VILLAGE OF HOMEWOOD BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING TUESDAY, DECEMBER 10, 2024 VILLAGE HALL BOARD ROOM

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: President Hofeld called the meeting of the Board of Trustees to order at 7:05 p.m.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: President Hofeld led trustees in the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>ROLL CALL</u>: Clerk Marilyn Thomas called the roll. Those present were Village President Richard Hofeld, Trustee Julie Willis, Trustee Vivian Harris-Jones, Trustee Jay Heiferman, Trustee Phillip Mason, Trustee Lauren Roman and Trustee Allisa Opyd.

President Hofeld introduced staff present: Village Manager Napoleon Haney, Village Attorney Chris Cummings, Director of Economic and Community Development Angela Mesaros, Fire Chief Bob Grabowski, Police Chief Denise McGrath, Director of Public Works Josh Burman, Director of Finance Amy Zukowski, Assistant Finance Director Lyndsay Cabay, Assistant Director of Economic and Community Development Noah Schumerth, IT Manager Rich Wachowski, Communications and Engagement Manager Antonia Steinmiller and Assistant Village Manager Terence Acquah.

<u>MINUTES</u>: The minutes of November 26, 2024, were presented. There were no comments or corrections.

A motion was made by Trustee Willis and seconded by Trustee Opyd to approve the minutes as presented.

<u>Roll Call</u>: AYES --Trustees Willis, Harris-Jones, Heiferman, Mason, Roman and Opyd. NAYS – None.

<u>CLAIMS LIST</u>: The Claims List in the amount of \$501,726.89 was presented. There were no questions from the Trustees.

A motion was made by Trustee Mason and seconded by Trustee Harris-Jones to approve the Claims List as presented.

President Hofeld said two items totaled 61 percent of the Claims List: \$260,256.17 for December employee health insurance and \$46,623.80 to M&J Asphalt Paving Co. Inc. for repaying the parking lot at the Homewood Science Center.

<u>Roll Call</u>: AYES --Trustees Willis, Harris-Jones, Heiferman, Mason, Roman and Opyd. NAYS – None. Motion carried.

<u>HEAR FROM THE AUDIENCE</u>: Resident Amy Crump thanked the Village Board for an outstanding Holiday Lights opening to the holiday season and the reopening of the Harwood Avenue METRA Train Station. She thanked the Village for reinstalling the Little Free Library at the station.

Resident Robert Miller asked what benefit the Village would be receiving from Wind Creek Chicago Southland Casino. President Hofeld said the inter-governmental agreement splits proceeds 45 percent to Homewood and 55 percent to Hazel Crest. The first four years both villages will pay 50 percent of the revenue into a foundation Wind Creek established that will benefit health care needs and train students in the health care field. After that, the revenue will go directly to the Village. President Hofeld anticipates the village also will recoup a portion of the sales taxes and places for eating tax.

Liz Varmecky argued the pollution at the Izaak Walton pond is continuing and initial testing showed a carcinogen at the discharge site. The Village is required to monitor discharge, according to its permit. She believes the Village is not doing this and argues the discharge must be stopped.

Manager Haney gave an update. He said the Village was close to a contract on testing. He expected the testing by mid-January. The cost of a previous study of \$6,880 is being split with Izaak Walton's board. He acknowledged that the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency moves slowly on its review.

Patrick McAneney asked if the Board was aware of issues that arose when the Thornton Township Democratic Committee's meeting needed police on-site. President Hofeld said Sen. Napoleon Harris asked to use the auditorium and said security would be provided.

Mr. McAneney also asked about the development of the village parking lot site. He asked if the Village would wait to see how the current Hartford Building's uses are affecting the area. McAneney pointed out that previous plans for development at that location failed. President Hofeld said this proposed development is rental units and he does not anticipate any issues.

<u>OMNIBUS VOTE</u>: The board was asked to pass, approve, authorize, accept, or award the following item(s):

President Hofeld invited Joaquin Anguiano to come and present to the board what his \$2 million investment for a Mexican restaurant will be (Items D-E-F). He said the restaurant will feature the flavors and culture of Mexico. He already has a restaurant in Chicago. The Homewood project will begin in spring.

Trustees thanked Mr. Anguiano for coming to Homewood. Trustee Opyd asked if there would be outdoor seating. Mr. Anguiano said he will have outdoor seating and parking.

A motion was made by Trustee Roman and seconded by Trustee Mason to approve the Omnibus Report as presented.

<u>Roll Call</u>: AYES --Trustees Willis, Harris-Jones, Heiferman, Mason, Roman and Opyd. NAYS – None. Motion carried.

<u>NEW BUSINESS: WATER RATE STUDY</u>: Manager Haney introduced the report on the Water Rate Study. He said the fund runs as a business enterprise, meaning it is expected to raise the money to cover its expenses. The study is meant to address what revenues will be needed to support costs of capital, personnel and operations. The Village is facing the unfunded federal mandate of removing water lead lines in the not too distant future and the water fund will need to over the expense.

Finance Manager Zukowski said the Board approved a water rate study in May. The last was done 15 years ago. Village funds are not used to cover costs of the water fund. She introduced David Naumann of Burns & McDonnell who is conducting the study. He gave a review of his work to date.

Mr. Naumann focuses on water/sewer financial planning at Burns & McDonnell. The study will be a financial road map: 1) Financial planning, 2) Cost of service, 3) Rate designs. This study is designed for understanding revenue efficiency. Another goal is looking for ways to price the service.

Funding lead service line removal is a project to be completed by 2034 and will cost an estimated \$76 million in Homewood, in addition to other water/sewer capital costs. IEPA offers low interest loans based on demographics of the community. Cook County and the federal government are offering some ways to cover costs. Non-home rule sales tax is a possibility, too.

Mr. Naumann and his team will provide rate design and pricing structures, and a written report. His next visit will be to present scenarios for the Village Board to review.

President Hofeld said the Village will come up with the best alternative relating to the lead lines. Trustee Mason asked if other communities have done lead line replacement, but Mr. Naumann said most are doing inventory assessments to judge what needs to be done. Trustee Roman said replacing lead lines is necessary, despite the high cost. She wondered what EPA loans Homewood can take advantage of. Manager Haney said Homewood is not considered a depressed community so outside federal funding will be limited.

<u>FIVE-YEAR CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN</u>: Director Zukowski said in April 2024 the first 5-year plan was presented. Since then, staff has identified additional needs. Financing and timing for capital improvements is ongoing.

The Village's biggest challenge is the funding source, which is limited. The Board has been using limited liability General Obligation Bonds and reserve funds and grants. Current capital plans reflect \$61 million in projects with just \$3.6 million available in general capital revenues. The first year of the plan (2025-26) has \$14 million in capital needs. Director Zukowski said it is going to be necessary soon to consider other funding sources. For now, she recommends the Board approve the transfer from the reserve fund to the capital projects fund of \$2.3 million.

She said the Village will need multiple funding sources for the \$76 million lead line removal project.

Trustees congratulated staff on the work putting the plan together. It is giving the Village Board needed information for planning purposes. President Hofeld said casino revenue may help offset some capital needs.

A motion was made by Trustee Roman and seconded by Trustee Mason to approve the transfer of one month of operating expenses in the amount of \$2,300,000 from the General Fund unassigned fund balance (Fund 01) to the Capital Projects Fund (Fund 37).

