14. Presentation of the 2021-2022 Fiscal Year Audit from Carl Deaton of Hankins, Eastup, Deaton, Tonn & Seay.

Carl Deaton of Hankins, Eastup, Deaton, Tonn & Seay presented the audited financial statements for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022. The assets and deferred outflows of resources of the Town of Hickory Creek exceeded its liabilities on September 30, 2022 by \$18,278,264. Of this amount \$6,501,816 may be used to meet the government's ongoing obligations to citizens and creditors. The Town's total net position increased by \$1,792,957 during the fiscal year from the results of current year operations. As of September 30, 2022, the Town of Hickory Creek's governmental funds reported combined ending fund balance of \$10,708,279, an increase of \$519,915 in comparison with the beginning of the period. Approximately 56 percent of this total amount, \$6,054,388 is available for spending at the government's discretion. At the end of the current period, unassigned fund balance for the general fund was \$6,054,388 or 113.97 percent of total general fund expenditures. The audit is required to include the activity of the Economic Development Corporation, Public Improvement District No. 1, Public Improvement District No. 2 and Hickory Farms Public Improvement District. The EDC total fund balance was \$2,545,414. The Public Improvement District No. 1 total fund balance was \$271,415. The Public Improvement District No. 2 total fund balance was \$483,104. Hickory Farms Public Improvement District total fund balance was \$356,326.

ON ANY SATURDAY OR SUNDAY OR TOWN HOLIDAY WITHIN THE TOWN LIMITS OF HICKORY CREEK; PROVIDING FOR FINDINGS; PROVIDING FOR DEFINITIONS; PROVIDING FOR OFFENSES; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION; PROVIDING FOR A CUMULATIVE REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR ENGROSSMENT AND ENROLLMENT; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS,** the Town Council of the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas desires to continue regulating the hours an unsupervised minor under 17 years of age may appear in public without undue infringement on their liberty;

**WHEREAS,** Section 370.002 of the Texas Local Government Code requires that such an ordinance be reexamined before the third anniversary of the date of adoption of a juvenile curfew ordinance and every third year thereafter, to determine whether such provisions should be continued in effect, modified or abolished;

**WHEREAS,** the Town Council of the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas recognizes the danger to the safety and security of unsupervised minors during certain hours of a day;

**WHEREAS,** the Town Council of the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas, recognizes that although dangerous, certain circumstances may exist that would necessitate a minor being in a public place due to an unforeseen combination of circumstances or an emergency;

**WHEREAS**, the Town Council of the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas, has conducted public hearings on the need to continue in effect within the Town of Hickory Creek juvenile curfew ordinance; and

**WHEREAS,** the Town Council of the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas, now finds and determines that the current juvenile curfew ordinance provisions in effect within the Town should be continued in effect with the modifications contained herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HICKORY CREEK, TEXAS, THAT:

# **Section I Findings**

That the above stated findings and recitals contained in the preamble of this ordinance are determined to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this ordinance.

# **Section II Definitions**

In this ordinance, the following definitions shall be used:

<u>Curfew Hours:</u> means 11:00 p.m. on any Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday until 6:00 a.m. of the following day; and 12:01 a.m. until 6:00 a.m. on any Saturday or Sunday or Town Holiday.

**Emergency:** means an unforeseen combination of circumstances or the resulting state that calls for immediate action. The term includes but is not limited to, a fire, a natural disaster, an automobile accident, or any situation requiring immediate action to prevent serious bodily injury or loss of life.

**Establishment:** means any privately-owned place of business operated for a profit to which the public is invited, including but not limited to any place of amusement or entertainment.

**Guardian:** means a person who, under court order, is the guardian of the person of a minor or a public or private agency with whom a minor has been placed by a court.

**Parent:** means a person who is a natural parent, adoptive parent, or stepparent of another person or at least 18 years of age and authorized by a parent or guardian to have the care and custody of a minor.

**Operator:** means any individual, firm, association, partnership, or corporation operating, managing, or conducting any establishment. The term includes the members or partners of an association or partnership and the officers of a corporation.

**Minor:** means any person younger than 17 years of age.

**Public Place:** means any place to which the public or a substantial group of the public has access, and includes but is not limited to streets, highways, the common areas of schools, the common areas of greenbelts in housing developments, hospitals, apartment houses, office buildings, transport facilities and shops.

**Remain:** means to linger, loiter, stay, or fail to leave premises when requested to do so by a police officer or the owner, operator, or other person in control of the premises.

<u>Serious Bodily Injury:</u> means bodily injury that creates a substantial risk of death or that causes death, serious permanent disfigurement, or protracted loss or impairment of the function of any bodily member or organ.

**Town Holiday:** means a day on which the Town of Hickory Creek observes a paid holiday for its employees.

### Section III Offenses

(1) A minor commits an offense if he or she remains in any public place or on the premises of any establishment within the Town limits during curfew hours.

- (2) A parent or guardian of a minor commits an offense if he or she knowingly permits, or by insufficient control, allows the minor to remain in any public place or on the premises of any establishment within the town limits during curfew hours.
- (3) The owner, operator, or any employee of an establishment commits an offense if he knowingly allows a minor to remain upon the premises of the establishment in the town limits during curfew hours.

#### Section IV Defenses

- (1) It is a defense to prosecution under Section III that the minor was;
  - (a) Accompanied by the minor's parent or guardian;
  - (b) On an errand at the direction of the minor's parent or guardian, without any detour or stop;
  - (c) In a motor vehicle involved in interstate travel;
  - (d) Engaged in an employment activity, or going to or returning home from an employment activity, without any detour or stop;
  - (e) Involved in an emergency;
  - (f) On the sidewalk abutting the minor's residence, or abutting the residence of a next-door neighbor, if the neighbor did not complain to the police department about the minor's presence;
  - (g) Attending an official school, religious, or other recreational activity supervised by adults and sponsored by the Town, a civic organization, or another similar entity that takes responsibility for the minor, or going to or returning home from, without any detour or stop, an official school, religious, or other recreational activity supervised by adults and sponsored by the Town, a civic organization, or other similar entity that takes responsibility for the minor;
    - (h) Exercising First Amendment rights protected by the United States Constitution, such as the free exercise of religion, freedom of speech, and the right of assembly;
    - (i) Married or has been married or had disabilities of minority removed in accordance with Chapter 31 of the Texas Family code; or
    - (j) Accompanied by an adult designated by his or her parent or guardian.
  - (2) It is a defense to prosecution of an owner, operator, or employee under Section III, that the owner, operator, or employee of an establishment promptly notified the police department that a minor was present on the premises of the establishment during curfew hours and refused to leave.

#### Section V Enforcement

(1) Before taking any enforcement action under this article, a police officer shall ask the apparent offender's age and reason for being in the public place. The officer shall not issue a citation or make an arrest under this article unless the officer reasonably believes that an offense has occurred and that, based on any response and other circumstances, no defense set forth in Section IV is present.

