ORDINANCE O-25-12

AMENDING CHAPTER 3 "GENERAL POLICE REGULATIONS", SECTION 3-1 "LITTER PROHIBITIONS" OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLANDS

WHEREAS, Chapter 3, Section 1 of the Borough Code establishes guidelines for littering prohibitions by the Borough of Highlands to protect the public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has analyzed and evaluated the Borough Code and has recommended certain changes with respect to the definitions contained within Section 3-1.1 as well as the prohibitions contained within Section 3-1 of the Borough Code; and

WHEREAS, the governing body finds that these recommendations further protect the general health, safety and welfare of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the governing body finds that the inclusion of additional prohibitions pertaining to littering will further protect the general health, safety and welfare of the Borough;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the governing body of the Borough of Highlands as follows:

SECTION I.

Borough Code Chapter 3 "General Police Regulations", Section 3-1.1 "Definitions", Section 3-1.2 "Use of Litter Receptacles", Section 3-1.9 "Commercial Establishments and Residences" shall be amended along with the addition of Sections 3-1.10, 3-1.11, 3-1.12 and 3-1.13 as follows: (All additions are shown in **bold italics with underlines.** The deletions are shown as **strikeovers in bold italics**.):

§ 3-1.1 Definitions.

LITTER

Shall mean garbage, refuse and rubbish as defined herein, and all other waste material which, if thrown or deposited as herein prohibited, tends to create a danger to public health, safety and welfare. "Litter" shall further mean any used or unconsumed substance or waste material which has been discarded, whether made of aluminum, glass, plastic, rubber, paper or other natural or synthetic material, or any combination thereof including, but not limited to, any bottle, jar or can, any unlighted cigarette, cigar, match or any flaming or glowing material or any garbage, trash, refuse, debris, rubbish, grass clippings or other lawn or garden waste, newspaper, magazines, glass, metal, plastic or paper containers or other packaging or construction material, but does not include the waste of the primary processes of mining or other extraction processors, logging, sawmilling, farming or manufacturing.

<u>GARBAGE</u>

Shall mean putrescible animal and vegetable wastes resulting from the handling, preparation, cooking, and consumption of food.

<u>LITTER</u>

Shall mean garbage, refuse and rubbish, as defined herein, and all other waste material which, if thrown, deposited, or stored, as herein prohibited, tends to create a danger to public health, safety, and welfare.

PRIVATE PREMISES

<u>Shall mean any dwelling house, building, or other structure designed or used either wholly or</u> <u>in part for private residential purposes, whether inhabited or temporarily or continuously</u> <u>uninhabited or vacant, and shall include any yard, ground, walk, driveway, porch, steps or</u> <u>vestibule belonging or appurtenant to such dwelling house, building or other structure.</u>

PUBLIC PLACE

<u>Shall mean any streets, sidewalks, alleys or other public ways and any and all public parks,</u> <u>squares, spaces, grounds and buildings.</u>

PUBLIC STRUCTURE OR BUILDING

<u>Shall mean any structure or building owned or operated by the Federal, County or State</u> <u>government or any governmental agency.</u>

<u>REFUSE</u>

<u>Shall mean all putrescible solid wastes (except body wastes), including garbage, rubbish, ashes,</u> <u>street cleanings, dead animals, and solid market and industrial wastes.</u>

<u>RUBBISH</u>

Shall mean nonputrescible solid wastes consisting of both combustible and noncombustible wastes, such as papers, wrappings, cigarettes, cardboard, tin cans, yard clippings, leaves, wood, glass, bedding, crockery, building materials and similar materials.

<u>VEHICLE</u>

<u>Shall mean every device in, upon or by which any person or property is or may be transported</u> <u>or drawn upon a highway, including devices used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks.</u>

§ 3-1.2. Use of Litter Receptacles.

a. Litter receptacles and their servicing are required at the following public places which exist in the municipality, including: sidewalks used by pedestrians in active retail commercially zoned areas, such that at a minimum there shall be no single linear quarter-mile without a receptacle; buildings held out for use by the public, including schools, government buildings and railroad and bus stations, parks, drive-in restaurants, all street vendor locations, self-service refreshment

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areas, construction sites, gasoline service stations islands, shopping centers, parking lots, campgrounds and trailer parks, marinas, boat moorage and fueling stations, boat launching areas, and at special events to which the public is invited including: sporting events, parades, carnivals, circuses and festivals. The proprietors of these places or the sponsors of these events shall be responsible for providing and servicing the receptacles such that adequate containerization is available.

b. Litter receptacle means a container suitable for the depositing of litter.

