ORDINANCE 0-22-18

DESIGNATING RESTRICTED PARKING IN FRONT OF RESIDENCE OCCUPIED BY PERSON WITH DISABILITIES

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 39:4-197.6 provides that any municipality may, by ordinance, establish a restricted parking zone in front of a residence occupied by a person with a disability provided such parking is not otherwise prohibited and the permitting thereof would not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 18-03 governs applications for restricted parking in front of residences occupied by persons with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the Highlands Police Department has received an application for on-street resident parking for persons with disabilities, which has been reviewed and approved by the Chief of Police; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Borough of Highlands wishes to designate an appropriate space for resident parking for persons with disabilities in accordance with the recommendation of the Chief of Police.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the governing body of the Borough of Highlands as follows:

SECTION I.

A parking space in front of 2 Rodgers Street, 22 feet southwest of utility pole J584B, of the property is hereby designated as a space for resident parking for persons with disabilities. This space shall be available to a resident of 2 Rodgers Street, Apartment A2. A sign shall be installed specifically identifying the parking space in accordance with Ordinance 18-03.

SECTION II. <u>SEVERABILITY.</u> If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.

SECTION III. <u>REPEALER.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION IV. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication in accordance with law.

ORDINANCE 0-22-19

AMENDING CHAPTER 2 (ADMINISTRATION), SECTION 2-10.2 ENTITLED "COMPOSITION" OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLANDS

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Highlands has determined that it is necessary to amend The Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Highlands to allow for the hiring of additional police officers if necessary.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Highlands as follows:

SECTION I. Chapter 2 (Administration), Section 2-10.2 entitled "Composition" is hereby amended as follows (additions are shown in **bold italics with underlines** and deletions are shown in **bold italics with strikeout**):

Section 2-10.2. Composition

The police department shall consist of a chief, *and* one captain, one lieutenant, no more than four sergeants and no more than *eight ten* patrolmen.

The borough administrator is designated as the appropriate authority for the police department and shall be responsible for the overall performance of the police department. The appropriate authority shall promulgate and adopt rules and regulations for the governance of the police department and for the discipline of its members.

SECTION II. <u>SEVERABILITY.</u> If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.

SECTION III. <u>REPEALER.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION IV. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication in accordance with law.

ORDINANCE 0-22-15

DESIGNATING RESTRICTED PARKING IN FRONT OF RESIDENCE OCCUPIED BY PERSON WITH DISABILITIES

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 39:4-197.6 provides that any municipality may, by ordinance, establish a restricted parking zone in front of a residence occupied by a person with a disability provided such parking is not otherwise prohibited and the permitting thereof would not interfere with the normal flow of traffic.

WHEREAS, Ordinance 18-03 governs applications for restricted parking in front of residences occupied by persons with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the Highlands Police Department has received an application for on-street resident parking for persons with disabilities, which has been reviewed and approved by the Chief of Police; and

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Borough of Highlands wishes to designate an appropriate space for resident parking for persons with disabilities in accordance with the recommendation of the Chief of Police.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the governing body of the Borough of Highlands as follows:

SECTION I.

A parking space in front of 128 Highland Avenue adjacent to the fence post at the southwest corner of the property is hereby designated as a space for resident parking for persons with disabilities. This space shall be available to a resident of 128 Highland Avenue. A sign shall be installed specifically identifying the parking space in accordance with Ordinance 18-03.

SECTION II. <u>SEVERABILITY.</u> If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.

SECTION III. <u>REPEALER.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION IV. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication in accordance with law.

ORDINANCE 0-22-16

AMENDING CHAPTER 21, PART IV, ARTICLE XIV, SECTION 81 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH
OF HIGHLANDS, ENTITLED "OUTDOOR STORAGE"

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48-1, et seq. authorizes local governmental units to adopt regulations designed to promote the public health, safety and general welfare of its citizenry; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Highlands has determined that it is in the best interest of the residents of the Borough to amend the Borough Code, Section 21-81 regarding outdoor storage, to prohibit the storage of construction equipment and other similar devices on residential properties.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the governing body of the Borough of Highlands as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 21, Section 81 of the Borough Code of the Borough of Highlands, entitled "Outdoor Storage" shall be amended to read as follows (additions are shown with **underlines**, and sections that remain unchanged are omitted below):

21-81 OUTDOOR STORAGE

A. Residential Districts.

[SUBSECTIONS 1 THROUGH 3 – NO CHANGE.]

