WHEREAS, the City of Jackson, desires to enter into a depository agreement with First

Missouri State Bank, Commerce Bank, First State Community Bank, The Bank of Missouri,

and US Bank for the deposit of Demand Deposits or checking account funds; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jackson, desires to enter into a depository agreement with said banks regarding the investment of idle City Funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOW:

- That the Mayor is hereby, authorized and directed to sign a depository agreement with First Missouri State Bank, Commerce Bank, First State Community Bank, The Bank of Missouri, and US Bank. Said agreements are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. That all of said depository agreements shall have a one-year term under a depository agreement as required by state statute.
- That said banks shall be depositories for all demand deposits of checking account funds
  of the City in an unlimited amount subject only to the deposit of securities as required by; Sections
  110.010 and 110.020, RSMo.

The Treasurer of the City shall, whenever the City accumulates idle funds, invest said funds in time certificates of deposits, based upon the highest sealed bids received from the designated depositories. All of such investment funds shall be in One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) or more increments. The Treasurer shall notify the depositories of available money for bid by phone, electronic transmission or United States Mail.
- 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval and shall repeal all ordinances or parts thereof in conflict herewith.

Dear Mr. Peetz:

In accordance with your request, Horner & Shifrin (H&S) has reviewed the three bid proposals pertaining to the above-referenced project, which were received by the City of Jackson on December 20<sup>th</sup>, 2022. Enclosed is the Bid Tabulation which summarizes the results of our bid evaluation.


Three bids were received for this project ranging from RIHC Contracting low bid of \$1,269,000 to the high bid of \$1,685,437.00 from T. Drury Contracting, Inc. Please note that our Engineer's Opinion of Probable Cost for this construction was \$1,258,800.00. The Engineer's estimate was based on Means Construction Cost Estimating books, past projects in the area, and manufacturer quotes. The lowest bid was 0.8% above the opinion of probable construction cost and the high bid was 29% above the opinion of probable construction cost.

In order to assess conformance of the submitted bids with the Procedural Bid Submittal Requirements, we examined the supplemental materials required by the Bidding Documents to be submitted with the Bid Form – Bid Bond, List of Major Subcontractors, and qualifications data. All bidders met conformance with all bid submittal items.

There were some concerns regarding the low bid received by RIHC Contracting, since they were \$375,000 below the next lowest bidder. H&S conducted a Teams meeting with RIHC and went through the entire project in detail to make sure they did not miss any significant items. There were a few small items that they missed, but nothing that would result in them pulling their bid. Overall, they are comfortable with their bid price.

We were contacted by another bidder the afternoon before bids were due, asking us about the coating systems. We discovered at that time there was confusion regarding the concrete coating systems to be used and where, but there was no time to get an addendum out. This item was one of the items RIHC did not include in their bid, but we agreed that since this was unclear in the bidding documents a Change Order will be issued after the Contract is awarded to add the System 12 coating to the new slab over the existing pit, which would total approximately \$6,200.

On the basis of our review of these bids, the agreement to add the Change Order, and the supporting materials submitted and discussions with the contractor, it is the recommendation of Horner & Shifrin



that the City of Jackson award RIHC Contracting as the successful bidder for the Jackson Water Plant Implementation Project – Phase 2, Project 2D.

The contract amount would be \$1,269,000.

# **CONTRACT FOR SERVICES**

THIS CONTRACT is made and entered into this \_\_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_,

2023, by and between the *Semo REDI*, a *Missouri corporation*, and the *CITY OF JACKSON*, *MISSOURI*, a municipal corporation, ("Founder"), WITNESSETH:

**WHEREAS,** Founder is one of a group of Founders which has established Semo REDI to provide services to Founder; and

WHEREAS, Semo REDI had been constituted a general not-for-profit corporation in the State of Missouri, whose corporate purpose is to actively solicit business, industry, and commerce for the greater Cape Girardeau, Missouri, area; and

**WHEREAS,** Founder is to receive the direct and indirect benefit of the activities and efforts of Semo REDI.

# **NOW, THEREFORE,** the parties agree as follows:

- 1. **TERM:** The term of this contract shall be for one year beginning January 1, 2023, and ending December 31, 2023. The Founder may at its sole option extend the term of this contract for an additional one year beginning January 1, 2024, and ending December 31, 2024. Thereafter, the parties may extend this contract for additional terms beginning on January 1 of each year and ending December 31 of each year.
- 2. **PAYMENT:** The City shall pay Semo REDI \$26,791.00 for the year 2023 in four equal quarterly installments payable January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1. Semo REDI shall set the amount to be charged for the upcoming year before December 31. The Founder shall have the option to re-negotiate the contract between the parties if the Founder objects to the amount set to be charged. Each year during the term of this contract payments shall be made to

Semo REDI in four equal quarterly installments payable January 1, April 1, July 1, and October 1.

