BACKGROUND:

This is a capital item that has been budgeted for 2022-2023. The current P&R Truck is the oldest in the town fleet. Currently the P&R Director uses his personal vehicle to make trips to pick up supplies or materials when they are needed outside of the Hilliard / Callahan area.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

This is a budgeted capital item for the Parks & Recreation Department. This is a significant expenditure but is budged and needed. This truck was quoted via state contract.

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve purchase of truck from Alan Jay Fleet Sales in the amount of \$36,270. This budget is over forecasted amount. Justification for purchase is due to the need of the department and expected cost savings of capital funds not expected to be expended this budget cycle.