<u>Roll Call</u>: AYES --Trustees Willis, Harris-Jones, Heiferman, Mason, Roman and Opyd. NAYS – None. Motion carried.

<u>GENERAL BOARD DISCUSSION</u>: Trustees congratulated staff on a successful Holiday Lights party and wished everyone a happy holiday season. President Hofeld said the Village gave 42 new business licenses in 2024, including Stoney Point Grill, the Ridgewood, Homewood Brewing, Wind Creek casino and Ollie's. Improvements also were made to Starbuck's on Harwood and Cherry Creek in its new location in Cherry Creek Plaza as well as Blue Pearl Candles.

<u>ADJOURN:</u> A motion was made by Trustee Harris-Jones and seconded by Trustee Willis to adjourn the regular meeting of the Board of Trustees.

The meeting adjourned at 8 p.m.

VILLAGE OF HOMEWOOD TRUTH IN TAXATION HEARING TUESDAY, DECEMBER 10, 2024 VILLAGE HALL BOARD ROOM

CALL TO ORDER: President Hofeld called the Truth in Taxation meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

<u>ROLL CALL</u>: Clerk Marilyn Thomas called the roll. Those present were Village President Richard Hofeld, Trustee Julie Willis, Trustee Vivian Harris-Jones, Trustee Jay Heiferman, Trustee Phillip Mason, Trustee Lauren Roman and Trustee Allisa Opyd.

Finance Director Amy Zukowski said that under Illinois' Property Tax Extension Limitation Law (PTELL), the Village of Homewood was required to hold a Truth in Taxation hearing to notify the public that the proposed levy would be greater than the Consumer Price Index (CPI). Director of Finance Amy Zukowski shared information with the Village Board and those present on the Village's funding through the 2024 levy.

Director Zukowski said the Village's 2024 increase over the previous year was 3.35 percent for CPI and 1.5% for new construction. The Village's total tax levy subject to PTELL is \$7,066,009. Approximately 56%, or \$4M, of the total tax levy will go towards all pension obligations, including Police Pension, Fire Pension, and the Illinois Municipal Retirement Fund. Of the \$4M allocated to pensions, 87% or approximately \$3.5M goes exclusively towards Police and Fire Pension obligations. The police and fire pension payments meet the state funding requirements.

The remaining \$3 million from the property tax levy not assigned to pensions goes towards all other operational items, including FICA (Employer Social Security and Medicare payments).

She said the Village is limited by state statute on what it can assess for corporate fund, police, fire, crossing guards, street and bridge.

Social Security and Medicare are not limited, but funding must be enough to cover costs. Audit and risk management also have no rate limit. The Village can levy for debt obligations. Those funds are not part of PTELL.

The Village sold \$2.6 million in General Obligation bonds in November to fund capital projects. Interest and debt on the bonds will be divided into four payments. This levy records the first debt repayment of \$746,688.

The final levy is \$7.8 million reflecting an increase of 13.62 percent; most of the increase is for debt service. The Village's final 2024 levy would have increased 4.8 percent if debt service is excluded.

The Village published notice of the Truth in Taxation hearing November 29, 2024 in the Daily Southtown newspaper.

Director Zukowski said that with the additional debt service, the Village's part of the total tax bill may go up from 10 percent to 11 percent of the total bill.

During public comment, Resident Liz Varmecky asked how the end of the Southgate TIF was allowing for additional taxes. Director Zukowski explained that explanation of the TIF does not

increase property taxes. During the TIF, the taxes collected for property in the TIF is deposited in as special fund administered by the village for infrastructure improvements, development, etc. With the end of the TIF, those taxes previously diverted to the TIF will be distributed to the Village and the other taxing districts.

Village Attorney Chris Cummings explained that the Southgate property tax rate was frozen 23 years ago. With the expiration of the TIF, the Village's tax portion goes back to the general fund. The move is not raising taxes but reallocating the taxes. When the TIF was created, it froze the base assessed valuation for what the property was worth. Over the 23 years, as the property values increased, the taxes raised through the increased valuation have gone into the TIF.

Before the TIF ending, the Village couldn't gain the increased value (for tax purposes). That property, for tax purposes, is now classified as new property because the parcels will register as new assessments.

Director Zukowski said the other taxing bodies – schools, parks, library – are notified that the TIF is expiring so they can capture the new assessments.

Ms. Varmecky asks why the Village is increasing taxes, but Attorney Cummings explained to her that there is no immediate tax increase, simply a reallocation of property taxes that previously were paid into the TIF.

Village Manager Napoleon Haney said he or staff would gladly sit down with Ms. Varmecky to offer her information on TIF funding.

Resident Robert Miller asked what the 13% increase will mean to his property taxes. Director Zukowski said the overall impact for taxpayers will be one percent from 10 percent to 11 percent.

Mayor Hofeld said on the 2023 levy the Village had zero debt, so the levy was lower.

Trustee Opyd said the tax levy is confusing to residents. She appreciated that the Village's increase will be small, compared to what people have been through with Cook County's recent property reassessments.

A motion was made by Trustee Heiferman and seconded by Trustee Roman to close the Truth in Taxation meeting.

PURPOSE

Administer the oath of office to Officer Luis Acosta, Officer Seth Bell, Officer Anthony Burton, and Officer Kenneth Norbut for the position of Police Officer.

PROCESS

Luis Acosta, Seth Bell, and Anthony Burton applied for the position of Police Officer through the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners' Police Officer Entry Level process. Through that process, the Board of Fire and Police Commission met on June 28, 2024 to consider issuing conditional offers of employment following a review of background reports. The Commissioners voted unanimously in favor of extending offers of conditional employment, which were contingent upon successful completion of polygraph, psychological, and medical exams.

Officer Acosta, Officer Bell, and Officer Burton successfully completed all exams and subsequently attended the Cook County Sheriff's Basic Law Enforcement Police Training Academy which began on August 26, 2024. All three (3) officers graduated from the academy on December 12, 2024 and entered the Homewood Police Department Field Training Program.

Officer Norbut applied for the position of Police Officer through the Board of Fire and Police Commissioners' Police Officer Lateral Application process. Lateral candidates are required to be State-certified Police Officers with a minimum of two (2) years at their current agency. The Board of Fire and Police Commissioners met on November 5, 2024 to consider issuing a conditional offer of employment following a review of background reports. The Commissioners voted unanimously in favor of extending an offer of conditional employment, which was contingent upon successful completion of polygraph, psychological, and medical exams.

Officer Norbut successfully completed all pre-employment testing and was hired as a full-time Police Officer effective December 14, 2024. Since Officer Norbut holds State certification and has already attended the police academy, he immediately began the Homewood Police Department Field Training Program.



Backgrounds

Officer Acosta attended South Shore International College Prep High School Youth Connection Leadership Academy and graduated in 2019. He served in the Marine Corps from April 2019 to September 2019 as a Mortar Man and later served in the Marine Corp Reserves. He has been previously employed as a drive and dock employee and U.S. Mail Carrier.

Officer Bell attended Momence High School and graduated in 2020. He attended Kankakee Community College and holds an Associate degree in Applied Science and Criminal Justice, which was awarded in May 2023. He was previously employed by the Kankakee County Sheriff's Department as a correctional officer.

