The November 2025 bank reconciliation and the revenues and expenses by department to date were available for council review and discussion.

HEARINGS & ORDINANCES

Mayor Bleichner stated, pursuant to the agenda, he will now convene a public hearing to review the State Revolving Fund loan application and to make public the environmental information document and the City's project plan. City Clerk/Treasurer Lampe stated no comments were received on this topic at City Hall. Bradley Lake, Strand Engineering, stated the project's purpose is stated on page 2 of the report in the agenda packet. The project's purpose is to make improvements to the wastewater treatment facilities to increase the capacity, meet future effluent limits, and reliability operate the City of Independence's wastewater system for the next 20 years. The following improvements in this project are: to replace the preliminary treatment equipment, construct two oxidation ditches, construct three secondary clarifiers, construct a new RAS/WAS pumping building, install UV disinfection equipment, construct four aerobic digesters, install new equipment in the existing sludge storage tank, construct two sludge storage tanks, and construct a new storage building. Modifications will be made to five of the existing buildings in an effort to save costs. There will also be new roadways, sidewalks, fencing, and other updated site utilities as a part of this project. As a part of this project, Strand had to look at all potential alternatives in the treatment process for biological treatment and disinfection and had to make sure the best processes were selected based upon certain criteria. The positive environmental effects of this project will be improved treatment of the wastewater from the City of Independence WWTP, compliance with existing and future effluent discharge permit limits, and reduced E. Coli and nutrients into Wapsipinicon River. Mr. Lake reviewed the twelve reasons why the project was concluded to have no significant impact. There will be another public hearing once the plans and specs have been approved. Mr. Lake stated he was the point of contact to receive comments about the environmental information document, and he also received no comments. Mayor Bleichner closed the public hearing and stated City Clerk Lampe will note all comments in the record.

Council Member Moore asked where he should ask about the assessment to the property owner? City Clerk/Treasurer Lampe stated it will be at a different item. The roll being called the following Council Members voted: Ayes: Moore, Mayner, Prusator, O'Loughlin, Jensen, Weber, and Hanna.

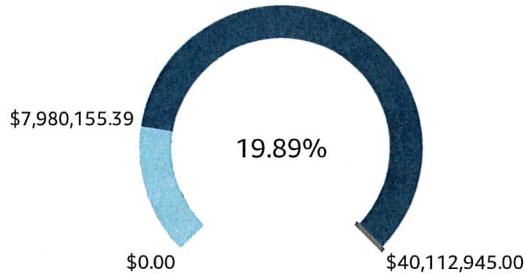

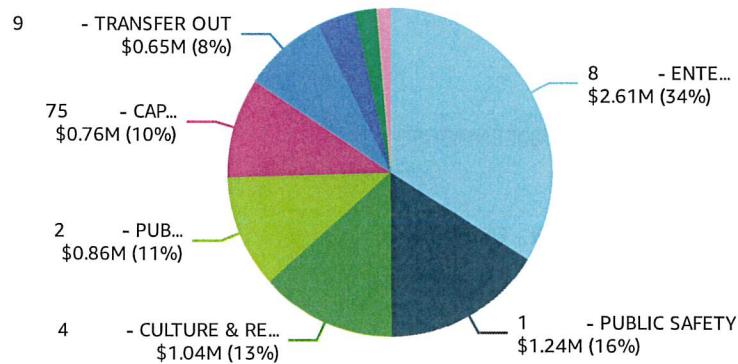

2026 Anticipated vs Revenue

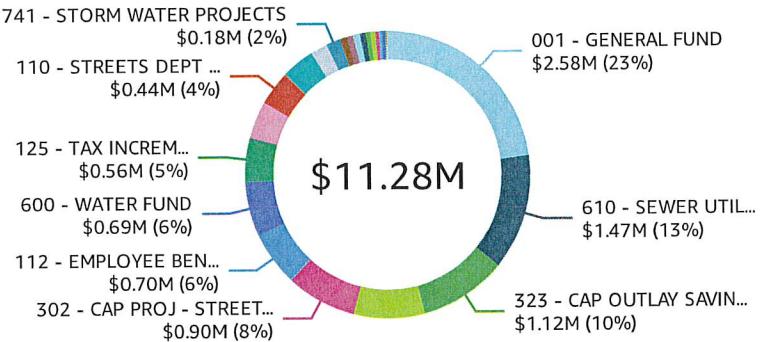

ITEM TITLE: Second Reading of an Ordinance Amendment to Chapters 76 (Bicycle Regulations) and 77 (Skateboards, Roller Skates, and In-Line Skates)

BACKGROUND:

During the July 28, 2025, City Council Meeting, Staff were asked to add a discussion item to the next City Council Work Session regarding Electric Scooters and their operation on City Sidewalks. The item was tabled at the August 4, 2025, Work Session and subsequently discussed at the September 2, 2025, Work Session.

Following the discussion at the September 2nd meeting, Staff worked with the City Attorney to create an Ordinance updating this section of code. The item was discussed again at the November 3rd meeting, where the Council provided feedback, which was incorporated into the version reviewed at the December 1, 2025, meeting. After discussion with legal counsel, a few small modifications were suggested. The first reading of this ordinance was held on December 8, 2025.

DISCUSSION:

Staff and the City Attorney have collaborated to develop the attached ordinance, incorporating the Council's previous instructions. This Ordinance amends Chapters 76 and 77 to regulate the use, operation, and penalties for bicycles, **electric micromobility devices**, skateboards, roller skates, and in-line skates.

Key updates in this draft include:

- **Definitions:** The definitions section has been moved to the beginning of the Ordinance (Section 2, creating new Section 76.02) to ensure terms such as "Micromobility Device" and "OPDMD" are defined prior to the regulations.
- **Yielding on Trails:** Sections 76.07, 76.09, and 76.10 have been updated to include "trails" alongside sidewalks. This ensures that operators of bicycles or micromobility devices must yield the right of way to pedestrians on trails as well as sidewalks.
- **Speed Limits:** A provision has been added ensuring no person operates these devices at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent, addressing the Council's desire for speed regulation.
- **Signage:** The ordinance supports the enforcement of signage prohibiting riding in specific locations.

RESULTS:

The City has established priorities during strategic planning sessions. This item supports the Vision from that session of **supporting and enhancing City infrastructure** and **supporting high-quality City services**.

