## 2023 Legislative, Strategic, & Capital Priorities

- ✓ <u>Water & sewer affordability and system maintenance needs</u>. Assistance for water and sewer infrastructure upgrades and repairs, capital needs is a top priority, especially since this is a major equity issue.
  - The Town has \$40 million in just wastewater collection system needs, much of which needs to be installed in the next few years.
  - As rates increase to address aging infrastructure and system reliability, these actions have a
    disproportionate impact on those in our community struggling the most to pay for life's essentials, such
    as those on fixed, and low to moderate incomes.
  - Many parts of Hillsborough's water and sewer system are over 50 years old with some closer to 100 years old. For example, the Hassell Street water tank is over 90 years old and still in service. Replacing this one tank alone will cost approximately \$3.5 million.
- ✓ <u>Affordable housing</u>. The Town is doing what it can within our resource limitations (moving towards a two cents equivalent of property tax yield) to assist with homeless prevention and affordability but need assistance from the State.
- ✓ <u>Transportation and connectivity</u>. Funding assistance with bike, pedestrian, public transportation, roadways, and integrating them to build a coordinated multi-modal system. The train station, future projects, such as Ridgewalk (north to south bike/ped connector), EV stations, and other projects in the planning stages have the opportunity to be transformative for our community.
- ✓ Environmental sustainability and meeting carbon reduction goals. In addition to meeting the Town's aggressive carbon reduction goals, sustainability covers encouraging development that protects limited water and sewer availability, water quality through the stormwater management program, and guiding development through plans that help address these and other environment priorities.
- ✓ <u>Local government pre-emption</u>. Please keep an eye on potential legislation that would local government authority in all areas (e.g., planning and development related). This is particularly important to Hillsborough as a local government that has our own W/S utility with limited capacity.
- ✓ <u>Statewide shortage of qualified individuals to serve as finance directors, technical accounting and finance staff, and auditing firms</u>. The shortage of local government staff and accounting firms with resources to perform annual audits has become a crisis. Approximately 25% of local governments have found themselves on the State Treasurer's and Local Government Commission Unit Assistance List. This is often due to staff shortage and inabilities to get the annual audit and other key reports completed in a timely manner.

## **Summary:**

In response to concerns from downtown businesses regarding parking availability, staff will provide an update to the board and public on recent and planned future activities.

<u>Downtown/West Hillsborough Business Owners Meeting (Jan. 22)</u> – staff and Mayor Bell heard various perspectives from business owners regarding parking experiences.

Notable comments included:

- Concern over the sustained parking of construction vehicles in on-street spaces
- Lack of lighting in the alley parking lot between King and Margaret, general safety concerns for late night staff
- Frustration with the availability of lower-level parking in the county garage (specifically on court days)
- Ready availability of accessible parking for mobility-limited people

## Specific follow-up actions include:

- Creation of temporary "construction parking" spaces in the town-owned alley lot
- Ordering of additional lighting for that lot as a pathway between the parking deck and the King Street area
- Staff will explore the question of individual rental of lower-level spaces in the county deck as requested
- Staff will work with communications on additional education of available parking, time limitations and alternative transportation choices

## Ideas that need further exploration:

- Is the current 3-hour limit suitable, does it need to be reduced?
- What level of enforcement is desired by the community and what can the town effectively provide?
- Is there an appetite for more paid parking options, such as metered spaces? (This was brought up at the meeting but received generally negative feedback).
- Is it possible to increase police presence at night to address safety concerns for staff and customers walking to further parking areas?
- Potential of a shuttle to and from the parking deck?
- Additional bike parking availability?

## **Upcoming Parking Study**

Town staff is working towards advertisement for a consultant to engage in a comprehensive parking study covering downtown and the West Hillsborough business areas. The study is intended to provide data on current parking inventory, trends in public parking, strategies for event parking, options for accessible parking and potential options for additional parking if needed. Staff is exploring options for technical assistance from Durham-Chapel Hill-Carrboro Metropolitan Planning Organization (DCHCMPO) staff on procurement and administration of funding for the project, which could be a significant relief for town staff.

## **Financial impacts:**

Minimal cost for signage fabrication and installation so far. Depending on the board's interest in specific enforcement or other activities, there may be additional costs. The parking study is funded jointly by the town, Tourism Board, Tourism Development Authority and DCHCMPO and is already budgeted.

## **Summary:**

In response to resident concerns regarding behavior at the Margaret Lane Cemetery and overall concerns with increased off-leash dogs and uncollected pet waste, staff has prepared an update on current and upcoming activities and will solicit feedback from the board. A summary of the current information is below.

- Work is underway to place updated rules signs at all three cemeteries (see attached images).
- There is an active "poop fairy" campaign including signage (attached), WHUP interviews and press releases to address the town wide issue of pet waste. There was a WHUP interview that covered both topics on Feb. 16
- A new leash sign will be rotated in identified problem areas (see attachment).
- There are not currently specific regulations in the town code regarding cemetery behavior, which limits enforcement options.
- Cemeteries have historically been used for socializing and passive recreation, and there are differing schools of thought in the recreation profession as to the appropriate level of activity.
- Leash laws are governed by Orange County, with no enforcement that town staff is aware of.
- Uncollected pet waste is a source of nonpoint pollution for our waterways and a concern for stormwater and environmental services.
- Staff will continue to provide community information via public space and stormwater related press releases, social media and other outlets, including an upcoming community newsletter.

## **Financial impacts:**

Minimal cost for signage fabrication and installation. If the board desires other active enforcement, there will be additional costs.
