### **Call to Order**

4. Staff reported that the new parcel had been purchased and the City is working on a new lease for potential tenants next year.
5. Staff discussed the condition of the asphalt pavement adjoining the concrete pad where the agriculture planes load. The asphalt is breaking up from the heavy use. The city will look at the potential of repairing that asphalt.
