1. Why do you want to serve on the Hyrum City Council?

I have been a resident in Hyrum City for five years. I love the location, the community and the people I have come to know here. I am a native Utahn, but lived in the Maryland for several years before returning to Utah.

I co-founded a company that brought broadband and enhanced public safety capabilities to rural communities in the Northeast, and have had the opportunity to work closely with many of the local county and city governments in Pennsylvania, New York, Maryland, Delaware, Ohio and West Virginia.

I believe that I have something to contribute, and would like to give back to this wonderful community in which I live.

2. What do you hope to accomplish as a City Council Member?

I see my role as an advocate for the members of our community. I want to understand the city's budget and priorities and provide support and guidance to ensure that the dollars that support Hyrum are utilized properly and effectively. I realize that growth is inevitable, but I hope to be able to provide input for the City's long-term plans for economic development and growth, while also considering the impact on our current quality of life and the capacity of our city systems to support that growth.

3. What is your vision for Hyrum City, and what role will you play in realizing that vision?

Hyrum is a rapidly growing community. While I do not want to discourage growth, it needs to take into account the demands for water, power, sewer and traffic infrastructure required to support that growth, while preserving the quality of life for the residents that live here. As a Council member, I would work with my associates on the City Council to provide the needed direction to accommodate our community needs and capacity vs growth.

4. If you could change one thing in the city, what would it be?

I believe that we could do a better job of enforcing the existing ordinances on the books, including those regarding animals and some of the industrial business activities that take place within the city limits. We should enforce the existing code, and if there are areas we need to change, I would make recommendations to effect those changes.

5. What is your understanding of the city budget?

Hyrum's budget is more complex than most of the communities in Cache Valley. Along with the typical maintenance, emergency services and parks budgets, Hyrum also has a power utility, sewer system and culinary and secondary water systems that are not found in many other communities the size of Hyrum.

Hyrum is fortunate to have good employees, and is a well-run city, compared to others that I have worked with. That said, I believe that there are always improvements that can be made as we direct the city funds to meet the needs and improve the amenities that Hyrum residents are privileged to enjoy.

6. Have you followed the City Council meetings last year? What do you believe that they have done well, and what could they have done better?

I have not watched or followed the city council meetings over the last year. Up to now, my time has been focused on my own company that I co-founded in 2004.

7. Have you previously served on a governing board of any type or as a leader in any organization? If so, please list your role and number of years served.

I am currently serving as Executive VP of Komodo Systems (merged with Conxx, Inc. in 2019), and have been in executive leadership roles since Conxx was formed in 2004. I have also served as an LDS bishop in Maryland for six years. I served on the Board of Directors for Conxx, Inc., and also with Skypacket and Conxx NE, which are entities that were all part of the original company we founded in 2004 but later spun off into their own operating companies. I resigned as a director of those entities in 2022 to focus on my work with Komodo Systems, but have retained my shares of interest in those companies.

8. Please tell us about any other activities, specialized skills, knowledge, or professional experience that would contribute to your effectiveness in serving on the City Council.

While I have not served on any local government boards or committees, I have worked with many of them in local governments across Pennsylvania, New York, Maryland, Delaware, West Virginia and Ohio. Our company focused on delivering public safety and rural broadband networks that serve those communities on a single platform that could meet both the local government communication requirements as well as public broadband needs. All of these communities were rural in nature, not unlike Hyrum.

We have since branched out in working with some of the largest utilities in the Northeast doing network engineering and providing state of the art network management for their critical network monitoring their power grid and natural gas systems. Our customers

include Commonwealth Edison (Chicago), Baltimore Gas & Electric, Philadelphia Electric, PEPCO (Washington DC), Delmarva Power (Delaware) and ACE (New Jersey). My background in working with these companies gives me a useful perspective as it relates to Hyrum Power.

9. If you could change one thing in our development code, what would it be and why?

I have not had a chance to review the city's development code. However, I have been concerned about the rapid growth and the very large projects that I have heard that have been proposed.

I was also concerned about the inclusion of Nibley into our sewer system, and that it will drive the capacity up to the point where it appears we must expand the plant sooner than was originally anticipated.

I have also watched the development that has been going off-and-on at the corner of 300 E and Main Street that to me has seemed a disaster, both for the developer and for the neighbors in that area.

I believe that there are areas of the code that we need to look at, but as I am filing this at short notice, I have not had the opportunity to familiarize myself with the current development code.

10. What do you believe are the three greatest strengths of Hyrum City?

I would have to start with the people. The people I have met and have come to know are wonderful, good people.

The second strength are the recreational and learning amenities that the City either owns or that that are in the area nearby. The City has a wonderful set of parks both in the City and up the canyon. My family has really enjoyed those venues, and we have appreciated a city that has taken the time and invested the resources to create and maintain those venues. And I must mention the Hyrum City Library. With the debacle we are watching with the county's library system, I appreciate the fact we have a wonderful library to serve our community. We also enjoy the museum and the Elite Hall.

The third is the infrastructure. The fact that Hyrum owns the power grid, the sewer system and water systems, it provides a level of local control that most other communities lack. Having come from a community in Maryland where my power, water and sewer bills were four times the cost of what it is here highlights a big reason Hyrum is such an affordable place to live. I see much of that as a result of the City's foresight to develop those resources.

