A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HUTCHINS, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR TO ENTER INTO A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH RON HOBBS ARCHITECTURE & INTERIOR DESIGN, LLP FOR THE DESIGN OF A 60'X60' MULTIPURPOSE PAVILION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROPOSAL ATTACHED HERETO AS EXHIBIT "A"; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council has been presented with a proposal by Ron Hobbs Architecture & Interior Design, LLP ("Ron Hobbs") for the design of a 60'X60' multipurpose pavilion which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, upon full review and consideration of the proposal from Ron Hobbs attached hereto as Exhibit "A," and all matters related thereto, the City Council authorizes the City Administrator to negotiate and enter into a Professional Services Agreement with Ron Hobbs for the design of a 60'X60' multipurpose pavilion.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HUTCHINS, TEXAS, THAT:

SECTION 1. The City Administrator is hereby authorized to negotiate and enter into a Professional Services Agreement with Ron Hobbs for the design of a 60'X60' multipurpose pavilion as set forth in Exhibit "A".

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Project involves designing a new 60'x60' multipurpose pavilion.

PROJECT BUDGET: To be determined

OWNER PROVIDED INFORMATION: The Owner will be responsible for providing the following:

- Property survey (boundary, utilities, & topographic information)
- Geotechnical report

BASIC ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES: This Agreement includes the services normally considered to basic architectural services. These services will include the services of the Architect and the usual and customary structural, mechanical, electrical, plumbing engineering services.

Basic architectural services will include the following Phases of work:

- Design Phase
- Construction Documents Phase
- Bidding/Procurement Phase
- Construction Administration Phase

Design Phase: The Architect shall review the Architectural Design Program and data and other information furnished by the Owner. The Architect shall evaluate the Owner's program, schedule, the proposed procurement and delivery method, and other Initial Information, each in terms of the other, to ascertain the requirements of the Project. The Architect shall notify the Owner of any inconsistencies discovered in the information and other information or consulting services that may be reasonably needed for the Project.

The Architect will use the Owner's Architectural Design Program to develop design concepts for the Project. Design Docum

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shall consist of drawings and other documents including floor plans, site plan, and, if appropriate, preliminary sections and elevations. Documents may include some combination of perspective sketches, or digital representations. During the Design Phase the Architect will also make preliminary selections for building materials and building systems. Diagrammatic layouts of structural, mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems may also be included.

Presentation drawings will be prepared that may include renderings or other artwork by graphic artists if requested and authorized by the Owner.

Construction Documents Phase: Based on the Owner's approval of the Design Development Documents, and on the Owner's authorization of any adjustments in the Project requirements and/or the budget for the Cost of the Work, the Architect shall prepare Construction Documents for the Owner's approval. The Construction Documents shall illustrate and describe the further development of the approved Design Development Documents and shall consist of drawings and specifications setting forth in detail the quality levels and performance criteria of materials and systems and other requirements for the construction of the Project. The Architect shall also assist the Owner by preparing the necessary bidding information, bidding forms, the Conditions of the Contract, and the form of Agreement between the Owner and Contractor.

At the completion of the Construction Documents Phase, the Architect will register the project with the State of Texas and submit the final construction documents to a Registered Accessibility Specialist for review.

The CD's will become the part of the Construction Contract that defines and establishes the scope of work required for the project. Construction Documents will also be used to:

- Obtain bids from contractors
- Obtain a building permit
- Receive approval from the State of Texas regarding accessibility requirements
- Construct the Project

Bidding/Procurement Phase: The Architect, following the Owner's approval of the Construction Documents and of the latest preliminary estimate of Construction Cost, shall assist the Owner in obtaining bids or negotiated proposals and assist in awarding construction contracts. During this phase the Architect will:

- Provide copies of the Construction Documents to the Owner, contractors, and/or the construction manager
- Attend/Conduct a Pre-Bid Conference
- Answer questions from bidders
- Prepare and issue any addenda
- Assist the Owner in receiving bids or proposals

Construction Administration Phase: After bids are accepted and a construction contract is signed, the Construction Administration Phase of work will begin. The Architect's responsibility to provide Basic Services for the Construction Phase under this Agreement commences with the award of the initial Contract for Construction and terminates at either the issuance to the Owner of the final Certificate for Payment or 60 days after the date of Substantial Completion of the Work.

The Architect shall at all times have access to the Work wherever it is in preparation or progress and shall provide administration of the Contract for Construction as set forth below and in the current edition of AIA Document A201, General Conditions of the

Contract for Construction, current as of the date of this Agreement, unless otherwise provided in this Agreement made to the General Conditions, when adopted as part of the Contract Documents, shall be enforceable under only to the extent that they are consistent with this Agreement or approved in writing by the Architect.

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During the Construction Administration Phase, the Architect will:

- Participate in a Preconstruction Conference
- Review and process submittals
- Review, process, and answer contractor generated Requests for Information (RFIs)
- Prepare and issue Architectural Supplement Instructions (ASIs)
- Attend construction progress meetings
- Make job site visits to observe the progress
- Report to the Owner via field reports and progress photos
- Assist in preparing a punch list

The Architect shall be a representative of and shall advise and consult with the Owner during the administration of the Contract for Construction. The Architect shall have authority to act on behalf of the Owner only to the extent provided in this Agreement unless otherwise modified by written amendment.

SUPPLEMENTAL SERVICES: All Supplemental Services must be authorized by Owner prior to the service being performed. Supplemental services include:

- Civil engineering services
- Landscape Architecture services

ADDITIONAL SERVICES: All Additional Services must be authorized by Owner prior to the service being performed. The following items are not included in the Basic Architectural Services and shall be considered Additional Services:

- Changing and/or modifying previously approved drawings.
- Preparing drawings, documents, and applications for approvals relating to land-use permits and/or zoning cases
- Board of Adjustments hearings, and/or environmental studies and/or attending public meetings, and hearings required for approvals of governmental authorities or others having jurisdiction over the Project
- Services of any consultants not included and identified in either Basic or Supplemental Services

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- Budget analysis
- Platting or Surveys
- Environmental studies (Soils, Hazardous Materials, etc.)
- Coordination of separate Contractors or independent Consultant
- Detailed construction cost estimates
- Inventories of materials or equipment
- Preparation of measured drawings for existing conditions
- Preparation of "Record or As-built Documents"
- Preparation of additional drawings, specifications, and other materials associated with Owner generated Change Orders

COMPENSATION:

Basic Architectural Services of the Architect & Engineers: Compensation for Basic Services shall be a fixed fee as follows:

Services of the Architect: \$11,750
Services of the Structural Engineer: \$2,500
Services of the Electrical Engineer: \$3,500

Total Architectural & Engineering Fee: \$17,750

Supplemental Services: Compensation for civil engineering and landscape architecture services shall be negotiated fee for the work to be performed. Compensation shall include the amount invoiced to the Architect plus ten percent (10%).

Additional Services: Compensation for Additional Services shall be based upon a negotiated fee for the additional work to be performed or shall be billed hourly. All additional services must be authorized by Owner prior to the service being performed. Compensation for Additional Services of the Architect's consultants shall be the amount invoiced to the Architect plus ten percent (10%).

HOURLY RATES: The hourly billing rates for services of the Architect and the Architect's employees are set forth below.

Principal Time: \$150.00/hour
Senior Architect: \$125.00/hour
Interior Designer: \$125.00/hour
Project Manager: \$115.00/hour
Interns/Technical: \$90.00/hour

For the purposes of this Proposal Ron Hobbs and Wadona Stich are principals.

COMPENSATION BY PHASES: The proportion of compensation for each phase of services shall be as follows:

Design Phase	Thirty-Five percent	(35%)
Construction Documents Phase	Forty percent	(40%)
Bidding/Procurement Phase	Five percent	(5%)
Construction Phase	Twenty percent	(20%)

Total Basic Compensation.....One Hundred percent (100%)

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REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES: Reimbursable expenses incurred by the Architect and the Architect's consultants (Juntary, procurs, renderings and artwork by graphic artists, delivery charges, TAS filing fees) are in addition to the base fee and will be billed at a rate of 1.1 x the expense.

PROGRESS PAYMENTS: Monthly invoices will be sent for the amount of work completed in the prior month. The Architect shall submit, on or about the last day of each month, an invoice for Basic Services, Reimbursable Expenses, Supplemental Services, and Additional Services for the work completed to date. Payments shall be made to the Architect within thirty (30) days from the date of the invoice. No deductions shall be made from the Architect's compensation on account of penalty, liquidated damages, other sums withheld on account of the cost of changes in the Work other than those for which the Architect is held legally liable.

