Subject: Amendment to Ordinance 2025-05

Please amend Ordinance 2025-05, an ordinance amending the FY 2024-25 Budget, to include the following amendments: **increase in General Fund Revenues totaling \$480,550** for increased property tax revenue, business license revenue, beer fines, court fines, interest, and other revenue; **increase in General Fund Expenditures totaling \$496,950** for accrued payroll, IDB legal fees for Project Bobcat, Fire Station 2 contractor's payment #1, Fire Department emergency HVAC repair, and East Ellis Street bridge repair; **increase in Water Sewer Fund Revenues totaling \$295,560** for ARPA TDEC grant funds, interest, operating water revenue, and water tap fees; **increase in Water Sewer Fund Expenditures totaling \$127,750** for accrued payroll, emergency pump replacement at Water Plant Jarnigan well, and TDEC ARPA project invoices. **The additional amendments are highlighted in light blue on the attached amendment spreadsheet.**

GENERAL FUND:

General Fund Unassigned Fund Balance will change from an estimated increase of **\$113,220** to an estimated increase of **\$96,820**.

WATER SEWER FUND:

Water Sewer Fund Estimated Income Before Capital Contributions will change from a decrease of \$289,025 to a decrease of \$121,215.

Estimated Capital Contributions will change from an increase of \$1,680,710 to an increase of \$1,738,850.

Estimated Increase in Net Position will change from \$1,391,685 to \$1,617,635.

Capital Expenditures estimated increase from \$2,220,820 to \$2,278,960.

Water and Sewer Cash Flow change from an estimated net decrease of \$829,135 to an estimated net decrease of \$661,325.

LICENSE AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into as of this the 22 day of 2015 by and between THE STATE OF TENNESSEE, acting by and through its Commissioner of Transportation, (hereinafter referred to as "State") and CITY OF MORRISTOWN, TENNESSEE, CITY OF JEFFERSON CITY, TENNESSEE and TOWN OF WHITE PINE, TENNESSEE (hereinafter referred to as "Licensees").

WHEREAS, Licensees desire to use a portion of the Licensed Premises for Gateway Signs on a Wayfinding Sign project at different locations on State Routes 32 and 34 in Hamblen County, Tennessee and on State Routes 34, 92 and 341 in Jefferson County, Tennessee, or better described by the attached plans for "Wayfinding Signs, Hamblen, Jefferson County, Tennessee," Project No. STP-M-9113(20), PIN 118903.00, which are attached as Exhibit A and made a part of this License; and

WHEREAS, the State is willing to permit said use of the Licensed Premises subject to certain conditions.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the execution of this License Agreement, it is mutually agreed between the parties hereto as follows:

- <u>LICENSE</u> Licensees are hereby granted permission to use the Licensed Premises for Gateway Signs on a Wayfinding Sign project at different locations on State Routes 32 and 34 in Hamblen County, Tennessee and on State Routes 34, 92 and 341 in Jefferson County, Tennessee, in accordance with the attached plans for Project No. STP-M-9113(20)(hereinafter referred to as the "Improvements").
- USE OF LICENSED PREMISES Licensees shall be permitted to use the Licensed Premises for the installation and maintenance of the Improvements and subject to the stipulations below. Licensees shall not be permitted to use the Licensed Premises for any other purpose except by prior written permission of the State.
- 3. <u>FEE</u> Licensees shall pay \$0 per year to the State for the use of the Licensed Premises.
- 4. TERM The License is a 10 year, renewable, license which shall begin on Suly 22, 2015 and shall end on 21, 2025.
- ACCESS The State shall provide Licensees access to the Licensed Premises at all times for the uses authorized herein.
- 6. <u>MAINTENANCE</u> The costs of any maintenance and operation of the Improvements shall be at the sole expense of Licensees.