- 4. The storage of commercial vehicles, commercial equipment, and construction equipment shall be prohibited, subject to the following exceptions:
 - a. Commercial vehicles, commercial equipment, and construction equipment may be stored on site for active and ongoing construction purposes authorized by the required zoning and construction permits only. All commercial vehicles, commercial equipment, and construction equipment shall be immediately removed from the site if the required permits have not been issued, expire, or otherwise become invalid. All commercial vehicles, commercial equipment, and construction equipment shall be immediately removed from the site if construction activity is completed, suspended, or if the site is abandoned for a period of 30 days or more.
 - b. Commercial vehicles, commercial equipment, and construction equipment may be stored on site no more than 30 days prior to the commencement of construction if valid zoning and construction permits have been issued.
 - c. For the purposes of this Section, "Commercial vehicles" shall not include vans or trucks with a gross vehicle weight rating of less than 14,000 pounds.

B. Nonresidential Districts.

- **1.** No storage area shall be located in a required front yard or in a required side yard adjoining a street.
- 2. No article, equipment, vehicle, supplies, or material shall be kept or stored outside the confines of any building unless the same is allowed by this chapter or is screened by special planting or fencing, as approved by the Board, and maintained in good condition, so that it shall not be visible from any adjacent property or public street. Any outdoor storage area shall meet the location requirements for accessory structures. Storage of trailers or use of trailers for storage is prohibited.
- 3. Unless being stored within a building or approved storage area in accordance with subsection 2 above, the storage of commercial vehicles, commercial equipment, and construction equipment shall be prohibited, subject to the following exceptions:

- a. Commercial vehicles, commercial equipment, and construction equipment may be stored on site for active and ongoing construction purposes authorized by the required zoning and construction permits only. All commercial vehicles, commercial equipment, and construction equipment shall be immediately removed from the site if the required permits have not been issued, expire, or otherwise become invalid. All commercial vehicles, commercial equipment, and construction equipment shall be immediately removed from the site if construction activity is completed, suspended, or if the site is abandoned for a period of 30 days or more.
- b. Commercial vehicles, commercial equipment, and construction equipment may be stored on site no more than 30 days prior to the commencement of construction if valid zoning and construction permits have been issued.
- c. For the purposes of this Section, "Commercial vehicles" shall not include vans or trucks with a gross vehicle weight rating of less than 14,000 pounds.

[SUBSECTION C - NO CHANGE]

D. Penalty for Violations. Any violation of this section shall be punishable by the penalties provided in section 1-5 of the Revised General Ordinances of the Borough of Highlands.

SECTION II. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.

SECTION III. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION IV. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect upon adoption and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE ADDING CHAPTER 2, SECTION 10.17 OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "ENTRY-LEVEL LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER APPOINTMENT"

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey has approved P.L. 2021, c. 7 and P.L. 2021, c. 406 which provide for the exemption of Civil Service examination requirements for entry level law enforcement officers who have either completed, or will complete, a full Basic Course for Police Officers, if such exemptions are adopted by municipal ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Highlands wishes to amend the Borough of Highlands Code to allow for such exemptions as provided by law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the governing body of the Borough of Highlands as follows:

SECTION I. Borough Code Section 2-10.17 entitled "Entry-Level Law Enforcement Officer Appointment" shall be added as follows:

§ 2-10.17 Entry-Level Law Enforcement Officer Appointment

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 11A:4-1.3, entry-level law enforcement officers may be appointed by the Borough Administrator upon the recommendation of the Chief of Police without taking a Civil Service examination, so long as the individual has successfully completed a full Basic Course for Police Officers training course at a school approved and authorized by the New Jersey Police Training Commission. Additionally, temporary entry-level law enforcement officers may be appointed by the Borough Administrator upon the recommendation of the Chief of Police without taking a Civil Service examination, so long as the individual successfully completes a full Basic Course for Police Officers training course at a school approved and authorized by the New Jersey Police Training Commission within nine months from the date of hire as a temporary entry-level law enforcement officer; upon successful completion of the training course, the temporary entry-level law enforcement officer shall be appointed as a permanent entry-level law enforcement officer.

