IN THE NAME AND BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE STATE OF IOWA

PROCLAMATION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, on June 11, 2025, and continuing thereafter, a series of severe storm systems affected the state of Iowa; and

WHEREAS, this storm system caused severe weather, including damaging winds, straight-line winds, heavy rains and thunderstorms, resulting in significant damage to public and private property, power outages resulting from downed power lines and poles and vegetative debris; and

WHEREAS, Osceola and Palo Alto Counties suffered significant damage from this event; and