Officer Burton attended Rich Central High School and graduated in 2017. He attended Emporia State University from 2017 to 2021 and holds a Bachelor of Science in Business. He has previously been employed as a maintenance worker, hiring/field supervisor, operations supervisor, and substitute teacher.

Officer Norbut attended H.L. Richards High School in Oak Lawn and graduated in 1992. He previously held certification as an EMT-A and is a nationally certified instructor for Commercial Motor Vehicle Interdiction. Officer Norbut has served as a police officer since 1994, initially as a part-time officer for the Calumet Park Police Department and later the Posen Police Department. In 1995, he was hired by East Hazel Crest Police Department as a full-time officer and in 1999 was hired by the Chicago Ridge Police Department. During his employment with Chicago Ridge, he served as a patrol officer, corporal, K9 handler, K9 coordinator, and was assigned to the Illinois State Police Narcotics and Currency Interdiction Team. Officer Norbut holds certifications for Evidence Technician, Crisis Intervention, Juvenile Specialist, and Basic SWAT.

3. Accomplishments:

- The Arbor Day Art Bag Program received a smaller response from local schools participating. The topic was "Tree Houses Rock". We have begun discussions of changing or replacing the program.
- Three memorial tree plantings were organized for Todd Beale (son-in-law for long time committee member Regina Zohfeld, who passed from cancer), Glenn Merritt (serving on the Homewood Planning Commission for 10 years and District 153 Board of Education for 17 years, 14 as President), and Jim Wright (Serving on the Homewood Fire Department for 22 years, Village Board Trustee for 4 years and Homewood Historical Society since 1983). Additionally, Jim donated significantly to the Village's reforestation effort.
- The Village was awarded Bird City Illinois status as a result of collaborative efforts of the Tree Committee, Homewood Izaak Walton Preserve and Thorn Creek Audubon Society. The second event celebrating World Migratory Bird Day was held in May.
- The Green Thumb Saturday program had many talented speakers, and it was well attended. The committee's third and fourth tree tour was completed as part of the program, highlighting parkway tree plantings and diversity. An outline platform has been developed for self-guided tours of the highlighted trees as well as additional future tree tours. We are very please do have this resource available to showcase the Village's urban forest diversity.
- The committee assisted with the Open Lands Tree Planting on September 14th.
- TreeShare and Arbor Day tree planting resumed after postponement due to the spring 2024 emergence of cicada brood XIII, to mitigate potential damage. We were at the Farmers Market and Public Works Open House providing public outreach regarding the cicada issue in the spring.
- The committee planted an oak tree at the Rail Park in celebration of Oaktober.
- Tree tags for the Homewood Arboretum tree inventory were adjusted to compensate for tree growth.

Topic: Tobacco License Request

PURPOSE

The Village received an application from Hare Krishna Ventures Inc., d/b/a 7-Eleven #30120A for a Class 1 tobacco retailer license for the location of 3154 183rd Street. A Class 1 tobacco license authorizes a business to conduct ancillary tobacco sales. The issuance of a tobacco license requires Board approval.

PROCESS

The 7-Eleven store located at 3154 183rd Street is in the process of changing owners. The current owners have held a tobacco license for many years.

When the current owners surrender their tobacco license, the allowed number of tobacco licensees automatically decreases; therefore, an increase to the allowed number of tobacco licenses is required for the new owners. The tobacco commissioner supports issuing a tobacco license to Hare Krishna Ventures Inc.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 4 OF THE HOMEWOOD MUNICIPAL CODE CONCERNING LICENSING AND REGULATION OF TOBACCO SALES WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF HOMEWOOD.

WHEREAS, section 4-234 of the Homewood Municipal Code restricts the number of tobacco licenses issued in the Village;

WHEREAS, the new owner of the business at 3154 183rd Street has applied for a Class 1 tobacco retailer license for an existing convenience store and vehicle fuel establishment;

WHEREAS, the number of available Class 1 tobacco licenses automatically decreased by one when the business ownership changed;

WHEREAS, the Tobacco Commissioner is in favor of increasing the allowed number of Class 1 tobacco retailer licenses to accommodate this request;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Homewood, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE - AMENDMENT TO THE HOMEWOOD MUNICIPAL CODE:

Section 4-234(b) of the Homewood Municipal Code is amended to increase the number of Class 1 tobacco retailer licenses by one.

Topic: Ordinance Proposing Designation of Harwood TOD TIF District

PURPOSE

The Village has engaged Ryan LLC (formerly Kane, McKenna, and Associates, Inc.) to establish a new tax increment financing (TIF) district – the Harwood TOD TIF District for the properties from Harwood Avenue east to Dixie Highway and Ridge Road north to the Dixie Highway viaduct.

The TIF Act requires that the Municipality convene a joint review board and conduct a public hearing before the adoption of a redevelopment plan and project, designating the redevelopment project area and adopting tax increment allocation financing. Any interested person or affected taxing district may file written objections and may be heard regarding the Redevelopment Plan and Project.

The Joint Review Board meeting is scheduled for January 29, 2025, at 2:00 p.m. and the public hearing is scheduled for March 11, 2025, at 7:00 p.m. at the Homewood Village Hall.

PROCESS

On September 10, 2024, the Village approved a contract with Ryan LLC to study removing approximately thirty parcels from the existing Downtown TOD TIF district to create the new TIF. The new TIF district could provide increment funds for future development initiatives and public improvements including the following projects:

- The Village Hall Parking Lot (2024 Chestnut Road). In July 2023, the Village approved a Letter of Intent with HCF Homewood II, to take steps toward developing a multiple-family residential building on the Village's parking lot. The proposed TIF will assist with available incentives for this development.
- The northeast corner of Ridge Road and Harwood Avenue, 2052-2066 Ridge Road and 18027 Harwood Avenue (Matrix Building), is a Village-owned property identified for transit-oriented redevelopment.
- Improvements to the Village-owned Harwood Commuter Parking Lot would qualify for TIF funds.

- St. John Neumann Parish's empty school building has potential for re-occupation or redevelopment.
- Village-owned property at 17900 Dixie Highway (former library).
- Village Hall campus area (Village Hall, Auditorium, Police Department, and Fire Department).

Ryan LLC has conducted an eligibility survey of the Redevelopment Project Area and has prepared its report which states that the proposed area qualifies as a "redevelopment project area" as defined in the TIF Act. On December 10, 2024, the Village Board passed a resolution announcing the availability of the TIF eligibility report and redevelopment plan. The survey and findings are on file and available for the public to view at the Village Hall as required under the TIF Act.

OUTCOME

The TIF District would provide funds for properties near the Metra station, consistent with the Village's transit-oriented development plan approved in 2024. The redevelopment and revitalization of downtown will benefit the community through increased walkability, new housing options, and property tax revenue.