#### Section VI Penalties

- (1) A person who violates a provision of this Article is guilty of a separate offense for each day or, part of a day, during which the violation is committed, continued, or permitted. Each offense, upon conviction, is punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500.00) and a separate offense shall be deemed committed upon each day during or on which a violation occurs and continues.
- (2) If the governing body of the Town of Hickory Creek determines that a violation of this Ordinance has occurred, the Town of Hickory Creek may bring suit in district court to enjoin the person, firm, partnership, corporation, or association from engaging in the prohibited activity.
- (3) When required by Section 51.08 of the Texas Family Code, as amended, the municipal court shall waive original jurisdiction over a minor who violates Section III of this ordinance and shall refer the minor to juvenile court.

# Section VII Publication Clause

The Town Secretary of the Town of Hickory Creek is hereby directed to publish in the Official newspaper of the Town of Hickory Creek, the Caption and Effective Date clause of this Ordinance as required by Section 52.011 of the Texas Local Government Code.

# Section VIII Cumulative Repealer

This Ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of the ordinances of the Town of Hickory Creek, Texas, except where the provisions of this Ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such ordinances, in which event the conflicting provisions of such ordinances are hereby repealed.

# **Section IX Severability**

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the Town Council of the Town of Hickory Creek that the phases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or section of this Ordinance should be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining phases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the Town Council without incorporation of this Ordinance of any such unconstitutional phase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

### Section X Engrossment and Enrollment

The Town Secretary of the Town of Hickory Creek is hereby directed to engross and enroll this Ordinance by copying the Exact Caption and Effective date clause in the minutes of the Town Council of the Town of Hickory Creek and by filing this Ordinance in the Ordinance records of the Town.

# Section XI Effective Date

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its date of passage and publication.

Halff Associates received a request from the Town of Hickory Creek to review a Final Plat application for The Reserve at Hickory Creek on January 18, 2023. The written comments contained in this letter reflect the revised plat. The surveyor/engineer is Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. The owner/applicant is Market Space Capital.

2<sup>nd</sup> Review Submittal Received: February 15, 2023 (including Site and Landscape Plans) 3<sup>rd</sup> Review Submittal Received: February 20, 2023

Halff has reviewed the Final Plat, Site and Landscape Plans and offers the following comments. Please note the Drainage Study and Construction Plans are under review by separate letter, and acceptance of the Final Plat should be contingent upon acceptance of the Drainage Study. Review comments from the Construction Plans should be reflected in the Final Plat.

Refer to the markup for all comments.

#### Final Plat

- Please note the proposed detention ponds will require a Stormwater Facilities Maintenance Agreement (to also include the retaining walls). This will not be executed until acceptance of Construction Plans.
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Review: Applicant has acknowledged and an example is included herewith.
- 2. Label the dimension and purpose of all easements.
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Review: Addressed.
- 3. A floodplain easement will be required to encompass the fully developed 100-year water surface elevation plus one foot of freeboard or 10 feet of horizontal distance, whichever is greater. 2nd Review: Addressed.
- 4. The planned detention ponds will require an emergency spillway encompassed by a drainage easement that directs overflow either to the stream or to ROW.
  - $2^{nd}$  Review: Drainage easement was added to cover the storm drain line and outfall but does not extend to cover the channel to the ROW line. The drainage easement must extend to the ROW line.  $3^{rd}$  Review: Addressed.
- The location and width of sidewalks are required. Sidewalks are required to connect each lot to a public sidewalk within ROW or easement. Sidewalk easements must cover the sidewalk plus 2 feet each side.
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Review: Note added to the plat to designate sidewalk easements across all open space lots.
- 6. Modify the approval block to reflect the Final Plat approval block in accordance with Town ordinance.

13. Provide the finished floor elevations for all lots surrounding the detention pond.

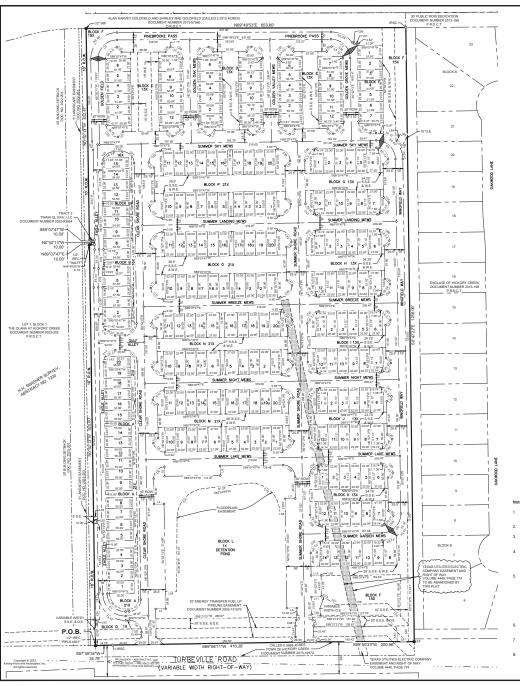

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#### AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES ON A DEFINED SCOPE OF SERVICES BASIS

This Agreement for Professional Engineering Services ("Agreement") is entered into by the **Town of Hickory Creek** a **General Law City** of the State of **Texas** ("Client"), duly authorized to act by the **Town Council** of said Client, and **HALFF ASSOCIATES, INC.**, a Texas corporation, acting through a duly authorized officer ("Engineer"), relative to Engineer providing professional engineering services to Client. Client and Engineer may be collectively referred to as the "Parties" or individually as a "Party".

#### WITNESSETH:

For the mutual promises and benefits herein described, Client and Engineer agree as follows:

- **I. TERM OF AGREEMENT.** This Agreement shall become effective on the date of its execution by both Parties and shall continue in effect thereafter until terminated as provided herein.
- **II. SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY ENGINEER.** Engineer shall provide to Client basic engineering services as described in the Scope of Services attachment and fully incorporated herein as "**Exhibit A**" which services may include, but will not be limited to, those services normally rendered by an engineer to a **General Law City.** Engineer shall perform its obligations under this Agreement as an independent contractor and not as an agent or fiduciary of any other party.
- **III. COMPENSATION.** Client agrees to pay monthly invoices or their undisputed portions within thirty (30) calendar days of receipt. Payment later than thirty (30) calendar days shall include interest at one percent (1%) per month or lesser maximum enforceable interest rate, from the date Client received the invoice until the date Engineer receives payment. Such interest is due and payable when the overdue payment is made.

It is understood and agreed by the Parties that Engineer's receipt of payment(s) from Client is not contingent upon Client's receipt of payment, funding, reimbursement, or any other remuneration from others.

Time-related charges will be billed as specified in this Agreement. Unless stated otherwise in this Agreement, direct expenses, subcontracted services, and direct costs will be billed at actual cost plus a service charge of ten percent (10%). Mileage will be billed at current IRS rates.