<u>c. Use of Receptacles to Prevent Scattering. Persons placing litter in public receptacles or in</u> <u>authorized private receptacles shall do so in such a manner as to prevent it from being carried</u> <u>or deposited by the elements upon any street, sidewalk or other public place.</u>

§ 3-1.3 - § 3-1.8 shall remain unchanged.

§ 3-1.9 Commercial Establishments and Residences.

The owner or person in control of any private property shall at all times maintain the premises free of litter, particularly one or more automobile bodies, frames, or chassis, one or more automobiles unable to be self-propelled, or one or more abandoned automobiles; provided, however, that this subsection shall not prohibit the storage of litter in authorized private receptacles for collection.

It shall be the duty of the owner, lessee, tenant, occupant or person in charge of any structure to keep and cause to be kept the sidewalk and curb abutting the building or structure free from obstruction or nuisances of every kind, and to keep sidewalks, areaways, backyards, courts and alleys free from litter and other offensive material. All sweepings shall be collected and properly containerized for disposal.

§ 3-1.10. Litter in Public Places.

No person shall throw or deposit litter in or upon any street, sidewalk or other public place within the Borough except in public receptacles or in authorized private receptacles for collection; provided, however, that the public receptacles shall not be used by persons owning or occupying property in the vicinity of the public receptacles for the deposit of domestic, commercial and industrial litter arising from the conduct of the activities. In the event litter is located in either private or public receptacles which litter contains the name and/or address of a person, a rebuttable presumption shall arise that such person placed or caused such litter to be placed in said public or private receptacle.

§ 3-1.11. Sweeping Litter into Gutters.

No person shall sweep into or deposit in any gutter, street or other public place within the Borough, the accumulation of litter from any building or lot or from any public or private sidewalk or driveway. Persons owning or occupying property shall keep the sidewalk in front of their premises free of litter.

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§ 3-1.12. Litter in Lakes and Fountains.

<u>No person shall throw or deposit litter in any fountain, pond, lake, stream, bay or any other</u> <u>body of water in a park or elsewhere within the Borough.</u>

§ 3-1.13. Litter on Vacant Lots.

<u>No person shall throw or deposit litter on any open or vacant private property within the</u> <u>Borough, whether owned by such person or not.</u>

§ 3-1. 10 14. Violations and Penalties.

a. Any person, firm or corporation who violates or neglects to comply with any provision of the section or any rule or regulation promulgated pursuant thereto shall be punishable upon conviction thereof by a fine not to exceed five hundred (\$500.00) dollars. As an alternate penalty, a convicted person may be ordered to perform community service in the Clean Communities program for a period not to exceed 90 days.

b. Each day such violation or neglect is committed or permitted to continue shall constitute a separate offense and be punishable as such. Enforcement shall be by summons heard in the municipal court of the Borough of Highlands.

The Remaining Sections of Chapter 3, Section 1 entitled "Litter Prohibitions" of the Borough Code shall remain unchanged.

SECTION II. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.

SECTION III. <u>**REPEALER**</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION IV. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage as provided by law.

ORDINANCE O-25-13

REMOVING RESTRICTED PARKING SPACE IN FRONT OF RESIDENCE PREVIOUSLY OCCUPIED BY A PERSON WITH DISABILITIES

WHEREAS, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 39:4-197.6 provides that any municipality may, by ordinance, establish a restricted parking zone in front of a residence occupied by a person with a disability provided such parking is not otherwise prohibited and the permitting thereof would not interfere with the normal flow of traffic; and.

WHEREAS, Chapter 7, Section 3.6B of the Borough Code governs applications for restricted parking in front of residences occupied by persons with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the aforesaid Code section, the Borough of Highlands previously designated a space for resident parking for a person with a disability at 1 Private Road; and

WHEREAS, the Highlands Police Department was notified of the vacation of the premises by said person with a disability at 1 Private Road, therefore, the space is no longer needed; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 7, Section 3.6B(g) of the Borough Code, if the Resident Parking Permit for Persons with Disabilities is no longer necessary for the residence, the Borough shall remove any signs installed pursuant to the Code.

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Borough of Highlands wishes to remove the previously designated space for persons with disabilities with the recommendation of the Chief of Police.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the governing body of the Borough of Highlands as follows:

SECTION I.