ORDINANCE <u>M - 2330</u>

AN ORDINANCE of the Village of Homewood, Cook County, Illinois, proposing the designation of a Redevelopment Plan and Project for the designation of the Harwood TOD TIF Redevelopment Project Area Plan, the designation of the Harwood TOD TIF Redevelopment Project Area, and the adoption of tax increment allocation financing therefor, convening a joint review board and calling a public hearing in connection therewith.

under the Tax Whereas, Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act (65 ILCS 5/11-74.4 et seq.), as supplemented and amended (the "TIF Act"), the President and Board of Trustees (the "Corporate Authorities") of the Village of Homewood, Cook County, Illinois (the "Municipality"), have heretofore determined and do determine that it is advisable and in the best interests of the Municipality and certain affected taxing districts that the Municipality designate a proposed redevelopment plan (the "*Redevelopment Plan*") and project (the "*Project*") and designate the redevelopment project area known as the Harwood TOD TIF Redevelopment Project Area (the "Redevelopment *Project Area*") as further described in EXHIBIT A attached and that the Municipality adopt tax increment allocation financing for the Redevelopment Project Area; and

Whereas, under Section 11-74.4-4.2 of the TIF Act, the Municipality must create an interested parties registry for activities related to the Redevelopment Project Area, adopt reasonable registration rules, and prescribe requisite registration forms for residents and organizations active within the Municipality that seek to be placed on said interested parties registry, and the Corporate Authorities have heretofore, and it hereby expressly is, determined that the Municipality has created such registry, adopted such registration rules and prescribed such registration forms and gave public notice thereof, on October 28, 2008 by passage of Ordinance M-1767; and

Whereas, the TIF Act requires the Municipality also to convene a joint review board and conduct a public hearing before the adoption of ordinances designating a redevelopment plan and project, designating the redevelopment project area, and adopting tax increment allocation financing therefor, at which public hearing any interested person or affected taxing district may file with the Village Clerk written objections to and may be heard orally regarding the Redevelopment Plan and Project; and

Whereas, the TIF Act further requires that such joint review board consist of a representative selected by each community college district, local elementary school district and high school district or each local community unit school district, park district, library district, township, fire protection district and county having authority to directly levy taxes on the property within the Redevelopment Project Area when the Redevelopment Project Area is approved, a representative selected by the Municipality, and a public member, to consider the subject of the public hearing; and

Whereas, the TIF Act further requires that the time and place of such public hearing be fixed by ordinance or resolution adopted by the Corporate Authorities; and

Whereas, the TIF Act further requires that not less than 10 days before adopting such ordinance or resolution fixing the time and place of a public hearing, the Municipality must make available for public inspection the redevelopment plan or a separate report that provides in reasonable detail the basis for the proposed designation of the Redevelopment Project Area's qualifying as a "redevelopment project area" under the Act; and

Whereas, the firm of Ryan LLC has conducted an eligibility survey of the Redevelopment Project Area and has prepared its report (the "*Report*") concluding that the

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proposed area qualifies as a "redevelopment project area" as defined in the TIF Act, which survey and findings have been presented to the Corporate Authorities and are now on file in the official files and records of the Municipality; and

Whereas, the Report has heretofore been on file and available for public inspection for at least 10 days in the offices of the Village Clerk as required under the TIF Act; and

Whereas, the TIF Act requires that notice of the public hearing be given by publication and mailing; and

Whereas, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is advisable to convene a joint review board and hold a public hearing to consider the proposed approval of the proposed Plan and Project; and

Whereas, the Corporate Authorities have determined that the Redevelopment Plan and Project will not displace residents from 10 or more inhabited residential units.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Homewood, Cook County, Illinois:

Section 1. Redevelopment Plan and Project. Approval of the Redevelopment Plan and Project, the Redevelopment Project Area, and the adoption of tax increment allocation financing therefor is proposed.

Section 2. Interested Persons Registry Created. On October 28, 2008 by Ordinance M-1767 the Village Board directed that an interested persons registry (the "Registry") be established for every existing or future Redevelopment Project Area within the Village. The Village Clerk is authorized and directed to maintain the Registry for the Harwood TOD TIF Redevelopment Project Area.

Section 3. Registration Rules and Forms. The registration rules for the Registry have been approved by the Village in Ordinance M-1767 and are available from the Village Clerk.

Section 4. Joint Review Board Convened. A joint review board as set forth in the TIF Act is convened and the board shall meet, review such documents, and issue such report as set forth in the TIF Act. The first meeting of the joint review board shall be held at **2:00 p.m. on January 29, 2025**, at the Homewood Village Hall, 2020 Chestnut Rd., Homewood, Illinois. The Municipality expressly finds and determines that said date is at least 14 days but not more than 28 days after the notice to affected taxing districts authorized in Section 7 of this ordinance will be mailed.

Section 5. Time and Place of Public Hearing Fixed. A public hearing (the "Hearing") shall be held by the President and the Board of Trustees of the Municipality at **7:00 p.m. on March 11, 2025**, at the Homewood Village Hall, 2020 Chestnut Rd., Homewood, Illinois, to hear from any interested persons or affected taxing districts regarding the proposed designation of the Redevelopment Plan and Project, designation of the Redevelopment Plan and Project, designation of the refor.

Section 6. Publication of Notice of Hearing. Notice of the Hearing, substantially in the form attached as Exhibit B, shall be published at least twice, the first publication to be not more than 30 nor less than 10 days before the Hearing, in a newspaper of general circulation within the taxing districts having property in the proposed Redevelopment Project Area.

Section 7. Mailing of Notice of Hearing Authorized. (a) Notice shall be mailed by certified mail not less than 10 days before the date set for the Hearing, addressed to the person or persons in whose name the general taxes for the last preceding year were paid

on each lot, block, tract or parcel of land lying within the Redevelopment Project Area. If taxes for the last preceding year were not paid, the notice shall also be sent to the persons last listed on the tax rolls within the preceding three years as the taxpayers of such property. Notice shall also be given within a reasonable time after the adoption of this ordinance by first class mail to all residential addresses located outside the proposed Redevelopment Project Area and within 750 feet of the boundaries of the proposed Redevelopment Project Area and to those organizations and residents that have registered with the Municipality for that information under the registration guidelines herein established by the Municipality. Notice shall also be given by Certified Mail to all taxing districts of which taxable property is included in the proposed Redevelopment Project Area and to the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity not less than 45 days before the Hearing, and such notice (i) shall advise the taxing bodies represented on the joint review board of the time and place of the first meeting of the joint review board and (ii) shall also include an invitation to each taxing district and the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity to submit written comments before the date of the Hearing to the Village, to the attention of the Village Clerk, Village Hall, 2020 Chestnut Road, Homewood, Illinois 60430-1702 about the subject matter of the Hearing. Each such mailed notice to the taxing districts shall include a copy of the Report, the name of an appropriate person to contact for additional information, and a copy of the proposed Redevelopment Plan.

Section 8. Superseder; Effective Date. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with the Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, repealed. This Ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.

Under the Redevelopment Plan and Project, the Village proposes to alleviate blighted area conditions in the Redevelopment Project Area and to enhance the tax base of the Village and the taxing districts having taxable property within the Redevelopment Project Area by utilizing tax increment financing to fund various eligible project costs to stimulate private investment within the Redevelopment Project Area. These eligible project costs may include, but are not limited to, studies, surveys, professional fees, property assembly costs, construction of public improvements and facilities, rehabilitation of properties, financing, and administrative and other professional costs, all as authorized under the Tax Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act, as amended. Topic: Zoning Variance to Construct a Driveway – 18148 Perth Avenue

PURPOSE

The applicant, Ruth Fulwiley, owner of the property at 18148 Perth Avenue, wishes to construct a second driveway to provide vehicular access from Stewart Avenue. The property is a double frontage lot, with frontages on both Perth Avenue and Stewart Avenue. The residence faces Perth Avenue to the east.

