Notes on potential plastic reduction requirements & efforts

Project option: transition to hand dryers instead of paper towels with trash bins in restrooms

Policy option:

- Plastic disposable water bottles
  - a. Single-use disposable plastic water bottles shall only be used in situations where government worker conditions are not sanitary.
  - b. Assuming budget allowance, all new City employees shall be offered a free reusable water bottle upon start of employment.

Plastic cutlery, cups, and plates

- c. Government workers shall not use City funds to purchase plastic single use disposable cutlery, cups, and plates.
- d. Prior to contract and/or ordering approval, the City shall ask if the contractor/temporary vendor is able to provide plastic free cutlery, cups, and plates.
- e. Internal City staff events
  - a. Where compostable or plastic-free cutlery, cups, and plates are able to be used, the City Sustainability Manager shall be responsible for having designated compost waste bins available with proper signage for disposal.

Special events permits

- a. No person shall use balloons or plastic confetti in any outdoor area of city property.
- b. No person shall use polystyrene foam food ware or unencapsulated polystyrene foam products on city property for special events.

Enforcement

- a. Following adoption of this policy, the City Sustainability Manager and Environmental Sustainability Board shall engage in public education efforts to inform affected persons and entities of the provisions of this article and to provide assistance with identifying environmentally friendly alternatives to the prohibited items.
- b. Enforcement for special event permits:
  - i. First violation: written warning;
  - ii. Second violation: \$25 fine;
  - iii. Third and subsequent violations: \$50 fine.

# 2024 ANNUAL REPORT

# **NOTE FROM BOARD CHAIR**

## **1**. Community Projects

This year the board contributed funds for two community projects including the Brooklyn Creek Bird Sanctuary and Brooklyn Community Garden. These small community sponsorships are a pilot initiative the board has started to sponsor important projects in the community that are implementing sustainability and/or environmental projects.

The Brooklyn Creek Bird Sanctuary is now a destination in Sullivan Park for bird watchers, nature lovers, and more. ESB funds went towards four birdhouses and a feeding station for all to enjoy.



The next project sponsored was ADA-assessible garden beds for the Brooklyn Community Garden. ESB recognizes a sustainable Hendersonville needs to prioritize the accessibility for all community members.

Continuing again this year, the board also sponsored 18 classrooms through the Symbolic Monarch Migration educational program which mimics the monarchs' journey by engaging more than 10,000 children from across the United States and Canada in creating paper butterflies to send to students in Mexico.

The last community sponsorship was to Caregivers of Mother Earth for their "Everyday is Earth Day" signs which were featured at Hendo Earth Fest. The signs provide simple actions anyone can take to reduce their impact on the environment.



## 2. Hendo Earth Fest

This year marked the second annual Hendo Earth Fest which has become a widely popular and successful festival that saw 3,000+ visitors, included 46 exhibitors as well as 7 engaging musical acts.

The purpose of the Hendo Earth Fest is to promote community education for all ages on environmental and sustainable practices, inspire action, and renew and expand commitments to protect our planet. Local and regional environmental allies focus on participation/hands-on activities and demonstrations designed to educate, renew and expand action to protect our Western North Carolina environment and natural resources.

Multiple ESB members led the sub-committee to plan the festival which also included partnering with non-profits and other community groups.



## 3. Sustainability Hero Award

This year marked the second annual Sustainability Hero Award which celebrates outstanding achievement in the pursuit of the City's commitment to lead by example in pursuing environmentally sustainable practices critical to preserving the community for future generations. The Sustainability Hero award honors an individual City employee or team that is a champion for change and is responsible for development and implementation of sustainability practices in Hendersonville and the surrounding community. This year, the board recognized Public Works Superintendent, Brandon Mundy for his work with the City's brush collection program reducing fuel and staff resources, analyzing the trash and recycling routes, and implementing a tracking system.

"Sometimes, it's as simple as looking at what services the city is already providing and finding ways to improve them so they are more efficient and thus more sustainable," said ESB board member Mary Ellen Kustin. "We commend this year's recipient for doing just that."

## 4. Sustainability Demonstration Station

New for the board was the approval for establishing the first Sustainability Demonstration Station. This project, led by the board's Waste Reduction Subcommittee, will demonstrates multiple sustainability practices community members can implement at their own homes with a focus on composting and will offer the City's first small scale community compost drop off location. Phase 1 of the project will be completed in the 2024 fiscal year with the last phase 2 completed in fiscal year 2025.



## 5. Mayor's Monarch Pledge & Bee City USA

The board submits the yearly report for the Mayor's Monarch Pledge which is a yearly commitment to raise awareness for the decline in the Monarch butterfly and is

organized by the National Wildlife Federation. The board also incorporates pollinator education in Hendo Earth Fest to assist in meeting the annual Bee City USA requirements.
