Subject: Whisper Ridge Hydrant test.

This morning the fire department did a coupe test on the new hydrants in Whisper Ridge to try and understand the concerns with the supply numbers that were given to the town. Just want to be clear that these test were done using apparatus gauges that have not been calibrated and several factors have to be considered. These include the facts that the tests were done about 9am on a weekday when school was out so they were done in probably the best case scenario as far as total town consumption and demand on the system.

The conducted the test using two different hydrants. We placed the first truck at hydrant #2 and connected to the hydrant. We found a static pressure of about 60-65 psi. The 2nd truck was placed at hydrant #8 at the back of Whisper Ridge. It was connected and the same static pressure was found. At this point truck #2 at hydrant #8 started flowing at 400-500 gallons a minute. This left a residual pressure of about 25-30 psi on hydrant #2. We then opened a truck discharge at hydrant #2 which was flowing between 100 and 150 gallons per minute. This dropped the residual pressure down to about 15-18 psi. At that point our supply hoses were soft and we were pulling maximum water from the system.

This very non scientific test tells us a couple things. It appears were can draw about 550 - 600 gallons a minute from the system in the best case scenario. From a firefighting standpoint this would support basic fire suppression. A more severe fire where suppression operations had to be sustained for a long period of time with high volumes of water would need additional tanker support and would put a strain on the system dropping it below safe psi's.

BACKGROUND:

TCA Electrical Contractors, Inc. were awarded the contract on June 17, 2021, for the R/W 18/36 Lighting Rehab Project, in the amount of \$307,025.00.

Federal funding appropriations provides stimulus funds to allow the FAA to fund 100% of this project.

TCA Electrical Contractors, Inc., Change Order No. 1, was approved on June 2, 2022, which resulted in a contract increase of \$11,650.00 and increase in contract time by 14 days due to unforeseen conflict of existing drainage piping and swales with the proposed new signage layout. This resulted in the total contract being \$\$31,675.00.

TCA Electrical Contractors, Inc. Change Order No. 2, final reconciliation of installed quantities. Results in a decrease of \$15,534.00, this resulted in the final total contract being \$303,141.00.

Hilliard Airpark is in the northern region of Florida, in the Town of Hilliard in Nassau County. The Airpark is approximately 8 miles from the Florida-Georgia state line. The project includes new MIRL LED edge and threshold/end light fixtures, new REILs at each end of the runway, a new 2 box PAPI system on each end, a new LED wind cone and a segmented circle. The project also includes a replacement regulator in the vault with new, more efficient equipment. Where possible, existing light bases were reused. Lights remained in the same location from runway edge.

AECOM designed the project and performed construction administration and Resident Inspection services. TCA Electrical Contractors, Inc. was awarded the construction contract on August 5, 2021 in the bid amount of \$307,025.00. Change Order One was executed on June 3, 2022 and increased the Contract Sum to \$318,675.00.

Change Order Two (FINAL) is being presented to the Town of Hilliard approval of a \$15,534.00 decrease to the original Contract amount. The revised contract amount is \$303,141.00, an overall decrease of 5% from the awarded contract value.

Below is a list of the items that make up Change Order Two.

Replace Runway 18-36 Edge Lighting, Signs, REILs, Wind Cone and PAPIs:

1. Various quantity decreases to account for actual installed quantities (electrical cable, conduit and counterpoise, electrical base cans, and electrical ducts).

These changes resolve all claims and issues regarding these items. There will be no further compensation in either time or money related to these issues. No liquidated damages are being assessed on the project.



I am writing to you on behalf of Waugh PLLC, attorneys for the Town of Hilliard, Florida. The Town has asked us to step in and facilitate discussions surrounding the Whisper Ridge community development project.

Our understanding is that there are serious concerns with the fire hydrant pressure levels. These concerns, primarily raised by the Public Works Director, Mr. Richie Rowe, indicate that the current pressure levels of the fire hydrants do not meet the necessary standards. This is an issue of utmost importance, as it directly pertains to the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the community.