SECTION II. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.

SECTION III. <u>REPEALER.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION IV. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE.</u> This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication in accordance with law.

RESOLUTION 22-200

GOVERNING BODY CERTIFICATION OF THE ANNUAL AUDIT

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 5-4 requires the governing body of every local unit to have made an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions, and

WHEREAS, the Annual Report of Audit for the year 2021 has been filed by a Registered Municipal Accountant with the Municipal Clerk pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A: 5-6, and a copy has been received by each member of the governing body; and

WHEREAS, R.S. 52:27BB-34 authorizes the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs; and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 5:30-6.5, a regulation requiring that the governing body of each municipality shall, by resolution, certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all members of the governing body have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations; and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed, as a minimum, the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations, as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and

The Borough of Highlands and the MCSPCA have teamed up to find a humane solution to our feral cat issues. *If you want to be a Community Cat Caregiver, you must fill in the Registration form and Single Colony Log form to the left and bring to the Borough Offices.* Once your application has been approved by both the town and MCSPCA, you may begin to care for community cats.

The MCSPCA has taken a leadership role in implementing a program proven to succeed – Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) in Highlands. TNR specifically addresses the burgeoning feral cat population in a humane way. Feral cats are trapped, spayed or neutered, and returned to the community to live in managed colonies. Kittens and "friendly" stray cats are put up for adoption at the MCSPCA, immediately reducing the population of ferals in the community. Grant funding and donations support the program and significantly reduces the cost to the municipality.

We understand that TNR is controversial. Many think the Trap-Remove, which really means Trap-Kill, is the only solution to feral cats. However, Trap-Kill has been proven NOT to work, while TNR does.

- 1. The Borough of Highlands TNR program is funded by the donation from a generous resident and the MCSPCA. The cost of the initiative to 100% funded by those two sources at no cost to the taxpayers for up to 100 cats per calendar year.
- 2. There are not enough animal control resources to trap all cats in a municipality. A female cat can start having litters at 4 months old and can have four litters in one year. One mating pair can regenerate the population very quickly. With the animal control resources available, it is impossible to trap every feral cat in a short enough time span to keep up with reproduction. TNR uses teams of local volunteers to humanely trap, transport and then care for the feral cats. More people are willing to help with TNR than Trap-kill.
- 3. With TNR, the cats are released into managed colonies with registered caregivers who are the only people allowed to feed feral cats. This stops late night "drive by" feeding by well-meaning people. The caregivers keep careful statistics on the population and most importantly, track the success of TNR.

Many people want to take their own measures to remove cats from their neighborhood. Once any of the cats go through the TNR program, they are identified as being owned by the Borough of Highlands and cared for by the Colony Caretakers. Also note, according to NJSA 4:22-20. Abandoning disabled animal to die in public place; abandoning domesticated animal; disorderly person's offense:

- 1. A person who shall abandon a maimed, sick, infirm or disabled animal or creature to die in a public place, shall be guilty of a disorderly persons offense.
- 2. A person who shall abandon a domesticated animal shall be guilty of a disorderly persons offense. The violator shall be subject to the maximum \$1,000 penalty.

There are many myths out there about feral cats. The biggest one is Feral cats cannot be "rehabilitated", this is NOT true. There is no farm or sanctuary that can take all the feral cats in Monmouth County.

Advantages of TNR

- 1. Population is immediately reduced via adoption of kittens and "friendlies"
- 2. Spayed/Neutered cats roam less, don't yowl or fight (typical mating behaviors)
- Neutered male cats mark less often and with significantly less odor
- 4. Disease is reduced since the cats get vaccinated (rabies etc)
- 5. Fewer nuisance calls about feral cats

TNR is an effective and humane way to control feral cats. TNR works because it is a multi-tiered approach as described above. The fact is these cats are out there. TNR means they are not reproducing, are disease-free, are fed and cared for and cause less trouble in the municipality. Using TNR we stabilize the population, so the colonies reduce through natural attrition. Together we can reach our goal to significantly decrease the feral cat population in Highlands over the next five years with our Community Cats Campaign.