Progress payments for each phase of Basic Services shall be calculated by multiplying the percentage of completion by the percentages identified in "Compensation by Phases" by the Owner's most recent budget for the Cost of the Work. Compensation paid in previous progress payments shall not be adjusted based on subsequent updates to the Owner's budget for the Cost of the Work.

If portions of the Project are deleted or otherwise not constructed, compensation for those portions of the Project shall be payable to the extent services are performed on those portions. The Architect shall be entitled to compensation in accordance with this Agreement for all services performed whether or not the Construction Phase is commenced.

INSURANCE: Architect shall maintain the following insurance coverages:

- Workers' compensation insurance in accordance with applicable law.
- Commercial general liability insurance insuring against any and all claims for bodily injury and property damage occurring in, or about the Project arising out of the Architect's negligent acts. Such insurance shall have be in the minimum amount of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence.
- Business and auto liability coverage insuring bodily injury and property damage with a combined single limit of \$1,000,000 per accident for company owned, non-owned and hired vehicles.
- Professional liability (Errors & Omissions) insurance in the minimum amount of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per claim and one million dollars (\$1,000,000) in the aggregate.

INITIAL PAYMENT: n/a

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS:

Architect's Accounting Records: Architect's accounting records related to reimbursable expenses, hourly services, supplemental services, and/or additional services shall be available for review by the Owner upon request.

Standard of Care: Architect shall perform its services under the Agreement in accordance with the standard of professional

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and care expected of architectural firms practicing in the geographic area in which the Project is located and experienced in the design and construction of projects similar in scope and size to the Project.

Mediation: Upon written consent of both parties, claims, disputes, or other matters in question between the parties to this Agreement arising out of or relating to this Agreement may be subject to and decided by mediation.

Request for mediation shall be made within a reasonable time after the claim, dispute, or matter in question has arisen. In no event shall the request be made after the date when institution of legal or equitable proceedings base on the matter in question would be barred by any applicable statutes of limitations. Unless otherwise specified, this Agreement shall be governed by the law of the principal place of business of the Architect.

Successors and Assigns: The Owner and the Architect, respectively, bind themselves, their partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives to the other party to this Agreement and to the partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives of such other party with respect to all covenants of this Agreement. Neither the Owner nor the Architect shall assign, sublet or transfer any interest in this Agreement without the written consent of the other.

Solicitation Process

EROSION CONTROL & VEGETATION NOTES

- Every soil disturbing activity shall have an accompanying Erosion Control Plan (ECP), and either Construction Site Notice (CSN) for those activities disturbing more than 1 but less than 5 acres, or Notice of Intent (NOI) for those activities disturbing 5 or more acres including those activities less than 5 acres, but are part of a common plan of development totalling 5 or more acres. A copy of the appropriate CSN or NOI shall be provided to the City.
- The CSN or NOI shall be posted in a location viewable to the public until construction is complete and Notice of Termination (NOT) submitted. The Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SW3P) shall be readily available for review by Federal, State, or local officials.
- No soil disturbing activities will occur prior to the SW3P, ECP, and associated Best Management Practices (BMP) being fully implemented. A copy of the SW3P shall be provided to the City prior to the start of construction.
- The contractor shall employ measures as necessary to prevent dirt, mud, debris from being tracked off site.
 Any dirt, mud, debris tracked offsite shall be cleaned up by the contractor immediately.
- The site shall be reviewed by the operator or his representative weekly, and after any major storm.
 Adjustments/renairs to the crossion control measure will be made as needed.
- A completed NOT shall be submitted to the State and a copy of this NOT shall be provided to the City prior to final acceptance.

TREE PROTECTION NOTES

- Unless shown on the plans to be removed, all trees within the construction area shall be protected during construction with temporary fencing or other measures as needed including pruning of limbs and roots.
- Protective measures shall be taken prior to the start of any work in the area and shall be maintained throughout the duration of the project.
- Pruning of limbs to provide clearance for construction equipment shall take place before construction begins to prevent damage to trees by ripping and tearing of branches.

- Construction materials shall be kept off existing sidewalks and consolidated in areas within the City right-of-way, unless otherwise approved by the City.

PAVING NOTES

- All concrete for all streets shall be in a accordance with NCTCOG Class "C" concrete (3,600 p.s.i.) compressive strength @ 28 days) for slip forming, NCTCOG Class "P" concrete (4,000 p.s.i. & compressive strength @ 28 days) for hand pours.
- Reinforcing steel shall be deformed bars No. 3 on 18 inch centers of No. 4 bars on 24 inch centers. Reinforcing shall be in both directions on center. Reinforcing steel shall be in accordance with ASTM 615, 616, & 617.
- All reinforcing steel shall be tied (100%). Reinforcing steel shall be set on plastic chairs. Bar laps be minimum 30 diameters.
- Expansion joints shall be spaced every 200 feet and at all intersections. Alleys shall have a minimum of two expansion joints.

- 5. Sawed transverse dummy joints shall be spaced every 20 feet on paving 8 inches or thicker and every 15 feet for paving thickness less than 8 inches sawing shall occur within 5 to 12 hours after the pour including sealing. Otherwise the section shall be removed and reconstructed, and longitudinal butt joint constructed.
- 6. Subgrade under pavements shall be minimum of 6 inches of lime treated subgrade. Only hydrated lime shall be utilized. Optimum lime shall be achieved. Optimum lime content shall be determined during the excavation by the use of a lime series test. Lime series test shall be taken along the excavation at all changes in soil and a minimum of 300 feet. Lime series shall be completed by an independent laboratory approved by the city.
- 7. Lime treated subgrade shall be compacted to a density of not less than 95 percent of the maximum density as determined by ASTM D 698. Moisture content shall be within -2 to +4 of optimum. Density test results shall be completed by an independent laboratory approved by the city. All results shall be provided to the city.
- 8. Lime trimmings are not acceptable for any use.
- 9. All fill shall be compacted by mechanical methods. Maximum loose lift for compaction shall be 8 inches. All lifts shall be tested for density by an independent laboratory approved by the city. Density requirements shall be as shown on the plans for the type of material called for in the plans.
- All disturbed areas of roadway work shall have grass established immediately. Grass shall meet the requirements of item 3.8, 3.9, 3.10, & 3.11 of NCTCOG.
- 11. No vehicles shall be permitted on concrete pavement without approval from the city. The city will make determination based on concrete break report.

STORM SEWER

- 1. The floor of the excavation for inlet box must provide a firm, level bed for the base section to rest upon.
- Minimum of 6 inches of 1" diameter (maximum) rock or gravel shall be used to prepare the bedding to final
 grade or in lieu of this, at least 6 inches of 2-sack cement stabilized-sand shall be allowed to set by keeping
 hole pumped dry.
- After pipe has been laid on proper bedding, backfilling will commence with 8" maximum loose lifts
 mechanically compacted to 95% standard proctor under roadway or 90% standard proctor outside roadway
 paving. Maximum size rock in backfill shall not exceed 4 inches in diameter.

- 7. "No Dumping" warning plaque to be installed on all standard and recessed inlets.
- 8. Concrete cast-in-place inlets shall have a minimum compressive strength of 4,200 p.s.i. @ 28 days.
- Storm drain tile shall be placed in the center of the inlet, 2 inches from the edge of opening as shown in the drawing. - 11. Reinforced concrete pipe class III minimum or high density polyethylene storm sewer pipe is approved within the city.

GENERAL CONSTRUCTION NOTES

- All construction, materials and workmanship shall conform to Standard Specifications for Public Works
 Construction. North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG Standard Specifications) latest
 Edition unless otherwise noted.
- 2. The Contractor shall provide temporary drainage measures during construction.
- Bracing of utility poles may be required by utility companies when trenching or excavation is in close proximity to the poles. The cost of bracing poles will borne by the Contractor. There is no separate pay item for this work. The cost shall be considered incidental work.
- 4. The locations, elevations and dimensions of existing utilities shown on the plans were obtained from Dig Tess and/or available utility company records and plans and are considered approximate. It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to verify locations, elevations, and dimensions of adjacent and/or conflicting utilities sufficiently in advance of construction in order that adjustments can be made to provide adequate clearances. The Contractor shall preserve and protect public utilities at all times during construction. Any damage to utilities resulting from Contractor's operations shall be restored at the Contractor's expenses. The City shall be notified when proposed facility grades conflict with existing utility grades.

