,616.

  - Phase 1: the entirety of Waterwitch Ave [from R36 to Marine Place], North St, Gravelly Point Rd, Ralph
     St, William St, Ocean Ave, Beach Blvd, Linden Ave, Bay Ave.
  - o **Phase 2**: Barberie Ave, Sea Drift Ave and both sides of Marine Place.
- **2021 Flood Mitigation Resiliency Plan** This comprehensive plan targets four major areas. Each project can be constructed independently, and some will happen sooner than others due to complexity and funding.
  - North Street Pump Station upgrades and storm drainage
  - Marine Place steel bulkhead Paint water side & replace cap
  - O Veteran's Park Living Shoreline & Bulkhead Combination

I tried to get an accommodation with DEP to no avail. Not wanting a 20-story building, I brought this information to the attention of the Governor's office, they could not help. The stalemate is on-going, so the developer is looking at design changes.
- Captain's Cove Area of Redevelopment DEP permits were signed off on 12/20. We are working on the Developer's Agreement and hope to have something in place by the end of the first quarter.
- Commercial Business District Area of Redevelopment Draft Plan released 11/24, public meetings will continue before a final plan is adopted. Amendments to the draft plan will be sent in January.
- Create Overlook Park [empty lot on NJSH 36] Awarded to Engineering 11/10/21. Will go out to bid in January.
- Enter the Community Rating System [CRS] program for lower flood insurance Named CRS Coordinator to be Gregory R. Valesi, PE, PP, CME, CFM of CME on 11/10.
- Update the Steep Slope Ordinance Waiting for recommendations from the Environmental Commission.
- Skate Park upgrade Zoom meeting for final visioning will be in January 2022, work to start in the Spring.
  - o Grant application to Green Acres submitted 7/12/21, awarded 10/21/21 \$449,260 in low interest loan and \$149,753 in a grant.
  - Grant application to Monmouth County Open Space submitted 9/16/21, \$200,000 awarded on 12/9.
- Move electric out of flood zone in Borough parks
  - Done for Vets and Cornwall completed in August, waiting for quote for Huddy
  - Ederle will be done as part of the larger project to rehab that entire park.
- Address runoff issues from Monmouth Hills
  - On-going discussions with Monmouth Hills HOA, State, County and Middletown officials. Monmouth Hills HOA hired an engineering firm to study the area and that engineer's report due is in January.