- 3. **SERVICES:** SEMO REDI will provide to Founder the direct and indirect benefit of Semo REDI carrying out the stated corporate purposes of Semo REDI, which are to solicit and recruit business and commerce to the Cape Girardeau, Missouri, area through establishing an office and hiring personnel to pursue industrial recruitment on a fulltime basis as directed by the member of the Board of Directors of Semo REDI made up of individuals elected and appointed by the Founders of Semo REDI.
- 4. **FOUNDER REPRESENTATION:** Founder shall have the right to select one of Semo REDI's seven-member Board of Directors, which director shall serve a term to be determined in accordance with the bylaws of Semo REDI so long as Founder extends the terms of this contract. In the event the terms of this contract are not extended, then Founder shall forfeit its right to select a member of the Board of Directors.
- 5. **YEARLY REPORT:** Semo REDI will report yearly to Founder on its recruitment and promotional activities and its financial transactions, including details of receipts and expenditures. In addition, the director shall report yearly to the Board of Aldermen of the Founder concerning business recruitment and development activities relating directly or indirectly to the Founder.
- 6. **AREA PROMOTED:** Semo REDI will promote the aggregate geographic area represented by all Founders and shall not promote any activity outside said geographic area without the express unanimous consent of the directors of Semo REDI. The aggregate geographic area represented by Founders is that area within the boundary of Cape Girardeau County, Missouri, and within the cities of Cape Girardeau, Jackson, and Scott City, Missouri.

- 7. **BOOKS AND RECORDS:** All books and records of Semo REDI prepared and maintained in the course of its operation shall be the property of Semo REDI and, except for the yearly reporting above provided for, the information contained therein shall be available to Founder and only through Founder's duly elected or appointed representative(s) to the Board of Directors of Semo REDI.
- 8. **NON-AGENCY:** Nothing contained herein shall be construed as an agency agreement. Semo REDI's only relationship with Founder is to provide the services set out herein and it has no authority to, and will not represent itself to have authority to, act on behalf of Founder in any manner except as provided herein.
- 9. **PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE:** Semo REDI agrees to maintain at all times during the term of this contract comprehensive public liability insurance in a responsible insurance company, licensed to do business in the State of Missouri, properly protecting and indemnifying Founder in an amount of not less than the insurance requirements stated below:
  - Commercial General Liability Insurance with a minimum limit of \$1,000,000 each occurrence/\$2,000,000 general aggregate written on an occurrence basis.
  - Comprehensive Business Liability Insurance for all owned, non-owned, and hired automobiles and other vehicles used with a combined single limit of \$1,000,000 minimum.
  - Worker's Compensation Insurance within statutory limits required by any applicable federal or state law and Employers Liability Insurance with minimum limit of \$1,000,000 per accident.
  - Additional Insured Endorsement naming the City of Jackson as a named additional insured.
- 10. **TERMINATION:** Founder shall have the right not to renew this contract for any calendar year of the contract (after the first calendar year). Founder shall act on renewal of this contract before December 31 of each year and shall provide Semo REDI with notice of its renewal or nonrenewal on or before December 31 of each year.

- INDEMNITY: To the fullest extent permitted by law, Semo REDI agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the City of Jackson, its officers, agents, volunteers, lessees, invitees, and employees form and against all suits, claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including but not limited to attorneys' fees, court costs, or alternative dispute resolution costs arising out of, or related to the services provided by Semo REDI under this contract involving an injury or damage to property (including loss of use or diminution in value), but only to the extent that such suits, claims, damages, losses, or expenses are caused by the negligence or other wrongdoing of Semo REDI its officers, agents, and volunteers, or anyone directly or indirectly employed or hired by the Semo REDI or anyone for who acts the Semo REDI may be liable, regardless of whether caused in part by the negligence or wrongdoing of City and any of its agents or employees.
- 12. **DEFENSES**: No provision of this contract shall constitute a waiver of the City of Jackson's right to assert a defense based on sovereign immunity, official immunity, or any other immunity available under law.
- 13. **LAW AND VENUE**: This contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of Missouri and the venue for any dispute between the parties shall be in the Circuit Court of Cape Girardeau County, Missouri.
- 14. **ASSIGNS AND SUCCESSORS**: The terms, covenants, and conditions of this contract shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of the successors and permitted assigns of the respective parties to this contract.
- 15. **ENTIRE CONTRACT**: This contract constitutes the entire contract between the parties and supersedes any prior representations, offers, negotiations or understandings between the parties with respect to the subject matter of this contract.

