#### CALLTO ORDER

Meeting called to order at 5:32 by Jeff Kelso

#### **MINUTES**

Motion to approve minutes from April meeting made by Lydia Raath, seconded by Nicole Westing. Motion carried unanimously.

#### **REPORTS & BUSINESS**

#### HERMISTON FAMILY AQUATIC CENTER

- 50-meter and the Multi-Use Pool (MUP) are filled and ready to go.
- Due to delay in the arrival of pool paint, the MUP did not get painted this season.
- Hermiston School District 2nd grade swim lessons start May 19<sup>th</sup>
- Echo School District 2<sup>nd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade swim lessons will start the following week.
- Collaboration with Echo School District to build 5<sup>th</sup> grade swim program curriculum that can be utilized for other districts in the coming years. Advanced self-rescue skills will be included in this curriculum.
- Currently hiring and training as many lifeguards as possible.
- Anticipating the pool to open for the summer on June 16<sup>th</sup>

#### SPLASH PAD

- Splash pad will open Memorial Day weekend featuring the newly resurfaced pad along with a donor sign thanking Good Shepherd Health Foundation, Wildhorse Foundation and Lamb Weston for generous donation to the splash pad project.
- Finishing pump upgrades and fixing leaks.
- Arrival of new slide is expected in mid-June.

#### **HORIZON PARK**

- City Council voted to officially name Hermiston's newest park, "Horizon Park".
- The name Horizon Park was a result of community wide survey in addition to a survey done with Loma Vista Elementary students.
- Grant request submitted to Lamb Weston in the amount of \$50,000 for the Horizon Park playground project.
- Ideas for playground equipment presented to the committee throughout the summer.

#### USDA URBAN FORESTRY GRANT

- Federal grand opportunity deadline: June 1. Funding minimum is \$100,000 up to \$50,000,000.
- Merchant McIntyre Associates, the grant writing agency we contract with, is moving quickly to put together a proposal for this grant.

Parks & Recreation

- Receiving this grant would benefit the Oxbow area by removing Russian Olives and replacing with new trees along the trail in addition to possibly establishing an arboretum.
- This grant would also provide an opportunity to inventory all trees throughout Hermiston, perform tree assessments with the tree arbiter, plus additional plantings to grow and enhance our urban tree canopies.

#### HARRISON PARK

- Eastern Oregon Telecom estimates \$25,000 to run fiber to Harrison Park for the use of security cameras that will cover the park.
- Possible addition of restrooms near the courts.
- Estimated working budget for the basketball courts, lights, restrooms, and shelter is \$221,365.
- Made to Thrive is continuing grant writing for this project.

#### TACTILE MAP, FUNLAND PARK

- Deposit has been made to begin production of the tactile map, for the visually impaired, to be located on the kiosk at the entry of Fundland park. The kiosk will also include visual map for those assisting the visually impaired to be able to navigate the playground.
- Donors for the tactile map will be featured on the other side of kiosk.
- Project is an estimated at \$18,000, Phil Hamm and Lions Club are doing a large portion of the fundraising.
- Estimated installation in the fall of 2023.

#### TEEN ADVENTURE SKATE PARK

- Groundbreaking on Tuesday, June 6<sup>th</sup> at 5:30pm.
- Estimated construction start date June 15 to be followed by 120-160 days of construction.
- Grand Opening will take place in mid-late October.

#### **HODGE PARK**

- Discussion from previous meeting about the Hodge Park playground equipment and the repeated vandalization.
- After consulting Jason Baron, Parks Manager, this piece of equipment is still useable and compliant if we
  decided to remove it and donate it to another organization. If we were to replace it, it is suggested that we
  look at a more natural type of playground equipment.

#### ALL CITY VOLLEYBALL LEAGUE

- Travel volleyball league providing youths in grades 5th-8th with the opportunity to play competitive club volleyball while keeping the costs affordable.
- Teams are coached by Janell Davis, a former varsity volleyball coach.
- League consists of teams from Hermiston, Kennewick, Richland, Pasco and Prosser.
- Last weekend Hermiston the league and had 300+ spectators in attendance throughout the day.
- Final tournament is Sunday, May 21st
- Hoping to expand the travel sport league with football and basketball in the off seasons.

#### CALL TO ORDER

Committee members assembled at 4:00pm with presentations beginning at 4:10pm

#### **MINUTES**

The Recreation Project Fund Advisory Committee met on June 20<sup>th</sup> to review eight proposals submitted for the 2023-24 allocation. Available for distribution is \$65,000\*, and the total application amount was \$72,338. Application packets were sent to prior applicants and known parties of interest and made available on the City's website.

- Hermiston Downtown District, presented by Judy Pederson, Kari Christiansen, and Brandi Howard Requesting \$6,875 for Downtown Flowerpots Plant, fertilize and application of insect control for the 55 concrete flowerpots along Main Street in the Downtown District. Service provided by Bennet Gardens four times per year.
- Made to Thrive, presented by Josh Burns Requesting \$15,000 for HEROS Sportsplex Lighting project at the HEROS Sportsplex.
- Made to Thrive, presented by Mitch Boylan Requesting \$15,000 for Sports & Safety at Harrison Park Installation of three full basketball courts with six hoops, new permanent soccer goals for existing fields, security cameras, lighting, and restrooms.
- **Campus Life**, presented by Ashly and Jeff Umbarger and Bennett Christianson Requesting \$5,963 for industrial kitchen appliances for Drop-in Center Plan to be available to feed kids every school day at the new Drop-in Center.
- Hermiston Food Pod, presentation by Patrick Hunt. Requesting \$10,000 for Shade Structures and Tables at Food Pod Provide shade and seating for customers of the Food Pod as well as more garbage cans to keep area clean.
- Inland Northwest Musicians, presentation by Lee Friese and Raniel Dunn Requesting \$3,000 for 25<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Concert Concert and dinner in celebration the \$25 year relationship between Hermiston and Inland Northwest Musicians.
- Hermiston Parks & Recreation, presented by Brandon Artz Requesting \$9,000 for Hermiston Teen Adventure Skate Park Amenities Benches, drinking fountain and a 24'x14' shade covering added to skate park upon completion of Phase 1

Committee discussed allowing the Hermiston Basketball Club's late request for consideration. Motion made by Val Hoxie, seconded by Helen Nevin. Motion passed unanimously.

• Consideration for Hermiston Basketball Club Requesting \$7,500 for Tournament Awards Custom embroidered backpacks for first place teams in each division at tournaments hosted in Hermiston.

Discussion by the committee followed the presentations. Motion made by Val Hoxie to award all applicants their full requested amount, seconded by Roy Barron. Motion passed unanimously.