The proposed driveway will extend 37' from the edge of the right-of-way on Stewart Avenue into the property. The driveway will be 16' in width. The Village Engineer has reviewed the driveway's construction and approved the design against access management and construction standards. The applicant has applied for a variance to construct a second driveway on Stewart Avenue.

PROCESS

In 2022, the adjacent property (18140 Perth) was permitted to construct a second driveway off Stewart Avenue. The Village adopted a new Zoning Ordinance in 2023. Under the previous zoning ordinance, single-family properties with double-frontage lots could install additional driveways. The new driveway zoning standards restrict single-family residential lots to only one driveway per principal dwelling unit (Section 44-05-05.D (1) (a))

At its regular meeting on November 21, 2024, the Homewood Planning and Zoning Commission reviewed the request for the variation to add a second driveway. With all seven (7) members present, the Commission voted 6 to 1 (six in favor and one opposed) to recommend approval of the variance request. The Commissioner who voted against the variation expressed concerns about allowing additional driveways along Stewart Avenue.

OUTCOME

The Planning and Zoning Commission reviewed the application, heard testimony by the applicant, considered the applicant's response to the Standards for a Variance, and incorporated the Findings of Fact into the record:

1. The subject property is a 0.61-acre site comprised of eight parcels located at 18148 Perth Avenue, near the intersection of Perth Avenue and Ravisloe Lane;

- 2. The subject property is owned by Ruth Fulwiley;
- 3. The subject property is located within the R-2 Single-Family Residence zoning district;
- 4. The subject property is used as a single-family residence;

- 6. The zoning regulations restrict single-family residential properties to one (1) driveway per principal dwelling unit, as stated in Subsection 44-05-05.D(1)(a) of the Village Zoning Ordinance;
- 7. The applicant has requested a variance from Subsection 44-05-05.D(1)(a) of the Village Zoning Ordinance to construct a second driveway on Stewart Avenue;
- 8. The proposed driveway meets construction and access management standards found in local codes and ordinances of the Village of Homewood;
- 9. The proposed improvements meet all other applicable standards in the property's current zoning district (R-2 Single-Family Residence).

Topic: Final Plat of Subdivision, Wind Creek

PURPOSE

The Village of Homewood and the Village of East Hazel Crest are working to facilitate the completion of the redevelopment of properties north of 175th Street, west of Halsted Street, for the casino, hotel, parking structure, and related infrastructure. Wind Creek IL, LLC owns the properties and has proposed the subdivision of the 23.878 parcel of the Wind Creek Subdivision. The current configuration of the property is comprised of six (6) parcels, three lots and vacated right-of-way. The applicant proposes the subdivision of the property into two lots, one in Homewood and one in East Hazel Crest. The portion in the Village of Homewood is 7.075 acres. New easements for access, public utilities, and stormwater management are proposed throughout the property.

PROCESS

In September 2020, the Planning and Zoning Commission reviewed the preliminary plan for the resubdivision plat on September 24, 2020, in conjunction with the original special use permit and site plan review applications for the Wind Creek Casino and Hotel parking garage. At the meeting, the preliminary plan for the subdivision was approved unanimously by a vote of 7-0. The approved site plan was amended and approved by the Planning and Zoning Commission on March 24, 2022.

On September 12, 2023, the Village Board passed Ord. M-2264 approving the vacation of public right-of-way known as 174th Street and transferring ownership to the adjacent property owner, Wind Creek IL, LLC. The Village recorded this vacation ordinance with the Cook County Clerk on September 28, 2023. In October 2024, the Village approved a Plat of Abrogation for 174th Street confirming that the Village has vacated the right-of-way and released any utility easements it may have within the vacated right-of-way. Wind Creek IL, LLC has requested that the Village approve the plat of subdivision.

At its meeting on January 9, 2025, the Planning & Zoning Commission recommended approval of the Final Plat of Wind Creek Subdivision.







Topic: Updated MABAS Automatic Aid Agreement

PURPOSE

Staff requests the Village Board approve the amended Mutual Aid Box Alarm System (MABAS) 24 master agreement to allow the addition of the Village of Matteson, Village of Richton Park, and the Village of Park Forest to MABAS 24.

HISTORY

A group of innovative fire captains and chiefs seeking to automate mutual aid responses in their regions created the Mutual Aid Box Alarm System, known as MABAS, in Illinois in 1970.

What is a "box alarm?"

Simply put, "box" refers to a fire. The term "box alarm" originally described the fire alarm boxes found on the street corner of many cities across North America. Simply put, each box had a unique number assigned to it, and within the physical box was an electronic system that transmitted a specific number to the firehouse. When pulled, bells in firehouses immediately rang the unique "box number" and the firefighters counted the bells and compared it to a chart indicating the box location. Firefighters would respond based on the location of the box and what types of structures were located in the area. In communities with on-call volunteer firefighters, a fog-style horn (or several horns) would blast the box number, turning out the members to respond to the fire.

Today's Box Alarm

In today's firefighting world, the term "box alarm" has been refined and now refers to a pre-set level of resources (engines, trucks, ambulances, squads, etc.) needed to effectively respond to a specific level of emergency. In MBAS 24 there are roughly eight (8) levels of box alarm responses: Still, Full Still, Box, 2nd Alarm, 3rd Alarm, 4th Alarm, 5th Alarm and an Interdivisional Request Alarm for major disasters. MABAS 24 has three distinct and separate "box cards" for structure fires, vehicle extrications and ambulatory events.

If someone activates a fire alarm, only Homewood would respond to this "minor response." Once on site, the incident commander makes the determination on whether to escalate to a higher

"box alarm." a smaller home/structure fire would include a Homewood response. If our department arrived and realized that the fire was larger, spreading, difficult to contain, the lead officer on-site would call for a "STILL." This callout would bring the following to resources to the fire: Additional engines from Glenwood, Country Club Hills and Hazel Crest; trucks from Flossmoor and Thornton; and an additional ambulance from Markham.

MABAS

From its inception in the Chicago suburbs, MABAS has grown to a statewide, non-discriminatory mutual aid response system for fire, emergency medical services (EMS) and specialized incident operational teams. There is no cost to join MABAS, however once joining MABAS an annual dues requirement exists on a sliding schedule based on a member departments annual operating budget. Local MABAS Division dues may be self-imposed by and at the control of each individual MABAS division.

PROCESS

In the current mutual aid agreement, the cooperating municipalities in MABAS 24 are the twenty (20) Villages of: Burnham, Calumet City, Country Club Hills, Dolton, East Hazel Crest, Flossmoor, Glenwood, Harvey, Hazel Crest, Homewood, Lansing, Lynwood, Markham, Munster, Oak Forest, Phoenix, Riverdale, South Holland, Thornton, and Tinley Park.

Earlier this year, MABAS allowed Park Forest, Matteson, and Richton Park to exit MABAS 27 and join MABAS 24. This move enhances collaboration by allowing MABAS 24 and the departments to benefit from shared organizational training sessions.

Additionally, the three (3) additional departments are part of SouthCom, which is currently merging with E-COM, further strengthening this partnership. The agreement has been reviewed and approved by both the MABAS attorneys and the Village Attorney.

OUTCOME

The Village of Matteson, the Village of Park Forest, and the Village of Richton Park will become members of MABAS 24.