This item helps achieve that vision by establishing clear safety regulations for the use of modern micromobility devices on public infrastructure, ensuring the safety of both riders and pedestrians on City sidewalks and trails.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATION:

The primary costs associated with this item are the standard legal publication fees for the ordinance. Additionally, there may be incidental costs associated with updating signage on trails to ensure compliance with the new definitions regarding motorized vehicles.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends a motion to approve the second reading of an ordinance that amends provisions pertaining to Chapters 76 and 77 of the City Code of Ordinances.

Staff recommends a motion to suspend the statutory rule requiring an ordinance to be considered and voted on for passage at two council meetings prior to the meeting at which it is to be finally passed.

Staff recommends a motion to have this ordinance, which amends provisions pertaining to Chapters 76 and 77 of the City Code of Ordinances, be placed on its final passage for adoption pursuant to Iowa Code Section 380.3 and to authorize the Mayor to sign the Ordinance. The changes will be effective upon the ordinance summary being published in the newspaper.

ORDINANCE NO. 2025- _____

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTERS 76 (BICYCLE REGULATIONS)
AND 77 (SKATEBOARDS, ROLLER SKATES, AND IN-LINE SKATES) OF THE
CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
INDEPENDENCE, IOWA:**

SECTION 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this ordinance is to amend and add to certain provisions of Chapters 76 and 77 of the City Code to regulate the use, operation, and penalties for violations of bicycles, electric micromobility devices, and skateboards, roller skates and in-line skates in the City.

SECTION 2. SECTIONS AMENDED IN CHAPTER 76. The following sections are hereby amended as follows with underlined text indicating language added and struck through text indicating language removed.

76.01 SCOPE OF REGULATIONS.

These regulations shall apply whenever a bicycle or micromobility device is operated upon any street or upon any public path set aside for the exclusive use of bicycles or micromobility devices, subject to those exceptions stated herein. However, these regulations do not apply to any law enforcement officer operating a bicycle or micromobility device while on duty and acting in the office line of duty. Further, these regulations do not apply to individuals operating an OPDMD as a reasonable accommodation due to a disability.

76.03 TRAFFIC CODE APPLIES; SIGNALS FOR BICYCLE AND SCOOTER OPERATORS.

Every person riding a bicycle or micromobility device upon a roadway shall be granted all of the rights and shall be subject to all of the duties applicable to the driver of a vehicle by the laws of the State declaring rules of the road applicable to vehicles or by the Traffic Code of the City applicable to the driver of a vehicle, except as to those provisions that by their nature can have no application. Whenever such person dismounts from a bicycle or micromobility device, the person shall be subject to all regulations applicable to pedestrians.

- A. For bicyclists and persons operating a micromobility device, signals shall be given in the following manner:
 1. Left turn: left hand and arm extended horizontally to the left.
 2. Right turn: left arm extended out sideways bent at a 90° angle at the elbow joint, hand pointing upward and the palm of the hand facing forward or right hand and arm extended horizontally to the right.
 3. Stop or decrease of speed: left arm extended out sideways bent at a 90° angle at the elbow joint, hand pointing downward and the palm of the hand rear facing.

76.04 DOUBLE RIDING RESTRICTED.

A person propelling a bicycle shall not ride other than astride a permanent and regular seat attached thereto. No bicycle or micromobility device shall be used to carry more persons at one time than the number for which it is designed and equipped.

76.05 TWO ABREAST LIMIT.

Persons riding bicycles or micromobility devices upon a roadway shall not ride more than two abreast except on paths or parts of roadways set aside for the exclusive use of bicycles or micromobility devices. All bicycles or micromobility devices ridden on the roadway shall be kept to the right and shall be operated as near as practicable to the right-hand edge of the roadway.

76.06 SPEED.

No person shall operate a bicycle or micromobility device at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions then existing.

76.07 EMERGING FROM ALLEY OR DRIVEWAY.

The operator of a bicycle or micromobility device emerging from an alley, driveway, trail or building shall, upon approaching a sidewalk or the sidewalk area extending across any alleyway, yield the right-of-way to all pedestrians approaching on said sidewalk or sidewalk area, and upon entering the roadway shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles approaching on said roadway.

76.08 CARRYING ARTICLES.

No person operating a bicycle or micromobility device shall carry any package, bundle or article that prevents the rider from keeping at least one hand upon the bicycles or micromobility devices intended handlebars.

76.09 RIDING ON SIDEWALKS.

1. Business District. No person shall ride a bicycle or micromobility device upon a sidewalk within the Business District, as defined in Section 60.02(1) of this Code of Ordinances.
2. Other Locations. When signs are erected on any sidewalk, trail, or roadway prohibiting the riding of bicycles or micromobility device thereon by any person, no person shall disobey the signs.
3. Yield Right-of-Way. Whenever any person is riding a bicycle or micromobility device upon a sidewalk or trail, such person shall yield the right-of-way to any pedestrian and shall give audible signal before overtaking and passing.

76.10 TOWING.

It is unlawful for any person riding a bicycle or micromobility device to be towed or to tow any other vehicle upon the streets or trails of the City unless the vehicle is manufactured for such use.

76.11 IMPROPER RIDING.

No person shall ride a bicycle or micromobility device in an irregular or reckless manner such as zigzagging, stunting, speeding, or otherwise so as to disregard the safety of the operator or others.

76.12 PARKING.

No person shall park a bicycle or micromobility device upon a street other than upon the roadway against the curb or upon the sidewalk in a rack to support the bicycle, or micromobility device, or against a building or at the curb, in such a manner as to afford the least obstruction to pedestrian traffic.

76.13 EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS.

Every person riding a bicycle or micromobility device shall be responsible for providing and using equipment as provided herein:

1. Lamps Required. Every bicycle or micromobility device when in use at nighttime shall be equipped with a lamp on the front emitting a white light visible from a distance of at least 300 feet to the front and with a lamp on the rear exhibiting a red light visible from a distance of 300 feet to the rear, except that a red reflector on the rear, of a type that is visible from all distances from 50 feet to 300 feet to the rear when directly in front of lawful upper beams of headlamps on a motor vehicle, may be used in lieu of a rear light.
2. Brakes Required. Every bicycle or micromobility device shall be equipped with a brake that will enable the operator to make the braked wheel skid on dry, level, clean pavement.