- **IV. CLIENT'S OBLIGATIONS.** Client agrees that it will (i) designate a specific person to act as Client's representative, (ii) provide Engineer with any previous studies, reports, data, budget constraints, special Client requirements, or other pertinent information known to Client, when necessitated by a project, (iii) provide site access, and to provide those services described in the attached Scope of Services, assist Engineer in obtaining access to property necessary for performance of Engineer's work for Client, (iv) make prompt payments in response to Engineer's statements and (v) respond in a timely manner to requests from Engineer. Engineer is entitled to rely upon and use, without independent verification and without liability, all information and services provided by Client or Client's representatives.
- V. TERMINATION OF WORK. Either Client or Engineer may terminate this Agreement at any time with or without cause upon giving the other Party ten (10) calendar days' prior written notice. Client agrees that termination of Engineer for Client's convenience shall only be utilized in good faith and shall not be utilized if either the purpose or the result of such termination is the performance of all or part of Engineer's services under this Agreement by Client or by another service provider. Following Engineer's receipt of such termination notice Client shall, within ten (10) calendar days of Client's receipt of Engineer's final invoice, pay Engineer for all services rendered and all costs incurred up to the date of Engineer's receipt of such notice of termination.
- **VI. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS.** Upon Engineer's completion of services and receipt of payment in full, Engineer shall grant to Client a non-exclusive license to possess the final drawings and instruments produced in connection with Engineer's performance of the work under this Agreement, if any. Said drawings and instruments may be copied, duplicated, reproduced, and used by Client for the purpose of constructing, operating, and maintaining the improvements. Client agrees that such documents are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by Client or others for purposes outside the Scope of Services of this Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Client

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understands and agrees that any and all computer programs, GIS applications, proprietary data or processes, and certain other items related to the services performable under this Agreement are and shall remain the sole and exclusive property of Engineer and may not be used or reused, in any form, by Client without the express written authorization of Engineer. Client agrees that any reuse by Client, or by those who obtain said information from or through Client, without written verification or adaptation by Engineer, will be at Client's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Engineer or to Engineer's employees, agents, representatives, officers, directors, affiliates, shareholders, owners, members, managers, attorneys, subsidiary entities, advisors, subconsultants or independent contractors or associates. Engineer may reuse all drawings, reports, data, and other information developed in performing the services described by this Agreement in Engineer's other activities. Under no circumstances shall delivery of electronic files for use by Client be deemed a sale by Engineer, and Engineer makes no warranties, either express or implied, of merchantability or fitness for any particular purpose. In no event shall Engineer be liable for any damages, including but not limited to indirect or consequential damages, as a result of Client's unauthorized use or reuse of the electronic files. Client is aware that differences may exist between the electronic files delivered and the printed hard-copy original documents. In the event of a conflict between the signed original documents prepared by Engineer and any electronic or other files or data provided, it is understood and agreed that the original signed or sealed hard-copy documents shall govern.

- **VII. NOTICES.** Any notices to be given hereunder by either Party to the other may be affected either by personal delivery, in writing, or by registered or certified mail.
- **VIII. SOLE PARTIES AND ENTIRE AGREEMENT.** This Agreement shall not create any rights or benefits to anyone except Client and Engineer and contains the entire Agreement between the Parties. Oral modifications to this Agreement shall have no force or effect.
- **IX. INSURANCE.** Engineer shall, at its own expense, purchase, maintain and keep in force throughout the duration of this Agreement and for a period of four (4) years thereafter, professional liability insurance. The limits of liability shall be \$2,000,000 per claim and in the aggregate. Engineer shall submit to Client a certificate of insurance prior to commencing any work for Client.
- **X. PROMPT PERFORMANCE BY ENGINEER.** All services provided by Engineer hereunder shall be performed in accordance with the degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised under similar circumstances by competent members of the engineering profession in the State of **Texas** applicable to such engineering services contemplated by this Agreement.
- **XI. CLIENT OBJECTION TO PERSONNEL.** If at any time after entering into this Agreement Client has any reasonable objection to any of Engineer's personnel, or any personnel, professionals and/or consultants retained by Engineer, Engineer shall promptly propose substitutes to whom Client has no reasonable objection, and Engineer's compensation shall be equitably adjusted to reflect any difference in Engineer's costs occasioned by such substitution.
- **XII. ASSIGNMENT.** This Agreement is binding on the heirs, successors, and assigns of the Parties hereto. Neither this Agreement, nor any claims, rights, obligations, suits, or duties associated hereto, shall be assigned or assignable by either Client or Engineer without the prior written consent of the other Party. Further, nothing under this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits in this Agreement to anyone other than Engineer and Client and all duties and responsibilities undertaken pursuant to this Agreement will be for the sole benefit of Engineer and Client and not for the benefit of any other party (no third party beneficiaries).
- **XIII. JURISDICTION AND VENUE.** This Agreement shall be administered under the substantive laws of the State of **Texas** (and not its conflicts of law principles) which shall be used to govern all matters arising out of, or relating to, this Agreement and all of the transactions it contemplates, including without limitation, its validity, interpretation, construction, performance and enforcement. Exclusive venue shall lie in any court of competent jurisdiction in **Denton County, Texas.**
- XIV. INTEGRATION, MERGER AND SEVERABILITY. This Agreement and the Scope of Services, including fee and schedule are fully incorporated herein and represent the entire understanding of Client and Engineer. No prior oral or written understanding shall be of any force or effect with respect to those matters covered herein. The Agreement may not be modified or altered except in writing signed by both Parties. This Agreement constitutes, represents and is intended by the Parties to be the complete and final statement and expression of all the terms and arrangements between the Parties to this Agreement with respect to the matters provided for in this Agreement. This Agreement

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supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, negotiations, and discussions between the Parties and all such matters are merged into this Agreement. Should any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction or by legislative pronouncement to be void, invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such voiding, invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof, and this Agreement shall be considered as if the entirety of such void, invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained in this Agreement.

