Minutes of Regular Meeting October 6, 2025

The City Council of Jefferson City, Tennessee, met in regular session on Monday, October 6, 2025, at 5:00 p.m., at City Hall, 112 City Center Drive, with Mayor Mitch Cain presiding.

The opening prayer and Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mayor Cain.

Also, present were James Gallup, City Manager; Robert Burts, City Attorney; and Bettina Chandler, City Recorder.

Upon motion of Councilman Melton, seconded by Vice Mayor Bunch, the City Council minutes of September 2, 2025, Beer Board minutes of September 2, 2025, and City Council Special Meeting minutes of September 2, 2025, were unanimously approved as written.

Upon request from Mayor Cain for citizen comments, there were none.

In communications from the mayor, he thanked the city and the Parks and Recreation Department for an excellent job with the Mossy Creek Festival and stated there has been a lot of positive comments and feedback about the event. He also commented that there was an increase in August sales tax collections.

Upon motion of Councilwoman Purkey, seconded by Vice Mayor Bunch, McGill Associate's proposal for professional planning services for Comprehensive Parks and Recreation Master Plan in the amount of \$60,000.00, was unanimously approved.

Upon motion of Vice Mayor Bunch, seconded by Councilman Melton, the purchase of police uniforms from Tru Blu Tactical in the amount of \$16,487.96, was unanimously approved.

Upon motion of Councilwoman Combs, seconded by Councilman Melton, change order 2 which increases the contract time for the city to acquire a testing-firm, and change order 3 which changes the structural steel for the building with a price decrease of \$12,482.84, for Fire Station 2, was unanimously approved.

Upon motion of Vice Mayor Bunch, seconded by Councilman Melton, the purchase of four (4) Scott Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) for the Fire Department in the amount of \$43,736.00 and the request to waive the sealed bid process, was unanimously approved.

Upon motion of Councilman Melton, seconded by Councilwoman Combs, annual city buildings sprinkler inspection repairs to be completed by Secufire in the amount of \$12,021.05, was unanimously approved.

Upon motion of Councilwoman Purkey, seconded by Councilwoman Combs, GameTime Playground Grant city match funds in the amount of \$149,953.43 for the Playground Project at Roy Harmon Park, was unanimously approved.

Upon motion of Councilwoman Purkey, seconded by Vice Mayor Bunch, the bid from Walden Chemical (Blue Water) in the amount of \$77,700.00 for RFB 26-02 for removal and installation of sand filtration pump and plumbing system at the Community Center, was unanimously approved.

Upon motion of Councilman Melton, seconded by Councilwoman Combs, the bid from Perfection Group in the amount of \$382,087.00 for RFB 26-03 for removal and installation of Dectron Unit Replacement at the Community Center, was unanimously approved.

Upon motion of Councilman Melton, seconded by Vice Mayor Bunch, Resolution 2025-26, a resolution to adopt the 2025 Jefferson County Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan, was unanimously adopted.





The Department hosted the TFACA Forcible Entry Trailer Training Prop for in-service training on forcible entry methods for 3 days in October.

Fire department personnel and apparatus participated in a functional exercise at Cherokee Dam which simulated a battery fire and hazardous materials release on October 8th.

Fire personnel delivered the "Sound-Off" program to all second graders at Jefferson Elementary on October 9th. Sound-Off is a fire prevention education program where students are instructed about smoke alarms and exit drills in the home (EDITH) activities.

Chief Turner attended the Kick-Off meeting for the recently awarded Tennessee Highway Safety Office Grant for an extrication tool.

The fire department hosted the JCHS Leadership class at the station for a "Lunch and Learn" activity where students were taught about fire department operations, fire prevention and fire equipment.

Chief Turner attended the quarterly Tennessee Fire Chief Association Meeting in Kingsport.

The Department hosted the first Annual City Trunk or Treat event, and it was overwhelming successful with a major turnout from the community. Department Outreach Coordinator Lora Wagner did an excellent job organizing the event.

JCFD Firefighters Bruce Moss and Jacob Coldwell graduated the 11-week Basi Fire Recruit School hosted by Kingsport Fire Department on October 28th.

24 JCFD Firefighters completed the 40-hour Trench Rescue Technician Course in October as part of the Department's In-Service training program.







BACKGROUND:

- The City received a quote of \$57,000.00 from Southeastern Tank for two (2) 4,500-gallon HDPE tanks to replace the current tanks which have become brittle over time and now leak. The City has received a quote of \$28,649.00 from MB&R Contractors, Inc. to install the above quoted tanks
- Installation of the new bleach tanks involves removal of part of the back wall of the current area occupied by the old bleach tanks. Water plant personnel have repaired and patched the tanks as much as possible and now must seek a more permanent remedy.

FISCAL IMPACT:

• The total cost of the project is \$85,649.00 and will require a budget amendment to (52113-259) for installation and another to (52113-262) for purchase of the tanks.

I request approval of this expenditure as it is necessary to provide potable water to our customers.

- This will help with the safety of the building if a fire should ever occur. It will also eliminate the old, corroded piping that could crack or burst at any time.