76.14 SPECIAL PENALTY.

Any person violating the provisions of this chapter may, in lieu of the scheduled fine or standard penalty provided for violations of this Code of Ordinances, allow the person's bicycle or micromobility device to be impounded by the City for not less than five days for the first offense, 10 days for a second offense and 30 days for a third offense.

1. A person that does not voluntarily agree to impound their bicycle or micromobility device will be issued a notice of the special penalty contained in this chapter and may be subject to a scheduled fine or standard penalty provided for violations of this Code of Ordinances. The notice shall contain the following:
 - a. A summary of the offense;
 - b. an explanation of the special penalty under this chapter;
 - c. an explanation that as a result of their refusal to impound their bicycle or micromobility device, future violations will be treated as a municipal infraction and subject to applicable penalties;
 - d. an explanation that in the event the City is unable to obtain consent for impoundment from a minor offender and the minor's parent or legal guardian, the parent or legal guardian shall be liable for any municipal infraction arising from the minor's subsequent offenses;
 - e. an explanation that agreement to allow impounding is voluntary;
 - f. the location of the impound facility.
2. If the person whose bicycle or micromobility device is subject to impoundment is under the age of 18 and refuses to voluntarily relinquish the bicycle or micromobility device, the City may seek consent for impoundment from the minor's parent or legal guardian. The parent or guardian's voluntary agreement shall be deemed sufficient authorization for the City to take possession of the bicycle or micromobility device in accordance with this chapter.
3. If the person whose bicycle or micromobility device is subject to impoundment is under the age of 18, refuses to voluntarily relinquish the bicycle or micromobility device, and the City is unable to obtain consent from the minor's legal parent or guardian, the City shall issue the notice as provided in section 76.13(1) and subsequent offenses will be treated as municipal infractions.

SECTION 3. SECTIONS ADDED IN CHAPTER 76. The following reflects entirely new sections of Chapter 76 of the Independence Code of Ordinances and therefore no struck through, or underlined language is included.

76.02 DEFINITIONS.

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

BICYCLE – Either of the following:

- A. A device having two or three wheels and having at least one saddle or seat for the use of a rider, which is propelled by human power.
- B. A device having two or three wheels with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of less than 750 watts (one horsepower), whose maximum speed on a paved level surface, when powered solely by such a motor while ridden, is less than 20 miles per hour.

MICROMOBILITY DEVICE – means any device not a bicycle or an OPDMD, designed to carry one rider or operator, where such device is equipped with an electric motor of less than seven hundred fifty watts, and where such device is not required to be licensed or registered by the State of Iowa. Micromobility devices may be propelled either by the power of the rider or by an electric motor or a combination thereof. Micromobility devices include, but are not limited to, electric unicycles, electric tricycles, electric stand-up scooters, electric sit-down scooters, and motorized skateboards.

OTHER POWER-DRIVEN MOBILITY DEVICE (“OPDMD”) – means any mobility device powered by batteries, fuel, or other engines that is used by individuals with mobility disabilities for the purpose of locomotion, including, electronic personal assistance mobility devices, or any mobility device designed to operate in areas without defined pedestrian routes, but that is not a wheelchair or a golf cart.

SECTION 4. SECTIONS AMENDED IN CHAPTER 77. The following section is hereby amended as follows with underlined text indicating language added and struck through text indicating language removed.

77.05 SPECIAL PENALTY.

Any person violating the provisions of this chapter may, in lieu of the scheduled fine or standard penalty provided for violations for the Code of Ordinances, allow such person’s skateboard, roller skates or in-line skates to be impounded by the City for not less than five days for the first offense, 10 days for the second offence and 30 days for a third offense. Punishment for fourth and additional offenses shall revert to the scheduled fines and standard penalties provided for violations of this Code of Ordinances.

1. A person that does not voluntarily agree to impound their skateboard, roller skates or in-line skates will be issued a notice of the special penalty contained in this chapter and may be subject to a scheduled fine or standard penalty provided for violations of this Code of Ordinances. The notice shall contain the following:
 - a. A summary of the offense;
 - b. an explanation of the special penalty under this chapter;
 - c. an explanation that as a result of their refusal to impound their skateboard, roller skates or in-line skates, future violations will be treated as a municipal infraction and subject to applicable penalties;
 - d. an explanation that in the event the City is unable to obtain consent for impoundment from a minor offender and the minor’s parent or legal

guardian, the parent or legal guardian shall be liable for any municipal infraction arising from the minor's subsequent offenses;

- e. an explanation that agreement to allow impounding is voluntary;
- f. the location of the impound facility.

2. If the person whose skateboard, roller skates or in-line skates is subject to impoundment is under the age of 18 and refuses to voluntarily relinquish the skateboard, roller skates or in-line skates, the City may seek consent for impoundment from the minor's parent or legal guardian. The parent or guardian's voluntary agreement shall be deemed sufficient authorization for the City to take possession of the skateboard, roller skates or in-line skates in accordance with this chapter.
3. If the person whose skateboard, roller skates or in-line skates is subject to impoundment is under the age of 18, refuses to voluntarily relinquish the skateboard, roller skates or in-line skates, and the City is unable to obtain consent from the minor's legal parent or guardian, the City shall issue the notice as provided in section 77.05(1) and subsequent offenses will be treated as municipal infractions.

SECTION 4. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ITEM TITLE: First Reading of an Ordinance amendment to Chapter 175 - Subdivision Regulations

BACKGROUND:

This item was discussed at the January 5, 2026, City Council Work Session. The City recently adopted the Statewide Urban Design and Specifications (SUDAS) program to standardize our engineering design and construction practices. Following this adoption, staff conducted a comprehensive review of Chapter 175 (Subdivision Regulations) to identify areas where our existing Code differed from these new statewide standards. This review revealed several sections within Chapter 175 that relied on outdated "City standards" or contained specific dimensional requirements that conflicted with SUDAS.