AUTOMATIC AID AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGES OF: BURNHAM, CALUMET CITY, COUNTRY CLUB HILLS, DOLTON, EAST HAZEL CREST, FLOSSMOOR, GLENWOOD, HARVEY, HAZEL CREST, HOMEWOOD, LANSING, LYNWOOD, MARKHAM, MATTESON, MUNSTER, OAK FOREST, PARK FOREST, PHOENIX, RICHTON PARK, RIVERDALE, SOUTH HOLLAND, THORNTON, and TINLEY PARK

This Agreement is made and entered into on the date next to the signature of the respective parties, by and between the Villages of Burnham, Calumet City, Country Club Hills, Dolton, East Hazel Crest, Flossmoor, Glenwood, Harvey, Hazel Crest, Homewood, Lansing, Lynwood, Markham, Matteson, Munster, Oak Forest, Park Forest, Phoenix, Richton Park, Riverdale, South Holland, Thornton, and Tinley Park referred to throughout this agreement as the "Cooperating Municipalities."

WHEREAS, Article VII, Section 10 of the Illinois Constitution authorizes units of local government to contract or otherwise associate among themselves in any manner not prohibited by law or ordinance; and,

WHEREAS, the "Intergovernmental Cooperation Act", 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq., provides that any power or powers, privileges or authority exercised or which may be exercised by a unit of local government may be exercised and enjoyed jointly with any other unit of local government; and,

WHEREAS, Section 5 of the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/5, provides that any one or more public agencies may contract with any one or more public agencies to perform any governmental service, activity or undertaking which any of the public agencies entering into the contract are authorized by law to perform, provided that such contract shall be authorized by the governing body of each party to the contract; and,

WHEREAS, the Cooperating Municipalities have determined that it is in their best interests to enter into this Agreement to secure to each the benefits of Automatic-aid in fire protection, firefighting and protecting life and property from an emergency or disaster; and,

WHEREAS, the Cooperating Municipalities have determined that it is in their best interests to jointly provide for communications procedures, training and other necessary functions to further the provision of the protection of life and property from an emergency or disaster; and,

WHEREAS, the Cooperating Municipalities have determined that it is in their best interests to include in this Automatic Aid Agreement provisions for the same mutually beneficial Auto Aid as it relates to Emergency Medical Services (EMS). The provision of EMS shall conform to Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) Region 7 and South Cook County guidelines for participation. EMS calls account for a majority of our calls for service and continue to tax our response capabilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals and the covenants contained herein, the Cooperating Municipalities agree:

Section One – Purpose

It is recognized and acknowledged that in certain situations, such as, but not limited to, emergencies, natural disasters and man-made catastrophes, using an individual Municipality's personnel and equipment to perform functions outside the territorial limits of the Municipality is desirable and necessary to preserve and protect the health, safety and welfare of the public. It is further acknowledged that in certain situations, such as the aforementioned, the use of other Municipality's personnel and equipment to perform functions within the territorial limits of a Municipality is desirable and necessary to preserve and protect the health, safety and welfare of the public. Further, it is acknowledged that the coordination of Automatic-aid through a formal agreement is desirable for the effective and efficient provision of emergency services.

Section Two – Definitions

For the purpose of this Agreement, the following terms as used in this agreement shall be defined as follows:

- A. "Cooperating Municipalities": The Villages of Burnham, Calumet City, Country Club Hills, Dolton, East Hazel Crest, Flossmoor, Glenwood, Harvey, Hazel Crest, Homewood, Lansing, Lynwood, Markham, Matteson, Munster, Oak Forest, Park Forest, Phoenix, Richton Park, Riverdale, South Holland, Thornton, and Tinley Park;
- B. "Stricken Municipality": A Cooperating Municipality requesting Automatic-Aid if an emergency occurs:
- C. "Aiding Municipality": A Municipality furnishing equipment, personnel, and/or services to a Stricken Municipality;
- D. "Emergency": An occurrence or condition in a Municipality's territorial jurisdiction resulting in a situation of such magnitude and/or consequence that it cannot be adequately handled by the Stricken Municipality and such that a Municipality determines the necessity and advisability of requesting aid.

Section Three – Authority and Action to Effect Automatic Aid

- A. The Cooperating Municipalities authorize and direct their respective Fire Chief or designee to take necessary and proper action to render and/or request Automatic-Aid from other Cooperating Municipalities according to the terms of this Agreement. The aid rendered shall be to the extent of available personnel and equipment not required for adequate protection of the territorial limits of the Aiding Municipality. The judgment of the Aiding Municipality's Fire Chief or designee shall be final as to the personnel and equipment available to render aid.
- B. Whenever an emergency occurs and conditions are such that the Fire Chief or his designee of the Stricken Municipality determines it advisable to request aid pursuant to this Agreement he shall notify all Cooperating Municipalities of the nature and location of the emergency and the type and amount of equipment and personnel and/or services requested from the Aiding Municipality.

- C. The Fire Chief or designee of each Aiding Municipality shall take the following action immediately upon being requested for aid:
 - 1. Determine what equipment, personnel and/or services are requested by the Stricken Municipality;
 - 2. Determine if the requested equipment, personnel, and/or services can be committed in response to the request from the Stricken Municipality;
 - Dispatch immediately the requested equipment, personnel and/or services, to the extent available, to the location of the emergency reported by the Stricken Municipality;
 - 4. Notify the Stricken Municipality if any or all of the requested equipment, personnel and/or services cannot be provided.

Section Four – Jurisdiction over Personnel and Equipment

Personnel dispatched to aid a party under this Agreement shall remain employees of the Aiding Municipality. Personnel rendering aid shall report for direction and assignment at the scene of the emergency to the Fire Chief or Senior Officer of the Stricken Municipality. The party rendering aid shall at all times have the right to withdraw any and all aid upon the order of its Fire Chief or designee; provided, however, that the party withdrawing such aid shall notify the Fire Chief or Senior Officer of the party requesting aid of the withdrawal of such aid and the extent of such withdrawal.

Section Five – Calls for Service While Rendering Automatic Aid

- A. When aid is requested from Cooperating Municipalities, the Fire Chief or Designee of the Stricken Municipality may also request assistance from MABAS to stage equipment and personnel from departments other than the Cooperating Municipalities as necessary.
- B. While the Cooperating Municipalities are rendering aid, personnel and equipment provided by MABAS shall backfill and respond to all subsequent calls for service to the Cooperating Municipalities as necessary.

Section Six – Compensation for Aid

Equipment, personnel, and/or services provided under this Agreement shall be at no charge to the party requesting aid; however, any expenses recoverable from third parties will be equitably distributed among responding parties. Nothing herein shall operate to bar any recovery of funds from any state or federal agency under any existing statutes.

The providing department will be entitled to bill patients transported by their ambulances and personnel according to their municipality's normal billing procedure and the providing municipality will be entitled to maintain the full value of the revenue received from the patient transport.

Section Seven – Insurance

Each party will procure and maintain, at its sole and exclusive expense, insurance coverage as follows:

- A. Commercial General Liability: \$1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage and \$1,000,000 per occurrence for personal injury. The general aggregate shall be twice the required occurrence limit. Minimum General Aggregate shall be no less than \$2,000,000.
- B. Automobile Liability: \$1,000,000 combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage.
- C. Workers' Compensation and Employers' Liability: Workers' Compensation coverage with statutory limits and Employers' Liability limits of \$500,000 per accident.