- 7. TRAFFIC CONTROL At no time will work authorized by this license agreement interfere with the normal flow of traffic on roadways adjoining the Licensed Premises. Licensees are responsible for providing traffic control for this work zone in accordance with the requirements of the current Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices. If proper traffic control is not in place, TDOT may order Licensees to stop work until proper traffic control is put in place.
- 8. DAMAGE TO STATE PROPERTY Licensees shall be liable for any damage to State property resulting from Licensees' (or their contractors' or agents') use of the Licensed Premises and/or installation and operation of the Improvements, including but not limited to, the roadway, shoulders, guardrail, drainage, landscaping, signs and controlled-access fences. All repair or replacement of such damage shall be made in accordance with the current TDOT Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction, TDOT Standard Drawings and any other applicable design and/or construction standards or guidelines.
- LIABILITY Licensees shall assume all liability for claims arising out of conduct on the part of the Licensees for which it would be liable under the Tennessee Governmental Tort Liability Act, Tenn. Code Ann. § 29-20-101, up to the limits for which it can be held liable for such conduct under that act, arising from its use of the Licensed Premises.
- 10. <u>INSURANCE</u> The Licensees, their successors and assigns, agree to maintain adequate public liability insurance which may include self insurance and will provide satisfactory evidence of such insurance to the State. Further, the liability limits of this insurance must not be less than the exposure and limits of the State's liability under the Claims Commission Statute, T.C.A. Section 9-8-307, as it may be from time to time amended and/or construed by the claims commission and courts. This statute currently limits liability of the State to \$300,000 per claimant and \$1,000,000 per occurrence. The insurance policy shall include a provision for the insurance company to notify the State in writing of any cancellation or changes of the policy at least 30 days in advance of the cancellation or change.
- PERMIT Licensees are responsible for obtaining and paying the costs of all permits, licenses or other approvals by any regulatory body having jurisdiction over the uses authorized herein.
- 12. <u>COMPLIANCE</u> Should Licensees fail or neglect to comply with any term or condition of this License Agreement or to comply with written notice and demand, this License shall be subject to termination. In the event of such termination, Licensees shall immediately remove any and all of their Improvements from the licensed Premises and surrender all rights and privileges under this License Agreement.
- 13. <u>TITLE VI ASSURANCES</u> The Licensees for themselves, their successors in interest and assigns, as part of the consideration hereof do hereby covenant and agree that in the event facilities are constructed, maintained, or otherwise operated on the property described in this License Agreement for a purpose for which the State or a State program or activity is extended or for another purpose involving the provision of similar services or benefits, the Licensees shall maintain and operate such facilities and services in compliance with all other requirements imposed pursuant to Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 21, Nondiscrimination in Federally Assisted Programs of the Department of Transportation Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and as said regulations shall be amended.
- TERMINATION The State may terminate this License at will with 60 days written notice to Licensees.
- ASSIGNMENT The License shall not be transferred, conveyed or assigned to another party without prior written approval from the State.

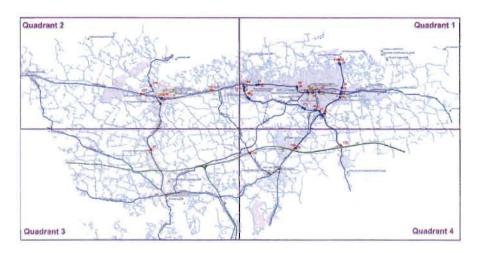

CLEARING AND GRUBBING INITIATED) MORE THAN 15 CALENDAR DAYS (10 CALENDAR DAYS FOR SITES WITH AN ACTIVE ARAP PRIOR TO GRADING OR EARTH MOVING ACTIVITIES UNLESS THE AREA IS MULCHED, SEEDED WITH MULCH, OR OTHER TEMPORARY COVER IS INSTALLED.
- 3. CLEARING, GRUBBING, AND OTHER DISTURBANCE TO RIPARIAN VEGETATION SHALL BE LIMITED TO THE MINIMUM NECESSARY FOR SLOPE CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPMENT OPERATIONS. EXISTING VEGETATION SHOULD BE PRESERVED TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT POSSIBLE. UNNECESSARY VEGETATION REMOVAL IS PROHIBITED.
- ALL DISTURBED AREAS SHALL BE PROPERLY STABILIZED AS SOON AS PRACTICABLE. PRIORITY SHALL BE GIVEN TO FINISHING OPERATIONS AND PERMANENT EPSC MEASURES OVER TEMPORARY EPSC MEASURES ON ALL PROJECTS.
- CONSTRUCTION SHALL BE SEQUENCED AND STAGED TO MINIMIZE THE EXPOSURE TIME OF GRADED OR DENUDED SOIL AREAS, PRESERVE TOPSOIL, AND MINIMIZE SOIL COMPACTION.

SEDIMENT CONTROL

- EPSC MEASURES SHALL BE INSTALLED AND FUNCTIONAL PRIOR TO ANY EARTH MOVING OPERATIONS, AND SHALL BE MAINTAINED THROUGHOUT THE CONSTRUCTION PERIOD.

STREAMWETLAND

8. SOIL MATERIALS MUST BE PREVENTED FROM ENTERING WATERS OF THE STATE/U.S. EPSC MEASURES TO PROTECT WATER QUALITY MUST BE MAINTAINED THROUGHOUT THE CONSTRUCTION PERIOD. - 10. INSPECTION, REPAIR, AND MAINTENANCE OF EPSC MEASURES/STRUCTURES IS TO BE PERFORMED ON A REGULAR BASIS. SEDIMENT SHALL BE REMOVED FROM SEDIMENT CONTROL STRUCTURES WHEN THE DESIGN CAPACITY HAS BEEN REDUCED BY FIFTY PERCENT (50%). DURING SEDIMENT REMOVAL, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL TAKE CARE TO ENSURE THAT STRUCTURAL COMPONENTS OF EPSC MEASURES ARE NOT DAMAGED AND THUS MADE INEFFECTIVE. IF DAMAGE DOES OCCUR, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL REPAIR THE STRUCTURES AT THE CONTRACTOR'S OWN EXPENSE.