DISCUSSION:

This ordinance amends Chapter 175 to reference SUDAS directly, ensuring clarity for developers and engineers working in Independence. The amendment addresses the following key areas to align with the technical manuals we have adopted:

- **Street Design:** Pavement widths, street grades, and geometric design criteria are updated to align with SUDAS Design Manual Chapter 5. This includes adjusting cul-de-sac standards to meet fire code and SUDAS recommendations.
- **Stormwater Management:** The update mandates the use of SUDAS design methodologies for hydrology and intake spacing to ensure drainage systems meet modern performance standards.
- **Utilities:** Water and sanitary sewer standards are aligned with SUDAS, including critical separation requirements mandated by the Iowa DNR and updated fire hydrant spacing.
- **Sidewalks:** Construction standards are updated to match SUDAS specifications, supporting better accessibility and long-term durability.

Adopting these amendments ensures consistency in our regulations and reduces confusion during the plan review process.

RESULTS:

The City has established priorities during strategic planning sessions. This item supports the Vision from that session of **supporting and enhancing City infrastructure** and **efficient and effective planning and prioritizing of all available resources**. This item helps achieve that vision by ensuring that future public improvements are built to the high standards established by the SUDAS program and by streamlining the development requirements into a single, consistent standard.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATION:

Once the new supplement has been mailed to City Hall, fees will need to be paid to Simmering-Cory Iowa Codification. Additional publication costs will also be incurred.

ORDINANCE NO. 2026-**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF INDEPENDENCE, IOWA, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS TO CHAPTER 175 SUBDIVISION REGULATIONS.**

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Independence, Iowa:

Section 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this ordinance is to update the City's subdivision regulations to adopt and reference the Iowa Statewide Urban Design and Specifications (SUDAS) program for the design and construction of public improvements.

Section 2. AMENDMENT. Section 175.03 (DEFINITIONS) of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by adding the following new definition:

29. "SUDAS" means the current edition of the Iowa Statewide Urban Design and Specifications Manuals (Design Manual and Standard Specifications) as adopted by the City Council.

Section 3. AMENDMENT. Section 175.30 (CONFORMANCE STANDARDS), Subsection 5, is hereby amended by repealing the subsection in its entirety and adopting the following in lieu thereof:

5. SUDAS Standards. All public improvements shall be designed and constructed in accordance with the current edition of the SUDAS Design Manual and SUDAS Standard Specifications, as adopted by the City Council. Where the standards of this Chapter are in conflict with SUDAS, the more restrictive standard shall apply unless otherwise approved by the Council.

Section 4. AMENDMENT. Section 175.37 (STREETS – DESIGN STANDARDS) is hereby amended by repealing Subsections 1(C), 1(D), 1(E), and 1(F) and adopting the following in lieu thereof:

C. Roadway and Right-of-Way Standards. The minimum right-of-way and pavement widths for all street classifications shall be designed in accordance with the SUDAS Design Manual.

D. Street Grades. Maximum and minimum street grades shall conform to the preferred values set forth in the SUDAS Design Manual.

E. Vertical Curves. All changes in street grade shall be connected by vertical curves designed in accordance with the SUDAS Design Manual.

F. [Reserved].

Section 5. AMENDMENT. Section 175.37 (STREETS – DESIGN STANDARDS), Subsection 1(C)(5) regarding Cul-de-sacs is hereby amended to read as follows:

(5) Cul-de-sacs. Cul-de-sacs shall meet all requirements of the SUDAS Design Manual. The maximum length of a cul-de-sac shall be as stated in the SUDAS Design Manual, or as required by the International Fire Code. The turnaround shall have a minimum roadway radius of 45 feet (or as required by the International Fire Code) and a right-of-way radius of 50 feet.

Section 6. AMENDMENT. Section 175.38 (STORM SEWERS AND DRAINAGE), Subsection 1, is hereby amended by repealing the subsection in its entirety and adopting the following in lieu thereof:

1. General Requirements. The Commission shall not recommend for approval any plat of a subdivision which does not make adequate provision for storm or flood water run-off channels or basins. The storm water drainage system shall be separate and independent of any sanitary sewer system.

A. Design Standards. Storm sewers and drainage facilities shall be designed in accordance with the SUDAS Design Manual. Design computations shall be submitted along with plans.

B. Inlet Spacing. Intake design and spacing shall comply with the SUDAS Design Manual to ensure surface water spread does not exceed safe limits.

C. Materials. Storm sewer pipe materials shall comply with the SUDAS Standard Specifications.

Section 7. AMENDMENT. Section 175.39 (WATER FACILITIES) is hereby amended by adding the following requirement to Subsection 1:

D. Standards. All water mains and appurtenances shall be designed in accordance with the SUDAS Design Manual and constructed in accordance with the SUDAS Standard Specifications.

Section 8. AMENDMENT. Section 175.39 (WATER FACILITIES), Subsection 3 (Fire Hydrants), is hereby amended to read as follows:

3. Fire Hydrants. Fire hydrants shall be required for all subdivisions except those coming under Subsection 2 of this section. Fire hydrants shall be located in accordance with the SUDAS Design Manual, typically spaced no more than 400 to 450 feet apart and within 300 feet of any structure, subject to approval by the Fire Chief.

Section 9. AMENDMENT. Section 175.40 (SEWAGE FACILITIES) is hereby amended by adding the following new Subsection 5:

5. Standards. All sanitary sewer facilities shall be designed in accordance with the SUDAS Design Manual and constructed in accordance with the SUDAS Standard Specifications. Service stubs shall be installed in accordance with the SUDAS Standard Specifications. Separation of sanitary sewers and water mains shall comply with the SUDAS Design Manual.

Section 10. AMENDMENT. Section 175.41 (SIDEWALKS), Subsection 2 (Construction), is hereby amended to read as follows:

2. Construction. Sidewalks shall be improved as required in Subsection 2 of Section 175.37 of this chapter. Sidewalks shall be constructed of Portland cement concrete with a minimum width of five (5) feet and a minimum thickness of four (4) inches (six (6) inches at driveways), in accordance with the SUDAS Standard Specifications and the SUDAS Design Manual.

Section 11. AMENDMENT. Section 175.42 (UTILITIES), Subsection 1, is hereby amended by adding the following sentence:

Utility location and separation shall comply with the guidelines set forth in the SUDAS Design Manual.

Section 12. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 13. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision, or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

Section 14. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect following its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

If you find these requirements have not been met, please call us immediately.

The proceedings attached include the following items:

1. Minutes of the January 12, 2026, meeting at which the hearing will be held on the proposed Resolution of Necessity. Copies of the written objections and a list of the oral objections should be attached to the transcript and made a part of your records.

