BILL NO. 24-71 ORDINANCE NO. 24-71

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 5 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI, RELATIVE TO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN
OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Chapter 5, Article I, Section 5-7, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Missouri, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 5-7. Consumption of alcoholic beverages in public places.

It shall be unlawful for any person to drink intoxicating liquor or nonintoxicating beer upon the public streets, parking lots, alleys, highways, thoroughfares, or sidewalks within the city unless the city has issued appropriate permits for activities that allow consumption at specific events."

Section 2. It is the intent of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen and it is hereby ordained that this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Missouri, and that sections of this ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intention.

Section 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

The matter of amending Chapter 45 (Offenses) of the Code of Ordinances, relative to Marijuana, came on for consideration. Alderman Reiminger introduced Bill No. 24-72, being for an ordinance entitled as follows:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 45 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI, RELATIVE TO MARIJUANA; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

On a motion made by Alderman Reiminger, seconded by Alderman Seabaugh, Bill No. 24-72 was placed on its first reading and was read by title, considered and discussed and was duly passed. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 45 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI, RELATIVE TO MARIJUANA; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Chapter 45, Article IX, Division 1, Section 45-906, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Missouri, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 45-906. Controlled substances; definitions; prohibited acts.

- A. Definitions for the purpose of this section:
 - 1. "Controlled substance" means a drug, substance or immediate precursor as referred to in Schedules I through V, listed in Chapter 195, Revised Statutes of Missouri, except marijuana as defined by Article XIV of the Constitution of Missouri.
 - 2. "Drug paraphernalia" means all equipment, products and materials of any kind which are used, intended for use or designed for use in planting, propagating, cultivating, growing, harvesting, manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, processing, preparing, testing, analyzing, packaging, repackaging, storing, containing, concealing, injecting, ingesting, inhaling or otherwise introducing into the human body a controlled substance or an imitation controlled substance in violation of Chapter 195, Revised Statues of Missouri.
- B. It is unlawful for any person to use, or to possess with intent to use, drug paraphernalia, to plant, propagate, cultivate, grow, harvest, manufacture, compound, convert, produce, process, prepare, test, analyze, pack, repack, store, contain, conceal, inject, ingest, inhale, or otherwise introduce into the human body a controlled substance or an imitation controlled substance as set forth in RSMo 195.017.
- C. It is unlawful for any person to place in any newspaper, magazine, handbill or other publication any advertisement, knowing, or under circumstances where one reasonably should know, that the purpose of the advertisement, in whole or in part, is to promote the sale of objects designed or intended for use as drug paraphernalia.
- D. It is unlawful for any person to use, or to possess with intent to use, an imitation controlled substance in violation of this chapter.
- E. It is unlawful for any person to place in any newspaper, magazine, handbill or other publication, or to post or distribute in any public place, any advertisement or solicitation with reasonable knowledge that the purpose of the advertisement or solicitation is to promote the distribution of imitation controlled substances."

Section 2. That Chapter 45, Article IX, Division 1, Section 45-907, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Missouri, is hereby added as follows:

"Sec. 45-907. Marijuana.

- A. Definitions for the purpose of this section:
 - 1. To "Smoke Marijuana" means inhaling, exhaling, burning, or possessing any lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe, bong, or any other device used for the delivery of marijuana. This specifically includes the use of an electric or electronic smoking device, that creates an aerosol of vapor, in any manner, or in any form.
 - 2. To "Consume Marijuana" means to ingest marijuana, by any means other than smoking. This includes, but is not limited to ingesting edibles,

marijuana infused drinks, and eating food prepared with marijuana as an ingredient.

- 3. "Public Place" means any public or private property, or portion of public or private property that is open to the general public, including, but not limited to sidewalks, streets, bridges, parks, schools, and businesses.
- 4. All other definitions contained in this section are the same as used in Article XIV of the Missouri Constitution.

B. Marijuana use in a Vehicle:

- 1. No person shall smoke, consume, or be under the influence of marijuana while they are operating or are in physical control of any motor vehicle or other motorized form of transportation.
- 2. No person shall smoke marijuana within a motor vehicle or other motorized form of transportation, whether or not the vehicle is being operated.
- 3. Marijuana may not be stored or transported in any motor vehicle or other motorized form of transportation, unless it is stored in a sealed, odor-proof package, container, or receptacle.

C. Minors:

- 1. No person under the age of twenty-one (21) years may use, consume, smoke, possess, purchase, or attempt to purchase marijuana.
- 2. No person shall distribute, deliver, or sell with or without consideration, marijuana to any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years.

D. Public Use of Marijuana:

- 1. No person shall smoke or consume marijuana in any public place.
- 2. No person shall possess, smoke, or consume marijuana or possess marijuana accessories on the grounds of a public or private preschool, daycare, elementary school, secondary school, institution of higher education, vocational training facility, or on a school bus.
- 3. No person shall possess or consume marijuana on the grounds of a correctional facility.

E. Marijuana Cultivation and Distribution:

1. No person shall grow, cultivate, distribute, deliver, sell, possess or manufacture with the intent to distribute, deliver or sell marijuana unless specifically licensed or otherwise authorized to do so under Missouri law or Article XIV of the Missouri Constitution.

- 2. No person shall grow or cultivate any marijuana plant in an unlocked space or any place that is visible by normal, unaided vision from a public place.
- F. No person shall possess marijuana, marijuana products, or marijuana plants in excess of the weight or quantity limitations of Missouri law or Article XIV of the Missouri Constitution.
- G. It shall be a rebuttable presumption that products, containers, or packages labeled as containing marijuana actually contain marijuana and need not be tested to verify the presence of marijuana. A defendant may challenge the presumption that marijuana is present, but the burden of proof of such challenge shall be on the defendant.