Contractor to water and establish vegetation twice a day for a period of 4 weeks minimum or until grass is established as determined by the City. Work shall be in accordance with NCTCOG I tem 202.
- 10. The Contractor shall protect all trees in the project area and temporary easements during construction. No tree shall be removed unless marked and approved for removal by the City.
- 11. The Contractor shall be responsible for taking measures to minimize damage to tree limbs, tree trunks, and tree roots along the route of the project. All such measures shall be considered incidental work. Contractor shall inspect the work site in advance and arrange to have any tree limbs pruned that might be damaged by equipment operations. The City shall be notified at least 24 hours prior to any tree trimming work. Nothing shall be stored over the tree root system within the drip line limits of any tree. The Contractor shall employ a qualified landscaper for all work required for tree care to ensure utilization of the best agricultural practices and procedures.
- 12. All fences to remain unless otherwise noted.
- 13. It will be the responsibility of the contractor to protect all public utilities in the construction of this project. All manholes, cleanouts, valve boxes, fire hydrants, etc. not shown to be abandoned, must be adjusted to finished grade by the contractor. All utility location and grade adjustment are subsidiary except for those included in the pay items.

SIDEWALK REPLACEMENT NOTE

 Sidewalk removal shall be from joint to joint. Sawcut shall be at existing joint. Connection to existing sidewalk shall be with reflex expansion join material (recycled rubber or equal). Full panel replacement required.

GENERAL NOTES FOR WATER LINES

- Fittings shall be ductile iron and shall be cement fined inside and bituminous coated on the outside. Where
 connections are made to pipes of dissimilar materials, suitable bond breakers shall be used.
- 2. All ductile iron fittings shall be mechanical joint or slip joint type CL250.
- 3. Pipe joints shall be of the push-on type unless otherwise noted
- 4. Valves, vault lids, fire hydrants and meter boxes shall be located outside of sidewalk areas.
- 5. All trenching, embedment and backfill will be incidental to the unit cost of pipe
- 6. Water line sections crossing wastewater mains or laterals shall be a minimum of 18 feet long and shall be centered over the wastewater main or lateral such that the joints of the water line are equidistance and at least nine feet horizontally from the center line of the wastewater main or lateral. Whenever possible, the crossing shall be centered between the joints of the wastewater main or lateral.
- 7. Water Lines shall be AWWA C900 DR18 pressure class.
- All trench backfill shall be placed in maximum 8-inch loose lifts and mechanically compacted. Testing shall be in accordance with NCTCOG as a minimum.
- 9. Work to make connections shall be continuous and shall occur during times of low usage.
- Valves on lines 12-inch and less shall be gate valves. Gate valves on laterals shall be attached to flanged outlet, tee or cross. Gate valves shall conform to AWWA C-509. Butterfly valves shall conform to AWWA C-504
- Dewatering of water line trench may be required during construction. Dewatering shall be subsidiary to pipe installation.
- 12. Contractor to construct water line to grade shown in the plans. All water lines shall have a minimum cover of 4 feet.
- 13. During water line testing contractor to dechlorinate in accordance with TCEQ requirements prior to releasing water overland and into storm drainage systems.
- 14. Contractor to support all existing utilities as construction of new water line crosses these utilities. No separate pay item. Include in cost of water line.
- 15. Contractor shall field locate pipelines at connection points prior to ordering or fabricating proposed pipe. Contractor shall verify pipe size, type, elevation and horizontal location. Contractor shall make all necessary adjustments to connect to existing line after approval from the engineer and City.
- 16. All new water services shall be AWWA C901, 3/4" minimum DR-9 (250 psi) HDPE poly pipe with PE4710 as specified in ASTM F714, from the service tap to the curb stop, 3/4-inch minimum compression fitting angle stop, and meter box, unless otherwise indicated on the plans. Curb stops will be located within the meter box and facing toward the lot.
- Bolts and nuts for mechanical joints will be of a high-strength low-alloy corrosion resistant steel conforming to ASTM A325 (Type 3).
- 18. Assembly of pipe to be performed as required by pipe manufacturer. Gaskets shall be clear and lubricated. Do not swing or stab the joint. Align the spigot to the bell, insert spigot into bell and contact gasket. The spigot end is marked with insertion mark. Insert pipe to the mark, do not over-insert.
- 19. All valve stacks shall be set at finished grade.
- 20. Contractor to construct waterline to grade as shown in plans.
- 21. All water lines shall be tested and disinfected prior to connections.
- 22. All crossings of sanitary sewer lines must meet current TCEQ requirements.

GENERAL NOTES FOR SANITARY SEWER LINES

- Unless otherwise noted on the plans, all sanitary sewer pipes shall be SDR26 PVC ASTM Designation D2241. Other pipe shall be subject to Approval by the City.
- All residential sanitary sewer laterals shall include a 4" tee wye bend, pipe and stopper. Sewer laterals shall be laid on a minimum slope of +2.00% from the main line to the street right-of-way.
- All sanitary sewer lines and laterals shall be tested by pulling a mandrel, air pressure test, and television video. The video shall be provided to the City in a electronic format (DVD) format.
- 4. All sanitary sewer manholes within flood plains or flood prone areas require Type "S" manhole lids and shall be properly sealed and vented per TCEQ requirements. Outlet of vent shall be minimum 1.5 feet above the 100-year water surface.
- 5. All manholes shall be vacuum tested in accordance to NCTCOG requirements.
- All manhole covers and clean outs shall be set at finished grade unless otherwise noted. In open spaces, the top of the sanitary sewer manhole shall be installed a minimum of 12 inches above the surrounding ground.
- 7. Contractor to construct sewer line to grade shown in the plans.
- Contractor to support all existing utilities as construction of new sewer line crosses these utilities. No separate pay item. Include in cost of sewer line.
- Assembly of pipe to be performed as required by pipe manufacturer. Gaskets shall be clear and lubricated.
 Do not swing or stab the joint. Align the spigot to the bell, insert spigot into bell and contact gasket. The spigot end is marked with insertion mark. Insert pipe to the mark, do not over-insert.
- 10. Contractor shall field locate pipelines at connection points prior to ordering or fabricating proposed pipe. Contractor shall verify pipe size, type, elevation and horizontal location. Contractor shall make all necessary adjustments to connect to existing line after approval from the engineer.
- 11. All crossings of potable water lines must meet current TCEQ requirements.

BACKELL NOTE

 All trench backfill shall be placed in maximum 8-inch loose lifts and be mechanically compacted. Density testing shall be in accordance with NCTCOG as a minimum and as directed by the City. The NCTCOG minimum for density testing is once per 300-feet per 1-foot of compacted denth, (NCTCOG Item 504.5.3.2)

GENERAL NOTES FOR TRAFFIC CONTROL

- . The temporary traffic control measures shown on these plans are to be considered a minimum. Additional measures shall be furnished when necessary for traffic safety and to meet the latest Texas MUTCD (TMUTCT).
- 2. When the normal function of the roadway is suspended through closure of any portion of the right-of-way, temporary construction work zone traffic control devices shall be installed to effectively guide the motoring public through the area. Consideration for road user safety, worker safety, and the efficiency of road user flow shall be an integral element of every traffic control zone. All traffic control devices shall be in accordance with the latest TMUTCD.
- The contractor shall be responsible for maintaining all traffic control devices on an around-the-clock basis, whether or not work is active. Any deficiencies shall be corrected by the contractor immediately, regardless of time of day.
- Lane closures will not be permitted on arterial roadways before 9:00 am or after 3:00 pm. Violations may result in suspension of all work at the job site for a minimum of 48-hours.
- 5. All temporary traffic control devices shall be removed as soon as practical when they are no longer needed. When work is suspended for short periods of time at the end of the workday, temporary traffic control devices that are no longer appropriate shall be removed or covered. The first violation of this provision will result in a verbal warning to the construction foreman. Subsequent violations will result in suspension of all work at the job site for a minimum of 48-hours.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

The Honorable Carrie Forney Gordon, PhD served as Mayor of Balch Springs, TX from May 2009 – May 2015. In that same year, she also retired from the City of Dallas after 31 years of service as an Urban Planner. Just a year later (2016), she gravitated back to the local government realm as a Zoning Consultant, City Administrator (Wilmer, TX), and member of the Balch Springs Industrial and Economic Development Corporation Board of Directors (Type A). In May 2020, Dr. Gordon was appointed by the Balch Springs City Council to serve a 1-year Mayoral term. Unbeknownst to her, the term would be extended 2-years as an unopposed Mayoral candidate. The voters then extended the term through 2025. Mayor Gordon stands as the longest serving elected official in its 70-year history.