The previously designated parking space for resident parking for persons with disabilities located in front of 1 Private Road is no longer necessary and shall be removed. Any sign that was installed to identify the parking space, in accordance with Chapter 7, Section 3.6B of the Borough Code, shall be removed.

SECTION II. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.

SECTION III. <u>REPEALER.</u> All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION IV. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect upon adoption and publication according to law.

ORDINANCE O-25-14

AMENDING CHAPTER 3 "GENERAL POLICE REGULATIONS", SECTION 3-21 "WILDLIFE FEEDING" OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF HIGHLANDS

WHEREAS, Chapter 3, Section 21 of the Borough Code establishes guidelines for wildlife feeding and prohibits the feeding of unconfined wildlife in any public park or on any other property owned or operated by the Borough of Highlands to protect the public health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has analyzed and evaluated the Borough Code and has recommended certain changes with respect to the definition of "Wildlife", as well as Prohibited Conduct as it pertains to the feeding of wildlife in any public park or on any other property owned or operated by the Borough, within Section 3-21 of the Borough Code; and

WHEREAS, the governing body finds that these recommendations further protect the general health, safety and welfare of the Borough.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the governing body of the Borough of Highlands as follows:

SECTION I.

Borough Code Chapter 3 "General Police Regulations", Section 3-21 "Wildlife Feeding", Section 3-21.2 "Definitions", and Section 3-21.3 "Prohibited Conduct" shall be amended by the following: (All additions are shown in **bold italics with underlines.** The deletions are shown as **strikeovers in bold italics**.):

§ 3-21 Wildlife Feeding.

§ 3-21.1 Purpose.

This section remains unchanged.

§ 3-21.2 Definitions.

For the purpose of this section, the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meanings stated herein unless their use in the text of this section clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words used in the plural number include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

FEED

Shall mean to give, place, expose, deposit, distribute or scatter any edible material with the intention of feeding, attracting or enticing wildlife. Feeding does not include baiting in the legal taking of fish and/or game.

PERSON

Shall mean any individual, corporation, company, partnership, firm, association, or political subdivision of this State subject to municipal jurisdiction.

WILDLIFE

Shall mean all animals that are neither human nor domesticated <u>and includes all organisms that</u> <u>live wild in an area, including, but not limited to, bears, coyotes, deer, stray and feral cats,</u> <u>foxes, groundhogs, opossum, raccoons, skunks, waterfowl, wolves, and hybrid wolves.</u> § 3-21.3 Prohibited Conduct.

No person shall feed, *cause to be fed, or in any manner provide access to food for,* in any public park or on any other property owned or operated by the Borough of Highlands, any wildlife, excluding confined wildlife (for example, wildlife confined in zoos, parks or rehabilitation centers, or unconfined wildlife at environmental education centers).

No person shall purposely or knowingly leave or store any refuse, garbage, food product, pet food, forage product, or supplement, salt, seed or birdseed, fruit or grain in a manner that would constitute an attractant to any wild animal or waterfowl.

No person shall fail to take remedial action to avoid contact or conflict with wild animals, which may include the securing or removal of outdoor trash, cooking grills, pet food, bird feeders or any other similar food source or attractant, after being advised by the Borough to undertake such remedial action. Further, after an initial contact or conflict with a wild animal, no person shall continue to provide, or otherwise fail to secure or remove, any likely food sources or attractants, including but not limited to outdoor trash, grills, pet food or bird feeders.

The Remaining Sections of Chapter 3, Section 21 entitled "Wildlife Feeding" of the Borough Code shall remain unchanged.

SECTION II. <u>SEVERABILITY</u>. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance, which shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.

SECTION III. <u>**REPEALER**</u>. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION IV. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage as provided by law.

WHEREAS, FHA II established a procedure by which municipalities can secure approval of a Housing Element and Fair Share Plan ("HEFSP") and

WHEREAS, that procedure contemplated that municipalities would adopt a binding resolution by January 31, 2025 committing to a fair share number and filing a declaratory relief action within 48 hours from adoption of the resolution and then filing a HEFSP by June 30, 2025 and filing that plan within 48 hours from adoption of the Plan with the Affordable Housing Dispute Resolution Program (the "Program"); and

WHEREAS, FHA gave municipalities immunity from exclusionary zoning litigation, including builder's remedy lawsuits, to any municipality that complied with these procedures; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with this statutory procedure, the Borough adopted a binding resolution on January 15, 2025 committing to a Present Need of 0 and Round 4 Prospective Need obligation of 30, subject to applicable adjustments;

