Planning Assistant Heather La Beau was in attendance as was Council Representative Allen Hayward. Council Representative Jackie Linton was absent. No Youth Advisors attended the meeting. Joe opened the meeting in prayer at 4:07pm.

Public Comment

Amy Palmer, Hermiston Coordinator for the National Day of Prayer, presented information regarding ways to participate in the upcoming event on Thursday, May 7. The website found here: nationaldayofprayerhermiston.org has information on multiple events being hosted by various churches and organizations. Events are held at different times and places throughout the day and evening and are open to everyone. In previous years there was one gathering. Ms. Palmer will attend the upcoming council meeting to present a proclamation for the National Day of Prayer. Councilor Hayward suggested the website include a link to donate.

Members commented on how wonderful it is to see the churches working together and multiple churches participating. It was suggested that other communities in the county be included on the website. It would be great to see coordinated prayer more often than one day a year. A Street Prayer Ministry was discussed with prayer stations in various city locations. Consistency of volunteers will be an important part of the ministry.

Food Insecurity Updates

Dan shared that Robert Longoria is now the Interim Executive Director of Eastern Oregon Mission, following the departure of Mark Gomolski. There is hope an evening food distribution may become available to serve those that work during the day. The organization needs more and younger volunteers, specifically a truck/trailer driver and board members. Joe shared the LDS Bishop Central Storehouse was able to make a large food donation to Agape House on April 1. James will investigate the hospital's community garden as a possibility for any excess food that may be able to be given to Agape House. James also mentioned that some service organizations have older mobile food units that may be able to be restored and used to serve as a mobile lunch distribution. The Catholic Church has garden space available if there is an interest from gardeners to assist.

It was shared that Marissa, the Director for Euvalcree, recently stepped down from the position.

School Adoption Updates

Teacher Appreciation Week is May 4 – 8 and is a great opportunity for churches to do something special at their adopted schools.