2. Minutes closing the hearing. 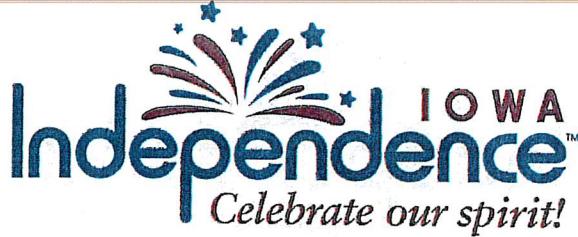

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Independence, Iowa (the “City”), has adopted a preliminary resolution in accordance with Section 384.42 of the Code of Iowa, covering the 2026 Street Rehabilitation Project (the “Project”); and

WHEREAS, pursuant thereto, the Project Engineers have prepared preliminary plans and specifications, an estimated total cost of the work and a plat and schedule, including the valuation of each lot as determined by this City Council, and the same have been duly adopted and are now on file with the City Clerk; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing has been held on the proposed Resolution of Necessity on January 12, 2026, at 5:30 p.m., at the City Hall, in the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, It Is Resolved by the City Council of the City of Independence, Iowa:

Section 1. It is hereby found and determined to be necessary and for the best interest of the City and its inhabitants to proceed with the Project, and to assess a portion of the cost of the Project to the property benefited thereby.

Section 2. The Project, all of which is assessable, shall consist of crack and seat of existing pavement, hot mix asphalt (HMA) overlay of pavement and miscellaneous related work, including curb & gutter replacement, and HMA milling, on and along the following segments of street and avenue in the City of Independence, Buchanan County, Iowa:

- 12th Avenue NW, from 3rd Street NW on the south to the north City limit
- O’Brien Court NW, from 12th Avenue NW on the east to the north end of the cul-de-sac
- 9th Street NW, from 9th Avenue NW on the east to the west City limit
- 9th Avenue NW, from and including its intersection with 7th Street NW on the south to the north City limit on the north
- 3rd Street SW, from 6th Avenue SW on the east to 7th Avenue SW on the west
- 17th Street SE, from 175 feet east of Highway 150 on the west to a point 1,150 feet east thereof
- 2nd Street NE, from 7th Avenue NE on the west to 8th Avenue NE on the east
- 2nd Street NE, from 298 feet west of the center line of 11th Avenue on the west, to a point 613 feet east thereof
- 3rd Street NE, from 4th Avenue NE on the west to a point approximately 17 feet from 5th Avenue NE on the east
- 5th Street NE, from a point approximately 15.1 feet from 5th Avenue NE on the west to 6th Avenue NE on the east
- 5th Street NE, from 7th Avenue NE on the west to 8th Avenue NE on the east
- 11th Avenue NE, from 2nd Street NE on the south to 3rd Street NE on the north

Section 3. It is considered that the properties abutting the above-described segments of street to be improved will be specially benefitted by this Project and should be specially assessed a portion of the cost of the Project.

Section 4. It is hereby found and determined that there are now on file in the office of the City Clerk an estimated total cost of the proposed work and a preliminary plat and schedule showing the amount proposed to be assessed to each lot by reason of the Project.

Section 5. Unless a property owner files objections with the City Clerk at the time of the hearing on this resolution of necessity, the property owner shall be deemed to have waived all objections pertaining to the regularity of the proceedings and the legality of using the special assessment procedure.

BACKGROUND:

This item was reviewed at the January 6th Planning & Zoning Commission meeting and was recommended for approval unanimously.

DISCUSSION:

Tammy Silberstein would like to construct a home on Lots 8 and 9 in the Pines First Addition – at approximately 803 Pine Dr. In reviewing what she would like to construct, we realized that the house would cross the property line between Lot 8 and Lot 9. While those two lots have been joined together according to the Amendment to Restrictive Covenants for The Pines First Addition in File No. 2010R02098, they have never been joined together according to the City's regulations. This agreement remedies this situation by allowing the Planning & Zoning Commission and the City Council to officially recognize the joining of these properties – without the owner having to submit a full plat of survey or something similar to perform this action.

Staff is very supportive of this action as it will allow Ms. Silberstein to build a large home on this property, adding more housing inventory to the City.

RESULTS:

The City has established priorities during strategic planning sessions. This item supports the Vision from that session of **efficient and effective planning and prioritizing of all available resources**. This item helps achieve that vision by following established processes to allow the combination of lots for a larger home to be constructed.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATION:

There is no significant financial consideration for this item other than the staff's time in preparing the resolution. There will be fees to have the agreement recorded, but it has been budgeted for in the City Administration budget.

***The Auditor is hereby requested to combine Parcel No. 1009304001 and 1009304002 into one tax parcel.**

The purchase of this Agreement is to set for my understanding and agreement to bind the Property made up of more than one platted lot, together as one, to agree to at no time to transfer one lot without the other, in recognition of the fact that to do so would be violative of the Independence, Iowa Code of Ordinances, and to further acknowledge my understanding and Agreement is irrevocable and shall run with the land, binding on my heirs, transferees, and successors in interest. The Property was combined pursuant to the Amendment of Restrictive Covenants for The Pines First Addition to the City of Independence, Iowa, in File No. 2010R02098, in the records of the Buchanan County, Iowa Recorded (the "Amendment"). While the Amendment attempted to combine the lots, the City does not recognize this as the City was not a party of the Amendment. Due to this fact, the Amendment effectively only restricted the ability of the owners of the Property to build a separate primary structure on each lot, and therefore this agreement is needed by the City to combine said lots together in order to build a single-family residence on the Property.

The City Council of the City of Independence approved this agreement by Resolution _____ on the _____ day of _____, 20_____, in lieu of requiring Tammy L. Silberstein to obtain a survey officially combining said lots to one parcel, as a mean of resolving side yard setback concerns where one house is proposed to be constructed on the Property, over the shared lot line of the lots described above.

Words and phrases herein, including acknowledgment hereof, shall be construed as in the singular or plural number, and as masculine or feminine gender, according to the context.