We kindly request that all parties involved, especially the town and development engineers, refrain from insisting Mr. Rowe to sign off on the engineering until these issues are fully resolved. Certificates of occupancy are reliant on the fulfillment of these standards, and the Town is legally obligated to ensure that these are met.

While we stand by the assessment that the current pressure levels do not meet the Town's standards, we are fully committed to working with all parties involved to find a solution. As such, the Town is open to conducting further testing, assessments, and potential reconstruction to address these concerns. Moving forward, we would recommend including the Fire Marshal, Mr. Butch Williams, in these discussions.

It is our understanding that the Town will issue permits for the construction of three model homes for the Whisper Ridge community. This decision was based on the Fire Marshal's belief that the current hydrant pressure levels are sufficient for these particular structures. However, this should not be seen as an acceptance of the current overall situation.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation, we look forward to working closely with each of you. Please reach out to our office with any questions or concerns.

Town of Hilliard:

As a follow up to our Whisper Ridge Teams Meeting on Wednesday regarding the concerns with the fire hydrants and associated pressures, we propose the following solutions for the short-term:

- 1. Have the developer remove the fire hydrants and deliver to the Town of Hilliard for future installation/use when adequate pressure/fire flow is available.
 - a. This would eliminate the concerns with significant pressure drops in Whisper Ridge, at FAA, and into Town and the need for boil water notices if a hydrant was opened.
 - b. 2" Flushing Hydrants are installed at the dead ends which would allow the Town to perform periodic flushing without significantly decreasing system pressures.
 - c. The downside is that no hydrant would be available for use in the event of a fire in Whisper Ridge.
- 2. Paint the fire hydrants in coordination with Fire Depts identifying all hydrants that cannot meet fire flow and/or require a boil water notice to be issued if opened.
 - a. Alternatively, can cover / bag the fire hydrants with an "out of service" or "Not in Service" notice.

In addition, as we've mentioned in recent correspondence, the following items should be addressed prior to any FDEP Certification of Completion submittal and the Town taking ownership of the system:

- Water Main Pressure Test Results
 - Test results list Public Pipe Segment as 12" Diam, and Private Pipe Segment as 10" Diam. It's our understanding all water mains will be turned over/dedicated to the Town upon completion and acceptance of the Work. It's also our understanding the larger diameter water main installed as part of this project was 8", with no 10" or 12" proposed. Clarify the differentiation between these segments and the size discrepancy. Revise or update as needed.
 - Verify with Richie or PW that they witnessed pressure test and are in agreement;
- Bacteriological Test Results
 - The submitted Bac-T results passed, although FDEP will consider these results unacceptable if the samples were taken more than 60 days prior. If these have not already been submitted to FDEP, they will have to re-sample
- 5/17/23 Fire Hydrant Flow Tests (see attached 5/31 email)
 - Developer and WW Gay should provide updated/correct fire flow test results, as the provided results were the exact same for each hydrant.
 - Recommend performing additional flow tests upstream to determine static and residual
 pressures at FAA at CR 108 and into town at FH #8 on Mill. It would be beneficial to know if the
 Town's system can maintain adequate pressure if the FH at FAA is opened, or if the FH at FAA is
 capable of providing adequate fire flow, independent of Whisper Ridge.

Long-term, the Town may want to consider and/or pursue the following options:

- Upsizing and looping the distribution system in this area (and other critical areas) as needed. This was
 discussed as a long-term solution early on when this project was in the design stages, and was more
 recently discussed during the Development Investigation Request for the proposed Kings Crossing
 development (see attached 4/4 email).
- 2. The installation of an in-line booster pump station closer to Town (Town side of the creek) which could improve/boost pressures downstream on CR 108 and Kings Ferry Road where development is occurring.
- 3. Town can also consider additional / upgraded Water Storage and Pumping Facilities to further improve capacities.

These could be pursued by the Town or in collaboration with the developers.

Please let us know if we can provide any additional information to assist on this matter.