No party will have any obligation to provide or extend insurance coverage for any of the items enumerated herein to any other party or its personnel. The obligations of the Section may be satisfied by a party's membership in a self-insurance pool, a self-insurance plan or arrangement with an insurance provider approved by the state of jurisdiction.

Section Eight – Indemnification

Each party agrees to waive all claims against all other Cooperating Municipalities for any loss, damage, personal injury, bodily injury or death in consequence of performing Automatic-Aid; provided, however, that such claim is not a result of gross negligence or willful misconduct by a party or its personnel.

Each party requesting or providing aid under this Agreement expressly agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend the party rendering aid and its personnel from any and all claims, demands, liability, losses, suits in law or in equity made by a third party. This indemnity shall include attorney fees and costs that may arise from providing aid under this Agreement. Provided, however, that all employee benefits, wage and disability payments, pensions, worker's compensation claims, damage to or destruction of equipment and clothing, and medical expenses of the party rendering aid will be the sole and exclusive responsibility of the respective party for its employees, provided, however, that such claims made by a third party are not the result of gross negligence or willful misconduct by the party rendering aid.

Section Nine – Non-Liability for Failure to Render Aid

The rendering of assistance under this Agreement shall not be mandatory if local conditions of the Aiding Municipality prohibit response. The Aiding Municipality will immediately notify the Stricken Municipality of the Aiding Municipality's inability to respond; however, failure to immediately notify the Stricken Municipality of such inability to respond shall not constitute evidence of noncompliance with this section and no liability may be assigned.

No liability of any kind or nature shall be attributed to or be assumed, whether expressly or implied, by a party, its duly authorized agents and personnel, for failure or refusal to render aid. Nor shall there be any liability of a party for withdrawal of aid once provided under this Agreement.

Section Ten – Term

This Agreement shall be in effect for a term of one year from the date of signature and will automatically renew for successive one-year terms unless terminated in accordance with this Section.

Any party may terminate its participation in this Agreement at any time, provided that the party wishing to terminate its participation in this Agreement shall give written notice to the remaining Cooperating Municipalities specifying the date of termination, such notice to be given at least 90 calendar days prior to the specified date of termination of participation. The written notice provided herein shall be given by personal delivery or certified mail.

Section Eleven – Effectiveness

This Agreement shall be in full force and effective upon approval by the Cooperating Municipalities in the manner provided by law and upon proper execution.

Section Twelve – Binding Effect

This Agreement will be binding upon and inure to the benefit of any successor entity which may assume the obligations of any party, provided, however, this Agreement may not be assigned by a Cooperating Municipality without prior written consent of all other Cooperating Municipalities.

Section Thirteen – Validity

The invalidity of any provision of this Agreement will not render invalid any other provision. If any provision is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unenforceable, that provision will be deemed severable and this Agreement may be enforced with that provision severed or modified by court order.

Section Fifteen – Governing Law

Section Sixteen – Execution in Counterparts

PURPOSE

Staff requests the Village Board authorize the Village Manager to donate surplus property to the Village of Hazel Crest.

PROCESS

Since 1989, the Villages of Homewood, Flossmoor, and Hazel Crest through an agreement, shared a reserve ambulance that was jointly maintained by all three communities. The current reserve ambulance is a 2003 Ford which was originally purchased and made part of the Homewood fleet.

After discussion amongst the three Villages, the Fire Chiefs agreed that all three communities should keep and maintain their own reserve ambulance, thus eliminating the shared ambulance concept. In short, when each community purchased a new front-line ambulance, the oldest ambulance in the respective community's fleet would be retained and used as the community's backup or reserve ambulance. The Village of Homewood recently took delivery of a new ambulance and the Village of Flossmoor recently purchased a new ambulance. Both Homewood and Flossmoor have implemented the new backup ambulance program.

The Village of Hazel Crest shared that they would greatly benefit from the acquisition of the 2003 Ford ambulance as their backup until they were ready to pursue a replacement ambulance. With the sale of the 2003 Ford ambulance to Hazel Crest, all three communities will have both front-line ambulances and a backup/reserve ambulance.

OUTCOME

Staff recommends approval of the attached ordinance authorizing the Village Manager to sell the surplus property item (ambulance) to the Village of Hazel Crest for one dollar (\$1.00). Hazel Crest will then be able to ensure the safety, health and welfare of their residents by having a backup and operational second ambulance.

Topic: Purchase Contract - 2029 Pierce Enforcer - Fire Engine

PURPOSE

Staff is requesting the Village Board approve an ordinance waiving competitive bidding requirements and a purchase agreement to acquire one (1) Pierce Enforcer Fire Engine, from MacQueen Emergency Group of Saint Paul, MN.

PROCESS

In 2009, the Fire Department implemented a vehicle replacement schedule, which has been followed with only minor adjustments over the years. This schedule has allowed the department to reduce its fleet size and establish a robust maintenance program. Today, the Fire Department operates a fleet that includes two (2) front line ambulances, one (1) back up ambulance, one (1) front line engine, one (1) backup engine, one (1) front line ladder truck, a shift commander car, two (2) Chief vehicles, and a utility pickup truck. The Fire Department also adopted Pierce Manufacturing (an Oshkosh Corporation) as their standardized fire apparatus manufacturer.

Earlier this year, the Fire Department created a specification committee to put together the actual "spec" material for the new fire engine, which would replace the 2004 engine. This committee consisted of Deputy Chief Steve DeJong, Captain Jason Presnak, Lieutenant Ryan Schneiter, and Firefighter/Paramedics Dave Vitolka and Kyle Paczesny. The committee completed the work and recommends the Pierce Enforcer with all of the standard NFPA equipment requirements in addition to the design that meets the department's needs. This vehicle meets the consortium pricing of the Houston – Galveston Area Council (HGAC).

Although the 2004 engine is not scheduled for replacement until 2029, the lead time for delivery of a new fire engine is between **48-51** months (4 years). After discussions with staff, the department feels it is best to order this vehicle now in order to lock in the 2025 price, avoiding future price increases. Since 2021, all manufacturers have consistently increased their vehicle prices on average by 20% or more per year. For example, the last engine Homewood purchased in 2019, was ordered in 2017, and cost just under \$600,000.



The Village received a purchase agreement of *\$1,385,000* through the Houston-Galveston Area Council, a government joint purchasing program, for a Pierce Enforcer HDR Pumper (vehicle) from MacQueen Emergency Group of Saint Paul, MN, the sales representative for Pierce Manufacturing.

Pre-Purchase/Future Delivery

Section 11-61-3 of the Illinois Municipal Code authorizes municipalities with less than 1,000,000 population to purchase personal property for public purposes by making installment payment(s) for a period of time less than 20 years. The purchase agreement provided by the vendor calls for a single installment payment of \$1,385,000 upon delivery of the engine in **2029**.

At this time, staff anticipates that future bond proceeds and grant funding will be used to fund the purchase in 2029; however, an alternative funding source, such as a lease program, may be identified.

Grant Funding Offsetting Purchase Cost

In 2021, \$200,000 was appropriated by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity (DCEO) to the Village to assist with the purchase of a new engine. Because the grant is a reimbursement grant, the Village must expend the amount of \$200,000 once the vehicle has been purchased and is in our possession, then be reimbursed by DCEO.