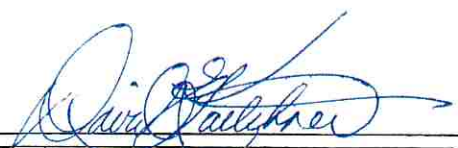

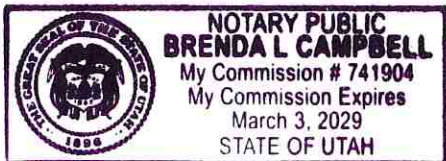

Subject: Resolution 26-12 – A resolution appointing UAMPS Member Representatives.

Summary: UAMPS requires the City Council to approve a Resolution appointing Hyrum City’s Representative and Alternate Representatives to serve and attend UAMPS Meetings. Mayor Steve Miller is recommending the replacement of former City Councilmember Adams with City Councilmember Michael Nelson as the second alternate representative to UAMPS.

An appointed member serving as Hyrum City’s representative to Utah Associated Municipal Power Systems (UAMPS) is responsible for representing the interests of Hyrum City in matters related to power supply, energy resources, and long-term utility planning. This role includes attending UAMPS meetings, participating in discussions and votes on policies, budgets, contracts, and power projects, and staying informed about regulatory, financial, and operational issues that impact municipal power systems.

The appointed representative serves as a liaison between UAMPS and the city’s governing body, providing regular updates, recommendations, and relevant information to city officials. They are expected to review agendas, reports, and technical materials in advance to make informed decisions that align with Hyrum City’s goals, financial capacity, and risk tolerance. Additionally, the representative must act in the best interest of Hyrum City and its residents, uphold ethical standards, and collaborate with other member cities to support reliable, affordable, and sustainable power services through UAMPS.

Currently, Power Superintendent Larry Coleman is serving as Hyrum City’s Representative (Resolution 24-32 on September 20, 2024); and Mayor Miller is serving as first alternate (Resolution 26-04 on January 15, 2026) to the UAMPS Board.

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Hyrum City, Utah:

Subject: Ordinance 26-10 – An ordinance amending Title 17 Zoning of the Hyrum City Municipal Code, Section 17.44.020 Use Regulations in the Commercial Zone C-1 and Section 17.45.020 Use Regulations in the Commercial Zone C-2 to remove certain permitted and conditional uses.

Summary:

The proposed application is initiated by Hyrum City to consider removing single-family dwellings, single-family dwellings with two family accessory apartments, boarding and rooming houses, planned unit developments, and light manufacturing out of the Commercial Zone C-1 district; and remove planned unit developments, taverns, night club, and light manufacturing out of the Commercial Zone C-2 district. Staff recommends that commercial zoning districts throughout the City limits permit uses that are more aligned with commercial while the residential zoning districts contain single-family and planned unit residential developments, as well as light manufacturing districts accommodate light manufacturing uses. In addition, staff also recommends that certain repair services in the commercial district be conducted within an enclosed building and outdoor storage be screened behind an opaque barrier in efforts to minimize impacts within the commercial zoning districts

Planning Commission Recommendation:

On January 8, 2026, the Planning Commission held the required public hearing and discussed the draft amendment. The Planning Commission made a vote (4-0) to recommend the draft amendment to the City Council. Following January 8, 2026, public hearing, staff determined to close the application and reopen due to no public attendance. Staff noticed the application again and sent letter notices to all vacant properties in the zoning districts advising property owners of the proposed amendment and opportunity to provide comment. On February 12, 2026, the Planning Commission held another public meeting. **The following public questions/comments were addressed: (1) What the City would like to see in the future on property located at 365 West Main Street. (2) What would be the options for reopening a sawmill located at 1575 East Highway 101 (3) The zoning districts did not mention references to Short-Term Rentals.** The Planning Commission made a vote (5-0) to recommend approval of the draft amendment to the City Council.

City Council Meeting:

On February 19, 2026, the City Council met to discuss the proposed amendment. The council supported the amendment, but the amendment was continued to allow staff to verify if certain residential facilities can be removed as uses in the zone with legal counsel and remove home occupations. On March 20, 2026, legal counsel supported the removal of the residential facilities.

WHEREAS, on January 6, 1994, the Hyrum City Council passed and posted an ordinance adopting the "Hyrum City Municipal Code", a recodification of municipal ordinances encompassing the "Revised Ordinances of Hyrum City" and ordinances adopted through July 15, 1993; and

WHEREAS, Title 17 of the Hyrum City Municipal Code is known as the Zoning Ordinance of Hyrum City and sets forth regulations governing land use within the municipal limits; and

WHEREAS, Section 17.04.040 allows Title 17 of the Hyrum City Municipal Code, the Zoning Ordinance, to be amended by the City Council following fourteen days' notice and a public hearing; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined there is a need to amend Title 17 to further clarify those regulations governing zoning and other regulations controlling land use and development within Hyrum City.

NOW THEREFORE, upon recommendation of the Planning Commission and following a public hearing as required by Section 17.04.040, the Hyrum City Council hereby adopts, passes, and publishes the following:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 17 ZONING OF THE HYRUM CITY MUNICIPAL CODE, SECTION 17.44.020 USE REGULATIONS IN THE COMMERCIAL ZONE C-1 AND SECTION 17.45.020 USE REGULATIONS IN THE COMMERCIAL ZONE C-2 TO REMOVE CERTAIN PERMITTED AND CONDITIONAL USES.

1. Section 17.44.020 Use Regulations (Commercial Zone C-1, East Hyrum) of the Hyrum City Municipal Code is hereby added to read as follows:

7. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall become effective upon posting three (3) copies in three (3) public places within Hyrum City.
