WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen have been presented a contract marked Exhibit A and attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully set forth; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Jackson, Missouri, deem it advisable to enter into said contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOW:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Jackson, Missouri, approve the contract marked Exhibit A and attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully set forth between the City of Jackson, a municipal corporation, and **Power Line Consultants, LLC of Farmington, Missouri**. It is the belief of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen that it is in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Jackson, Missouri, that the City enters into said contract.

Section 2. That the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute said contract for and on behalf of the City of Jackson, Missouri.

ORDINANCE NO. 22-

AN ORDINANCE CALLING A BOND ELECTION IN THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:



CITY OF JACKSON
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MINUTES

Section 1. The Board of Aldermen of the City of Jackson, Missouri, finds it necessary and hereby declares its intent to borrow \$10,100,000.00 for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, extending, and improving the combined waterworks and sewerage system of the City (the "Project") and to evidence such borrowing by the issuance of combined waterworks and sewerage system revenue bonds of the City (the "Bonds") in the amount of \$10,100,000.00.

Section 2. A special bond election is hereby ordered to be held in the City of Jackson, Missouri, on Tuesday, August 2, 2022, on the following question:

QUESTION

Shall the City of Jackson, Missouri, issue its combined waterworks and sewerage system revenue bonds in the amount of \$10,100,000.00 for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, extending, and improving the combined waterworks and sewerage system of the City; the cost of operation and maintenance of said system and the principal of and interest on said revenue bonds to be payable solely from the revenues derived by the City from the operation of its combined waterworks and sewerage system, including all future extensions and improvements thereto?

The authorization of the Bonds will authorize the City to fix, establish, maintain, and collect rates and charges for the services provided by the City through its combined waterworks and sewerage system, including all extension and improvements thereto hereafter constructed or acquired by the City, in addition to the other rates and charges for such services provided by law as will produce income and revenues sufficient to provide funds to pay the costs of operation and maintenance of the combined waterworks and sewerage system and the principal of and interest on the Bonds as they become due and to retire the same within thirty-five years from the date thereof and to provide for the establishment of reasonable reserves therefor.

Section 3. The form of the Notice of Bond Election for said special election, a copy of which is hereby attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby approved.

Section 4.