- **XV. EXCLUSIVITY OF REMEDIES.** The Parties acknowledge and agree that the remedies set forth in this Agreement (Agreed Remedies) are and shall remain the Parties' sole and exclusive remedy with respect to any claim arising from, or out of, or related to, the subject matter of this Agreement. The Parties agree that Engineer is to have no liability or responsibility whatsoever to Client for any claim(s) or loss(es) of any nature, except as set forth in this Agreement. No Party shall be able to avoid the limitations expressly set forth in this Agreement by electing to pursue some other remedy.
- XVI. TIMELINESS OF PERFORMANCE. To the extent of compliance with applicable law, including Texas Local Government Code §271.904(d)(2) which requires the Engineer to perform its services in a timely manner consistent with the professional skill and care ordinarily provided by competent engineers practicing under the same or similar circumstances and professional licensure, the Parties agree that, except as limited above and except to the extent that Engineer's performance of services is impacted by information, decisions, guidance, direction, data or review by others, that should Engineer fail to meet the time limits for completion as identified in "Exhibit A" of this Agreement, but only to the extent such is caused solely and exclusively by Engineer's willful misconduct, that such failure will result in City having the right to assess liquidated damages of \$50.00 per day for each consecutive business day until the plans, if any, are submitted and with the further understanding that any such liquidated damages will only be actionable up to a capped amount of \$10,000 and then only to the extent payable by applicable required insurance pursuant to this Agreement.
- **XVII. DISPUTE RESOLUTION.** In the event of any disagreement or conflict concerning the interpretation of this Agreement, and such disagreement cannot be resolved by the signatories hereto, the signatories agree to schedule a series of no less than two (2) meetings of senior personnel of Client and Engineer in which the disagreement or conflict will be discussed. The first of such meetings will be scheduled as soon as possible following identification of such disagreement or conflict and the second meeting must occur within thirty (30) calendar days following the initial meeting. Subsequent meetings, if any, may be scheduled upon mutual agreement of the Parties. The Parties agree that these two (2) meetings are conditions precedent to the institution of legal proceedings unless such meetings will adversely affect the rights of one or more of the Parties as such rights relate to statutes of limitation or repose.
- XVIII. PROJECT ENHANCEMENT/BETTERMENT. IF A COMPONENT OF CLIENT'S PROJECT IS OMITTED FROM ENGINEER'S CONTRACT DOCUMENTS DUE TO THE BREACH OF CONTRACT OR NEGLIGENCE OF ENGINEER, ENGINEER WILL NOT BE LIABLE TO CLIENT TO THE EXTENT OF ANY BETTERMENT OR ADDED VALUE TO THE PROJECT. SPECIFICALLY, CLIENT WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE AMOUNT IT WOULD HAVE PAID TO THE CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTOR (OR SUPPLIER OR SUBCONTRACTOR OR OTHER) FOR THE COMPONENT AS IF SUCH HAD BEEN INCLUDED IN ENGINEER'S CONTRACT DOCUMENTS. NOTWITHSTANDING THE FOREGOING, ENGINEER WILL BE RESPONSIBLE, IF AT ALL, TO THE EXTENT REASONABLE AND NECESSARY TO PLACE CLIENT IN THE SAME POSITION IT WOULD HAVE BEEN BUT FOR SUCH BREACH OR NEGLIGENCE, FOR THE REASONABLE (I) RETROFIT EXPENSE, (II) WASTE, OR (III) INTERVENING INCREASE IN THE COST OF THE COMPONENT FURNISHED THROUGH A CHANGE ORDER FROM THE CONTRACTOR. TO THE EXTENT THAT THE CONTRACTOR PROVIDED UNIT PRICING, CLIENT UNDERSTANDS AND AGREES THAT THE ISSUE OF INTERVENING UNIT COST INCREASES WOULD ONLY BE APPLICABLE TO NEWLY IDENTIFIED ITEMS, NOT INCREASES IN QUANTITY OF EXISTING ITEMS.

IF IT IS NECESSARY TO REPLACE A COMPONENT OF THE PROJECT DUE TO THE BREACH OF CONTRACT OR NEGLIGENCE OF ENGINEER, ENGINEER WILL NOT BE LIABLE TO CLIENT FOR THE ENHANCEMENT OR UPGRADE OF THE COMPONENT BEYOND THAT ORIGINALLY INCLUDED IN THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS. IN ADDITION, IF THE COMPONENT HAS AN IDENTIFIABLE USEFUL LIFE THAT IS LESS THAN THE SYSTEM/STRUCTURE/IMPROVEMENT ITSELF, THE DAMAGES OF THE OWNER SHALL BE REDUCED TO THE EXTENT THAT THE USEFUL LIFE OF THE COMPONENT WILL BE EXTENDED BY THE REPLACEMENT THEREOF.

SHOULD THERE BE AN ALLEGATION OF ERROR, NEGLIGENCE, BREACH OR OTHER DEFICIENCY IN THE SERVICES OF ENGINEER OR ANY OF ITS CONSULTANTS, AND SHOULD SUCH ALLEGATION RELATE TO A

# EXHIBIT "A" SCOPE OF SERVICES

for

# Construction Plans, Specifications and Estimates DENTON COUNTY BOND STREETS in THE TOWN OF HICKORY CREEK

Halff Associates, Inc. (Professional) will provide professional services to the Town of Hickory Creek (Town) for the development of construction plans, specifications, and estimates to be used in the reconstruction of Town streets as described below.

#### 1. Description:

The purpose of this project is to design the reconstruction and widening of four (4) asphalt streets, totaling 11,050 linear feet. They are as follows:

**South Hook Street and Garth Lane** – Main Street to Wolters Street (4,710 LF)

**Country Lane** – Oak Drive to Woodlake Road (1,030 LF)

Harbor Lane – Strait Lane to Road D (2,190 LF)

**Point Vista Road** – 210 feet south of Stamford Drive to Point Vista Estates (3,120 LF)

It is anticipated that the asphalt streets will be widened and reconstructed from an existing 20- to 24-foot wide section to a 28-foot wide reinforced concrete section per the recommendations of the Geotechnical Engineering Report. New sidewalks and driveway returns within street rights-of-way will be constructed where the condition and material composition necessitates. All streets shall include drainage improvements and will include utility adjustments as necessary.

### 2. Assumptions:

- **A.** Professional services shall include only services that are normal and customary and are not represented as including special services or those requiring expertise that is greater than that provided by other service providers.
- **B.** Design services of the streets shall be separated into Phases and have a staggered schedule of submittals as detailed below in Section 5 "Schedule."

- **C.** Right-of-Way Acquisition is not included in this proposal. All Right-of-Way Acquisition will be handled by the Town. Right-of-Way Acquisition and/or Negotiation services can be provided for an additional fee.
- **D.** Floodplain Analysis and Drainage Studies will not be necessary for this project and are not included in this proposal. If it is determined during design that a downstream assessment is necessary, Hydraulic & Hydrologic Analysis services can be provided for an additional fee.
- **E.** Professional will provide a Traffic Control and Sequencing Plan following TMUTCD established minimums. Contractor will be responsible for submitting the final Traffic Control Plan for Town approval.
- **F.** Construction Staking, Management, Inspection and Materials Testing is not included in this proposal.

#### 3. Work Plan:

#### A. Data Collection and Field Assessment:

- (1) Perform field assessment of the proposed corridor and prepare photographic record of major features.
- (2) Obtain master plans, record drawings and other records from the Town.
- (3) Obtain deeds, easements, plats and other property records from the Denton County Appraisal District.
- (4) Professional shall prepare for and participate in one (1) project kick-off meeting. Professional shall prepare and distribute meeting minutes.
- (5) Fee for this service is included in Basic Fee Services.
- **B. Site Visit:** The Professional shall conduct up to two (2) site visits per street
  - (1) Verify the existing features and above ground utilities were captured by the survey.
- **C.** Design Surveys (Topographic and Boundary): The Professional shall provide surveying services, which, in general, may be defined as normal services applicable to a project of this type. The following particulars will also apply.
  - (1) Vertical benchmarks shall be established such that all points of construction shall be within 500 feet of a benchmark. Benchmarks

- should not be subject to loss during construction. Fire hydrants and similar appurtenances are not to be used for benchmarks. The surveyor shall establish temporary benchmarks throughout the length of the project.
- (2) Topographic features will be surveyed along with any and all other features needed for design, review, permitting, construction, and inspection of the project. Coverage will extend beyond the proposed rights-of-way far enough to integrate the design with the adjacent properties.
- (3) Existing property corners, iron pins, etc. shall be tied in order to establish existing rights-of-way. Prior to surveying on private property, the surveyor shall secure written permission from the property owners and/or tenant and shall provide the Town a copy of said written permission. Should only oral permission be granted, the surveyor shall document the permission granted by letter to the property owner/tenant, with a copy to the Town. If permission cannot be obtained, the Town will assist or other arrangements will be worked out.
- (4) Consultant shall use a combination of mobile LiDAR and conventional survey as necessary to collect field data. Feature extraction for the above two items will include detailed list shown below in "Deliverables."