WHEREAS, in accordance with this statutory procedure, the Borough's Affordable Housing Counsel filed a declaratory relief action within 48 hours from adoption of the binding resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Borough requested that its affordable housing planning consultant, Susan Gruel P.P., of Heyer, Gruel, & Associates prepare a HEFSP to address the Borough's affordable housing obligations under FHA II; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Gruel, PP, prepared a HEFSP and the Highlands Borough Land Use Board adopted the HEFSP on June 12, 2025, which is attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Gruel, PP, also prepared a Spending Plan, which shows how much money the Borough has in its affordable housing trust fund; how much it anticipates receiving by June 30, 2035 and how it plans to spend trust fund money in accordance with FHA II and applicable law; and

WHEREAS, the Highlands Borough Land Use Board adopted the Spending Plan on June 12, 2025, which is attached hereto as Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the procedure established by FHA II, the Borough's Affordable Housing Counsel filed the duly adopted HEFSP with the Program created within 48 hours from adoption; and

WHEREAS, the Borough's Affordable Housing Counsel also filed the Spending Plan with the Program created within 48 hours from adoption; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council now wishes to endorse the HEFSP adopted by the Highlands Land Use Board and seek approval of the HEFSP by the Program and Court; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council also wishes to adopt the Spending Plan adopted by the Highlands Land Use Board and seek approval of same.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Borough of Highlands, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The Borough Council hereby endorses the HEFSP previously adopted by the Highlands Land Use Board and attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- 2. The Borough Council hereby adopts the Spending Plan previously adopted by the Highlands Land Use Board and attached hereto as Exhibit B.
- **3.** The Borough Council hereby directs the Borough's Affordable Housing Counsel to (a) file this resolution with the Program, along with any additional documents the professionals deem necessary or desirable; and (b) seek a Compliance Certification from the Program or Vicinage area judge as may be appropriate formally approving the Plan.
- **4.** The Borough reserves the right to further amend the HEFSP and Spending Plan attached hereto, should that be necessary.

WHEREAS, that procedure contemplated that municipalities would adopt a resolution by January 31, 2025 committing to a fair share number and filing a declaratory relief action within 48 hours from adoption of the resolution and then filing a Housing Element and Fair Share Plan by June 30, 2025 and filing that plan within 48 hours from adoption with the Affordable Housing Dispute Resolution Program (the "Program"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough adopted a resolution by January 31, 2025 committing to a fair share number and filed a declaratory relief action within 48 hours from adoption of that resolution; and

WHEREAS, the Borough asked its affordable housing planning consultant, Susan Gruel P.P., of Heyer Gruel Associates, to prepare a Housing Element and Fair Share Plan (hereinafter "HEFSP") to address the Borough's affordable housing obligations under FHA II; and

WHEREAS, the Borough now wishes for the Highlands Land Use Board to consider adopting the HEFSP prepared by Ms. Gruel, P.P. and the file the duly adopted HEFSP with the Program within 48 hours; and

WHEREAS, Susan Gruel P.P., also prepared a Spending Plan, which shows how much money the Borough has in its affordable housing trust fund; how much it anticipates receiving by June 30, 2035 and how it plans to spend trust fund money in accordance with FHA II and applicable law and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40:55D-13 of the MLUL, the Land Use Board scheduled a public hearing on the HEFSP for June 12 at 7:00 p.m. at Municipal Building, 151 Navesink Ave Highlands, New Jersey 07732; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40:55D-13 of the MLUL, the Land Use Board published a notice of this public hearing in the Borough's official newspaper at least ten days before the scheduled date for the public hearing and served a copy of this notice upon the clerks of all municipalities adjoining the Borough, upon the clerk of the County Land Use Board, and upon the New Jersey Office of Planning Advocacy; and

WHEREAS, a copy of the HEFSP and the Spending Plan was placed on file with the Land Use Board Secretary and was available for public review at least ten days before the scheduled date for the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, upon notice duly provided pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40:55D-13, the Land Use Board held a public hearing on the Housing Element and Fair Share Plan on June 12, 2025; and

WHEREAS, by way of Resolution 22-184, duly adopted on August 16, 2023, Nancy Tran was appointed to serve as Registrar for a term concurrent with the term of office as Municipal Clerk; and

WHEREAS, <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 40A:9-133.7 provides that a Municipal Clerk possessing a Registered Municipal Clerk Certificate, having served and performed all of the statutory duties of said office for not less than three (3) consecutive years immediately prior to such reappointment shall upon reappointment hold office during good behavior and efficiency; and