During Dr. Gordon's Mayoral tenure, she has and continues to serve as a "change agent"! Her legacy has left and continues to leave indelible marks in the city's history and region. Here are just a few "seeds" planted and harvested during her administration:

- Unprecedented feat During the 83rd Texas Legislature, spearheaded efforts to successfully consolidate the Dallas County Water Control & Improvement District No. 6 with the City of Balch Springs. Her efforts led to the successful dissolution of one of the largest Municipal Utility Districts in Texas (Senate Bill 1635), to consolidate the delivery of city services and strengthen its economic positioning in Southeast Dallas County. [Water Utilities]
- Worked with Dallas Area Rapid Transit (DART), Star Transit, Dallas County, and the North Central Texas Council of Governments to successfully launch a 'non-DART' public transit partnering program, a framework that spans southeast and southwest Dallas County as partnerships continue to be brokered to meet transit needs. [Transportation]

Background Information

Last fiscal year, Halff Associates created a GIS (Geographical Information System) database which focused on data related to Public Works. This database provides data maps to both the public and secure information for staff. A new GIS project was included in the FY 2023-2024 budget to add map layers pertaining to public safety. The Police and Fire Departments have a need for accessing accurate maps when responding to emergency calls. There is also a need for mapped public safety data such as report history, crime, fire calls, and traffic accidents.

In this project, Halff will update the City's existing GIS data including streets, address points, city facilities, and emergency medical services (EMS) areas provided by the City. This information can be used to inform third-party 911 mapping systems to help ensure that emergency responders arrive at the correct address.

Halff will map City provided public safety data such as crime, fire calls, traffic accidents, etc. Mapping historical calls for service can help prepare responders to know what to expect upon arrive, and provide data to help inform traffic safety decisions.

The updated and newly developed public safety GIS data will be presented to the City for comment to ensure the required data and information are properly represented. Halff will address the City's comments and integrate the updated and newly developed public safety GIS data into the City's Enterprise GIS database. Halff will review the updated and newly developed public safety GIS data and develop public safety GIS web map layers. Halff will add these web map layers to the City's existing public and/or secured web maps or create new public and secured web maps per City's guidance.

Budget Implications

The contract amount of \$37,400 was included in the approved FY 2023-2024 Budget.

Operational Impact

The GIS Public Safety Project will help improve emergency response, serve as a tool for data analysis, and allow for future data integration.

Legal Review

The contract and resolution were approved by the City Attorney.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the contract pertaining to the GIS Public Safety Project.

AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES ON A TASK ORDER BASIS

This Agreement for Professional Engineering Services ("Agreement") is entered into by the <u>City of Hutchins</u> a General Law City of the State of Texas ("Client"), duly authorized to act by the City Council of said Client, and HALFF ASSOCIATES, INC., a Texas corporation, acting through a duly authorized officer ("Engineer""), relative to Engineer providing professional engineering services to Client. Such Task Orders shall be bound by and interpreted by the terms of this Agreement. Task Orders shall be numbered sequentially. Task Orders will be individual stand-alone proposals and when executed by both Parties shall incorporate the terms of this Agreement such that this Agreement shall be amended. Engineer shall perform its obligations under this Agreement as an independent contractor and not as an agent or fiduciary of any other party.
- III. COMPENSATION. Client agrees that Engineer shall be paid for any services requested by Client at the hourly rates reflected on Exhibit A, attached hereto, plus reasonable and necessary reimbursable expenses (Direct Costs) incurred by Engineer in the performance of the requested services. Direct costs shall include, but are not limited to, long distance telephone, postage, equipment, expendables, mileage, subcontractors or special consultants, freight, testing fees, copies, and blueprints. See Exhibit B for the current Unit Pricing Schedule for direct costs. Direct Costs shall be billed at 1.1 times actual costs. If additional services, trips, or expenses are requested, Engineer will not provide such additional services until authorized by Client in writing to proceed.

Engineer agrees to submit monthly statements to Client for basic professional engineering services. These statements will be based upon Engineer's actual services performed and reimbursable expenses incurred, if any, and Client shall endeavor to make prompt payments. Each monthly invoice submitted by Engineer to Client shall be reasonably itemized to show the amount of work performed during that month broken down by the identity of the person(s) performing such work, the amount of time expended by such person(s) in performing that work, the billing rate for each such person, and a brief summary of the work performed by each such person. If Client fails to pay Engineer within thirty (30) calendar days of the receipt of Engineer's invoice, Engineer may, after giving ten (10) calendar days' written notice to Client, suspend professional engineering services until payment is received. Client agrees that Engineer shall be entitled to interest on accounts that are greater than forty-five (45) calendar days and such interest shall be reimbursed to Engineer at a rate of one percent (1%) per month. The assessment of interest on accounts receivable shall not preclude Engineer from suspending services as described above.

IV. CLIENT'S OBLIGATIONS. Client agrees that it will (i) designate a specific person to act as Client's representative, (ii) provide Engineer with any previous studies, reports, data, budget constraints, special Client requirements, or other pertinent information known to Client, when necessitated by a project, (iii) assist Engineer in obtaining access to property necessary for performance of Engineer's work for Client, (iv) make prompt payments in response to Engineer's statements, and (v) respond in a timely fashion to requests from Engineer. Engineer is entitled to rely upon and use, without independent verification and without liability, all information and services provided by Client or Client's representatives.

- V. TERMINATION OF WORK. Either Client or Engineer may terminate this Agreement at any time with or without cause upon giving the other Party ten (10) calendar days' prior written notice. Client agrees that termination of Engineer for Client's convenience shall only be utilized in good faith and shall not be utilized if either the purpose or the result of such termination is the performance of all or part of Engineer's services under this Agreement by Client or by another service provider. Following Engineer's receipt of such termination notice Client shall, within ten (10) calendar days of Client's receipt of Engineer's final invoice, pay Engineer for all services rendered and all costs incurred up to the date of Engineer's receipt of such notice of termination.
- OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS. Upon Engineer's completion of services and receipt of payment in full, Engineer shall grant to Client a non-exclusive license to possess the final drawings and instruments produced in connection with Engineer's performance of the work under this Agreement, if any. Said drawings and instruments may be copied, duplicated, reproduced, and used by Client for the purpose of constructing, operating, and maintaining the improvements. Client agrees that such documents are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by Client or others for purposes outside the Scope of Services of this Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Client understands and agrees that any and all computer programs, GIS applications, proprietary data or processes, and certain other items related to the services performable under this Agreement are and shall remain the sole and exclusive property of Engineer and may not be used or reused, in any form, by Client without the express written authorization of Engineer. Client agrees that any reuse by Client, or by those who obtain said information from or through Client, without written verification or adaptation by Engineer, will be at Client's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Engineer or to Engineer's employees, agents, representatives, officers, directors, affiliates, shareholders, owners, members, managers, attorneys, subsidiary entities, advisors, subconsultants or independent contractors or associates. Engineer may reuse all drawings, reports, data, and other information developed in performing the services described by this Agreement in Engineer's other activities. Under no circumstances shall delivery of electronic files for use by Client be deemed a sale by Engineer, and Engineer makes no warranties, either express or implied, of merchantability or fitness for any particular purpose. In no event shall Engineer be liable for any damages, including but not limited to indirect or consequential damages, as a result of Client's unauthorized use or reuse of the electronic files. Client is aware that differences may exist between the electronic files delivered and the printed hard-copy original documents. In the event of a conflict between the signed original documents prepared by Engineer and any electronic or other files or data provided, it is understood and agreed that the original signed or sealed hard-copy documents shall govern.
- VII. NOTICES. Any notices to be given hereunder by either Party to the other may be affected either by personal delivery, in writing, or by registered or certified mail.
- VIII. SOLE PARTIES AND ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement shall not create any rights or benefits to anyone except Client and Engineer and contains the entire Agreement between the Parties. Oral modifications to this Agreement shall have no force or effect.
- IX. INSURANCE. Engineer shall, at its own expense, purchase, maintain and keep in force throughout the duration of this Agreement and for a period of four (4) years thereafter, professional liability insurance. The limits of liability shall be \$2,000,000 per claim and in the aggregate. Engineer shall submit to Client a certificate of insurance prior to commencing work for Client.
- X. PROMPT PERFORMANCE BY ENGINEER. All services provided by Engineer hereunder shall be performed in accordance with the degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised under similar circumstances by competent members of the engineering profession in the Texas applicable to such engineering services contemplated by this Agreement.
- XI. CLIENT OBJECTION TO PERSONNEL. If at any time after entering into this Agreement Client has any reasonable objection to any of Engineer's personnel, or any personnel, professionals and/or consultants retained by Engineer, Engineer shall promptly propose substitutes to whom Client has no reasonable objection, and Engineer's compensation shall be equitably adjusted to reflect any difference in Engineer's costs occasioned by such substitution.
- XII. ASSIGNMENT. This Agreement is binding on the heirs, successors, and assigns of the Parties hereto. Neither this Agreement, nor any claims, rights, obligations, suits, or duties associated hereto, shall be assigned or assignable by either Client or Engineer without the prior written consent of the other Party. Further, nothing under this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits in this Agreement to anyone other than Engineer and

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Client and all duties and responsibilities undertaken pursuant to this Agreement will be for the sole benefit of and Client and not for the benefit of any other party (no third party beneficiaries).