ORDINANCE NO. 23-\_\_

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 5 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI, RELATIVE TO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Chapter 5, Article I, Section 5-1, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Missouri, is hereby amended to read as follows:

# "Sec. 5-1. Definitions.

As used in this chapter, the following words and phrases shall have the respective meanings ascribed to them in this section:

Club means a corporation organized under the laws of this state or an association not formed for pecuniary profit solely for promoting some common object other than the sale and consumption of alcoholic liquors.

*Hotel* means every building or other structure kept, used, maintained, advertised and held out to the public to be a place where food is actually served and consumed and where sleeping accommodations are offered for adequate pay to travelers and guests.

Intoxicating liquor means and includes alcohol for beverage purposes, alcoholic, spirituous, vinous, fermented, malt or other liquors, or a combination of liquors, a part of which is spirituous, vinous or fermented, and all preparations or mixtures for beverage purposes, containing in excess of one-half of one percent by volume.

Light wines means and includes light wines containing not in excess of fourteen (14) percent of alcohol by weight exclusively from grapes, berries and other fruits and vegetables.

Malt liquor (beer) shall be construed to refer to and to mean any beer manufactured from pure hops or pure extract of hops and pure barley malt or other wholesome grains or cereals, and wholesome yeast and pure water, and free from all harmful substances, preservatives and adulterants, having an alcoholic content of not more than five (5) percent by weight.

*Nonintoxicating beer* shall be construed to refer to and to mean any beer manufactured from pure hops or pure extract of hops, pure barley malt or other wholesome grains or cereals, wholesome yeast, pure water, and free from all harmful substances, preservatives and adulterants, having an alcoholic content of

more than one-half of one (0.5) percent by volume and not exceeding three and two-tenths (3.2) percent by weight.

*Original package* means any package containing one (1) or more standard bottles, cans, or pouches of beer or intoxicating liquor sold in sealed containers.

*Person* means and includes an individual, association, joint stock company, syndicate, copartnership, corporation, receiver, trustee, conservator, or other office appointed by any state or federal court.

Restaurant means any public place kept, used, maintained, advertised and held out to the public as a place where meals are actually served and regularly served."

Section 2. That Chapter 5, Article I, Section 5-27, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Missouri, is hereby amended to read as follows:

# "Sec. 5-27. Issuance; contents of license; conduct.

- (a) *Issuance*. On approval of the application by the city clerk and the payment of the license taxes herein provided, the city clerk shall grant the applicant a license to conduct business at the specified location in the city for a period set forth in section 5-21.
- (b) *Content.* Every license issued under this chapter shall set forth the type of license granted.
- (c) *Requirements, restrictions:* Failure to commence operations within thirty (30) days of issuance shall result in automatic revocation of license."

Section 3. That Chapter 5, Article I, Section 5-29, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Missouri, is hereby amended to read as follows:

# "Sec. 5-29. Fees.

A separate license is required for each place of business, and the following license fees shall be paid annually:

- (1) Retailers of intoxicating liquor, light wines, malt liquor (beer) and nonintoxicating beer whether by drink, original package, and location to be consumed, except Sale on Sunday, twenty-five (\$25.00).
- (2) Retailers of intoxicating liquor, light wines, malt liquor (beer), and nonintoxicating beer in the original package, not to be consumed upon the premises where sold, and sold on Sundays, in addition to all other fees required by law of such retailer, two hundred dollars (\$200.00).

(3) Manufacturers or distillers of intoxicating liquors containing alcohol in excess of five (5) percent by weight or malt liquor (beer) containing not more than five (5) percent of alcohol by weight, five hundred dollars (\$500.00)."

Section 4. That Chapter 5, Article I, Section 5-30, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Missouri, is hereby amended to read as follows:

# "Sec. 5-30. Temporary permit.

Notwithstanding the other provisions of this chapter, a permit for the sale of intoxicating liquor, light wines, malt liquor (beer), and nonintoxicating beer for consumption on premises where sold may be issued by the city clerk to any retailer, club, church, school, civic, service, fraternal, veteran, political, or charitable club or organization for the sale of the aforesaid items at a picnic, bazaar, fair, or similar gathering. Said permit shall be issued only for the day or days named therein and it shall not authorize the sale of the aforesaid items for more than seven (7) days by any said organization as described in any fiscal year. For such a permit issued, the licensee shall pay to the city the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00). No provision of law or rule or regulation of the city shall prevent any wholesaler or distributor from providing customary storage, cooling, or dispensing equipment for use by the holder of the license at such picnic, bazaar, fair, or similar gathering."