- 11. WHERE DISCHARGE LOCATIONS ARE INACCESSIBLE, NEARBY DOWNSTREAM LOCATIONS SHALL BE INSPECTED. LOCATIONS WHERE VEHICLES ENTER AND EXIT THE SITE SHALL BE INSPECTED FOR EVIDENCE OF OFF-SITE ROADWAY SEDIMENT TRACKING.
- 13. THE TDOT PROJECT SUPERVISOR (OR THEIR DESIGNEE) AND THE CONTRACTOR'S SITE SUPERINTENDENT ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR INSPECTIONS. MAINTENANCE AND REPAIR ACTIVITIES ARE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE CONTRACTOR.
- EPSC MEASURES FOUND TO BE INEFFECTIVE SHALL BE REPAIRED, REPLACED, OR MODIFIED BEFORE THE NEXT RAIN EVENT, IF POSSIBLE.

MATERIALS AND STAGING

15. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL BE SOLELY RESPONSIBLE FOR AND OBTAIN ANY NECESSARY ENVIRONMENTAL PERMITS OR APPROVALS, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ARCHAEOLOGY, ECOLOGY, HISTORICAL, HAZARDOUS MATERIALS, AIR AND NOISE, TOEC ARAP/401, USACE SECTION 404, TVA SECTION 26A, AND TDEC NPDES PERMITS, FROM FEDERAL, STATE AND/OR LOCAL AGENCIES REGARDING, ANY STAGING AREAS TO BE USED. ANY SUCH PERMITS SHALL BE SUPPLIED TO THE TDOT PROJECT RESPONSIBLE PARTY PRIOR TO THE USE OF THE PERMITTED AREAS

PERMITS, PLANS, RECORDS

- 16. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL BE SOLELY RESPONSIBLE FOR AND OBTAIN ANY NECESSARY ENVIRONMENTAL PERMITS OR APPROVALS, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO TDEC ARAP/401, USACE SECTION 404, TVA SECTION 25A, AND TDEC NPDES PERMITS, FROM FEDERAL STATE AND/OR LOCAL AGENCIES REGARDING THE OPERATION OF ANY PROJECT-DEDICATED ASPHALT AND/OR CONCRETE PLANTS.
- 17. ANY DISAGREEMENT BETWEEN THE PROJECT PLANS, THE PROJECT AS CONSTRUCTED, AND THE PERMIT(S) ISSUED FOR THE PROJECT, SHALL BE BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF THE TOOT PROJECT RESPONSIBLE PARTY. THE ENVIRONMENTAL DIVISION, DESIGN DIVISION. AND HEADQUARTERS CONSTRUCTION OFFICE SHALL BE CONTACTED IN THESE INSTANCES AND DECIDE WHICH HAS PRECEDENCE AND WHETHER PERMIT OR PLANS REVISIONS ARE NEEDED. IN GENERAL, PERMIT CONDITIONS WILL PREVAIL.
- ALL PROJECT RELATED ENVIRONMENTAL PERMITS SHALL BE MAINTAINED AT OR NEAR THE PROJECT SITE.
- 19. THE EPSC PLAN SHALL BE UPDATED WHENEVER EPSC INSPECTIONS INDICATE. OR WHERE STATE OR FEDERAL OFFICIALS DETERMINE EPSC MEASURES ARE PROVING INEFFECTIVE IN ELIMINATING OR SIGNIFICANTLY MINIMIZING POLLUTANT SOURCES OR ARE OTHERWISE NOT ACHIEVING THE GENERAL OBJECTIVES OF CONTROLLING POLLUTANTS IN STORM WATER DISCHARGES ASSOCIATED WITH THE CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITY.

LITTER, DEBRIS, WASTE, PETROLEUM

20. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL ESTABLISH AND MAINTAIN A PROACTIVE METHOD TO PREVENT LITTER, CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS, AND CONSTRUCTION WASTES FROM ENTERING WATERS OF THE STATE/JJS. THESE MATERIALS WILL BE PICKED UP AND REMOVED FROM STORMWATER EXPOSURE PRIOR TO ANTICIPATED STORM EVENTS. AFTER USE, MATERIALS USED FOR EPSC WILL BE REMOVED FROM THE SITE.

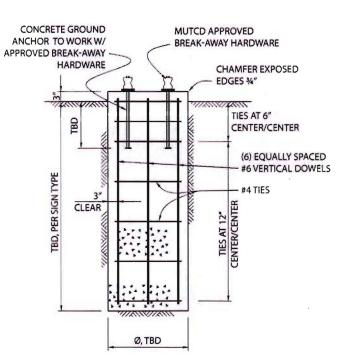