#### (5) Deliverables:

- Survey files will be delivered in MicroStation or AutoCAD CADD files.
- b. Topographic survey will include a DTM with minor contours at 1foot intervals and major contours at 5-foot intervals and site planimetric along the route.
- c. Locate topographic features along with any above-ground features needed, such as edges of pavement, curbs and gutter, sidewalks, building corners, power poles, valves and other appurtenances.
- **D. Right-of-Way and Easement Documents:** The Professional shall evaluate where Right-of-way and easements may be required.
  - (1) A maximum of six (6) individual permanent ROW or easement exhibits/parcels and maximum of four (4) individual temporary construction easement exhibits/parcels shall be prepared on 8.5" x 11" paper and shall include area required, area remaining, parcel number, and owner of record. Individual exhibits shall be stamped, dated, and signed by a Registered Land Surveyor. Additional parcels, if required, shall be prepared for an additional fee.

- (2) Prepare a preliminary list of right-of-way parcels and easements necessary to construct the project (if any). Submit to the Town of Hickory Creek as soon as possible and prior to the preliminary plan submittal.
- (3) Legal descriptions shall reference volume, page and owner of record and shall be incorporated into the standard Town of Hickory Creek instrument document.
- (4) Upon approval of the Right-of-Way plans by the Town, Professional shall then stake and flag the taking for inspection by the appraiser and property owner. The documents, including legal description, shall be furnished to the Town in PDF format.

### E. Subsurface Utilities Engineering (SUE) Services:

The Professional will perform SUE in accordance with ASCE CI/ASCE 38-02 "Standard Guideline for the Collection and Depiction of Existing Subsurface Utility Data." This standard defines the following Quality Levels:

#### A. Quality Level-A

i. Precise horizontal and vertical location of utilities obtained by the actual exposure (or verification of previously exposed and surveyed utilities) and subsequent measurement of subsurface utilities, usually at a specific point. Minimally intrusive excavation equipment is typically used to minimize the potential for utility damage. A precise horizontal and vertical location, as well as other utility attributes, is shown on plan documents. Quality Level A services are not included in this proposal. The Professional shall notify the Town of the need for Level A services as they arise. The Town shall conduct all Level A services utilizing their in-house crews.

#### B. Quality Level-B

i. Information obtained through the application of appropriate surface geophysical methods to determine the existence and approximate horizontal position of subsurface utilities. Quality Level-B data should be reproducible by surface geophysics at any point of their depiction. This information is surveyed to applicable tolerances defined by the project and reduced onto plan documents.

#### C. Quality Level-C

 Information obtained by surveying and plotting visible above-ground utility features and by using professional judgment in correlating this information to Quality Level-D information.

#### D. Quality Level-D

i. Information derived from existing records or oral recollections.

### (1) Quality Level-A Utility Test Holes (Vacuum Excavation)

- A. Up to ten (10) test holes will be performed on various utilities at locations specified by the Town of Hickory Creek. The Professional will cut up to a 12" square test hole, excavate down to utility, record the depth to top of utility, backfill & compact the hole, and restore the surface to its original condition. An iron rod with cap or "x-cut" will be set to mark the approximate centerline location of the utility. A jackhammer will be utilized for work to be performed in asphalt and concrete areas. This Scope of Services includes all test holes being performed under one (1) mobilization.
- B. If test holes are requested on non-conductive/untonable utilities depicted as Quality Level-D where the horizontal location is assumed, The Professional will coordinate with Client and respective utility owner, on-site personnel if private property and available records to pinpoint the location to perform the test hole. Due to the concrete/ground conditions, one (1) attempt shall be made, which may or may not expose the subject utility. Should the utility not be exposed, The Professional will coordinate with the Town of Hickory Creek for direction on digging additional test holes if required and shall be compensated for each test hole dug. Because of limited utility record information and the possibility of nonconductive/un-toneable utilities, The Professional cannot guarantee all utilities will be found and marked within the project limits.

### (2) Quality Level-B Utility Designating

A. The Professional will designate the approximate horizontal position of conductive/toneable utilities within the project limits using geophysical prospecting equipment and mark using paint and/or pin flags. We anticipate the designation of

approximately 24,000 linear feet of utilities including buried communication, electric, natural gas, petroleum pipeline, traffic signal, water, waste water/sanitary sewer, and storm drain/storm sewer. Designation of irrigation lines, HDPE lines, gathering lines, asbestos concrete and/or pvc lines, as well as pvc lines without tracer wire or access are not part of this Scope of Services.

B. Because of limited utility record information and the possibility of non-conductive/un-toneable utilities, The Professional cannot guarantee all utilities will be found and marked within the project limits.

### (3) Quality Level-C Surveying

A. Quality Level-B Utility Designation paint markings, pin flags, and above ground utility appurtenances as well the iron rod with cap or "x-cut" for Quality Level-A Test Holes will be surveyed and tied utilizing project survey control provided by the Town of Hickory Creek.

#### (4) Quality Level-D Records Research:

- A. Available Records will be provided to The Professional by the Town of Hickory Creek. The Professional will perform additional utility record research as needed to successfully complete the project.
- B. Because there are situations where the utility does not have a metallic composition, a metallic tracer line attached, or access to insert a tracer line, the approximate location of the utility may be determined by the use of utility records and direct correspondence with the utility owner/representative. In these areas, the information will be considered Quality Level-D, depicted according to utility record information only.

#### (5) SUE Field Manager / Professional Engineer

A. A SUE Field Manager will be on-site for a portion of this project for field crew supervision, field quality control, and coordination with on-site personnel. A Professional Engineer will be responsible for QA/QC, management of the contract, coordination with the project team and signing the final deliverables if required.

### (6) SUE Deliverables / CADD

A. Deliverables for the Quality Level-B 2D Utility Designation will be 11-in. x 17-in. SUE plan sheets depicting the findings of the investigation. Deliverables for the Quality Level-A Test Hole excavations will be a 8.5-in. x 11-in. Test Hole Data Form for each Test Hole performed indicating depth, size, location, and other notable characteristics of the utility. Electronic files will be provided in MicroStation and/or AutoCAD format along with PDFs and photos. A Utility Investigation Report will be provided in accordance with ASCE/UESI/CI 38-22.

### (7) Right-of-Entry

A. Right-of-Entry is not part of this Scope of Services as work is anticipated within the existing road right-of-way. If right-of-entry is required, it will be performed and provided to The Professional by the Town of Hickory Creek. The Professional will coordinate with property owner(s) once right-of-entry has been obtained.

