Background Information

In 2018 City Council approved and adopted the 2018 Roadway Impact Fee update which included charging impact fees based on total acreage in lieu of charging the fees based on the square footage of the proposed facility. It has been brought to staffs attention that this may be something council would like to discuss and potentially change. Staff has compared the 2023 fees to other cities in the metroplex and found that Hutchins has actually been lower than other cities in the area.

Roadway Impact Fees are imposed upon any new development (which includes expansion of existing facilities) to generate revenue for funding or recouping the costs of capital improvements or facility expansions to these systems necessitated by or attributable to the new developments' demand on these systems. The Roadway Impact Fees are calculated using Service Units, which are a standardized measure of consumption or use (supply and demand) of the roads in the city by new development and are calculated in accordance with generally accepted engineering or planning standards for Roadway Systems' capital improvements or facility expansion. The total impact fee due is determined by the land use, the location of the development, and the square footage of the building.

ORDINANCE NO. 3356

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, TEXAS, APPROVING REVISED COLLECTION SCHEDULES FOR WATER, WASTEWATER, AND ROADWAY IMPACT FEES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Chapter 395, Tex. Loc. Gov't Code, provides procedures for adopting and updating land use assumptions, capital improvements plans, and impact fees; and

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Waxahachie, Texas, adopted land use assumptions, capital improvements plans and impact fees for water and wastewater facilities in accordance with statutory procedures and established provisions for administering its impact fee program through Ordinance No. 2092, adopted August 20, 2001; and

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Waxahachie, Texas, adopted land use assumptions, a capital improvement plan and impact fees for roadway facilities in accordance with statutory procedures and established provisions for administering its impact fee program through Ordinance No. 2494, adopted November 17, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the City Council last approved updated land use assumptions and capital improvements plans for water and wastewater facilities by Ordinance No. 3239, adopted December 7, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the City last updated its Water and Wastewater Schedule 1 and 2 rates for collecting impact fees by Ordinance No. 3239, adopted December 7, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the City Council last approved updated land use assumptions and capital improvements plans for roadway facilities by Ordinance No. 3239, adopted December 7, 2020, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the City last updated its Roadway Schedule 1 and 2 rates for collecting impact fees by Ordinance No. 3239 adopted December 7, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the City of Waxahachie has appointed an Impact Fee Capital Improvements Advisory Committee to advise the City Council concerning amendments to and adoption of the land use assumptions, impact fee capital improvements plans, and impact fees for water, wastewater, and roadway facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City has retained consultants to prepare and/or update land use assumptions, capital improvements plans, and impact fees for water, wastewater, and roadway facilities; and

WHEREAS, the capital improvements plans and impact fees for water, wastewater, and roadway facilities were prepared by a qualified professional engineer; and

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WHEREAS, notice has been published, public hearing held, and the written recommendations of the Impact Fee Capital Improvements Advisory Committee received concerning revised land use assumptions, impact fee capital improvements plans, and the assessment of impact fees for water, wastewater, and roadway facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City to adopt updated land use assumptions, capital improvements plans, and impact fees for water, wastewater and roadway facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that in all things the City has complied with Chapter 395 of the Texas Local Government Code in the notice, adoption, promulgation, and methodology necessary to adopt impact fees; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance is intended to and satisfies the statutory requirements for adoption of land use assumptions, capital improvements plans and impact fees; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WAXAHACHIE, TEXAS THAT:

Section 1. Schedule Two. Schedule 2 for water, wastewater, and roadway facilities is hereby updated, setting forth the maximum collection rate per service unit to be charged against new development for water, wastewater, and roadway facilities, which schedule is attached hereto as Exhibit A, and is incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth. City Council may increase or decrease the maximum collection rate for water, wastewater, and roadway facilities, but in no event may the maximum collection rate be set higher than the maximum assessment rate for water, wastewater, and roadway facilities.