- XIII. JURISDICTION AND VENUE. This Agreement shall be administered under the substantive laws of the State of Texas (and not its conflicts of law principles) which shall be used to govern all matters arising out of, or relating to, this Agreement and all of the transactions it contemplates, including without limitation, its validity, interpretation, construction, performance, and enforcement. Exclusive venue shall lie in any court of competent jurisdiction in *Dallas County* County, Texas.
- XIV. INTEGRATION, MERGER AND SEVERABILITY. This Agreement and the authorized Task Orders are fully incorporated herein and represent the entire understanding of Client and Engineer. No prior oral or written understanding shall be of any force or effect with respect to those matters covered herein. The Agreement may not be modified or altered except in writing signed by both Parties. This Agreement constitutes, represents, and is intended by the Parties to be the complete and final statement and expression of all the terms and arrangements between the Parties to this Agreement with respect to the matters provided for in this Agreement. This Agreement supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, negotiations, and discussions between the Parties and all such matters are merged into this Agreement. Should any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction or by legislative pronouncement to be void, invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such voiding, invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof, and this Agreement shall be considered as if the entirety of such void, invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained in this Agreement.
- XV. EXCLUSIVITY OF REMEDIES. The Parties acknowledge and agree that the remedies set forth in this Agreement (Agreed Remedies) are and shall remain the Parties' sole and exclusive remedy with respect to any claim arising from, or out of, or related to, the subject matter of this Agreement. The Parties agree that Engineer is to have no liability or responsibility whatsoever to Client for any claim(s) or loss(es) of any nature, except as set forth in this Agreement. No Party shall be able to avoid the limitations expressly set forth in this Agreement by electing to pursue some other remedy.
- XVI. TIMELINESS OF PERFORMANCE. Engineer shall perform its professional services with due and reasonable diligence consistent with sound professional practices.
- XVII. DISPUTE RESOLUTION. In the event of any disagreement or conflict concerning the interpretation of this Agreement, and such disagreement cannot be resolved by the signatories hereto, the signatories agree to schedule a series of no less than two (2) meetings of senior personnel of Client and Engineer in which the disagreement or conflict will be discussed. The first of such meetings will be scheduled as soon as possible following identification of such disagreement or conflict and the second meeting must occur within thirty (30) calendar days following the initial meeting. Subsequent meetings if any may be scheduled upon mutual agreement of the Parties. The Parties agree that these two (2) meetings are conditions precedent to the institution of legal proceedings unless such meetings will adversely affect the rights of one or more of the Parties as such rights relate to statutes of limitation or repose.
- XVIII. PROJECT ENHANCEMENT/BETTERMENT. IF A COMPONENT OF CLIENT'S PROJECT IS OMITTED FROM ENGINEER'S CONTRACT DOCUMENTS DUE TO THE BREACH OF CONTRACT OR NEGLIGENCE OF ENGINEER. ENGINEER WILL NOT BE LIABLE TO CLIENT TO THE EXTENT OF ANY BETTERMENT OR ADDED VALUE TO THE PROJECT. SPECIFICALLY, CLIENT WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE AMOUNT IT WOULD HAVE PAID TO THE CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTOR (OR SUPPLIER OR SUBCONTRACTOR OR OTHER) FOR THE COMPONENT AS IF SUCH HAD BEEN INCLUDED IN ENGINEER'S CONTRACT DOCUMENTS. NOTWITHSTANDING THE FOREGOING, ENGINEER WILL BE RESPONSIBLE, IF AT ALL, TO THE EXTENT REASONABLE AND NECESSARY TO PLACE CLIENT IN THE SAME POSITION IT WOULD HAVE BEEN BUT FOR SUCH BREACH OR NEGLIGENCE, FOR THE REASONABLE (I) RETROFIT EXPENSE, (II) WASTE, OR (III) INTERVENING INCREASE IN THE COST OF THE COMPONENT FURNISHED THROUGH A CHANGE ORDER FROM THE CONTRACTOR. TO THE EXTENT THAT THE CONTRACTOR PROVIDED UNIT PRICING, CLIENT UNDERSTANDS AND AGREES THAT THE ISSUE OF INTERVENING UNIT COST INCREASES WOULD ONLY BE APPLICABLE TO NEWLY IDENTIFIED ITEMS, NOT INCREASES IN QUANTITY OF EXISTING ITEMS.

IF IT IS NECESSARY TO REPLACE A COMPONENT OF THE PROJECT DUE TO THE BREACH OF CONTRACT OR NEGLIGENCE OF ENGINEER, ENGINEER WILL NOT BE LIABLE TO CLIENT FOR THE ENHANCEMENT OR UPGRADE OF THE COMPONENT BEYOND THAT ORIGINALLY INCLUDED IN THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS. IN

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ADDITION, IF THE COMPONENT HAS AN IDENTIFIABLE USEFUL LIFE THAT IS LESS THE SYSTEM/STRUCTURE/IMPROVEMENT ITSELF, THE DAMAGES OF THE OWNER SHALL BE REDUCED TO THE EXTENT THAT THE USEFUL LIFE OF THE COMPONENT WILL BE EXTENDED BY THE REPLACEMENT THEREOF.

SHOULD THERE BE AN ALLEGATION OF ERROR, NEGLIGENCE, BREACH OR OTHER DEFICIENCY IN THE SERVICES OF ENGINEER OR ANY OF ITS CONSULTANTS, AND SHOULD SUCH ALLEGATION RELATE TO A CONDITION, COMPONENT, OR ITEM, IN THE SERVICES OR THE PROJECT THAT IS ALLEGED OR OTHERWISE CLAIMED TO BE INACCURATE OR OMITTED FROM ENGINEER'S DRAWINGS, INSTRUMENTS OR OTHER DOCUMENTS PREPARED UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, IT IS UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BY ALL PARTIES THAT ENGINEER AND ITS CONSULTANT'S LIABILITY, IF ANY, SHALL EXCLUDE ANY AND ALL DAMAGES, COSTS, OR EXPENSES THAT CREATE OR RESULT IN ADDED VALUE, UPGRADE, BETTERMENT OR ENHANCEMENT OF THE PROJECT AS SUCH RELATE TO THE INACCURATE OR OMITTED CONDITION, COMPONENT, OR ITEM AS ORIGINALLY DESIGNED.