#### (8) Permitting

A. Street Cut permits will be coordinated with the Town of Hickory Creek as required.

#### (9) Work Zone Traffic Control

- A. The Professional will provide standard temporary work zone traffic control consisting of cones and free-standing signage for this project. This Scope of Services does not include lane closure(s), flag person(s), changeable message board(s), arrow board(s) and/or engineered traffic control plans.
- B. If an engineered traffic control plan is required for permit approval or if unique traffic control conditions exist, The Professional will notify the Town of Hickory Creek and submit a supplemental agreement for authorization prior to proceeding with additional work.

#### F. Environmental Services:

The Professional will perform Environmental coordination for U.S. Army Corpos of Engineers (USACE) Approvals and Permitting and necessary Section 404 Permitting as detailed below:

### (1) South Hook Street and Garth Lane

#### A. USACE Approvals and Permitting:

I. The proposed project has the potential to impact waters of the United States regulated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), under the authority of Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (Section 404). The project also may entail the placement of fill material within the flowage easement of Lake Lewisville. Clearance for both of these actions must be coordinated through the USACE Regulatory Branch and USACE Operations Branch, respectively.

#### B. Section 404 Permitting:

- I. <u>Jurisdictional Determination/Delineation:</u> The Professional will perform a field investigation to confirm the presence/absence of potential waters of the United States, Including wetlands. The exercise will delineate the limits of the ordinary high water mark of stream channels and open waters where present. The presence/absence of wetlands will be verified consistent with U.S. Army Corps of Engineers protocol for wetland delineations. A summary report will be prepared describing the methodology and results of the investigation.
- II. <u>Cultural Resources Assessment:</u> A cultural resources review and field investigation will be conducted to complete the requirements of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (Section 106) and Chapter 26 of the Texas Antiquities Code. This task includes a literature review, a check of site records available in the office of the State Archaeologist, and a pedestrian field survey. The results of the survey will be incorporated into a stand-alone summary report.
- III. Section 404 Permitting: It is It is anticipated that the project may be permitted under Nationwide Permit 14 Linear Transportation Projects (NWP 14). This scope and fee include preparing and submitting a pre-construction notification for written verification that the project may proceed under NWP 14, the contents of which include:
  - Name, address and telephone numbers of the prospective permittee;
  - ii) Location of the proposed project;

- iii) A description of the proposed project; the project's purpose; direct and indirect adverse environmental effects the project would cause, including the anticipated amount of loss of water of the United States expected to result from the NWP activity, in acres, linear feet, or another appropriate unit of measure;
- iv) Delineation of waters of the United States;
- v) Compensatory mitigation plan (if required);
- vi) Threatened and endangered species assessment; and
- vii) Cultural resources assessment.

This service is currently assumed to be an exclusion for Hook Street and Garth Lane. If it is determined to be required, an additional service request will be required.

- IV. Lewisville Lake USACE Operations Coordination: If the placement of fill material within the flowage easement of Lake Lewisville is required The Professional will prepare a letter of application on behalf of the Town of Hickory Creek to initiate review of the request with the Lake Lewisville Office. The application will include by attachment items prepared by other tasks described herein as follows:
  - Detailed design plans, including the elevation of the proposed activity and design plans for the baseline and finished floor elevations;
  - ii) Plat map showing location of the proposed action and the relationship with the government boundary and lakeshore (2 copies) elevation;
  - iii) Calculations of any excavations and/or fill showing no net loss of flood storage capacity within the flowage easement;
  - iv) A map with the elevations of the activity, cut and fill locations, and the relationship with the government property line and the flowage easement controlling elevations.

This service is currently assumed to be an exclusion for Hook Street and Garth Lane. If it is determined to be required, an additional service request will be required.

V. <u>Assumptions:</u> This task assumes that the project will be located wholly outside of USACE fee-owned land. If the project requires expansion outside of existing easements/right-of-way onto USACE fee-owned lands, further coordination with the USACE Operations Division real estate group will be required. If an outgrant is

determined to be required, an additional service request will be required.

### (2) Point Vista Road

### A. USACE Approvals and Permitting:

I. The proposed project has the potential to impact waters of the United States regulated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), under the authority of Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (Section 404). The project also may entail the placement of fill material within the flowage easement of Lake Lewisville. Clearance for both of these actions must be coordinated through the USACE Regulatory Branch and USACE Operations Branch, respectively.

### B. Section 404 Permitting:

- I. <u>Jurisdictional Determination/Delineation:</u> The Professional will perform a field investigation to confirm the presence/absence of potential waters of the United States, Including wetlands. The exercise will delineate the limits of the ordinary high water mark of stream channels and open waters where present. The presence/absence of wetlands will be verified consistent with U.S. Army Corps of Engineers protocol for wetland delineations. A summary report will be prepared describing the methodology and results of the investigation.

- Name, address and telephone numbers of the prospective permittee;
- ii) Location of the proposed project;
- iii) A description of the proposed project; the project's purpose; direct and indirect adverse environmental effects the project would cause, including the anticipated amount of loss of water of the United States expected to result from the NWP activity, in acres, linear feet, or another appropriate unit of measure:
- iv) Delineation of waters of the United States;
- v) Compensatory mitigation plan (if required);
- vi) Threatened and endangered species assessment; and
- vii) Cultural resources assessment.
- IV. <u>Lewisville Lake USACE Operations Coordination:</u> The Professional will prepare a letter of application on behalf of the Town of Hickory Creek to initiate review of the request with the Lake Lewisville Office. The application will include by attachment items prepared by other tasks described herein as follows:
  - Detailed design plans, including the elevation of the proposed activity and design plans for the baseline and finished floor elevations;
  - ii) Plat map showing location of the proposed action and the relationship with the government boundary and lakeshore (2 copies) elevation;
  - iii) Calculations of any excavations and/or fill showing no net loss of flood storage capacity within the flowage easement:
  - iv) A map with the elevations of the activity, cut and fill locations, and the relationship with the government property line and the flowage easement controlling elevations.
- V. <u>Assumptions:</u> This task assumes that project only utilizes existing easements within USACE fee-owned property; therefore, the project will not require an outgrant through the USACE Operations real estate group. If an outgrant is required, an additional service request will be required.
- (3) Environmental Services are not anticipated to be required on Harbor Lane or Country Lane as they will likely not include a Section 404 regulated activity. If it is determined during design that either street includes a Section 404 regulated activity, further Environmental services can be provided for an additional fee.