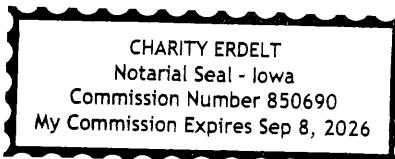

ITEM TITLE: Lease Termination – Streeter Aircraft Mechanic Services

BACKGROUND:

The Streeters began their contract in the Volt hangar in September 2025. Since that time, they have determined that the hangar is smaller than required for their operations. Consequently, the current arrangement is not working for their business needs.

On January 1, 2026, the Airport Director and City Manager received written notice from the Streeters regarding their intent to terminate their lease. They have requested this termination be effective at the end of January 2026.

DISCUSSION:

The Streeters initially proposed an alternative to stay at the Independence Municipal Airport (IIB). They requested a guaranteed space in the terminal (large) hangar, including the use of the office and tool room, while keeping the rental rate consistent with their current arrangement.

The Airport Commission met on January 7, 2026, to discuss this matter. The Commission reviewed the request to move to the terminal hangar versus the request to terminate the lease.

After review, the Airport Commission recommends accepting the lease termination as requested by the tenant. This action allows the City to market the Volt hangar to new tenants who may fit the space requirements better.

RESULTS:

The City has established priorities during strategic planning sessions. This item supports the Vision from that session of **efficient and effective planning and prioritizing of all available resources**. This item helps achieve that vision by ensuring our airport assets are utilized effectively. While we regret losing a tenant, recognizing when a facility does not meet a business's needs allows us to reset and find a more suitable user for the Volt hangar.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATION:

The City will cease receiving rental revenue from this lease after January 2026. The current rate for the space is \$575.00 per month. We will look to offset this by securing a new tenant for the Volt hangar as soon as possible. RFP's are currently being reviewed.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff and the Airport Commission recommends that the City Council approve the lease termination for Streeter Aircraft Mechanic Services, effective January 31, 2026.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATION:

BACKGROUND:

This item was discussed at the January 5th Work Session and is typically presented and approved each January. Costs for this item are split between the Water and Sewer Departments, and the attached agreement shows the proposed modifications – in price only.

DISCUSSION:

Funding of this agreement allows ILPT to perform billing services for the City for utility billing operations rather than the City having to employ staff and resources to facilitate this billing activity.

The cost of this item last year was \$74,366.01. This agreement's cost is \$75,109.67, an increase of 1%.

RESULTS:

The City has established priorities during strategic planning sessions. This item supports the Vision from that session of **efficient and effective planning and prioritizing of all available resources** and **promoting and encouraging community involvement and engagement**. This item helps achieve that vision by allowing utility billing to be included on other bills already being sent to many property owners rather than having separate billing activities for Water, Wastewater, and Trash Collection.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATION:

Funds to pay for this agreement are budgeted within the Water and Sewer Department operating budgets.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends a motion to approve and authorize the City Manager to sign the ILPT Annual Billing Agreement.

AGREEMENT FOR BILLING SERVICES AND WATER METER READING

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this ? day of January 2026 by and between the City of Independence, Iowa, a Municipal Corporation, Party of the First Part, hereinafter called the "City", and Independence Light & Power, Telecommunications, a Municipal Utility, Party of the Second Part, hereinafter called "ILP,T".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS the City and ILP, T have combined City municipal and ILP, T billing for utilities; and

WHEREAS the City municipal utilities billing is for water, sewer, garbage, storm water utility, and environmental fees; and

WHEREAS the ILP,T utilities billing is for electric and telecommunications, including internet, cable television, and telephone; and

WHEREAS ILP,T handles for the City all billing, payments, taking all calls, responding to complaints, scheduling appointments, processing water meter readings, creating meter maintenance orders, maintaining customer records, maintaining the billing system, collections, disconnect orders and reconnect orders, generation of reports, collect all revenues, disbursements to the appropriate City funds, and performs all banking functions relating to water, sewer, garbage, storm water utility, and environmental; and

WHEREAS the combination of utility billings into a centralized location and operation provides economic benefits to both entities, as well as, to the citizens of Independence, Iowa; and

WHEREAS the City has recently begun to roll out AMI water meters and has made plans to complete the conversion of all its water meters to the AMI technology; and

WHEREAS ILP,T has completed the installation of AMI electric meters and has completed a conversion of its billing system over to NorthStar; and

WHEREAS ILP,T will begin to utilize, through its membership in WPPI Energy, the Meter Data Management platform for; collecting, storing, and validating interval meter data, as well as providing future technology improvements such as Outage Notification, Outage management, Demand response, Electric Rate Design, and Customer access to interval electric and water data via online portal (MyMeter); and

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL COVENANTS AND AGREEMENTS contained herein to be kept and performed by each of the parties hereto, it is mutually agreed as follows:

1. That all billing for City municipal utilities and services, and ILP,T utilities and services shall be centralized and located at the ILP,T office at 700 7th Street NE, Independence, Iowa.
2. All complaints regarding City municipal utilities shall first be attempted to be resolved by ILP, T. If the complaint cannot be resolved, said complaint will then be forwarded to the City Manager.
3. ILP, T shall be responsible for receipt of all payments and/or City municipal utility deposits and any such payments or City municipal utility deposits received shall be deposited daily to the appropriate City accounts as currently exist.

4. The City Water Department shall receive its share of all penalties which are assessed and received by ILP, T for late payment charges.
5. ILP,T agrees to abide by all regulations of the State and Federal Commerce Commission or any regulatory agencies supervising or promulgating rules concerning City municipal utilities, ILP, T and/or utility billings in general.
6. ILP,T shall assume and be responsible for all expenses involved in the billing process, including but not limited to, postage, forms, etc. The City's payment to ILP, T shall be reviewed on an annual basis, not later than January 31 of each year, with any revision in the annual payment to be effective July of the year in question. The City and ILP, T further agree to meet each year concerning other provisions of this agreement.
7. The City shall pay to ILP, T beginning July 1, 2026, the sum of \$75,109.67 annually for such services provided by ILP, T as are necessary for the City municipal utility billings.
8. In addition to the 75,109.67 for billing service. ILP,T will track and record, on the City Electric and Labor Report, all work (in-kind) completed by ILP,T staff for the purpose of collecting meter reads on water meters that are not yet converted to AMI and or are having communication issues with the AMI Network.

The conditions and covenants of this Agreement shall inure to the benefit and be binding upon the successors, assigns, or transferee of either party hereto.