XIX. AGREED REMEDIES

- A. IT IS THE INTENT OF THE PARTIES TO THIS AGREEMENT THAT ENGINEER'S SERVICES UNDER THIS AGREEMENT SHALL NOT SUBJECT ENGINEER'S INDIVIDUAL EMPLOYEES, OFFICERS OR DIRECTORS TO ANY PERSONAL LEGAL EXPOSURE FOR CLAIMS AND RISKS ASSOCIATED WITH THE SERVICES THAT ARE EITHER PERFORMED OR PERFORMABLE UNDER THIS AGREEMENT.
- B. IN RECOGNITION OF THE RELATIVE RISKS AND BENEFITS OF THE PROJECT TO BOTH CLIENT AND ENGINEER AND ACKNOWLEDGING THAT THE ALLOCATION OF RISKS AND LIMITATIONS OF REMEDIES ARE BUSINESS UNDERSTANDINGS BETWEEN THE PARTIES AND THESE RISKS AND REMEDIES SHALL APPLY TO ALL POSSIBLE LEGAL THEORIES OF RECOVERY, CLIENT AGREES, TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, AND NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT OR ANY REFERENCE TO INSURANCE OR THE EXISTENCE OF APPLICABLE INSURANCE COVERAGE, THAT THE TOTAL LIABILITY, IN THE AGGREGATE, OF ENGINEER AND ENGINEER'S OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, EMPLOYEES, AGENTS, AND SUBCONSULTANTS TO CLIENT OR TO ANYONE CLAIMING BY, THROUGH OR UNDER CLIENT, FOR ANY AND ALL CLAIMS. LOSSES. COSTS OR DAMAGES WHATSOEVER ARISING OUT OF, RESULTING FROM, OR IN ANY WAY RELATED TO, THE SERVICES UNDER THIS AGREEMENT FROM ANY CAUSE OR CAUSES OF ENGINEER OR ENGINEER'S OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, EMPLOYEES, AGENTS, AND SUBCONSULTANTS, SHALL NOT EXCEED ENGINEER'S FEE RECEIVED FOR THE SERVICES PERFORMED, ADJUSTED DOWNWARD TO ACCOUNT FOR SUBCONSULTANT/SUBCONTRACTOR FEES INCURRED AND REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES, UNDER THIS AGREEMENT OR \$50,000, WHICHEVER IS LOWER. INCREASED LIMITS MAY BE NEGOTIATED FOR ADDITIONAL FEE.
- C. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THE AGREEMENT, ENGINEER SHALL HAVE NO LIABILITY TO CLIENT FOR CONTINGENT, CONSEQUENTIAL OR OTHER INDIRECT DAMAGES INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, DAMAGES FOR LOSS OF USE, REVENUE OR PROFIT; OPERATING COSTS AND FACILITY DOWNTIME; OR OTHER SIMILAR BUSINESS INTERRUPTION LOSSES, HOWEVER, THE SAME MAY BE CAUSED.
- D. <u>CLIENT MAY NOT ASSERT ANY CLAIM AGAINST ENGINEER AFTER THE SHORTER OF (1) THREE (3) YEARS FROM SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION OF SERVICES GIVING RISE TO THE CLAIM, OR (2) THE STATUTE OF LIMITATION PROVIDED BY LAW.</u>
- E. <u>IT IS UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BY BOTH PARTIES TO THIS AGREEMENT THAT THE FIRST TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00) OF REMUNERATION PAID TO ENGINEER UNDER THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE IN CONSIDERATION FOR INDEMNITY/INDEMNIFICATION PROVIDED FOR IN THIS AGREEMENT.</u>
- XX. WAIVER. Any failure by Engineer to require strict compliance with any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver of such provision, and Engineer may subsequently require strict compliance at any time, notwithstanding any prior failure to do so.
- XXI. SIGNATORIES. Client and Engineer mutually warrant and represent that the representation of each who is executing this Agreement on behalf of Client or Engineer, respectively, has full authority to execute this Agreement and bind the entity so represented.

EXHIBIT 'A'

Scope of Services, Fees and Rate Schedule

A. Overview

As requested, and directed by the City of Hutchins, Halff will update the existing GIS data and develop new GIS data to support the City's public safety management and communications. The updated and newly developed public safety related GIS data will be integrated into the City's Enterprise GIS and maintained. Halff has the knowledge and experience developing and hosting GIS solutions.

B. Public Safety GIS Data Development

i. GIS Data Update and Development

Halff will update the City's existing GIS data including streets, address points, city facilities, and emergency medical services (EMS) areas provided by the City. Halff will map City-provided public safety data such as crime, fire calls, traffic accidents, etc. The updated and newly developed public safety GIS data will be presented to the City for comment to ensure the required data and information are properly represented. Halff will address the City's comments and integrate the updated and newly developed public safety GIS data into the City's Enterprise GIS database.

ii. Web Map Development

Halff will review the updated and newly developed public safety GIS data and develop public safety GIS web map layers. Halff will add these web map layers to the City's existing public and/or secured web maps or create new public and secured web maps per City's guidance.

C. Miscellaneous GIS Services

Halff will create a specific task order (Task Order 00) to perform services which are not included in the scope of Public Safety GIS Data Development described in Item B. The Miscellaneous GIS Services Task will support and enhance the GIS services for the City. These services include:

- i. Creation of new datasets or updates to the GIS database hosted by Halff.
- ii. Requests made for new GIS features or functionality.
- iii. Ad hoc data, map and general GIS requests, updates and support.

The compensation for the services under Task Order 00 will be paid at the hourly rates (see Item G for Rate Schedule). Halff will keep Task Order 00 opened until receiving termination notice from the City.

D. Additional Services

Additional services may be requested by the City of Hutchins on a task order basis. Halff will

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develop a separate scope of services and fee schedule for each additional service an approval from the City prior to initiating work on the additional services. Examples of additional services include, but are not limited to:

- i. Developing risk-based prioritization (Water, Sewer) to aid Capital project selection
- ii. Developing a GIS master plan
- iii. Developing utility networks to support service impact analysis
- iv. Integrating a work order and asset management system

E. Service Level Agreement

Data Ownership – All data developed as part of or resulting from the services and work under this Agreement shall be and shall remain the sole and exclusive property of the City. Upon request from the City, Halff agrees to provide the data stored in the hosted GIS database to the City in an Esri ArcGIS File Geodatabase. It is understood and agreed that the ownership of the original data provided by the City remains the property of the City. However, any and all custom functions, interfaces, stored procedures, or calculations developed with and requiring software development (source code, scripting, or machine language) and all other related information, data and software is and shall remain the sole and exclusive property of Halff and the City understands and agrees that this Halff property shall not be provided or otherwise shared with others, including the City.

Background Information

The maintenance agreement pertains to the GIS portal provided by Halff Associates through Esri. This agreement was expected from the beginning of the initial GIS development process, and is a budgeted expense. The hosting agreement allows Halff Associates to provide routine maintenance, troubleshooting, and supports to ensure the GIS portal operates smoothly. It also provides licenses through Esri so that staff members can access the secured portal.

Budget Implications

The annual contract amount is \$7,000, with the option to add additional licenses if needed.

Operational Impact

The hosting agreement will allow staff to have continued use of the GIS system.

Legal Review

The resolution and contract were approved by the City Attorney.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the contract.

AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERING SERVICES ON A DEFINED SCOPE OF SERVICES BASIS

This Agreement for Professional Engineering Services ("Agreement") is entered into by the <u>City of Hutchins</u> a General Law City of the State of Texas ("Client"), duly authorized to act by the City Council of said Client, and HALFF ASSOCIATES, INC., a Texas corporation, acting through a duly authorized officer ("Engineer"), relative to Engineer providing professional engineering services to Client. Client and Engineer may be collectively referred to as the "Parties" or individually as a "Party".

WITNESSETH:

For the mutual promises and benefits herein described, Client and Engineer agree as follows:

- I. TERM OF AGREEMENT. This Agreement shall become effective on the date of its execution by both Parties and shall continue in effect thereafter until terminated as provided herein.
- II. SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY ENGINEER. Engineer shall provide to Client basic engineering services as described in the Scope of Services attachment and fully incorporated herein as "Exhibit A" which services may include, but will not be limited to, those services normally rendered by an engineer to a <u>General Law City</u>. Engineer shall perform its obligations under this Agreement as an independent contractor and not as an agent or fiduciary of any other party.
- III. COMPENSATION. Client agrees to pay monthly itemized invoices or their undisputed portions within thirty (30) calendar days of receipt from Engineer. Payment later than thirty (30) calendar days shall include interest at one percent (1%) per month or lesser maximum enforceable interest rate, from the date Client received the invoice until the date Engineer receives payment. Such interest is due and payable when the overdue payment is made.

It is understood and agreed by the Parties that Engineer's receipt of payment(s) from Client is not contingent upon Client's receipt of payment, funding, reimbursement, or any other remuneration from others.

Time-related charges will be billed as specified in this Agreement. Unless stated otherwise in this Agreement, direct expenses, subcontracted services, and direct costs will be billed at actual cost plus a service charge of ten percent (10%). Mileage will be billed at current IRS rates.

