#### **RESOLUTION 2311 – RECREATION IMMUNITY**

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY FOR USE OF TRAILS OR STRUCTURES IN PUBLIC EASEMENT OR UNIMPROVED RIGHT OF WAY PROVIDED IN ORS 105.668.

Resolution would affect all trails (improved and unimproved) in the Parks and Recreation park system.

- Resolution would go into effect within 30 days of being adopted.
- \$5,000 grant included to provide updated signage at all of the trails.
- Motion in support of Resolution 2311 was made by Lydia Rath and seconded by Angel Aguilar. Motion carried unanimously.

#### TEEN ADVENTURE SKATEPARK

A design flaw detected in the ADA ramp has created delay in completion. All efforts by California Skate Parks to fix the design issues of the ramp are being made. The resolution is creating a short pathway around the back side connecting the ADA parking stalls to the skate park.

#### CIMMARON RECREATION AREA

Parks and Recreation to apply for \$400,000 Local Government Grant Program (LGGP)
Cimmaron Terrace developers Rotschy Inc., dedicated approx 8 acres of wetlands to Parks and Recreation.
Additional acreage was purchased for \$165,000 and will serve as the matching portion of the LGGP grant application. Purpose of this grant will be to provide trail improvements, retaining wall, playground equipment, improve direct trail access, lighting, irrigation and grass, security cameras. Park naming open house event in addition to surveys published through social media and local schools will be used as a resource for naming the park.

Motion made by Angel Aguilar to support the application for the LGGP grant. Seconded by Lydia Rath. Motion carried unanimously.

#### HARRISON PARK

\$195,000 budget for project, \$160,000 current funding. Project includes courts, picnic pavilions, pathways, lights, and security cameras. Parks crews to start in March grubbing out footprint for courts and lay conduit.

#### PICKLEBALL FACILITY

Parks and Rec has been working with the Hermiston Pickleball Club over the past year in search of a location to build a pickleball facility. Plans/designs have been created and fundraising efforts are in full swing hoping to raise the nearly \$660,000 for the project. Additional goals for the facility would be to completely cover the courts.

Initial location proposed for the Pickleball facility was at Butte Park in the area directly south of the dog park. While this would be an ideal location to construct the pickleball courts, there are a few specific concerns.

- 1.) Restroom proximity is too far and would require the construction a restroom facility closer to the courts for an additional \$100,000.
- 2.) Noise pollution is a big concern to the nearby residents, and they have spoken vehemently against the facility being built at this location specifically due to the noise pollution.

To date, there are several alternate locations that have been explored, the following two locations are under consideration:

- 1.) Butte Park/Current Dog Park. This would require the dog park to be re-locate other side of where it currently sits, and new shelter would remain. Restrooms are in closer proximity eliminating the need to construct new restroom. There would be terrain issues to on the west side of the property and while there would be less noise pollution to near by residents, it still would exist.
- 2.) EOTEC. Area north of HERO Sportsplex. No need for sound mitigation, portable trail bathrooms onsite for HERO Sportsplex, plenty of parking

Hermiston Pickleball Club will be invited to attend one our next meetings to present their plans for the facility and fundraising efforts,

#### HERO SPORTSPLEX

Hermiston Youth Lacrosse (HYL) will be holding their first tournament at the HERO Sportsplex on March 30<sup>th</sup>. HYL will be handling the team registrations and most of aspects of the tournament. Parks and Recreation will offer onsite assistance with staff and will be handling the parking fees.

Treasure State Lacrosse is bringing youth summer camps in July and possible additional tournament.

## **Recreation Immunity**

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE IMMUNITY FROM LIABILITY FOR USE OF TRAILS OR STRUCTURES IN PUBLIC EASEMENT OR UNIMPROVED RIGHT OF WAY PROVIDED IN ORS 105.668

- WHEREAS, ORS 105.668(2) provides to cities
  with a population of 500,000 or more immunity
  from liability for injury or property damage
  against cities including their officers, employees,
  or agents, adjacent property owners, and certain
  nonprofit groups and their volunteers that arise
  from the use of trails or structures located on
  public easements or unimproved right of way; and
- WHEREAS, ORS 105.668(3) authorizes cities with populations of less than 500.000 to opt into the immunities provided in ORS 105.668(2) by adoption of an ordinance or resolution; and
- WHEREAS, the City desires to opt into the immunities provided by ORS 105.668 to further the public interest by protecting and supporting efforts and activities of the City.