- **G. Construction Plans:** The Professional shall develop construction plans for review, permitting, bidding, construction, inspection and record keeping. In general, construction plans shall be consistent with normal practice for projects of this nature. The following particulars will also apply. The construction plans will consist of numerous sheets ordered as follows:
  - (1) Cover Sheet and Sheet Index: The cover sheet shall include a location map. Additionally, the cover sheet shall show the project name, project number, date, Town logo, Professional's name, address, and telephone number and other items as may be specified. Following the title sheet shall be a sheet index with drawings numbered consecutively and without subscripts.
  - (2) <u>Project Layout Sheet(s)</u>: The project layout sheet(s) will be drawn to a scale of 1" = 50' and laid out with the north arrow up or to the right. The purpose of the project layout is to depict the project in a simplified view. Major items of work will be shown without excessive detail. Additionally, survey control points shall be shown.
  - (3) <u>Project General Notes and Legend:</u> These sheets will include a listing of abbreviations, legend, and general notes.
  - (4) <u>Typical Sections</u>: Typical sections shall be drawn to scales of 1" = 5' h and 1" = 2' v and shall depict a view looking north or east. As a minimum, typical sections will be drawn showing the relationship of the proposed street and existing and proposed improvements. Typical sections will include existing roadways, right-of-way lines, etc., along with all proposed highway improvements and will depict all significant items of work.
  - (5) Plan and Profile Sheets (Paving and Storm Drain/Ditches): Planprofile sheets will be arranged from south to north and from west to east, with the north arrow up or to the right on the sheet. Plan-profile sheets will be drawn to scales of 1" = 20' h and 1" = 4' v. Stationing will be from south to north or west to east with the beginning station being set at approximately 1+00. Each plan-profile sheet will include no more than 500 feet of street; thus, leaving ample margins both left and right. The plan and profile station will align vertically on the sheet with the proposed centerline drawn parallel to the profile grid. When there is a centerline curvature, the plan-profile should be drawn so that as much of the plan view is in alignment as possible. Plan-profile sheets shall depict all existing and proposed items pertinent to the project.

- (6) <u>Grading Plans:</u> The Professional will provide grading plans that include 1' proposed contours with spot elevations labeled at PC, PT, PI, drainage structures and maximum 50 feet spacing.
- (7) <u>Drainage Plans:</u> The Professional will provide a drainage area map and calculations to support the design of a closed conduit and/or open ditch systems, depending on street and drainage characteristics and determine any additional inlets needed to appropriately convey runoff for the street corridor. Existing storm drain infrastructure will remain in place wherever practicable.
- (8) <u>Detail Sheets:</u> The Town's standard drawings will be used as a beginning point in developing standard details for this project. They will be reviewed and modified for this project. Where other agency standards are used, they shall be reduced as necessary to fit on the Town's standard sheet format with complete title block.
- (9) <u>Miscellaneous:</u> Construction plans will also address erosion control, traffic control (including detours, road closures, signing, barricading, etc.) pavement markings and signage, and all other improvements.
- (10) <u>Cross Sections:</u> Cross sections shall be drawn to scales of 1" = 10' h and 1" = 5' v on sheets of 1" grids H and V. They shall be arranged from bottom to top of the sheet looking up station and shall show existing and proposed features and improvements. Generally, no more than eight (8) sections per sheet are to be plotted. Each section should extend beyond the easement and rights-of-way a sufficient distance to clearly show the relationship between the proposed improvements and the existing properties. Full sections will be drawn at critical locations, such as steep driveways, retaining walls, and at maximum spacings of 50 feet.
- (11) Review Plans: Preliminary plans shall then be prepared and submitted at the 30% milestone. Pre-Final plans shall be prepared and submitted at the 90% milestone, followed by final plans prepared and submitted at the 100% milestone. Also, the Professional may submit plan sheets or working drawings to the Town for review and comment to reduce the number of revisions that otherwise would be required. During development of the plans, the Professional shall attend meetings as needed. The Professional shall, in company with the Town, perform at least one plans-in-hand review.
- (12) <u>Design:</u> The design of the project shall be in general accordance with the Town of Hickory Creek ordinances, standard details, and good Engineering practices. During the design phase, the Professional shall contact various utility companies and obtain information relating to existing utility lines. The design should avoid major utility

- relocations, where practical. When required, proposed relocations or replacements will be shown in plan and profile.
- (13) Prints: The Professional shall provide prints of construction plans for review and permitting. Three (3) sets of half-size plans will be submitted to the Town for each review stage. The Professional will provide utility companies with half-size copies of 90% plans for review. The Professional will provide up to six (6) sets of half-size prints for bidding and construction. Electronic files in PDF format shall be provided to the Town for use by Town staff and for posting on BIDSYNC.
- (14) General: Construction plans shall be furnished full-size and half-size. Overall dimensions of full-size construction plans shall be 22" x 34". The Town's standard format shall be used. Up to two (2) full-size and five (5) half-size final construction plans shall be furnished to the Town. Up to two (2) full-size and six (6) half-size final construction plans shall be furnished to the Contractor. Electronic files in PDF and DGN or DWG format shall be provided to the Contractor for use during construction.
- (15) <u>Generic Sheet List:</u> Following is a general list of plan sheets required for each construction package.

- H. Specifications: The Professional shall prepare a project manual and technical specifications required for bidding and constructing the project at the 90% and 100% milestones for each phase. The project manual will be provided in the Town's standard format. Only specifications amending or supplementing COG specifications need be furnished. Project manual, specifications, bid items and quantities shall be furnished on hard copy and by electronic file.
- **I. Estimates:** Estimates of probable cost will be developed at each milestone submittal for each phase.
- J. Public Meetings: The Professional shall be required to attend a total of two (2) public meetings, one for each phase of this project, during the preliminary design phase for both of the project phases. The Professional shall be responsible for preparing project exhibits for presentation at these meetings.
- K. Town Council Coordination: The Professional shall be required to attend one (1) Town Council meeting under this contract for the award of design of the project. The Professional shall not be responsible for preparing presentation or exhibits for this meeting.
- **L. Construction Control Staking:** The Contractor will provide construction staking.

### M. Bidding, Construction, Closure:

(1) <u>Bidding</u> – During the bidding of each separate phase of streets, the Professional will prepare bid documents and assist the Town in advertising the project for bids. The Professional will address technical questions and prepare addenda and issue to the bidders. The Professional shall attend a pre-bid meeting and prepare minutes. The Professional shall attend a bid opening meeting. The Professional will tabulate bids and make recommendation for award of contract.

### (2) Construction:

- (a) Attend one (1) pre-construction meeting for each phase of streets.
- (b) Professional shall attend monthly progress meetings, as required, and document each meeting with written minutes. Professional shall visit the project site at the request of the Town, maximum six (6) site visits for each phase of streets, and as construction proceeds to observe and report on the progress and quality of the executed work. In performing these services the Professional will endeavor to protect the Town against defects and deficiencies in the work of the Contractor. However, the Professional cannot quarantee the performance of the Contractor, nor be responsible