- IV. CLIENT'S OBLIGATIONS. Client agrees that it will (i) designate a specific person to act as Client's representative, (ii) provide Engineer with any previous studies, reports, data, budget constraints, special Client requirements, or other pertinent information known to Client, when necessitated by a project, (iii) provide site access, and to provide those services described in the attached Scope of Services, assist Engineer in obtaining access to property necessary for performance of Engineer's work for Client, (iv) make prompt payments in response to Engineer's statements and (v) respond in a timely manner to requests from Engineer. Engineer is entitled to rely upon and use, without independent verification and without liability, all information and services provided by Client or Client's representatives.
- V. TERMINATION OF WORK. Either Client or Engineer may terminate this Agreement at any time with or without cause upon giving the other Party ten (10) calendar days' prior written notice. Client agrees that termination of Engineer for Client's convenience shall only be utilized in good faith and shall not be utilized if either the purpose or the result of such termination is the performance of all or part of Engineer's services under this Agreement by Client or by another service provider. Following Engineer's receipt of such termination notice Client shall, within ten (10) calendar days of Client's receipt of Engineer's final invoice, pay Engineer for all services rendered and all costs incurred up to the date of Engineer's receipt of such notice of termination.
- VI. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS. Upon Engineer's completion of services and receipt of payment in full, Engineer shall grant to Client a non-exclusive license to possess the final drawings and instruments produced in connection with Engineer's performance of the work under this Agreement, if any. Said drawings and instruments may be copied, duplicated, reproduced, and used by Client for the purpose of constructing, operating, and maintaining the improvements. Client agrees that such documents are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by Client or others for purposes outside the Scope of Services of this Agreement. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Client

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understands and agrees that any and all computer programs, GIS applications, proprietary data or pro certain other items related to the services performable under this Agreement are and shall remain the sole and exclusive property of Engineer and may not be used or reused, in any form, by Client without the express written authorization of Engineer. Client agrees that any reuse by Client, or by those who obtain said information from or through Client, without written verification or adaptation by Engineer, will be at Client's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Engineer or to Engineer's employees, agents, representatives, officers, directors, affiliates, shareholders, owners, members, managers, attorneys, subsidiary entities, advisors, subconsultants or independent contractors or associates. Engineer may reuse all drawings, reports, data, and other information developed in performing the services described by this Agreement in Engineer's other activities. Under no circumstances shall delivery of electronic files for use by Client be deemed a sale by Engineer, and Engineer makes no warranties, either express or implied, of merchantability or fitness for any particular purpose. In no event shall Engineer be liable for any damages, including but not limited to indirect or consequential damages, as a result of Client's unauthorized use or reuse of the electronic files. Client is aware that differences may exist between the electronic files delivered and the printed hard-copy original documents. In the event of a conflict between the signed original documents prepared by Engineer and any electronic or other files or data provided, it is understood and agreed that the original signed or sealed hard-copy documents shall govern.

- VII. NOTICES. Any notices to be given hereunder by either Party to the other may be affected either by personal delivery, in writing, or by registered or certified mail.
- VIII. SOLE PARTIES AND ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement shall not create any rights or benefits to anyone except Client and Engineer and contains the entire Agreement between the Parties. Oral modifications to this Agreement shall have no force or effect.
- IX. INSURANCE. Engineer shall, at its own expense, purchase, maintain and keep in force throughout the duration of this Agreement and for a period of four (4) years thereafter, professional liability insurance. The limits of liability shall be \$2,000,000 per claim and in the aggregate. Engineer shall submit to Client a certificate of insurance prior to commencing any work for Client.
- X. PROMPT PERFORMANCE BY ENGINEER. All services provided by Engineer hereunder shall be performed in accordance with the degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised under similar circumstances by competent members of the engineering profession in the State of Texas applicable to such engineering services contemplated by this Agreement.
- XI. CLIENT OBJECTION TO PERSONNEL. If at any time after entering into this Agreement Client has any reasonable objection to any of Engineer's personnel, or any personnel, professionals and/or consultants retained by Engineer, Engineer shall promptly propose substitutes to whom Client has no reasonable objection, and Engineer's compensation shall be equitably adjusted to reflect any difference in Engineer's costs occasioned by such substitution.
- XII. ASSIGNMENT. This Agreement is binding on the heirs, successors, and assigns of the Parties hereto. Neither this Agreement, nor any claims, rights, obligations, suits, or duties associated hereto, shall be assigned or assignable by either Client or Engineer without the prior written consent of the other Party. Further, nothing under this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits in this Agreement to anyone other than Engineer and Client and all duties and responsibilities undertaken pursuant to this Agreement will be for the sole benefit of Engineer and Client and not for the benefit of any other party (no third party beneficiaries).
- XIII. JURISDICTION AND VENUE. This Agreement shall be administered under the substantive laws of the State of Texas (and not its conflicts of law principles) which shall be used to govern all matters arising out of, or relating to, this Agreement and all of the transactions it contemplates, including without limitation, its validity, interpretation, construction, performance and enforcement. Exclusive venue shall lie in any court of competent jurisdiction in *Dallas County* County, Texas.
- XIV. INTEGRATION, MERGER AND SEVERABILITY. This Agreement and the Scope of Services, including fee and schedule are fully incorporated herein and represent the entire understanding of Client and Engineer. No prior oral or written understanding shall be of any force or effect with respect to those matters covered herein. The Agreement may not be modified or altered except in writing signed by both Parties. This Agreement constitutes, represents and is intended by the Parties to be the complete and final statement and expression of all the terms and arrangements between the Parties to this Agreement with respect to the matters provided for in this Agreement. This Agreement

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supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, negotiations, and between the Parties and all such matters are merged into this Agreement. Should any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction or by legislative pronouncement to be void, invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such voiding, invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof, and this Agreement shall be considered as if the entirety of such void, invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained in this Agreement.

- XV. EXCLUSIVITY OF REMEDIES. The Parties acknowledge and agree that the remedies set forth in this Agreement (Agreed Remedies) are and shall remain the Parties' sole and exclusive remedy with respect to any claim arising from, or out of, or related to, the subject matter of this Agreement. The Parties agree that Engineer is to have no liability or responsibility whatsoever to Client for any claim(s) or loss(es) of any nature, except as set forth in this Agreement. No Party shall be able to avoid the limitations expressly set forth in this Agreement by electing to pursue some other remedy.
- XVI. TIMELINESS OF PERFORMANCE. Engineer shall perform its professional services with due and reasonable diligence consistent with sound professional practices.
- XVII. DISPUTE RESOLUTION. In the event of any disagreement or conflict concerning the interpretation of this Agreement, and such disagreement cannot be resolved by the signatories hereto, the signatories agree to schedule a series of no less than two (2) meetings of senior personnel of Client and Engineer in which the disagreement or conflict will be discussed. The first of such meetings will be scheduled as soon as possible following identification of such disagreement or conflict and the second meeting must occur within thirty (30) calendar days following the initial meeting. Subsequent meetings, if any, may be scheduled upon mutual agreement of the Parties. The Parties agree that these two (2) meetings are conditions precedent to the institution of legal proceedings unless such meetings will adversely affect the rights of one or more of the Parties as such rights relate to statutes of limitation or repose.
- XVIII. PROJECT ENHANCEMENT/BETTERMENT. IF A COMPONENT OF CLIENT'S PROJECT IS OMITTED FROM ENGINEER'S CONTRACT DOCUMENTS DUE TO THE BREACH OF CONTRACT OR NEGLIGENCE OF ENGINEER, ENGINEER WILL NOT BE LIABLE TO CLIENT TO THE EXTENT OF ANY BETTERMENT OR ADDED VALUE TO THE PROJECT. SPECIFICALLY, CLIENT WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE AMOUNT IT WOULD HAVE PAID TO THE CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTOR (OR SUPPLIER OR SUBCONTRACTOR OR OTHER) FOR THE COMPONENT AS IF SUCH HAD BEEN INCLUDED IN ENGINEER'S CONTRACT DOCUMENTS. NOTWITHSTANDING THE FOREGOING, ENGINEER WILL BE RESPONSIBLE, IF AT ALL. TO THE EXTENT REASONABLE AND NECESSARY TO PLACE CLIENT IN THE SAME POSITION IT WOULD HAVE BEEN BUT FOR SUCH BREACH OR NEGLIGENCE, FOR THE REASONABLE (I) RETROFIT EXPENSE, (II) WASTE, OR (III) INTERVENING INCREASE IN THE COST OF THE COMPONENT FURNISHED THROUGH A CHANGE ORDER FROM THE CONTRACTOR. TO THE EXTENT THAT THE CONTRACTOR PROVIDED UNIT PRICING, CLIENT UNDERSTANDS AND AGREES THAT THE ISSUE OF INTERVENING UNIT COST INCREASES WOULD ONLY BE APPLICABLE TO NEWLY IDENTIFIED ITEMS, NOT INCREASES IN QUANTITY OF EXISTING ITEMS.

IF IT IS NECESSARY TO REPLACE A COMPONENT OF THE PROJECT DUE TO THE BREACH OF CONTRACT OR NEGLIGENCE OF ENGINEER, ENGINEER WILL NOT BE LIABLE TO CLIENT FOR THE ENHANCEMENT OR UPGRADE OF THE COMPONENT BEYOND THAT ORIGINALLY INCLUDED IN THE CONTRACT DOCUMENTS. IN ADDITION, IF THE COMPONENT HAS AN IDENTIFIABLE USEFUL LIFE THAT IS LESS THAN THE SYSTEM/STRUCTURE/IMPROVEMENT ITSELF, THE DAMAGES OF THE OWNER SHALL BE REDUCED TO THE EXTENT THAT THE USEFUL LIFE OF THE COMPONENT WILL BE EXTENDED BY THE REPLACEMENT THEREOF.