This Agreement is subject to the approval of the City Council of the City of Independence, Iowa, and of the Independence Light & Power, Telecommunications Board of Trustees.

This Agreement shall take effect upon the date first written above and shall remain in effect for an initial term that ends at midnight June 30, 2027, and thereafter until terminated by notice as provided in this section. This contract may be terminated by either party upon one (1) year prior written notice, sent by registered mail, to the other party effective at the end of the initial term, or any time thereafter.

ITEM TITLE: Approval of Professional Services Agreement with McGrath Human Resources Group for Classification and Compensation Study

BACKGROUND:

The City of Independence recently issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) to select a qualified consultant to conduct a comprehensive city-wide Classification and Compensation Study. This item was previously discussed during the City Council Work Session held on January 5, 2026, where staff presented an analysis of the proposals received.

While the City has reviewed individual positions periodically, a comprehensive city-wide analysis has not been conducted in recent history. Consequently, our current pay structures and job descriptions have evolved organically, which creates potential operational and liability risks. Ten proposals were received in response to the RFP, and an evaluation committee comprised of the City Manager, Assistant City Manager/City Clerk/Treasurer, Deputy City Clerk, and all Department Heads reviewed the submissions.

DISCUSSION:

This study is a strategic priority to ensure our human resources framework enables us to attract and retain a high-quality workforce, ensure internal equity among positions, and maintain external competitiveness within the current labor market. The evaluation committee identified McGrath Human Resources Group as the best value partner for the City based on their experience, methodology, and client references.

McGrath Human Resources Group was selected for three primary reasons:

- **Commitment to Independence:** They utilize a "teach-to-fish" methodology that includes training our leadership team on their point-factor analysis method, which will allow us to reclassify jobs internally in the future without relying on outside consultants.
- **Data Integrity:** They utilize fresh market data collected specifically for Independence rather than relying on aged third-party data.
- **Relevant Experience:** They have a strong track record with other Iowa municipalities, including West Des Moines and Polk County.

The scope of work includes a comprehensive review of the City's compensation philosophy, a market analysis using relevant public sector comparators, and the updating or development of job descriptions. The project is expected to take approximately five months to complete.

The City Attorney and City Manager have been working to complete review of the contract and believe it to be mostly completed. There may be some additional revisions to general conditions, but there will not be additional revisions to the scope of work.

RESULTS:

The City has established priorities during strategic planning sessions. This item supports the Vision from that session of **efficient and effective planning and prioritizing of all available resources and encouraging a supportive environment for businesses, workforce, and economic development**. This item helps achieve that vision by moving the City from a reactive approach to a structured compensation plan. This allows the Council to forecast personnel costs accurately and make data-driven budget decisions rather than ad-hoc adjustments, while also mitigating legal risks associated with outdated job descriptions.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATION:

The City budgeted \$35,000 for this project in the current fiscal year. The base consultation fee for the study is \$37,344. The agreement also includes provisions for travel expenses (not to exceed \$5,000).

While the base fee is slightly above the initial budgeted amount, funds are available within the current budget to cover the costs associated with this necessary investment.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends a motion to approve the agreement with McGrath Human Resources Group for the Classification and Compensation Study, and authorize the City Manager to sign the agreement.

**AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF INDEPENDENCE
AND MCGRATH HUMAN RESOURCES GROUP FOR A
COMPENSATION AND CLASSIFICATION STUDY**

THIS AGREEMENT made the by and between McGrath Human Resources, hereinafter called the Consultant, and the City of Independence, IA hereinafter called the City. (Consultant and City at times referred to as Parties, or individually as Party)

WHEREAS, the Consultant submitted a proposal, dated November 2025 to the City to conduct a compensation and classification survey for City.

WHEREAS, the City selected the Consultant to perform this study.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties (the City and the Consultant) do mutually agree to the following (“Agreement”):

The City shall engage the Consultant to perform the work described in its proposal of November referred to as the Project, which is incorporated herein by reference, and adopted as part hereof as if fully set forth verbatim herein.

The Project shall be undertaken and completed in such sequence as to assure the most expeditious completion and to best carry out the purposes of this Agreement.

The Consultant agrees to complete the Project in an agreed upon timeline for a total estimated cost of \$37,344 in consultation fees and expenses.

The City agrees to pay the Consultant for work on the Project and expenses incurred, as the performance of such work is demonstrated by submission of an invoice for \$4,000 upon receipt of the signed contract; \$10,069 upon submission of the draft report; \$4,000 upon submission of the draft report, and the balance of \$3,000 upon submission of the final report. Travel expenses will be billed separately and not to exceed \$5,000.

Job description project will be billed \$2,000 at the start of the project, and the balance based on actual number of job descriptions developed at \$205 per job title. Total estimated cost based on 55 job titles \$11,275.

The City shall remit payment within 30 days of receipt of said billing. In consideration of this Agreement, the City agrees to:

- Assure reasonable access to the members of the organization, i.e., City Manager, selected supervisors, and other appropriate employees.
- Afford prompt decisions on matters affecting the progress of the work.

GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS

1. **City Ownership and Proprietary Information:** The Parties expressly agree that all data, documents, records, studies, or other information generated, created, found or otherwise completed by Consultant in the performance of Consultant's duties under the terms of this contract shall at all times remain the proprietary information of and under the ownership of the City. All data, documents, records, studies, or other information generated, referred to above, with the exception of the market raw data (which is deemed proprietary information), shall be provided to the City by Consultant upon request so long as the City is not in default under other terms of this Agreement.
2. **Nondiscrimination:** In consideration of the signing of this Agreement, the Parties hereto for themselves, their agents, officials, employees, and servants agree not to discriminate in any manner on the basis of race, color, creed, or national origin with reference to the performance of this Agreement.
3. **Successors and Assigns:** The City and the Consultant each bind the other and assigns, in all respects, to all of the terms, conditions, covenants, and provisions of this Agreement, and any assignment or transfer by the Consultant of its interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the City shall be void.
4. **Compliance with Law:** The Consultant will comply with any and all applicable federal, state, and local laws as the same exist and may be amended from time to time.
5. **Indemnification Clause:** For purposes of this section, work performed is described as the preparation of studies and recommendations pertaining to the scope of services contained in this Agreement, as presented to the City for review and approval. Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, to the maximum extent permitted by law, the Consultant shall not be liable for consequential damages or for actions resulting from working as an agent of the City in performance of this study.
7. **Confidential Information:** Any confidential information provided to or developed by the Consultant in the performance of the agreement shall be kept confidential and not made available to any individual or organization by the Consultant without the prior written approval and consent of the City.
8. **Independent Contractors:** The Consultant and its agents and employees are independent contractors performing professional services for the City and are not employees of the City. Nothing herein shall be construed as incurring for the City any liability for Worker's Compensation, FICA, withholding tax, unemployment compensation, or any other payment, which would be required to be paid by the City if the City and the Consultant were standing in an employer/employee relationship, and the Consultant hereby agrees to assume and pay all such liabilities.