Section 5. That Chapter 5, Article I, Section 5-34, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Missouri, is hereby amended to read as follows:

# "Sec. 5-34. Authority of city to inspect premises of licensee.

The board of aldermen, the city administrator, the chief of police or their designated agents and employees have the right at any time to inspect the premises wherein alcoholic beverages are being sold under a license issued under the provisions of this chapter. Upon the request of any such persons, the person or persons to whom a license is issued under the provisions of this chapter or those in their employ shall, at all times, allow said persons to inspect the premises and shall show them the stock of goods in any room or place in the premises that they desire to inspect. If a violation of the Code of Ordinances or State law is discovered, there shall be made a report to the board of aldermen of their findings upon their inspection, and the board of aldermen shall have the authority to act thereon as a result of such findings in accordance with the provisions of this chapter which shall include, but not be limited to, the revocation of the license."

Section 6. It is the intent of the Mayor and Board of Aldermen and it is hereby ordained that this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Jackson, Missouri, and that sections of this ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intention.

Section 7. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

Section 8. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

SUBJECT: Taxation on retail sales of adult use non-medicinal marijuana

# Agenda Item

An ordinance calling an election in the City of Jackson, Missouri, on April 4, 2023, to impose a sales tax at the rate of three percent on the retail sales of adult use non-medicinal marijuana.

# Summary

The attached ordinance imposes a sales tax at a rate of three percent on all tangible personal property retail sales of adult use marijuana sold within the City of Jackson, Missouri, pursuant to Article XIV, Section 2.6(5) of the Missouri Constitution subject to the approval by the voters of the Jackson at the general municipal election to be held on Tuesday April 4, 2023, designating the form of ballot, and directing the city clerk to provide notice of said election.

# Background

On November 8, 2022, Missouri voters passed Amendment 3 to legalize recreational marijuana to adults. The amendment allows for a sales tax at a rate of three percent on all tangible personal property retail sales of adult use marijuana sold. Currently, Cape Girardeau County and several other cities are planning on putting the tax on the April ballot. If the Board of Aldermen wishes to impose the three percent tax, the taxation ordinance and ballot must be approved by the Board and delivered to the County Clerk no later than January 24, 2023 at 5:00 p.m.

ORDINANCE NO. 23-\_

AN ORDINANCE IMPOSING A SALES TAX AT A RATE OF THREE PERCENT ON ALL TANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY RETAIL SALES OF ADULT USE NON-MEDICAL MARIJUANA SOLD WITHIN THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI, PURSUANT TO ARTICLE XIV, SECTION 2.6(5) OF THE MISSOURI CONSTITUTION SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL BY THE VOTERS OF THE CITY AT THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON APRIL 4, 2023; DESIGNATING THE FORM OF BALLOT; AND DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO PROVIDE NOTICE OF SAID ELECTION.

**WHEREAS,** on November 8, 2022, the electors of the State of Missouri approved Amendment 3 to the Missouri Constitution enacting Section 2 of Article XIV of the Missouri Constitution effective December 8, 2022; and

**WHEREAS**, the newly enacted Article XIV, section 2.6(5) of the Missouri Constitution authorizes the City of Jackson, Missouri to impose, by ordinance, an additional sales tax in amount not to exceed three percent on all tangible personal property retail sales of adult use non-medical marijuana sold in such political subdivision subject to approval by voters of the City of Jackson, Missouri; and

**WHEREAS,** the Board of Aldermen believes that it is in the best interests of the citizens of the City of Jackson, Missouri to impose a sales tax of three percent on all tangible personal property retail sales of adult use non-medical marijuana sold in the City of Jackson, Missouri and to submit the same to the voters of the City for approval by a majority of those voting at the general municipal election to be held on April 4, 2023.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION 1 – ADULT USE NON-MEDICAL MARIJUANA SALES TAX.</u> A sales tax at the rate of three percent on all tangible personal property retail sales of adult use non-medical marijuana sold in the City of Jackson, Missouri, as authorized by Article XIV, section 2.6(5) of the Missouri Constitution, is hereby imposed. The tax imposed hereunder shall be in addition to any and all other sales taxes allowed by law.

<u>SECTION 2 – EFFECTIVE DATE</u>. The sales tax imposed by this Ordinance shall not be effective unless approved by a majority of the votes cast by the qualified voters voting thereon at the General Municipal Election to be held on April 4, 2023, at which election a proposal to authorize the Board of Aldermen of the City of Jackson, Missouri, to impose the tax herein provided for shall be submitted to the voters of the City of Jackson.