H. Penalties:

- 1. A person under the age of twenty-one (21) years who violates this section shall be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$100 and forfeiture of marijuana. Any such person shall be provided the option of attending up to four hours of drug education or counseling in lieu of the civil penalty. This limitation shall only apply to violations related to public consumption and possession of three ounces or less of marijuana.
- 2. A person over the age of twenty-one (21) years who violates this section is subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$100.
- 3. A person who grows or cultivates marijuana in violation of this section is subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$250 and forfeiture of the marijuana.
- 4. A person of any age who possesses more than the weight or quantity of marijuana as authorized by Article XIV Missouri Constitution is subject to the following:
 - For the first violation, a civil penalty of \$250 and forfeiture of the marijuana.
 - b. For the second violation, a civil penalty of \$500 and forfeiture of the marijuana.
 - c. For the third or subsequent violation, a civil penalty of \$1000 and forfeiture of the marijuana.
 - d. The civil penalty may be satisfied by the performance of community service. The rate of pay down shall be either \$15 per hour, or the minimum wage of the State of Missouri that is effective at the time of judgment, whichever is greater."

Section 3. It is the intent of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen and it is hereby ordained that this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Missouri, and that sections of this ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intention.

Section 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such

ORDINANCE NO. 24-___

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 3 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI, RELATIVE TO PURCHASING PROCEDURE AND TASK ORDER ASSIGNMENTS; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Chapter 3, Article VII, Section 3-309, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Missouri, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 3-309. Purchasing procedure.

The city administrator or designate shall procure for the city all materials, supplies, equipment and contractual services needed by the city in accordance with the procedures described in this section. To that end, he shall have the power and be required to:

- (3) *Purchase orders*. If the consideration is more than one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00), the appropriate authority shall obtain a purchase order for any transaction.
- (4) *Competitive bidding*. When the city negotiates any purchase or other contract, there shall be provided ample opportunity for competitive bidding in the following manner:
 - a. If the consideration is more than two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) but less than or equal to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00), the appropriate authority shall obtain at least three (3) quotations from qualified vendors for the materials, supplies, equipment or contractual services to be purchased. The quotations may be obtained orally and the award for the purchase shall be given to the responsible entity with proper qualifications submitting the lowest quote.
 - b. If the consideration is more than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) but less than or equal to twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00), the appropriate authority shall solicit at least three (3) written quotations for the materials, supplies, equipment or contractual services to be purchased. The quotation shall be in written form and the award for the purchase shall be given to the responsible entity with proper qualifications submitting the lowest quote."

Section 2. That Chapter 3, Article IX, Section 3-374, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Missouri, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 3-374. Procedure for selection of task order assignments.

Whenever it becomes necessary for the city to negotiate task order assignments for architectural, engineering and land surveying services for individual projects, the following policy will be utilized:

- (2) For individual projects not anticipated to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00), the city administrator or designate shall solicit such services from one (1) or more firms on a time and materials basis according to the terms of the master services agreement on file for the person, firm or consultant.
- (3) For individual projects anticipated to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00), the city administrator or designate shall solicit a written scope of work, cost estimate and project schedule (based upon the project description as prepared by city staff) prior to making a final selection. Task order assignments shall be presented to the board of aldermen for approval if the project is anticipated to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00). All services shall be performed in accordance to the terms of the master services agreement on file for the person, firm or consultant."

Section 3. It is the intent of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen and it is hereby ordained that this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Missouri, and that sections of this ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intention.

Section 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

Section 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

POLICY UPDATE REGARDING PURCHASE ORDER PROCEDURE

This policy update is adopted by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Jackson, Missouri, on the day below written.

The purpose of this policy is to update the procedures for requesting and issuing purchase orders.

- 1. Complete a requisition form to initiate the order. The requisition is then approved and signed by the City Administrator or Assistant City Administrator.
- 2. Use the Purchase Order Requisition form for all requests as required by Section 3-309 of the City of Jackson Code of Ordinances. This includes any local, State, or Federal grant expenditures.
- 3. It is necessary to show the cost of each item as well as amounts for shipping charges. The use of estimates is generally discouraged.
- 4. To be sure your budget is properly expended, include the expense account number to be charged.

Failure to follow the above steps may result in a delay in issuing the purchase order.

Accounts Payable will prepare a Purchase Order upon receipt of an approved Purchase Order Requisition. A copy of the Purchase Order will be returned to the appropriate department. It is the requester's responsibility to place the order for the goods or services. No orders exceeding the specified amount should be placed until a Purchase Order has been issued.



WHEREAS, the Daughters of the American Revolution seek to perpetuate the memory and spirit of the men and women who achieved American independence; to promote, as an object of primary importance, institutions for the general diffusion of knowledge, thus developing an enlightened public opinion; and to cherish, maintain, and extend the institutions of American freedom, to foster true patriotism and love of country and to aid and secure for mankind all the blessings of liberty; and

WHEREAS, in carrying out the aforementioned objectives, the Daughters of the American Revolution desire to install a monument for the Revolutionary War Patriots who achieved American independence and fought valiantly to found a new nation from 1775-1783.

WHEREAS, on the 15th day of April, 2024 the Board of Aldermen passed Resolution No. 2024-04 which granted to the John Guild Chapter authority to attach a monument to the western wall of the entrance of the Old City Cemetery; and

WHEREAS, it was learned that the type of sign originally approved was not conducive to placement on the wall thereby necessitating a new design concept.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The City of Jackson, Missouri, does hereby grant to the John Guild Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution the authority to install a granite monument between the curb and the right entry way to the entrance of the Old City Cemetery.
- 2. The monument shall be made of granite with a serpentine top and measure 2 1/2 feet long, 6 inches wide, and 2 feet tall.
- 3. This Amended Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Board of Aldermen.