SHOULD THERE BE AN ALLEGATION OF ERROR, NEGLIGENCE, BREACH OR OTHER DEFICIENCY IN THE SERVICES OF ENGINEER OR ANY OF ITS CONSULTANTS, AND SHOULD SUCH ALLEGATION RELATE TO A CONDITION, COMPONENT, OR ITEM IN THE SERVICES OR THE PROJECT THAT IS ALLEGED OR OTHERWISE CLAIMED TO BE INACCURATE OR OMITTED FROM ENGINEER'S DRAWINGS, INSTRUMENTS OR OTHER DOCUMENTS PREPARED UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, IT IS UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BY ALL PARTIES THAT ENGINEER AND ITS CONSULTANT'S LIABILITY, IF ANY, SHALL EXCLUDE ANY AND ALL DAMAGES, COSTS, OR EXPENSES THAT CREATE OR RESULT IN ADDED VALUE, UPGRADE, BETTERMENT OR ENHANCEMENT OF THE PROJECT AS SUCH RELATE TO THE INACCURATE OR OMITTED CONDITION, COMPONENT, OR ITEM AS ORIGINALLY DESIGNED.

XIX. AGREED REMEDIES

- A. <u>IT IS THE INTENT OF THE PARTIES TO THIS AGREEMENT THAT ENGINEER'S SERVICES UNDER THIS AGREEMENT SHALL NOT SUBJECT ENGINEER'S INDIVIDUAL EMPLOYEES, OFFICERS OR DIRECTORS TO ANY PERSONAL LEGAL EXPOSURE FOR CLAIMS AND RISKS ASSOCIATED WITH THE SERVICES THAT ARE EITHER PERFORMED OR PERFORMABLE UNDER THIS AGREEMENT.</u>
- B. IN RECOGNITION OF THE RELATIVE RISKS AND BENEFITS OF THE PROJECT TO BOTH CLIENT AND ENGINEER AND ACKNOWLEDGING THAT THE ALLOCATION OF RISKS AND LIMITATIONS OF REMEDIES ARE BUSINESS UNDERSTANDINGS BETWEEN THE PARTIES AND THESE RISKS AND REMEDIES SHALL APPLY TO ALL POSSIBLE LEGAL THEORIES OF RECOVERY, CLIENT AGREES, TO THE FULLEST EXTENT PERMITTED BY LAW, AND NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT OR ANY REFERENCE TO INSURANCE OR THE EXISTENCE OF APPLICABLE INSURANCE COVERAGE, THAT THE TOTAL LIABILITY, IN THE AGGREGATE, OF ENGINEER AND ENGINEER'S OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, EMPLOYEES, AGENTS, AND SUBCONSULTANTS TO CLIENT OR TO ANYONE CLAIMING BY, THROUGH OR UNDER CLIENT, FOR ANY AND ALL CLAIMS, LOSSES, COSTS OR DAMAGES WHATSOEVER ARISING OUT OF, RESULTING FROM, OR IN ANY WAY RELATED TO, THE SERVICES UNDER THIS AGREEMENT FROM ANY CAUSE OR CAUSES OF ENGINEER OR ENGINEER'S OFFICERS, DIRECTORS, EMPLOYEES, AGENTS, AND SUBCONSULTANTS, SHALL NOT EXCEED ENGINEER'S FEE RECEIVED FOR THE SERVICES PERFORMED, ADJUSTED DOWNWARD TO ACCOUNT FOR SUBCONSULTANT/SUBCONTRACTOR FEES INCURRED AND REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES UNDER THIS AGREEMENT OR \$50,000, WHICHEVER IS LOWER. INCREASED LIMITS MAY BE NEGOTIATED FOR AN ADDITIONAL FEE.
- C. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THE AGREEMENT, ENGINEER SHALL HAVE NO LIABILITY TO CLIENT FOR CONTINGENT, CONSEQUENTIAL OR OTHER INDIRECT DAMAGES INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, DAMAGES FOR LOSS OF USE, REVENUE OR PROFIT; OPERATING COSTS AND FACILITY DOWNTIME; OR OTHER SIMILAR BUSINESS INTERRUPTION LOSSES, HOWEVER, THE SAME MAY BE CAUSED.
- D. <u>CLIENT MAY NOT ASSERT ANY CLAIM AGAINST ENGINEER AFTER THE SHORTER OF (1) THREE (3) YEARS FROM SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION OF SERVICES GIVING RISE TO THE CLAIM, OR (2) THE STATUTE OF LIMITATION PROVIDED BY LAW.</u>
- E. <u>IT IS UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BY BOTH PARTIES TO THIS AGREEMENT THAT THE FIRST TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00) OF REMUNERATION PAID TO ENGINEER UNDER THIS AGREEMENT SHALL BE IN CONSIDERATION FOR INDEMNITY/INDEMNIFICATION PROVIDED FOR IN THIS AGREEMENT.</u>
- XX. WAIVER. Any failure by Engineer to require strict compliance with any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver of such provision, and Engineer may subsequently require strict compliance at any time, notwithstanding any prior failure to do so.
- XXI. SIGNATORIES. Client and Engineer mutually warrant and represent that the representation of each who is executing this Agreement on behalf of Client or Engineer, respectively, has full authority to execute this Agreement and bind the entity so represented.

EXHIBIT 'A'

Scope of Services, Fees and Rate Schedule

A. Overview

As requested, and directed by the City of Hutchins, Halff will provide and maintain enterprise GIS hosting services. Halff has the knowledge and experience developing and hosting GIS solutions. Halff's hosting capabilities allow City staff to access their GIS data via web maps using current web browsers running on desktop, laptop, or mobile devices.

B. GIS Hosting Services

Halff will provide the computer resources required for the hosted solution, which will include the GIS database, web maps, and mobile GIS applications. Halff will provide general supporting for city staff up to 20 hours annually for the hosted solution. The general supporting includes items below:

- 1. Troubleshooting and answering questions through email, phone, and video conference communication technologies.
- 2. Managing user accounts on the Web Map Portal.
- 3. Updating Esri's GIS applications as applicable.

Halff will continue providing hosting services on an annual basis to coincide with the City's fiscal year unless the City notifies Halff in writing to terminate the service.

C. Service Level Agreement

- Hosting Environment The web maps and GIS database will be hosted on Halff's corporate servers which physically reside in Richardson, TX. Halff's IT department has a formal backup and disaster recovery plan in place which includes offsite virtualized servers, emergency power backup (short term and long term), and redundant internet connections. The hosting service includes server monitoring, data backups, security and user account administration, database administration, web map monitoring, and access to the ArcGIS Field Maps App (iOS/Android).
- 2. Level of Service Halff's server availability goal is 99.0% fully operational for our hosted solutions, excluding regularly scheduled maintenance.
- 3. User Access The hosted solution requires the use of named user accounts to access the web maps and mobile GIS applications, unless specifically published for public consumption. License allocation included with the annual hosting services for the City of Hutchins will be:
 - a. Four (4) Viewer accounts
 - b. Three (3) Editor accounts
 - c. Two (2) Field Data Collector add-on licenses
- 4. Support Halff will provide up to twenty (20) hours of support annually through email, phone, and video conference communication technologies.
- 5. Annual Hosted Solution Term and Fee The hosted solution provided by Halff will have a term of 1 year with a fee of \$7,000. The hosting fee includes the hosting environment, level of service, user access and support. Additional user access licenses and support

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hours can be added at any time, the annual hosting fee will be adjusted based o schedule and Esri requirements. The annual hosting agreement will automatically renew each year unless the City notifies Halff in writing at least 30 days prior to the annual renewal data.

The Municipal Court is currently facing a significant surge in cases due to a rise in the number of citations issued by the police department. Therefore, the court needs a part-time/temporary employee to help prepare the monthly court settings, assist with bilingual cases, and assist in processing court documents.

The Municipal Court is operated by a single Municipal Court Administrator. However, the Administrator relies on the City Secretary, who also works alone, for assistance with bilingual translations and providing information to defendants. The court schedules monthly court proceedings three times a month, but due to the increase in citations, the dockets have been growing the past few months.

The impact on the budget would be an additional \$5,000 to cover the cost of a part-time employee working 20 hours a month for three months.

WHEREAS, on September 5, 2023, the City Council of the City of Hutchins approved Ordinance Number **2023-1179** officially adopting the Fiscal Year 2023/2024 Budget; and
