Minutes

Mayor Drotzmann and City Manager Smith Meeting Report

James and Dean stated they had a very productive meeting with the Mayor and City Manager and discussed very thoughtful suggestions that the Committee could consider to work/focus on, to include:

- How the I Love My City initiative is one of the finest events of the City
- Someone from FBAC attend the Hispanic Advisory Committee meetings to support this demographic
- What we can do to support young couples
- Spanish Library "Book Shower"- Purchase books to expand the Spanish book collection
- How to help Parents of youth going through CAB (Community Accountability Board)/It's Just Dinner Programs
- Marriage and parent Trainings
 - It was suggested that the Committee reach out to Made to Thrive and True Care as both organizations have offered these types of services in the past
- PATH (Practical Assistance Through Transitional Housing) Project AKA Stepping Stones Alliance asking congregations to help gather volunteers and provide worship services once their facility has been completed

The group briefly discussed these items and stated they would re-present this information when a quorum is present.

I Love My City Event Updates

James and Dean stated over 620 volunteers served the community on this day saving the City about \$35,000, and over 920 people attended the following days Sunday Service at EOTEC. These events continue to grow and allow the community to prosper through giving.

- Free lunch programs provided for the homeless by area churches and what is offered through Rose Ministries. The Committee stated they would discuss this at the next meeting when more members were present.

Committee members spoke regarding the continuing purpose of the Committee. Many of the items above were initiated by this Committee and have been passed on to other organizations and groups who have continued to grow most of these programs. The Committee is at a standstill and needs to know what the function of the group is and should be, and if there is value in continuing the Committee.

After some discussion, the committee agreed there is still value in meeting in this capacity to support the City in Faith-Based efforts. The Committee and members of the audience discussed the Committee focusing on current and potential future crisis situations, such as:

- Helping children by providing Foster Care
- Emergency Planning, specifically discussing food shortage, as food shortage has not been talk about in other Umatilla County Emergency Management Planning meetings that members of this group have attended.

The Committee decided James and Dean will meet with City Manager Smith and Mayor Drotzmann before their next meeting and ask them what they would like the Committee to focus on or work towards.

Other

There was discussion regarding:
