2. Emergency Allocations

- A. Iowa Communications Network is requesting a supplemental allocation in the amount of \$6,450.52. This increases the total allocation to \$43,050.00. On October 19, 2020, ICN sustained cable damage due to excessive erosion along Highway 20 in Dubuque County. Request is to cover repair costs.

The State Auditor’s Office has reviewed this request and recommends allocation and payment. This represents full and final payment and this allocation will be closed.

- B. Iowa Communications Network is requesting a supplemental allocation in the amount of \$31,797.22. This increases the total allocation to \$88,736.85. On May 14, 2021, ICN sustained cable damage due to excessive erosion along Highway 34 between 120th Avenue and 127th Avenue and 185th Trail and 190th Avenue in Lucas County. Request is to cover repair costs.

The State Auditor’s Office has reviewed this request and recommends allocation, subject to audit of actual invoices and supporting documentation and demonstration that no costs covered by the maintenance contract have been included.

- C. Iowa Communications Network is requesting an emergency allocation in the amount of \$7,327.00. On April 9, 2021, ICN sustained cable damage due to accidental tripping of fires suppression system at DMACC Ankeny Campus. Request is to cover repair costs.

The State Auditor’s Office has reviewed this request and recommends allocation, subject to audit of actual invoices and supporting documentation and demonstration that no costs covered by the maintenance contract have been included.

- D. Department of Natural Resources is requesting a supplemental allocation in the amount of \$66,571.97. This increases the total allocation to \$100,932.50. On June 21, 2018, heavy rains damaged multiple wildlife management areas. Request is to cover repair costs not covered by FEMA.

The State Auditor’s Office has reviewed request and recommends allocation, subject to audit of actual invoices.

- E. Iowa State Fair is requesting an emergency allocation in the amount of \$6,750.91. On April 29, 2021, a water line break caused damage to the Administration Building. Request is to cover repair costs.

The State Auditor’s Office has reviewed request and recommends allocation, subject to audit of actual invoices.

F. Department of Corrections is requesting a supplemental allocation in the amount of \$18,000.00. This increases the total allocation to \$68,000.00. On December 28, 2020, hot water condensate tank failure needed tank and water line replacement. Request is to cover repair costs.

The State Auditor's Office has reviewed request and recommends allocation, subject to audit of actual invoices.

3. Payment of Cost Items

A. Department of Natural Resources\$5,974.49
On November 7, 2018, flooding caused damage to road crossings at Little Sioux Wildlife Management Area in Clay County. Request is to cover repair costs.

The State Auditor's Office has reviewed this request and recommends payment. This represents partial payment.

B. Department of Natural Resources\$19,029.45
On March 27, 2019, damage was sustained at Water Patrol Living Quarters at Templar State Recreation Area. Request is to cover repair costs.

The State Auditor's Office has reviewed this request and recommends payment. This represents full and final payment, \$470.55 will be reverted and this allocation closed.

C. Department of Natural Resources\$4,269.00
On June 8, 2020, high winds caused a tree to fall on Stone State Park Lodge. Request is to cover repair costs.

The State Auditor's Office has reviewed this request and recommends payment. This represents full and final payment.

D. Department of Natural Resources\$8,630.00
On August 10, 2020, State Forest Nursey in Story County was damaged by a derecho. Request is to cover repair costs.

The State Auditor's Office has reviewed this request and recommends payment. This represents full and final payment.

E. Department of Natural Resources\$73,250.00
On October 15, 2020, a Bobcat skid loader was damaged due to an electrical fire. Request is to cover repair costs.

The State Auditor's Office has reviewed this request and recommends payment. This represents full and final payment.

- F. Iowa Communications Network\$6,800.00
On September 29, 2020, ICN sustained cable damage due to rodent chew at the intersection of Highway 61 and Highway 92 in Muscatine County. Request is to cover repair costs.

The State Auditor’s Office has reviewed this request and recommends payment. This represents full and final payment, \$7,421.24 will be reverted and this allocation closed.

- G. Board of Regents – University of Iowa\$30,737.77
On January 21, 2020, a radiator malfunction caused water damages to drywall at the Bedell Entrepreneurship Learning Lab. Request is to cover repair costs.

The State Auditor’s Office has reviewed this request and recommends payment. This represents full and final payment.

- H. Department of Administrative Services\$48,615.04
On June 22, 2019 water damaged the Hoover Building due to flooding. Request is to cover repair costs.

The State Auditor’s Office has reviewed this request and recommends payment. This represents full and final payment, \$51,588.76 will be reverted and this allocation closed.

- I. Iowa Veterans Home\$43,274.03
On February 13, 2021, diesel fuel was required to run the facility boilers during a natural gas mandatory curtailment due to excessive, unprecedented cold temperatures in February. Request is to cover repair costs.

The State Auditor’s Office has reviewed this request and recommends payment. This represents full and final payment.