TNR ANNUAL REPORT FOR FY 2021

The Borough of Highlands, working with the MCSPCA and 33 Cat Colony Managers, successfully trapped 22 cats during the period of January 2021 through December 2021. As of December 31, 2021, there were 149 registered cats in Managed Colonies. This is down from 168 cats in FY 2020.

Our Memorandum of Understanding with the MCSPCA was updated on April 5, 2019 to include up to 100 cats per year paid for by a private donation directly to MCSPCA. Therefore, the first 100 cats are at no cost to the taxpayers.

The Highlands TNR Program is usually explained during the spring TNR public meeting at the Community Center located at 42 Snug Harbor. This year due to COVID19, this flyer will outline where we are with the program. Over the years, several Colony Managers and others have reached out to MCSPCA to alert them of areas where cats congregate. Contact details for MCPCA are listed below.

MCSPCA Trap/Neuter/Release Program Trapping Tips

Before You Trap

Familiarize yourself with the Trap-Neuter-Return process and plan your trapping day in advance. Throughout all of your trapping endeavors, plan ahead to ensure the safety and well-being of the cats and reduce your own stress.

- oordinate with other caregivers who may be feeding the cats, and prepare the cats for trapping by feeding on a schedule and in a designated feeding area.
- ssess the colony to see how many cats need to be trapped.
- etermine a safe, temperature-controlled location where you will be able to hold the cats after surgery while they recover.
- ather and prepare all of the appropriate e uipment and understand how it all wor s ahead of time and practice t is important to test all traps, to ensure that the trip plate wor s.
- ithhold food hours before trapping, and you are ready to start trapping.

Trapping

- n the day-of, prepare the traps by lining the bottom with newspaper, tagging with a location description, and baiting.
- et the traps and watch them from afar.
- nce a cat is trapped, cover the trap this will help eep the cat calm.
- head of time, learn how to deal with particularly hard-to-trap cats.
- Never leave a trap unattended
- se stin y cat food such as, wet canned food, tuna fish, sardines or mac erel to bait the trap. entuc y Fried hic en may also be used for tough cats
- lace a sheet over the trap once it is set, the sheet will help calm the cat down once it is trapped.

Post-Surgery

- Transport the cats safely bac to your secure, indoor location where cats will be in a temperature-controlled environment, dry, and away from danger.
- onitor the cats for any illness.
- For your safety and the cats eep them in their covered cages at all times.
- Feed the cats eight hours or so after surgery.

- rovide ade uate food and water for the cats on a regular basis, year-round. Feed during daylight hours for your safety and so that you can easily assess the members of the colony. e recommend feeding colony cats at dawn and dus.
- ome colonies find shelter for themselves in a shed or under a building where their safety is uncertain. ou might want to consider building a shelter for the cats. t can eep them safe from the elements and help you control their location and deter them from neighbors properties.

Pet Licensing

January is dog licensing month; July is cat licensing month. The instructions for renewing your dog/cat license are listed below.

- 1. State Statute requires that all dogs/cats be licensed and have a current tag affixed to collar or harness. All dogs/cats 6 months or older must be licensed.
- 2. All dog licenses expire on December 31 each year. All cat licenses expire on June 30 each year. Failure to renew dog/cat license may result in a court appearance.
- 3. Check rabies information. State Statute requires that any rabies vaccine that expires before November 1 st for dogs, or before May 1 st of following year for cats of the licensing year will require an updated vaccine prior to the issuance of a new license. If there has been any change since the last billing, be sure to enclose the required rabies certificate, which will be returned.
- 4. Check neuter status. If you have not already qualified for a reduced license fee, you may do so only by enclosing a spay/neuter certificate signed by a licensed veterinarian.
- 5. License must be issued in the name of an adult member of the household.
- 6. **FREE RABIES CLINIC** offered by MCRHC. For more info, call (732) 493-9520 or visit www.mcrhc.org.
- 7. If your pet has passed or no longer lives in the borough of Highlands, please notify us. There is a check box on the back of renewal notice for this purpose.

Please come to borough hall at 42 Shore Drive to fill out a form or you can download and print the application.

Spayed/Neutered dog/cat licenses are \$18.00. Non-Spayed/Neutered dog/cat licenses are \$21.00.

You can now pay online here and then email receipt and completed application to the Clerk's office.