9. General Terms and Provision:

- a. "Notices and Demands" Whenever this Agreement requires or permits any notice or written request by one Party to another, it shall be deemed to have been properly given if and when delivered in person or three (3) business days after having been deposited in any U.S. Postal Service and sent by regular or certified mail, postage prepaid, addressed as follows:

or at such other address with respect to either Party as that Party may, from time to time designate in writing and provide to the other Party.

- b. "Binding Effect" This Agreement shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of City and Consultant and their respective successors and assigns.
- c. "Execution By Scanning or Electronic Signature" The Parties agree that this Agreement may be transmitted between them by scanning or electronic signature. The Parties intend that the scanned or electronic signatures constitute original signatures and that such scanned or electronically signed Agreement containing the signatures (original, scanned, or e-signed) of all the Parties is binding on the Parties.
- d. "Responsibilities" Subject to the terms of this Agreement, Consultant will be solely responsible for completing all work on the Project. Neither Party will be considered an agent of the other for purposes of this Project, and each will hold harmless and indemnify the other for any damages suffered by any person or entity as a result of its own or its agents' acts or failures to act in performance of its obligations under this Agreement.
- e. "Assignment of Agreement" The Consultant may not assign, transfer or convey in whole or in part this Agreement, without the consent of the City, which will be given/determined in the sole discretion of the City Council.
- f. "Amendments" No change, modification, or termination of any of the terms, provisions or conditions of this Agreement shall be effective unless made in writing and signed by the Parties.
- g. "Entire Agreement" This Agreement contains the entire understanding between the City and the Consultant with respect to the Project.
- h. "Laws Ordinances and Regulations" Consultant shall comply with all laws, rules and regulations relating to its business, other than laws, rules and regulations the failure to comply with which or the sanctions and penalties

resulting therefrom, would not have a material adverse effect on the business, property, operations, financial or otherwise, of Consultant.

- i. "Governing Law / Jurisdiction" This Agreement shall be governed by Iowa law with jurisdiction in the Buchanan County District Court.
- j. "Non-Discrimination" In carrying out the Project, Consultant shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, sexual orientation, national origin, age or disability.
- k. "Conflict of Interest" Consultant agrees that no member, officer or employee of City, or its designees or agents, nor any consultant or member of the governing body of City, and no other public official of City who exercises or has exercised any functions or responsibilities with respect to the Project during his or her tenure, or who is in a position to participate in a decision-making process or gain insider information with regard to the Project, shall have any interest, direct or indirect, in any contract or subcontract, or the proceeds thereof, for work to be performed in connection with the Project, or in any activity, or benefit therefrom, which is part of this Project at any time during or after such person's tenure. In connection with this obligation, Consultant shall have the right to rely upon the representations of any party with whom it does business and shall not be obligated to perform any further examination into such party's background.
- l. "Construction" Words and phrases herein, including acknowledgement hereof, shall be construed as in the singular or plural number, and as masculine, feminine, or neuter gender according to the context. The captions preceding the Sections are inserted only as a matter of convenience and for reference purposes and should not be considered substantive or relied upon in interpreting any provision of this Agreement. This Agreement shall be considered to have been jointly drafted by the Parties.
- m. "Captions" The captions preceding the Sections are inserted only as a matter of convenience and for reference purposes and should not be considered substantive or relied upon in interpreting any provision of this Agreement
- n. "Severability" If any part, term or provision of this Agreement is held to be illegal, in conflict with any law or otherwise invalid, the remaining portion or portions shall be considered severable and not be affected by such determination, and the rights and obligations of the parties shall be construed and enforced as if the Agreement did not contain the illegal or invalid part, term, or provision.
- o. "Acknowledgement" The Parties, by signing this Agreement, acknowledge having carefully read the same, having had an opportunity to consult with counsel concerning the legal effect of this Agreement and its various terms and conditions, and have signed the Agreement voluntarily and without duress or coercion.

10. Events of Default and Remedies:

- a. **Events of Default Defined**" The following shall be "Events of Default" under this Agreement and the term "Event of Default" shall mean, whenever it is used in this Agreement, any one or more of the following events:
 - i. Failure by either Party to substantially observe or perform any material covenant, condition, obligation or agreement on its part to be observed or performed under this Agreement.
- b. **"Remedies on Default"** Whenever any Event of Default is alleged to have occurred, the Party alleging the default may take any one or more of the following actions after giving written notice to the other Party of the alleged Default, but only if the alleged Default has not been cured within twenty (20) days following such notice, or if the Default cannot be cured within twenty (20) days and the Party alleged to be in default does not provide adequate assurances found acceptable to non-defaulting Party that the Event of Default will be cured as soon as reasonably possible thereafter:
 - i. The non-defaulting may in its sole discretion choose to cancel and terminate this Agreement, or pursue any legal remedies available under applicable law; and
- c. **"No Remedy Exclusive"** No remedy herein conferred upon or reserved to either Party is intended to be exclusive of any other available remedy or remedies, but each and every such remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy given under this Agreement or now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute. No delay or omission to exercise any right or power accruing upon any default shall impair any such right or power or shall be construed to be a waiver thereof, but any such right and power may be exercised from time to time and as often as may be deemed expedient. Should either Party have to take legal action to enforce any term of this Agreement, the Party found to be in violation of this Agreement shall be liable for the other Party's legal expenses and costs.
- d. **"No Implied Waiver"** In the event any agreement contained in this Agreement should be breached by any Party and thereafter waived by any other Party, such waiver shall be limited to the particular breach so waived and shall not be deemed to waive any other concurrent, previous or subsequent breach hereunder.