- for the actual supervision of the construction operations or for the safety measures that the Contractor takes or should take.
- (c) Review shop drawings and Contractor submittals for each phase of streets.
- (d) Review laboratory test reports on materials and equipment for each phase of streets.
- (e) Review monthly payment applications submitted by the Contractor for each phase of streets.
- (f) Prepare and negotiate Change Orders between the Contractor and the Town for each phase of streets.
- (g) Prepare record drawings from information supplied by the Contractor for each phase of streets.
- (3) <u>Closure</u> The Professional shall prepare "record" plans, incorporating all changes and known variations to provide the Town the best possible set of record drawings for each phase of streets. The final record drawings shall be furnished in .tif and .pdf format on CD. CADD files shall be furnished on CD as well.
- **N. Geotechnical Investigation:** The Professional will subcontract with CMJ Engineering to provide sub-surface investigations in the form of boring logs. Borings shall be of sufficient depth and spacing to provide general information needed for the design and construction of the project.
- O. Reimbursable Expenses: All direct non-labor expenses, including services of special professionals (if authorized by Owner in writing), printing and reproduction costs, messenger and overnight delivery charges, travel subsistence for staff when required for the proper execution of the work.
- **P. Miscellaneous:** Miscellaneous services not provided for herein and not generally associated with a project of this type will be paid for under an amendment to this Agreement and for an additional fee.
- **4. Exclusions:** Other services, not included in this contract, will be negotiated with the Town as needed. Compensation will be based on a mutually agreed lump sum fee or an hourly rate as described below. Items that are considered additional services include:
  - Any services not specifically listed under Exhibit A above
  - Full tree preservation/mitigation plan
  - Landscape architecture and irrigation design
  - Traffic signal design
  - Collection of traffic counts and traffic studies
  - TDLR filing, application preparation, or inspection fees.
  - Revisions to plans requested by the Town after plans are approved

- Permit fees, filing fees, pro-rated fees, impact fees and taxes except as noted herein
- Preparation of right of entry documents
- Property acquisition and/or negotiations
- Design of water, sanitary sewer, gas, telephone, or utility improvements except as noted herein
- Design of utilities or other improvements outside of the project boundary or roadway rights of way (not in scope)
- Graphic products except as noted herein
- Photometric analysis and illumination design services
- Structural design services
- FEMA CLOMR and/or LOMR submittal
- Hydrologic and Hydraulic Modeling
- Advanced, 2D hydraulic analysis
- Sediment transport analysis
- Scour analysis

- **B.** Completion/furnishing 30% preliminary plans and construction cost estimate: 120 calendar days from date of written authorization to begin.
- **C.** Completion/furnishing 90% pre-final plans, specifications, bid quantities, and construction cost estimate: 150 calendar days from the date of receipt of Phase I 30% Town Comments.
- **D.** Completion/furnishing 100% final plans, specifications, bid quantities, and construction cost estimate: 60 calendar days from the date of receipt of Phase I 90% Town Comments and pending any required USACE plan review, permitting and approval.\*
- **E.** Bidding services: 60 calendar days from Town's approval of final plans.

- **F.** Construction services: In accordance with construction schedule (estimated to be 450 calendar days total)
- **G.** Closure: 60 calendar days from the date of construction completion.

### Phase II: Point Vista Road

- **A.** Completion of design surveys, SUE Level "B-D" and geotechnical investigation: 60 calendar days from completion of Phase I design surveys, SUE Level "B-D" and geotechnical investigation
- **B.** Completion/furnishing 30% preliminary plans and construction cost estimate: 120 calendar days from completion of Phase I design surveys, SUE Level "B-D" and geotechnical investigation
- **C.** Completion/furnishing 90% pre-final plans, specifications, bid quantities, and construction cost estimate: 90 calendar days from the date of receipt of Phase II 30% Town Comments.
- D. Completion/furnishing 100% final plans, specifications, bid quantities, and construction cost estimate: 45 calendar days from the date of receipt of Phase II 90% Town Comments and pending any required USACE plan review, permitting and approval.\*
- **E.** Bidding services: 60 calendar days from Town's approval of final plans.
- **F.** Construction services: In accordance with construction schedule (estimated to be 360 calendar days total)
- **G.** Closure: 60 calendar days from the date of construction completion.

<sup>\*</sup> Denotes task dependent upon action of Town or USACE. Delay in completion of these tasks, due to extended review times, delayed responses or otherwise, are not within Halff's control and will not be considered in assessment of liquidated damages per Article XVI of the contract.

Exhibit "B" defines the basis of compensation to the Professional for the services rendered.

A. Basic Fee Services (Project Management and Construction Plans) – The basic fee for the services as described in Exhibit "A" will be \$811,900 which includes printing, direct costs and computer charges normally associated with production of these services.

The basis of compensation for Basic Fee services shall be as follows:

- 1. \$253,000 for Phase I: South Hook Street and Garth Lane
- 2. \$71,600 for Phase I: Country Lane
- 3. \$177,700 for Phase I: Harbor Lane
- 4. \$186,000 for Phase II: Point Vista Road
- 5. \$123,600 for Bidding and Construction Phase Services

The basis of compensation for Items (1) through (4) will be lump sum, which will be billed monthly based on actual completion of the tasks and may include partial payments of the total amounts designated for each item.

Item 5. The Town will only be billed for this item based upon the amount of time and effort actually needed.

**B. Special Services** – The maximum not-to-exceed fee for special services as described in Attachment "A" will be **\$305,100.** The basis of compensation for special services shall be lump sum unless noted otherwise. The table below summarizes special services fees.

The total maximum fee for all services is \$1,117,000.00 (one million one hundred seventeen thousand dollars and zero cents). All fees shall be billed as lump sum with exception to the following:

Item 4. SUE Level A fee includes a maximum of ten (10) excavations completed times \$2,000 per each. The Town will be final billed based on the number of excavations completed with a minimum of two excavations.

Item 5. and 6. The Town will only be billed for the number of easement parcels produced.

Reimbursable costs include printing, deliveries, mileage and other direct costs associated with the project. Subcontract expenses and outside services shall be reimbursed at cost to Professional plus a markup of ten percent (10%).

### TOWN OF HICKORY CREEK, TEXAS RESOLUTION NO. 2023-0327-\_\_

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF HICKORY CREEK, TEXAS, APPROVING THE DENTON COUNTY HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, natural hazards in the Town of Hickory Creek area historically have caused significant disasters with losses of life and property and natural resources damage; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 and Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) require communities to adopt a hazard mitigation action plan to be eligible for the full range of pre-disaster and post-disaster federal funding for mitigation purposes; and

WHEREAS, FEMA requires that communities update hazard mitigation action plans every five years in order to be eligible for the full range of pre-disaster and post-disaster federal funding for mitigation purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Hickory Creek has assessed the community's potential risks and hazards and is committed to planning for a sustainable community and reducing the long-term consequences of natural and man-caused hazards; and

WHEREAS, the Denton County Hazard Mitigation Plan outlines a mitigation vision, goals and objectives; assesses risk from a range of hazards; and identifies risk reduction strategies and actions for hazards that threaten the community.

#### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Denton County Hazard Mitigation Plan is approved in its entirety;
- The Town of Hickory Creek will pursue available funding opportunities for implementation of the proposals designated therein, and will, upon receipt of such funding or other necessary resources, seek to implement the actions contained in the mitigation strategies;
- 3. The Town of Hickory Creek vests with the Mayor the responsibility, authority, and means to inform all parties of this action; assure that the Hazard Mitigation Plan will be reviewed at least annually; and that any needed adjustments will be presented to the Town Council for consideration; and
- 4. The Town of Hickory Creek to take such other action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the Plan and report on progress as required by FEMA and the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM).