Section 2. Provisions Cumulative; Conflicts. This ordinance shall be and is hereby declared to be cumulative of all other ordinances of the City of Waxahachie, and this ordinance shall not operate to repeal or affect any of such other ordinances except insofar as the provisions thereof might be inconsistent or in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, in which event such conflicting provisions, if any in such other ordinance or ordinances are hereby superseded.

Section 3. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, such holding shall not affect the validity of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance. The remaining portions of this ordinance.

Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after approval. The collection rates to the maximums will start on April 1, 2023.

 - (1) Nonprofits will be reduced by 75%. The nonprofit must be 501(c)(3) and the owner of the building.
 - (2) Dining uses identified in the impact fee study's LUVMET will be reduced by 50%.
 - (3) Other retail uses identified in the impact fee study's LUVMET will be reduced by 50%.
 - (4) Institutional uses identified in the impact fee study's LUVMET will be exempt from impact fees.

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APPENDIX A Roadway Cost Estimates



1.1 Introduction

This document is an update/addendum to the 2016 and 2018 Roadway Impact Fee Studies and Updates, in accordance with the requirements of Chapter 395.052 of the Local Government Code for the City of Hutchins. The parameters of this update include removing certain streets that have been reconstructed since the last update in 2018 and adding roadways identified in the CIP along with construction costs. We were also requested to update the construction cost of traffic signals identified in the 2018 update. All other data remains the same as the 2018 update, including Population Assumptions, Land Use Planning Assumptions, and Existing and Future Capacity, Demand, Deficiencies and Projected New Demand. The 2018 update document, prepared by Bannister Engineering is included for reference (noted in this document as "2018 update").

For ease of reference, this 2023 addendum uses the same table numbers as the 2018 update, with the updated tables noted (see List of Tables).

1.2 Maximum Allowable Roadway Impact Fee

The updated cost, including finance costs of the roadway capital improvements that serve growth projected from new developments for years 2016 to 2026 is \$106,134,664. Finance costs are

based on 5% interest over 20-year bonds. The projected increase in the number of roadway service units for the ten (10) year impact fee period is derived from the 2018 update and remains at 39,059. The maximum allowable roadway impact fee calculation is shown in Table 1.1 (updated), below:



Background Information

The police department currently utilizes a DGI mavic pro drone. This drone does not have infrared capabilities and does not have the ability of two-way communications. This drone is a multipurpose drone that anyone from the public can purchase from a local source. Due to the popularity of drones and commercial use the FAA is now requiring remote ID from all drones flying in public air space. This law went into effect September 16, 2023. The DGI drone does not have remote ID however it can be adapted with an additional module. The DGI drone does not have Infrared therefore it cannot be used for search missions.

During budget discussions the Police department requested the purchase a new LEMUR II drone that is specific to Law Enforcement and is capable of flying indoors, outdoors, and capable of daytime and nighttime searches, and capable of remote two-way communications. The enhanced capabilities of this drone will help in the event of building searches, searches where communication needs to be established with a known suspect, can be flown indoors to search large warehouses more efficiently and keeping officers safe when a know assailant is present. The LMEUR drone also has infrared capabilities for use during night search missions and meets all current FAA standards for remote ID.

Budget Implications

The purchase of a new Police department drone was approved in the 2023/2024 budget. The Police department respectfully request to move forward with the purchase of the LEMUR II drone.

SECTION 2. This resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.





- 1/ 4K Day Time, Night Vision & Thermal Sensors, with a FLIR Lepton[®] sensor onboard, white light strobe light and night vision illuminator.
- 2/ Makes Realtime Floorplans, which is streamed to the controller as a 2D map and the accompanying BRINC LiveOps platform as a 3D map.
- **3/ Glass Breaker Attachment**, for making entry into structures or ventilating buildings.
- 4/ 2-Way Communications, where officers can call the drone to communicate through the LEMUR 2's integrated microphone and loudspeaker.
- 5/ Mesh Networking, each LEMUR 2 meshes with other drones, controllers and body born radios for extended range in complex scenarios.
- 6/ Offsite Access, via an optional 4G connection, LEMUR 2 streams a live video feed and map data to the accompanying BRINC LiveOps web app.
