Re: Discussion: Capital Improvement Plan (CIP)

#### **Objective:**

To update the Town Council on revisions to the FY25-30 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), including the addition of two new projects, the removal of five obsolete or completed projects, and the adjusted project timelines and budget totals.

#### **Summary:**

The CIP has been updated to reflect current priorities and completed projects. The changes ensure the plan aligns with the Town's strategic goals and fiscal capacity.

#### Additions to the CIP:

- 1. Talichet Lift Station Upgrades (\$150,000 in FY25)
- 2. Central Park Basketball Court Refinishing (\$50,000 in FY26)

#### Removed Projects:

The following projects have been removed from the CIP as they are either obsolete or completed:

- 1. Acquire Drake Point Water-Wastewater System:
  - o Obsolete; Drake Point is no longer creating its own utility infrastructure.
- 2. Drilling for Wells 5 & 6:
  - o Completed.
- 3. Wastewater Treatment Plant Construction:
  - o Obsolete; the Town is not planning to build its own wastewater treatment plant.
- 4. Water Master Plan:
  - o Completed.
- 5. Water Tower Repair and Painting:
  - o Obsolete; the Council decided against this project after obtaining 50% grant funding.

#### **Fiscal Impact:**

There are \$24,035,000 in projects in the FY25-FY30 period.

#### **Staff Recommendation:**

At this time, staff is looking for Council input on the current version of the CIP.

Description of Project (200 words or less):

Cost was determined by the Public Services Director for small stormwater projects for a typical year. For FY25, this is the Town Engineer's estimated costs as required for the application to the LCWA grant to perform a water quality stormwater project along N. Lakeshore.

Public Works Director will be applying for additional grants to cover stormwater projects in the upcoming years.

Justification and Urgency for the Project (When is it required to be complete and why?):

Providing stormwater improvements and water quality improvements throughout the Town is one of the requirements of the Town's FDEP\* Phase II MS4\* NPDES\* Permit. Description of Project (200 words or less):

Using grant funds available from DEP, install gravity flow sewer mains along both South Florida and South Dixie Avenues. Connect all existing houses to new sanitary sewer lines. Suggest line be placed on west side of South Dixie and along East Side of South Florida. Connect new lines via a grinder pump and a small lift station at each side intersecting street (3 each) to the existing force main on west side of South Florida Avenue. Properly abandon all septic tanks currently installed along South Dixie and South Florida Avenues. Require all property owners with existing houses or residences to hook up. Any vacant lots must hook up to sanitary sewer system upon construction. No costs will be assessed to existing house property owners. Town Utility Fund will cover any grant matching or ineligible costs with sewer impact fees. Residents will pay standard monthly sewer charges per utility fund rate schedule in the future to maintain system.

Costs were estimated by Councilor Miles.

Justification and Urgency for the Project (When is it required to be complete and why?):

This project will use existing available grant funds to continue the Town's efforts to provide sanitary sewer service to all properties within Town Boundaries. This is in keeping with County, State, and Federal goals to keep our environment clean and healthy for all residents.

Description of Project (200 words or less):

Due to the projected growth coming to the Howey area, the Town will need to increase the size of the library to accommodate this increase.

The library needs study/meeting rooms to accommodate those who need privacy and quiet to work on school or professional business. The children's area also needs to increase due to an influx of families into our area. An expansion would also allow more shelving to be added for more titles.

Estimated costs were based on the actual costs of a previous expansion, and are limited by the annual request limit.