OUTCOME

Purchasing the new fire engine now will secure the 2025 pricing and avoid potential future price increases. This proactive approach will also ensure timely delivery of the fire engine while meeting the desired specifications.

PURCHASE AGREEMENT

This Purchase Agreement (together with all attachments referenced herein, the "Agreement"), made and entered into by and between MacQueen Equipment, LLC, as Delaware corporation DBA MacQueen Emergency ("MacQueen"), and <u>Village of Homewood</u>, (customer) is effective as of the date specified in Section 3 hereof.

1. Definitions

- a. "Product" means the fire apparatus and any associated equipment furnished for the Customer by MacQueen, pursuant to the specifications.
- **b.** "Specifications" means the general specifications, technical specifications, orientation, and testing requirements for the Product contained in the MacQueen Proposal for the Product prepared in response to the Customer's request for proposal.
- c. "MacQueen Proposal" means the proposal provided by MacQueen attached as Exhibit C prepared in response to the Customer's request for proposal.
- **d.** "Delivery" means the date MacQueen is prepared to make physical possession of the Product available to the Customer.

2. Purpose

This Agreement sets forth the terms and conditions of MacQueen's sale of the Product to the Customer.

3. Term of Agreement

This Agreement will become effective on the date it is signed and approved by MacQueen's authorized representative pursuant to Section 22 hereof ("Effective Date") and, unless earlier terminated pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, it will terminate upon the Customer's Acceptance and payment in full of the Purchase Price.

4. Purchase and Payment

The Customer agrees to purchase the Product specified on Exhibit A for the total purchase price of \$<u>1,385,000.00</u> ("Purchase Price"). Prices are in US Funds.

NOTE: Upon final inspection at the factory for pick-up or delivery, the customer will need to supply a "Certificate of Insurance" and "FULL PAYMENT" prior to release of the vehicle, unless prior arrangements for vehicle's release have been made.

5. Future Changes

Various state or federal regulation agencies (e.g., NFPA, DOT, EPA) may require changes to the Specifications and/or the Product and in any such event any resulting cost increases incurred to comply therewith will be added to the Purchase Price to be paid by the Customer. Any future drive train upgrades (engine, transmission, axles, etc.) or any other specification changes have not been calculated into our annual increases and will be provided at additional cost. The Company reserves the right to update pricing in response to manufacturer-imposed increases as a result of PPI inflation. The Company will document and itemize any such price increase for the Customer's review and approval before proceeding. Should the customer choose not to accept the pricing update, the customer has the ability to cancel without penalty or cancellation fee.

6. Agreement Changes

The Customer may request that MacQueen incorporate a change to the Products or the Specifications for the Products by delivering a change order to MacQueen; provided, however, that any such change order must be in writing and include a description of the proposed change sufficient to permit MacQueen to evaluate the feasibility of such change ("Change Order"). Within seven (7) business days of receipt of a Change Order, MacQueen will inform the Customer in writing of the feasibility of the Change Order, the earliest possible implementation date for the Change Order, of any increase or decrease in the Purchase Price resulting from such Change Order, and of any effect on production scheduling or Delivery resulting from such Change Order. MacQueen shall not be liable to the Customer for any delay in performance or Delivery arising from any such Change Order. A Change Order is only

effective when counter-signed by MacQueen's authorized representative. Only the listed customer person(s) specified on Exhibit A may be able to authorize and sign the Change Order.

7. Cancellation/Termination

In the event this Agreement is cancelled or terminated by the Customer before completion, MacQueen may charge a cancellation fee. The following charge schedule based on costs incurred may be applied: (a) 10% of the Purchase Price after order is accepted and entered by MacQueen; (b) 20% of the Purchase Price after completion of approval drawings, and; (c) 30% of the Purchase Price upon any material requisition. The cancellation fee will increase accordingly as costs are incurred as the order progresses through engineering and into manufacturing. MacQueen endeavors to mitigate any such costs through the sale of such Product to another purchaser; however, Customer shall remain liable for the difference between the Purchase Price and, if applicable, the sale price obtained by MacQueen upon sale of the Product to another purchaser, plus any costs incurred by MacQueen to conduct any such sale.

8. Delivery, Inspection, and Acceptance

a. Delivery

Delivery of the Product is approximately <u>48.5-51.5 months</u> of the Effective Date of this Agreement. Risk of loss shall pass to Customer upon Delivery. Delivery shall be made and title documentation shall pass upon Customer's complete fulfillment of its obligations arising under Section 4 hereof. Due to global supply chain constraints, any delivery date contained herein is a good faith estimate as of the date of this order/contract, and merely an approximation based on current information. Delivery updates will be made available, and a final firm delivery date will be provided as soon as possible.

b. Inspection and Acceptance

Upon Delivery, Customer shall have fifteen (15) days within which to inspect the Product for substantial conformance to the material Specifications, and in the event of substantial non-conformance to the material Specifications to furnish MacQueen with written notice sufficient to permit MacQueen to evaluate such non-conformance ("Notice of Defect"). Any Product not in substantial conformance to material Specifications shall be remedied by MacQueen within thirty (30) days from the Notice of Defect. In the event MacQueen does not receive a Notice of Defect within fifteen (15) days of Delivery, Product will be deemed to be in conformance with Specifications and Accepted by Customer.

9. Notice

Any required or permitted notices hereunder must be given in writing at the address of each party set forth below, or to such other address as either party may substitute by written notice to the other in the manner contemplated herein, by one of the following methods: hand delivery; registered, express, or certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid; or nationally-recognized private express courier:



Each Occurrence: \$5,000,000

The Customer may request MacQueen to provide the Customer with a copy of a current Certificate of Insurance with the coverages listed above.

12. Indemnity

The Customer shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless MacQueen, its officers, employees, dealers, agents or subcontractors, from any and all claims, costs, judgments, liability, loss, damage, attorneys' fees or expenses of any kind or nature whatsoever (including, but without limitation, personal injury and death) to all property and persons caused by, resulting from, arising out of or occurring in connection with the Customer's purchase, installation or use of goods sold or supplied by MacQueen which are not caused by the sole negligence of MacQueen or Pierce.

13. Force Majeure

MacQueen shall not be responsible nor deemed to be in default on account of delays in performance due to causes which are beyond MacQueen's control which make MacQueen's performance impracticable, including but not limited to civil wars, insurrections, strikes, riots, fires, storms, floods, other acts of nature, explosions, earthquakes, accidents, any act of government, delays in transportation, inability to obtain necessary labor supplies or manufacturing facilities, allocation regulations or orders affecting materials, equipment, facilities or completed products, failure to obtain any required license or certificates, acts of God or the public enemy or terrorism, failure of transportation, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, failure of vendors (due to causes similar to those within the scope of this clause) to perform their contracts or labor troubles causing cessation, slowdown, or interruption of work.

14. Default

The occurrence of one or more of the following shall constitute a default under this Agreement:

Neither party may assign its rights and obligations under this Agreement unless it has obtained the prior written approval of the other party.



17. Governing Law; Jurisdiction

Without regard to any conflict of law's provisions, this Agreement is to be governed by and under the laws of the state of Minnesota.

18. Facsimile & Electronic Verified Signatures

The delivery of signatures to this Agreement by facsimile transmission and/or electronic verified shall be binding as original signatures.

19. Entire Agreement


