

On September 6, 2023, the Florida Elections Commission received the enclosed complaint alleging that you violated Florida's election laws. Section 106.25(2), Florida Statutes, states:

The respondent shall have 14 day *after receipt* of the complaint to file an initial response, and the executive director may not determine the legal sufficiency of the complaint during that time period.

Should you choose to file a response to the complaint, please send it to my attention at the address listed above. You may also send your response to my attention at fec@myfloridalegal.com. You will be notified by letter whether the complaint is determined to be legally sufficient.

Please note that all documents related to this matter will be mailed to the above address unless you notify us of a new address.

Pursuant to Section 106.25, Florida Statutes, complaints, investigations, investigative reports, and other documents relating to an alleged violation of Chapters 104 or 106, Florida Statutes, are confidential until the Commission finds probable cause or no probable cause, unless the Respondent files a written waiver of confidentiality with the Commission. The confidentiality provision does not apply to the Complainant or the Respondent.

Should you retain counsel, your attorney must file a notice of appearance with the Commission before any member of the Commission staff can discuss this case with him or her.

Subject: Formal Complaint Against Lisa Purvis, Town Clerk of Hilliard, Florida

Dear Members of the Florida Elections Commission,

I am writing to file a formal complaint against Lisa Purvis, the Town Clerk of Hilliard, Florida, regarding an incident that took place between May and June 2022. The details of the incident involve Ms. Purvis' alleged actions that may have violated fair and democratic election practices in the town.

During this period, I, Mary Godwin, contacted the Hilliard Town Hall at (904) 845-3555 to inquire about the leadership of the town and to gain information about the upcoming mayoral election. As an engaged citizen, I sought clarity about who oversaw the town and when the next election was scheduled for the position.

During this conversation, Ms. Purvis provided me with information that raised concerns about the transparency and fairness of the election process. Specifically, she mentioned that the town had a mayor and that 2022 was a reelection year for this position, even though the incumbent Mayor had decided not to run for reelection. When I inquired about the process to become a mayoral candidate, Ms. Purvis disclosed that the town had already selected a candidate and that this individual had been a member of the Town Council for over 20 years.

My concern was further amplified when Ms. Purvis indicated that the town did not require or desire additional candidates to run for the mayoral position, as they had already decided on a single candidate. This response raises serious questions about the integrity of the election process, as it appears that prospective candidates were not being given a fair opportunity to participate in the democratic selection of the town's leadership. No other candidates appeared on the ballot 2022. John P. Beasley ran uncontested.

Such actions, if true, undermine the principles of democracy and fair representation that are crucial to our electoral system. It is imperative that all eligible candidates have an equal chance to run for office and that voters can choose from a diverse pool of candidates during an election. This is our right.

I kindly request that the Florida Elections Commission conduct a thorough investigation into this matter. If the allegations are found to be substantiated, appropriate measures should be taken to rectify the situation, reverse all ordinances, tax increases and laws implemented due to election interference and ensure that future elections in Hilliard, Florida, are conducted in accordance with the principles of fairness, transparency, and equal opportunity. It is my desire that the town clerk be relieved of her duties, an interim mayor be placed during this process, and a new-fair election be run this year with no interference from members of the council or town clerk for all seats voted on during the 2022 elections.

Thank you for your attention to this matter. I trust that the Florida Elections Commission will take appropriate steps to address this complaint and uphold the democratic values that our nation holds dear.


